FROM THE TIP

- ▶ Arizona earned the 2-seed in this week's Pac-12 Tournament, their best seeding since 2004.
- ▶ The Wildcats will face 3-seed UCLA in the semifinals on Friday at 9 p.m. MST.
- ▶ Arizona is playing in their second-straight semifinals for the first time since 2004.
- ▶ The Wildcats beat UCLA in the second game of the season back in December.
- ▶ Aari McDonald was named Pac-12 Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year.
- ▶ She is the first person to be Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year since Chiney Oguwmi.
- ▶ McDonald is the only player in Pac-12 history to lead the league in scoring and steals three-straight seasons.
- ▶ She was also named a Lieberman Award Finalist and a Naismith Player of the Year semifinalist this week.
- ▶ Adia Barnes was named a Naismith Coach of the Year Semifinalist on Wednesday.
- ▶ Arizona was ranked No. 7 in the NCAA selection committee's most recent poll, making them a 2-seed.
- ▶ Arizona won 13 conference games for the first time since the 2003-04 season when Arizona won the Pac-10.
- ▶ Arizona is the only school in the Pac-12 with three 1,000-point scorers on the roster.
- ▶ McDonald has scored in double-figures in 86-straight games, the longest active streak in the nation.
- ▶ She is the NCAA career scoring leader among active players, is 4th in Arizona history and 18th in Pac-12 history.
- ▶ Sam Thomas was named Pac-12 All-Defense for the second year in a row and was All-Pac-12 this year.
- ▶ Thomas was named the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year on Thursday.
- ▶ She is shooting 53% from three in her last nine games.
- ▶ Thomas is the career leader in blocks among all active Pac-12 players. No other player has 100 blocks.
- ▶ She is the only player in the Pac-12 to average at least two steals and one block per game.
- ▶ After missing her first 10 threes to start the season, Thomas is shooting 45% from deep.
- ▶ Cate Reese earned her second All-Pac-12 selection while Trinity Baptiste was named honorable mention.
- ▶ Lauren Ware was named Honorable Mention Pac-12 All-Freshman.
- ▶ Arizona has had someone on the All-Freshman team four years in a row now.
- ▶ The Wildcats have been ranked in the AP Poll for 32-straight weeks, the longest stretch in school history.
- ▶ Arizona has been ranked in the top 10 in 13 of the 15 polls.

- The Wildcats set a school record for three-point percentage against Washington (75%).
- 75% (12-16) is the second-best percentage of any team in the nation this season.
- Arizona is 45-11 in their last 56 games.
- Adia Barnes, Kelly Graves and Tara VanDerveer are the only Pac-12 coaches to have two 24-win seasons in their first four years at their respective school.
- Aari McDonald and Sam Thomas were named Senior CLASS Award candidates.
- The Cats swept the regular season series vs. Oregon for the first time in 10 years.
- The Wildcats swept the Oregon schools for the first time in 10 years earlier this season.
- Arizona allowed 41 points to Oregon on Jan. 14, the fewest the Ducks have scored since 2017.
- 41 points is also the fewest points Arizona has ever allowed to a top-10 team.
- Arizona allowed just 33 points to Cal on Jan. 3, the fewest ever to a Pac-12 opponent.
- Arizona won their first five Pac-12 games for the first time in school history.
- Barnes reached 75 wins faster than any coach in Arizona history.
- Madison Conner joined Arizona as a mid-year enrollee on Jan. 15 and made her first appearance vs. Washington.
- The Wildcats swept Colorado and Utah on the road for the first time in school history.
- Arizona's win over No. 9 UCLA was their first win in program history over a top-10 team while they were ranked in the top 10.
- The Wildcats swept the L.A. schools at home for a second-consecutive season. Arizona has not posted four-consecutive wins against USC and UCLA since the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons.

Last Time Out

Arizona dominated Washington State on the defensive end, forcing 26 turnovers while allowing 44 points. Trinity Baptiste had her game of the season, scoring 17 points to go along with six rebounds and a career-high six steals. Aari McDonald had 13 points, nine assists and five rebounds.

Living up to the Hype

Arizona was picked to finish second in the Pac-12 by the coaches this season, and that is right where the Wildcats finished. Second place is the highest Arizona has finished since winning the Pac-10 title back in the 2003-04 season.

The OG3

It's no secret that the big three of Aari McDonald, Sam Thomas and Cate Reese mean the world to Adia Barnes and the Arizona program. The trio has laid the foundation to building a top-10 program that Arizona has become, but it didn't come without some growing pains. During the 2017-18 season, Thomas played 36 minutes per game on a team that won six games while McDonald could only watch from the sideline as she was forced to sit out after transferring from Washington. Meanwhile, Reese was a senior at Cypress Woods High School and was the first McDonald's All-American to commit to Arizona. Fast forward three years later, they have played a combined 320 games, all scored over 1,000 career points, and have Arizona regularly in the top 10. Thanks to them, Arizona is the only team in the Pac-12 with three 1,000-point scorers on the roster.

A Program Changing Player

Aari McDonald is a player that only comes around so often, and her hard work to help bring this program to the spotlight was vindicated this week after being named both Pac-12 Player of the Year and Pac-12 Co-Defensive Player of the Year. She is the first player since Chiney Ogwumike in 2014 to be named both Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year. For the third year in a row, she led the Pac-12 in scoring (19.4) and steals (2.7) per game, something no one in the history of the Pac-12 conference has achieved. She has scored in double-figures in 85-straight games, her entire career and the longest active streak in the nation and is the NCAA active leader in career points.

An Elite Scorer

On Jan. 22, McDonald scored her 2,000th career point vs. Utah with a free throw in the fourth quarter. She became just the third player to ever put the Arizona uniform to score 2,000 career points (Adia Barnes & Davellyn Whyte). Additionally, she is the 24th player in Pac-12 history to score 2,000 career points. On the season, McDonald averages 18.8 points per game, the second-most in the Pac-12.

She gets it done on the Defensive End Too

Although McDonald is known for her dynamic play on the offensive side of the ball, she should equally be known for her lockdown defense as she is a two-time Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year. She finished the regular season leading the Pac-12 in steals per game for a third-straight season averaging 2.7 per game. McDonald is the first Pac-12 player since Lisa Willis (2006) to lead the conference in steals three years in a row.

A Helping Hand

We all know McDonald can score with the best of them. What you may not know is that she finished in the Pac-12 in assists per game (4.4). She was in a giving mood on Thursday night dishing out a season-high nine assists.

Heating Up

All-Pac-12 selection Sam Thomas missed her first 10 three-pointers of the season, but since then, she is shooting 45% from downtown. Against Washington on Feb. 14, she was red hot, shooting 6-8 from downtown to set a new career high for made threes in a game, which is one short of the Arizona record. The last player to make at least six in a game was Taryn Griffey on Dec. 21, 2015. In her last eight games, Thomas is shooting 53% from three (18-34).

100-100

Sam Thomas is the 11th player in school history to make 100 career triples and is the sixth player in school history with 100 career blocks. The senior is fourth all-time in Arizona history in blocks and sixth in made three-pointers and is the only player in school history with 100 three-pointers and blocks. She is also the only active Pac-12 player with 100 threes and blocks.

Hand in the Cookie Jar

We know all about Thomas' shot blocking ability, but she is equally as good, if not better, at picking the opponent's pocket. The two-time Pac-12 All-Defense selection is second in career steals among all active Pac-12 players (201), trailing only Aari McDonald (258). She finished the regular season fourth in the Pac-12 in steals per game (2.2).

Versatility you Read About

Thomas, who should be considered the most versatile defender in the Pac-12, is fourth all-time in Arizona history with 160 blocked shots in her career. She is first on the active career blocked shot list in the Pac-12 while no other current player in the Pac-12 has 100. This season, she averages 2.1 steals and 1.2 blocks per game, the only player in the Pac-12 to average at least two steals and a block per game.

Sam Joins the 1K Club

On Jan. 10, Thomas hit a three-pointer in the third quarter to become the 21st player in Arizona history to score 1,000 points. She is the second player to score 1,000 points at Arizona under Adia Barnes (Aari McDonald).

A Dominating Performance

Cate Reese was an absolute force in Eugene, scoring a season-high 25 points on 11-14 from the field and a perfect 3-3 from three. Coming into the game, Reese was 3-9 from three and was dared to shoot the long ball, a decision that proved to be quite detrimental.

I'll Have a Double-Double

A two-time All-Pac-12 selection Cate Reese has the sixth-most career double-doubles in Arizona history with 16 in her career. On the season, Reese is second on the team in points (11.5) per game and is second on the team in rebounds per game (5.3). She also leads the team in field goal percentage (48%).

Cate Hits the Mark

On Jan. 22, Reese became the 22nd player in school history to score 1,000 career points with a layup in the third quarter vs. Utah. She joins Sam Thomas, who also scored her 1,000th career point in the month of January.

Trinity Gets in the Mix

Grad transfer and the 2020 ACC Sixth Player of the Year Trinity Baptiste has been a major key to Arizona's success this season and was rewarded for her performance as she was named Honorable Mention All-Pac-12. She is Arizona's third-leading scorer and leading rebounder as she averages 8.5 points and 5.7 rebounds per game while starting all 20 games. She had her best game of the season in the quarterfinals, scoring 17 points to go along with six rebounds and a career-high six steals.

Ware Shows Out

A two-time Gatorade Player of the Year and former five-star prospect, Lauren Ware has been tremendous for Arizona as she was named Honorable Mention Pac-12 All-Freshman. Ware is the team's second leading shot blocker and fourth leading rebounder and is also a member of the Arizona Volleyball team and was the 2018-19 North Dakota Gatorade Player of the Year.

That's Arizona Defense

It's no secret that Arizona is one of the top defensive teams in the Pac-12 and the nation. The numbers are backing them up as well as they finished the season leading the Pac-12 in steals per game (10.4) and forced turnovers (17.9), second in scoring defense (56.6), third in field goal pct. defense (37.5%) and fourth in blocks per game (4.6). In their last 12 games, Arizona is averaging 12.3 steals per game. In those same 12 games, opponents are averaging 52.6 points and 20.1 turnovers per game. In the previous eight games, teams averaged 60.5 points and 15.8 turnovers.

Some of Arizona's Best Defensive Games

- Against Utah, Arizona forced 29 turnovers and had a season-high 19 steals. Sam Thomas led the way with six and three other players had three steals.
- Arizona put the clamps on one of the best offenses in the country on Jan. 14 as No. 10 Oregon managed just 41 points, the fewest they had scored since 2017. Coming into the game, Oregon averaged 83 points per game. 41 points is the fewest point Arizona has ever allowed to a top-10 team in school history, and it is also the fewest points they've allowed to Oregon in school history.
- A few weeks earlier, Arizona allowed Cal to score just 33 points, which is the fewest amount of points Arizona has ever allowed in a Pac-12 game and was three points shy of the Pac-12 record.

Bombs Away

Against Washington on Feb. 14, Arizona was scalding hot from the field and especially from three. The Wildcats shot 55% from the field and a preposterous 75% from deep on 12-16 shooting, setting a new single-game school record for three-point percentage. 75% is the second-best shooting percentage of any team in the nation this year, just behind NAU who shot 78.6% from three on Feb. 11. Individually, Sam Thomas made six of her eight three-point attempts for a new career high, which was one shy of the school record for most made threes in a game. The last player to make six threes in one game was Taryn Griffey back in 2015.

Dominating the Transition Game

Adia Barnes and the Arizona Wildcats make it a point to dominate the transition game on the offensive and defensive side of the ball. In seven instances this season, Arizona has allowed fewer than five fast-break points to their opponent and in eight of their last 10 games, Arizona held the opponent to fewer than 10 fast-break points.

Getting up for the Big Ones

Arizona is no stranger to facing some of the top teams in the country. In fact, the last 10 ranked opponents they have faced have been ranked in the top-11. Baller Barnes

Adia Barnes is back in Wildcat Country, and this time it's as the head coach of the University of Arizona. Barnes is known as one of, if not the best women's basketball player to come through Tucson. As a player, she is the program's leading scorer as she finished with 2,237 career points (18.5 ppg). She is also second all-time in career rebounds (921). During Barnes' freshman year in the 1994-95 season, the Cats finished with a record of 11-19. The next three years were a complete turnaround as the Wildcats won at least 22 games in each season and made a three-straight postseason appearances. Over those three years, Arizona was 68-23, which is still the best three-year stretch in Arizona history.

It's a Family Affair

When Adia Barnes was deciding who she would hire for her three assistant coach spots, she looked no further than her husband Salvo Coppa, who has coached all over the world. Some of his coaching stops include Italy, Thailand, Sicily, Malta, the Seattle Storm and Montana State. Coppa is a certified FIBA coach and is also fluent in English, Spanish, French and Italian. He is the son of legendary international coach Santino Coppa, who founded and coached the club Trogylos Priolo, who has won two Italian league titles and one European Cup. The two have one son, Matteo, who is three years old and is around the program all the time.

Earn the A

When official practice got under way, Adia Barnes and her staff challenged her players to 'earn their A.' Once you earn your A, the coaching staff rewards you with all your gear for the upcoming season but until then, you are not allowed to wear anything with the Block A on it. Players earn their A by a vote that is cast by each person in the program (players and staff). To earn the A, you need to receive 18 of 20 votes. The criteria of earning your A consists of being a good teammate, practicing hard and advancing the Made For It culture in the program.

Worldwide Recruiting

The coaching staff has made it a point of emphasis to recruit overseas. Assistant coach Salvo Coppa coached overseas for quite some time, so he is taking full advantage of the relationships that he has formed since he began his coaching career, as well as Adia Barnes, who played professionally overseas.

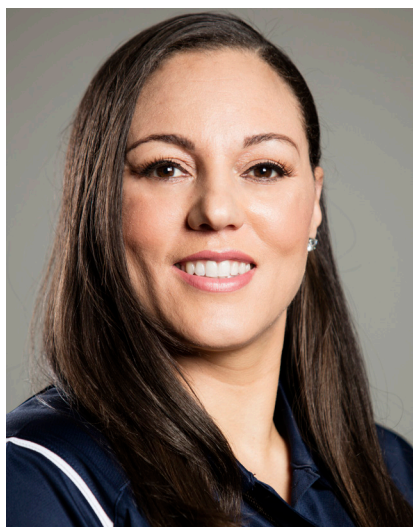

Conner, a Chandler, Ariz. native, is ranked No. 33 in the country by ProspectsNation.com and will make the short drive down the I-10 to Tucson after playing her high school ball at Compass Prep and Perry High School. The four-star prospect averaged 20 points, seven rebounds and over three assists per game during her junior season while shooting 40% from three. She helped lead the Pumas to a 21-8 record and the 2020 6A Arizona State semifinals. Conner was a McDonald's All-American nominee.

Aaronette Vonleh

Vonleh, a West Linn, Ore. native and the sister of NBA player Noah Vonleh, is a top-100 prospect by both ESPN and ProspectsNation and was a McDonald's All-American nominee. The 6-3 post player averaged 17 points, 7.5 rebounds and over one block per game as the Lions won the 6A Three Rivers League with an overall record of 21-6 and 10-1 in league play during the 2019-20 season. She had a career game on Jan. 14 as she scored 38 points to go along with 14 rebounds in a 22-point victory and had eight 20-point games during her junior season.
