THE CITADEL GAME

After the open date, Wofford returns home to face The Citadel ... Last season the Bulldogs won 39-12 in Charleston, ending a 16 game winning streak in the series by the Terriers ... Wofford is 4-2 on the season after a 21-7 road win at Tennessee Tech, a 38-13 loss to #18 Ole Miss, a 59-0 win over Johnson C. Smith, a 31-0 SoCon win over ETSU, a 28-26 road loss at Samford and a 31-19 win over Western Carolina in Cullowhee... The Citadel is 6-0 overall and 4-0 in the league after a 22-14 win over Chattanooga on Saturday in Charleston ... The Terriers are second in the nation in rushing offense and first in rushing defense ... They are second in total defense and 57th in total offense ... The Bulldogs are first in the nation in rushing offense and 22nd in total offense, while 13th in rushing defense and tenth in total defense ... Wofford is 121st in passing offense, with The Citadel 122nd in passing nationally ... Wofford is receiving votes in the STATS FCS poll and the FCS Coaches Poll, while The Citadel is 5th in the STATS FCS poll and 6th in the FCS Coaches Poll.

TERRIER TOP TEN

Here are the top ten notes of interest heading into the The Citadel game:

- The Terriers finished fourth in the nation in 2015 with 300.0 rushing yards per game and have 312.0 per game in 2016
- Mike Ayers has 191 wins at Wofford in his 29th season and 202 career wins in 32 seasons overall as a head coach
- Lorenzo Long enters the game with 2,732 career rushing yards to rank 7th in school history
- The offensive line was third in the country last season with only 0.73 sacks allowed per game. They have allowed three sacks in the 2016 season (0.50) to rank fourth.
- In the second half, Wofford is outscoring the opponent 106 to 31, with 14 of the points scored by Ole Miss.
- The Terriers black shirts are first in the nation in rushing defense, second in scoring defense and second in total defense.
- In the SoCon Preseason Coaches Poll, Wofford was picked sixth. Four players were named Preseason All-SoCon.
- Anton Wahrby and David Marvin both earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors last season
- The Wofford defense has allowed just one 100+ yard rusher in the last 28 games
- On defense, nine players have sacks, 18 have a tackle for loss, four have interceptions and three have fumble recoveries

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT ...

THE CITADEL LAST GAME

With a 22-14 win inside Johnson Hagood Stadium on Saturday afternoon, the 8th-ranked Citadel football team defeated No. 5 Chattanooga and took over sole possession of first place in the Southern Conference.

The score remained 17-14 in favor of the Bulldogs until the last play of the third quarter. A flag was thrown for intentional grounding in the end zone resulting in a safety to give the Bulldogs a 19-14 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

With 10:51 left in the game and The Citadel still leading 19-14, Chattanooga was forced to go for it on 4th-and-7 but the Bulldogs' pressure was too much and the Mocs overthrew the pass. With time winding down in the fourth quarter, Clark sealed the game with a 32-yard field goal to push the score to 22-14 with 24 seconds remaining in the game.

The Citadel finished the game with 342 rushing yards and held Chattanooga to just 55 in the victory, the Mocs' lowest single-game rushing total since 2011. Allen finished the game with a season-high 144 yards rushing and was followed by Cam Jackson and Tyler Renew who both finished with at least 60 yards on the ground.

LAST MEETING

WOFFORD 12, THE CITADEL 39

CHARLESTON, S.C. – Wofford was defeated 39-12 by The Citadel on Saturday afternoon at Johnson Hagood Stadium. The Bulldogs took an early 14-0 lead and used a 16-play drive to open the second half to put the game out of reach for the Terriers. Wofford was led by Ray Smith with 58 rushing yards and a touchdown, while R.J. Taylor had six catches for 97 yards. The Bulldogs were led by Tyler Renew with 85 rushing yards, while Dominique Allen added 72 rushing yards and 125 passing yards. The Citadel defense had eleven tackles for loss in the game.

The Terriers had the ball first and gained one first down before punting. The Bulldogs went three-and-out and punted, with Wofford taking over at the ten-yard line. Wofford lost yardage on their next drive and punted. Working with a short field, Dominique Allen ran the ball in from one-yard out. The Citadel had a 7-0 lead with 6:21 on the clock in the first quarter.

Wofford had a 56-yard kickoff return by Chris Armfield to begin the next drive at the 46-yard line. After a first down, the Terriers had a fourth-and-one but the run was short and the Bulldogs took over. The Citadel went three-and-out and Wofford took over at the 31-yard line with 58 seconds left in the first quarter. On the second play of the drive, the Terriers fumbled and the Bulldogs recovered. Dominique Allen went 24-yards for a touchdown and The Citadel had a 14-0 lead with seven seconds on the clock in the first quarter.

With the ball back, the Terriers fumbled again with a high snap and had to punt back to the Bulldogs. After a three-and-out by The Citadel, Wofford began the next drive at the 17-yard line. The Terriers needed nine plays to go the length of the field and the drive was capped by a three-yard run by Lorenzo Long. The PAT was missed and Wofford trailed 14-6 with 4:28 left in the second quarter. The Citadel had three first downs and added a touchdown on a 17-yard run by Reggie Williams. The lead was 21-6 with 56 seconds left in the first half.

To open the second half, the Bulldogs went on a 16-play drive that covered 80 yards and was capped by a three-yard touchdown run by Tyler Renew. The Citadel had a 28-6 lead with 8:17 on the clock in the third quarter. On Wofford's next drive, Ray Smith scored from eight yards out, but the two point run was stopped short. The Citadel lead was 28-12 with 4:34 left in the third quarter. A 24-yard touchdown pass from Dominique Miller to Brandon Eakins ended the next Bulldog drive and the two point conversion was good for a 36-12 advantage with 2:30 remaining in the third quarter. Wofford went three-and-out and punted. After one first down, a 46-yard field goal attempt was wide left. Wofford took over, but gained only one first down before punting.

A 23-yard Bulldog field goal pushed the score to 39-12 with 5:56 left in the game. After back-to-back punts, with one second left Brandon Goodson was intercepted in the end zone by Dondray Copeland. He returned it for a touchdown, but it was called back by penalty. The Bulldogs took a knee on the final untimed play for a 39-12 final score.

ABOUT WOFFORD

The Terriers return a total of eight starters on offense and nine starters on defense, along with three specialists ... Wofford returns a pair of quarterbacks who started last season - Brad Butler was 14-of-25 passing with 101 rushing yards in three starts and Brandon Goodson was 3-of-8 passing with 24 rushing yards in starts at Clemson, Mercer and The Citadel ... Lorenzo Long led the team in rushing with 969 yards on 178 carries, along with eight touchdowns ... R.J. Taylor was the leading receiver with 186 yards on 14 catches ... John Patterson is the leading returning tackler, while Miles Brown is the top returner after 3.5 sacks last season ... Michael Roach had 6.5 tackles for loss last season to lead the team ... David Marvin was 10-of-13 on field goals and 30-of-34 on PATs to lead the team in scoring with 60 points.

INJURY UPDATE

Players that missed the Western Carolina game to injury included QB Evan Jacks (knee/season), QB Brad Butler (knee/season), LB Daryl Vining and LB Billy Hinton. Status of injuries will be updated later in the week.

MICHAEL ROACH UPDATE

A junior from Kenosha, Wisconsin, Michael Roach started the Tennessee Tech game at outside linebacker. He collapsed in the team bench area during the third quarter of the contest. He was attended to by the athletic training staff, team physicians and EMS. He was transported to Cookeville Regional Medical Center where he was alert and responsive. He stayed at CRMC on Thursday and Friday nights. On Saturday, he was released from Cookeville Regional Medical Center and returned to campus. He was diagnosed with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy and had a procedure to place an implantable cardioverter defibrillator on Friday. He will miss the remainder of the season.

HOMECOMING NOTES

When the Terriers host The Citadel on Saturday afternoon, it will mark the 71st Homecoming game at Wofford ... The Terriers are 46-22-2 all-time in Homecoming games ... Mike Ayers is 21-7 in Homecoming games at Wofford.

THE 2015 SEASON

The Terriers were 5-6 overall in 2015 and 3-4 in the Southern Conference with wins against Mercer, VMI and Furman, along with losses to The Citadel, Western Carolina, Chattanooga, and Samford ... Wofford also suffered a pair of losses to FBS teams in Idaho and Clemson ... The Tigers were 14-1, won the ACC Championship and the Orange Bowl before falling to Alabama in the national championship game ... The 5-6 record marked the second losing season in the past three years for the Terriers ... Earning first team honors from the Southern Conference Coaches was offensive lineman Anton Wahrby. Second team honors went to fullback Lorenzo Long and defensive lineman Miles Brown ... In the media voting, first team honors went to offensive lineman Anton Wahrby, with second team recognition going to fullback Lorenzo Long, defensive lineman Miles Brown, and cornerback Brion Anderson. ... Wofford was fourth in the nation in rushing offense and 66th in total offense, while the defense was 58th in the nation overall.

2015 ALL-SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

Wofford had four student-athletes named to All-Southern Conference teams as announced on November 24 by the league office. Earning first team honors from the Southern Conference Coaches was offensive lineman Anton Wahrby. Second team honors went to fullback Lorenzo Long and defensive lineman Miles Brown. Brown also earned All-Freshman Team honors. In the media voting, first team honors went to offensive lineman Anton Wahrby. Second team recognition went to fullback Lorenzo Long, defensive lineman Miles Brown, and cornerback Brion Anderson. The four players honored are the fewest for Wofford since the 2009 season.

WOFFORD'S LAST GAME

On Saturday night, Wofford defeated Western Carolina 31-19 at E.J. Whitmire Stadium. The

Catamounts made it a five point game in the fourth quarter, but the Terriers answered with a 14-play touchdown drive that used over eight minutes. A forced fumble and recovery by Datavious Wilson enabled the Terriers to run out the clock. Wofford was led by Lorenzo Long with 135 rushing yards and two touchdowns, while Cole Cleary added 70 yards and a touchdown. The Catamounts were led by Terryon Robinson with 99 receiving yards and a pair of touchdowns. Wofford had 360 total yards, with 322 rushing. Western Carolina had 331 total yards, 285 of which were passing. First downs were tied at 19 each. Wofford was 7-of-15 on third downs and 2-of-2 on fourth down. Western Carolina was 6-of-14 on third down and 1-of-1 on fourth down. Western Carolina was called for five penalties, while Wofford was whistled six times. Wofford had a 39:01 to 20:59 time of possession advantage.

WOFFORD VS. WCU GAME NOTES

The Terrier defense has not allowed a 100-yard rusher in a game this season. They allowed only 46 rushing yards by the Catamounts, but gave up 285 passing yards ... Lorenzo Long had 135 rushing yards and two touchdowns. It marked his twelfth career 100 yard game and fourth this season. He now has 2,732 career rushing yards to rank 7th in school history ... The 35-yard run by Cole Cleary in the second quarter was his first career touchdown ... The interception by Dominique Lemon was his second of the season ... David Marvin had a 57-yard field goal in the first quarter, the longest in school history. He has four of the five longest field goals in school history ... Game captains were Roo Daniels, Chuck Rouse, Tyreik Lyles and Miles Brown ... Attendance was 9,457 at E.J. Whitmire Stadium.

SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

The Southern Conference named Wofford senior safety Jaleel Green the Defensive Player of the Week on September 5. The players of the week are selected by the league office. Green helped Wofford preserve a 21-7 victory at Tennessee Tech last Thursday night. With the Terriers holding a 14-point lead, Green intercepted Michael Birdsong at the Wofford 5-yard line with 4:48 left in the game, allowing the Terriers' offense to run out the clock and preserve the win. Green added five tackles, including three solo stops, in the win. A native of Jacksonville, Florida, this is the first player of the week of his career.

SOCON SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

The Southern Conference named Wofford's David Marvin as the Special Teams Player of the Week on October 10. Marvin handled all three phases of the kicking game for the Terriers in their 31-19 win at Western Carolina. Marvin set a new school record with a career-long 57-yard field goal in the first quarter. The kick tied the league record for longest field goal in conference history and was the longest since 2000. The junior from Charlotte, N.C. was 4-of-4 on PATs and punted three times for an average of 57.0 yards per punt. Marvin kicked off six times and recorded four touchbacks against the Catamounts.

PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL

In the 2016 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, the conference's nine head coaches picked Chattanooga as the choice to win the league championship, while Wofford was picked to finish sixth. The Southern Conference Sports Media Association also selected Chattanooga first, with Wofford in sixth place. East Tennessee State joins the league for the 2016 season.

A FEW TURNOVERS

One common denominator over the past three seasons has been turnovers. After being +7 in turnovers during the 2012 SoCon Championship season, the Terriers have been in the negative. In 2013, Wofford was -5 (24 turnovers, 19 take-aways) and in 2014 the team was -1 (12 turnovers and 11 take-aways). Last season, Wofford was -2 in the turnover column with 19 turnovers (15 fumbles lost and 4 interceptions) to 17 take-aways. The only turnover-free games during the season were against Clemson, Gardner-Webb and VMI. So far in 2016, Wofford only has two turnovers (two fumbles) and has five interceptions along with three fumble recoveries to be +1.00 on the season.

REACHING 2,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Lorenzo Long had 969 yards last season to bring his total to 2,055, becoming only the 16th player in school history to reach the 2,000 yard mark. He has added 677 yards this season for a total of 2,732 which is seventh in school history. Here are the top ten career rushers at Wofford:

REACHING 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Will Gay reached the 1,000 mark against Tennessee Tech in 2015 and was at 1,078 yards when an injury cut his season short. He began 2016 with a 116 yard game and now has 1,360 career yards. Evan Jacks also reached the milestone, hitting 1,000 at Western Carolina in 2015. He has 1,366 career yards.

FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the season opener at Tennessee Tech, LB Datavious Wilson, CB George Gbese, CB Devin Watson, DL Chris Boudreaux, and WR Jason Hill made first career starts. At Ole Miss, WR Cole Cleary made his first career start, while LB Tyreik Lyles and DL Mikel Horton started against JCSU. In 2015, Wofford had 13 players make their first starts during the season. In the 2014 season, a total of 21 players overall made first career starts.

VETERAN CAREER STARTS

The most veteran player on the team this year is senior offensive lineman Anton Wahrby with 35 career starts. He is followed by offensive lineman Dequan Miller (27), safety Jaleel Green (27), running back Will Gay (27), fullback Lorenzo Long (25), and center Bradley Way (22).

TRUE FRESHMEN ON THE FIELD

Seven true freshmen played in the 2016 season opener at Tennessee Tech. LB Datavious Wilson started at linebacker. Other true freshmen on the field included RB Ostin McPherson, RB Blake Morgan, LB Jireh Wilson, DL Mikel Horton, CB Dimitri Redwood, and WR Dorian Lindsey. Additional true freshmen playing this season are S Mason Alstatt, QB Joe Newman and DL Robbie Armstrong.

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

David Marvin and Anton Wahrby were named to the 2015 CoSIDA Academic All-District Football Team, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances athletically and in the classroom. Marvin played in all eleven games and led the team in scoring with 60 points. This is the second CoSIDA Academic All-District honor for the biology and chemistry double-major. Wahrby started all eleven games at right tackle and led the team in knockdown blocks. He is majoring in French. It was the 16th straight season at least one Wofford football student-athlete has been named Academic All-District.

2016 RECRUITING CLASS

Wofford welcomed a total of 18 student-athletes in the 2016 recruiting class. The class includes nine players on defense and nine players on offense. The student-athletes are from eight different states, including five from South Carolina, three from Georgia, two from Ohio, two from Kentucky, and one each from Alabama, Florida, Tennessee, and Washington, D.C. On defense, the nine players include five defensive backs, three linebackers, and one lineman. On offense, the nine players include four running backs, three offensive linemen, one wide receiver and one quarterback.

THE RETURNERS

Wofford welcomes back 20 starters. On offense, the eight players include offensive linemen Anton Wahrby, Ross Demmel, Jared Jacon-Duffy, Bradley Way and DeQuan Miller, backs Will Gay and Lorenzo Long, and quarterback Evan Jacks. On defense, the nine returners are defensive linemen Miles Brown, Boston Bryant and Steven Cornellier, safeties Jaleel Green and Nick Ward, cornerback Chris Armfield, plus linebackers Michael Roach, John Patterson and Daryl Vining. In addition, kicker David Marvin, punter Brian Sanders and long snapper Ross Hammond return. An additional 12 players who started at least one game also return.

DEEP THOUGHTS...

Of the 27 scoring drive this season, eleven were for 10 or more plays, while twelve covered 70 yards or more ... The Wofford red zone offense is 22-of-23 overall with 17 touchdowns and five field goals for a 95% success rate which is 9th in the nation ... Wofford is 12-of-16 on fourth downs, while opponents are 1-of-5 so far ... The Terriers are 10th in the nation in fourth down percentage and are 8th in fourth down attempts ... Lorenzo Long leads the team with 44 rushes for a first down or a touchdown, with 16 of those coming on third down ... Will Gay has 40 carries and picked up 15 first downs, with four of those on third down ... Lorenzo Long leads the team with six plays of 20 or more yards ... Fourteen different players have plays of 20 or more yards ... Of the 36 receptions, 19 have been for a touchdown or first down ... The Terriers have an average start of the 31.5 yard line, while opponents have a 26.4 yard line average start ... The Terriers are outscoring opponents in all four quarters; however in the second half Wofford has a 106 to 31 advantage in scoring.

PLAYER INTEREST NOTES

S Devin Watson is cousins with Clemson QB Deshaun Watson, however they were never on the field at the same time in Clemson game last season ... CB George Gbese (Ghana) and OL Anton Wahrby (Sweden) are the lone foreign born players on the roster ... RB Hunter Windham is among the walk-ons who earned a scholarship ... S Michael Sarafianos filled in at kicker as a freshman when David Marvin missed several games due to injury ... LS Ross Hammond's father is serving as South Carolina Secretary of State ... DL Miles Brown went to high school at Sidwell Friends, where he was classmates with President Obama's daughters ... K David Marvin is serving as the Co-President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) this year ... QB Brandon Goodson spent the summer as an intern at the Aspen Institute in Colorado ... Over 80 players spent time this season on campus and in addition to taking classes, took part in a variety of internships and jobs. Jobs included working at a local moving company, Waffle House, and on the campus grounds crew ... Four players recently took exams for post-graduate studies and all four scored above the 90th percentile: QB Brad Butler (MCAT), PK David Marvin (MCAT), RB Nick Colvin (DAT), RB Hunter Windham (LSAT).

WOFFORD 100 YARD RUSHERS

Wofford had a 100+ yard rusher in nine of the eleven games in 2014. Through the eleven games in 2015, Wofford had seven 100-yard rushers. Evan Jacks and Lorenzo Long reached the mark at Mercer. Long added 143 yards against Chattanooga and Jacks had 109 at VMI, plus 120 against Furman. Long and Jacks both hit the mark again against Samford. Wofford began 2016 with a 100-yard game from Will Gay against Tennessee Tech and added 100-yard games from Lorenzo Long against JCSU, ETSU, at Samford and at Western Carolina.

OPPONENT 100 YARD RUSHERS

The Wofford rushing defense ended the 2014 season ranked ninth in the nation in rushing defense, allowing only 1,182 total yards on 392 carries for an average of 107.5 yards per game. A big part of that defense was not allowing an opponent to have a 100+ yard rusher. The Terriers went 17 games without allowing a 100+ rusher (last 2 games in 2013, 11 games in 2014, first four games in 2015) before allowing Tee Mitchell to go for 110 yards at Mercer on October 3. The previous 100+ rusher was Jacob Huesman of Chattanooga on November 9, 2013 with 116 yards on 18 carries. Wofford also held opponents to under 100 total rushing yards three times last year - Gardner-Webb (91), Western Carolina (89) and VMI (46). Wofford started 2016 by holding Tennessee Tech to 41 rushing yards and did not allow a 100-yard rusher at Ole Miss. JCSU gained only 18 total yards and ETSU was at -7 for the game, while Samford ran for only 30 yards and Western Carolina had 46.

TERRIERS ON TURF

Wofford played on artificial turf three times in 2012 with a 1-2 record. In the 2013 season, Wofford played four games on turf and were 1-3. In 2014, the Terriers were 1-4 with losses on turf at Gardner-Webb, Western Carolina, Chattanooga, and Furman, plus a win at Samford. In 2015, Wofford played only two games on artificial turf - a loss at Idaho and a win at Mercer to go 1-1. The Terriers play on artificial turf five times this season at Tennessee Tech, at Samford, at Western Carolina, at Furman and at Chattanooga and are 2-1 so far.

MAKING THE LONG KICKS

David Marvin kicked a 51-yard field goal in his first career game at Georgia Tech in 2014 and set a school record (and tied the SoCon mark) with a 57-yard field goal at Western Carolina on October 8. He has recorded five of the ten longest field goals in school history. Here are the top ten:

A LITTLE MORE PASSING

In 2012, Wofford ran 854 total plays. Of those plays, 766 were rushing and 88 were pass attempts (89.7% rush offense). In the 2013 season, the Terriers ran 784 plays, 647 of which were runs and 137 pass attempts. The rush offense was down to 82.5%, or conversely the passing offense was up seven percent. In 2014, of the 688 total plays, 575 were runs and 113 were passes for a 83.6% rush offense. During the 2015 season, Wofford had 106 passes and 633 rushes for a 85.6% rushing offense. This season the Terriers have 351 rushing attempts and 60 passes for a 85.4% run offense.

LESS PASSING, MORE WINS

Since the start of the 2010 season, the Terriers have been most successful when they throw the ball ten times or less in a game. With ten or fewer attempts, Wofford is 34-16 overall. With eleven or more passes per game, Wofford is 13-14 overall.

COACHING CHANGES

During the 2015 offseason, the Terriers welcomed four new coaches to the staff. Greg Gasparato (Wofford '09) works with the inside linebackers, Dane Romero (Wofford '09) is the running backs coach, B.J. Connolly (Williams '84) works with the tight ends, while Brian Mance (Clemson '05) is the cornerbacks coach. Leading up to the 2016 season, there has only been one change to the staff, as Shiel Wood (Wofford '06) returned as safeties coach.

COACHING STABILITY AT THE TOP

With Mike Ayers entering 29th season on the sidelines at Wofford, some of his assistants have also put in a number of years. Offensive coordinator Wade Lang leads the way at 29 years on staff. Offensive line coach Eric Nash has 14 years of experience at Wofford. Overall, the assistant coaches have 78 years of combined service at Wofford. In addition, six of the ten assistant coaches are Wofford graduates.

WINNING SEASONS

With a 9-4 mark in 2012, Wofford had a winning record for the third straight season and the tenth time in the last eleven years in 2012. The Terriers were 5-6 in 2013, one game under the .500 mark, but rebounded with a 6-5 record in 2014. Wofford was 5-6 in 2015. Over the past twenty-seven seasons under Coach Ayers, Wofford has recorded 19 winning seasons.

TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS

The 2016 season marks the 19th time in the last 18 seasons the Terriers have played against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A). Overall, Wofford is 1-18 in those games. In 2011, Wofford had a lead at Clemson in the third quarter. At South Carolina in 2012, the game was tied at 7-7 at the start of the fourth quarter. Wofford was down five points to Georgia Tech in 2014 with ten minutes to go in the game. In 2016, Wofford lost to Ole Miss, while South Carolina (2017) and Wyoming (2018) are also on future schedules.

HEAD COACH MIKE AYERS • 29TH SEASON

Wofford head coach Mike Ayers (Georgetown, Ky. '74), the winningest coach in school history, is in his 29th season at the Terrier helm with a record of 187-132-1. Ayers has spent 31 years as a collegiate head coach and has a record of 198-153-2 that includes a three-year stint as the head coach at East Tennessee State from 1985-87. Ayers earned Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors from the league coaches in 2000, 2003 and 2007 and by the media in 2000, '02, '03 and '10. Ayers was the 2003 recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award as Division I-AA's National Coach of the Year and also earned the 2002 Division I-AA National Coach of the Year award from the *College Sporting News* in addition to being the runner-up for the Robinson Award. Ayers is the longest tenured coach in the Southern Conference at 29 years, with Russ Huesman at Chattanooga next at seven seasons.

WINNINGEST ACTIVE FCS COACHES

Head coach Mike Ayers has 198 wins (187 Wofford, 11 ETSU) which ranks fourth in the FCS among active coaches entering the 2016 season.

DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense is a true team with contributions from numerous players. Overall, 13 players recorded ten or more tackles. Eighteen players have at least a share of a tackle for loss, while nine have recorded sacks. Four players have interceptions, three have fumble recoveries and three have forced fumbles.

THE QUARTERBACK POSITION

Despite the loss of Evan Jacks in August, who started five games last season, Wofford returned a pair of quarterbacks who have started games. Brad Butler played in only three games in 2014, but five games last season with three starts. He started the first four games before suffering a knee injury. Brandon Goodson had three starts last season, including at Clemson, and played in five games. The third quarterback, David Howerton, did not see action at quarterback but played on special teams. Freshman Joe Newman joins the group this season and is currently the second quarterback.

GOING OVERTIME

The overtime game at Mercer on October 3, 2015 was only the seventh overtime game in school history. The Terriers lost the first two overtime games, then won the next two against Western Carolina and Georgia Southern. In 2012, a 24-17 double overtime loss at Samford was followed by a win over Chattanooga. After the win over Mercer, Wofford is now 4-3 all-time in overtime games.

TERRIERS AT HOME

Wofford has won 60 of its last 77 games played in Gibbs Stadium, including going 5-0 in 2014 ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 81-31 (.737) ... Under Mike Ayers, Wofford is 89-44 (.673) in home games ... The Terriers have won 47 of 71 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium.

THE 2016 TERRIERS GROUND ATTACK

Despite playing two FCS teams in the first three games last season, Wofford finished the season ranked fourth in the nation in rushing at 300.2 yards per game. So far this season, Wofford is at 312.0 rushing yards per game to rank fourth in the nation.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) in eight of the last ten seasons to earn public recognition. In 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015, Wofford had the highest APR in the SoCon. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 146 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003.

Among all NCAA Division I (FBS and FCS) football teams, Wofford's APR score of 986 is 18th in the nation. The Terriers are ahead of schools such as Richmond (985), Stanford (983), Princeton (983), Navy (982), Boston College (981), Harvard (979), Virginia (974), and Wake Forest (968).

Wofford has had at least one player named CoSIDA/Capital One First Team All-District in each of the last 16 seasons. Last season David Marvin and Anton Wahrby were named Academic All-District. In addition, safety James Zotto was named an Academic All-American in 2014.

WOFFORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE

OPPONENTS

Since 2000, Wofford is 22-3 in non-conference regular season FCS games ... Wofford's loss to Coastal Carolina in 2006 snapped a streak of 10 straight regular season non-conference wins against FCS opponents ... The Terriers had not lost a non-conference regular season game to a FCS opponent since dropping the 2000 season opener to Lehigh 34-14 ... The loss to Gardner-Webb in 2013 ended a nine-game streak and Wofford lost again to Gardner-Webb in 2014.

PREVENTING THE SACK

The offensive line is a veteran group this season, with two seniors, a junior and a pair of sophomores in the starting five. Last year they gave up only eight sacks all season which ranked third in the nation (0.73 per game). So far in 2016 they did not allow a sack at Tennessee Tech, Ole Miss or Western Carolina, and had just one each against Johnson C. Smith, ETSU and Samford.

BRENTON BERSIN

Wide receiver Brenton Bersin signed as an undrafted free agent with the Carolina Panthers in April of 2012. He spent the 2013 season on the Panthers practice squad. He re-signed with the Panthers again in 2014 and made the 53-man roster and had his first NFL catch against Detroit on September 14. He caught his first touchdown on October 19 at Green Bay and made his first start on October 26 against Seattle. Bersin's 1-yard touchdown reception at Green Bay was the first touchdown catch by a player from Wofford since Jerry Richardson had a touchdown as a member of the Baltimore Colts at Dallas (10/30/60). In 2015, Brenton Bersin was again in camp with the Carolina Panthers, but was released prior to the start of the regular season. He rejoined the Panthers on the practice squad. Bersin was signed to the active roster on September 26 and had a career-high four catches against Tampa Bay (10/4). He remained on the roster for the remainder of the season as the Panthers won the NFC Championship and played in Super Bowl 50.

KASEY REDFERN

Kicker/punter Kasey Redfern signed as an undrafted rookie free agent by Jacksonville in 2014. He played in four preseason games, but was waived in the final roster cutdown. He was in training camp again with the Jaguars in 2015 and played in three preseason games before being waived. He landed on the San Diego Chargers practice squad for the final game of 2015. He signed with San Diego again in 2016, but was released in camp and he signed as a free agent with the Carolina Panthers on August 16. On August 29, he was traded by the Panthers to the Cleveland Browns but was waived by the Browns on September 3.

MR. RICHARDSON

Jerry Richardson came to Wofford in the mid-1950s as an unheralded pass receiver from Fayetteville, N.C. By the time he left to begin his pro career with the Baltimore Colts, the passing combination of Charlie Bradshaw to Jerry Richardson had received nationwide fame. Richardson was an Associated Press Little All-America selection in 1957 and '58. He still holds Wofford's single-game record with 241 receiving yards vs. Newberry in 1956 and is the record holder for touchdown receptions in a season (9 in 1958) and in a career (21). Drafted by the defending world champion Colts, Richardson played two seasons in the NFL, earning Colt Rookie of the Year honors in 1959 and finishing third in the balloting for top NFL rookie. As a senior at Wofford, he scored 72 points on nine touchdowns, 12 extra points and two field goals. Richardson calls his greatest honor being elected team captain in 1958. In 1983, he was chosen to Wofford's All-Time Football team as a receiver. He is currently the owner of the Carolina Panthers. Last year, Wofford announced the construction of two new facilities on campus donated by Richardson. Due to be completed in Spring 2017, the Rosalind S. Richardson Center for the Arts will become home to academic programs in theatre arts, visual arts and art history. Expected to open in Fall 2017, the Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium will be a 123,000-square-foot facility that will include a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 500-seat volleyball competition venue.



CAROLINA PANTHER TRAINING CAMP

The Carolina Panthers have held summer training camp at Wofford since their inaugural season in 1995 and it will be held on campus until at least 2019. The camp provides Wofford tremendous national exposure and visibility. Media members that visit Wofford during the camp include ESPN, Fox Sports, NFL Network, USA Today and Sports Illustrated. This year's camp drew a record crowd, finishing with a total of nearly 135,400 visitors as camp ended on Tuesday, Aug. 16. That's nearly a 75 percent increase from 2015's record 77,625 visitors.

RECENT SUCCESS

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in eleven of the last twelve years, winning four SoCon Championships. COOKEVILLE, Tenn. — Wofford opened the season with a 21-7 win at Tennessee Tech on Thursday night at Tucker Stadium. The Golden Eagles scored first, but Terriers responded with three rushing touchdowns from quarterback Brad Butler.

Wofford was led by Will Gay with 116 yards on nine carries, while Lorenzo Long added 91 yards and Brad Butler had 85. The defense held Tennessee Tech to 257 total yards and had eight tackles for loss, including five sacks. The Golden Eagles were led by Brock McCain with seven catches for 94 yards.

The Golden Eagles began the game with an onside kick that was recovered by the kicker. After gaining a pair of first downs, the Terriers defense came up with a stop on fourth-and-one. The Wofford offense went three-and-out. TTU began their next drive at the Wofford 40-yard line. The Golden Eagles scored on a four-yard touchdown run by Kip Patton for a 7-0 lead with 6:22 left in the first quarter.

On the next drive by the Terriers, Brad Butler ran for a first down and threw to Nick Colvin for a first down. Will Gay picked up a first down on a 19-yard run, but a 42-yard field goal by David Marvin was wide right with seven seconds left in the first quarter. With the ball back, Wofford had first down runs by Blake Morgan and Lorenzo Long. Nick Colvin picked up a first down and then Brad Butler capped the drive with a 10-yard run. The point after was good and the score was tied at 7-7 with 7:37 left in the second quarter.

After a first down by the Golden Eagles, Lincoln Stewart had a sack for a loss of eleven yards. A TTU punt gave Wofford the ball back. Will Gay picked up a first down, but the Terriers had to punt. The Golden Eagles began a drive with two minutes left in the first half and gained two first downs before punting. Wofford had the ball back with 28 seconds remaining and Will Gay ran for a 34-yard first down. A 62-yard field goal try by David Marvin was wide right to end the first half.

The Golden Eagles had the ball to begin the second half. After four passing first downs, TTU was inside the 20-yard line. A roughing the passer call moved the ball to the eight-yard line. The Terriers defense held and TTU's 24-yard field goal attempt was wide left with 8:56 on the clock in the third quarter.

On the Terriers first drive of the second half, Will Gay gained 18 yards and Brad Butler went for 32 yards to move into TTU territory. On the ensuing drive by the Golden Eagles, back-to-back sacks forced a fourth-and-17 when a long pass was intercepted at the five-yard line by Jaleel Green with 4:48 left in the game. OXFORD, Miss. — On Saturday afternoon, Wofford was defeated 38-13 by #18 Ole Miss at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. The Rebels scored on their first five possessions of the game and held the Terriers to a field goal in the first half. Wofford scored twice in the fourth quarter, a touchdown and field goal, for the final margin. Wofford was led by Brad Butler with 59 rushing yards, including a touchdown, and 4-of-7 passing. For Ole Miss, Chad Kelly was 20-of-27 passing for 219 yards and three touchdowns.

The Rebels had the ball first and kicked a 40-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead just 1:57 into the contest. Wofford went three-and-out and punted on their opening drive. With the ball back, Ole Miss went on a 13-play drive that covered 81 yards and was capped by a five-yard touchdown pass from Chad Kelly to Markell Pack. BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – Wofford could not overcome penalties in a 28-26 loss at Samford on Saturday afternoon at Seibert Stadium. The Terriers committed a season high ten penalties, while the Bulldog offense scored four passing touchdowns.

Wofford moves to 3-2 on the season and 1-1 in the Southern Conference, while Samford is 3-1 and 1-1 in the league. Wofford was led by Lorenzo Long with 117 rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns, while Will Gay had 81 receiving yards on three catches. CULLOWHEE, N.C. – The Wofford College football team defeated Western Carolina 31-19 on Saturday night at E.J. Whitmore Stadium. The Catamounts made it a five point game in the fourth quarter, but the Terriers answered with a 14-play touchdown drive that used over eight minutes. A forced fumble and recovery by Datavious Wilson enabled the Terriers to run out the clock.

Wofford moves to 4-2 on the season and 2-1 in the Southern Conference, while Western Carolina is 1-4 and 0-3 in the league. Wofford was led by Lorenzo Long with 135 rushing yards and two touchdowns. The Catamounts were led by Terryon Robinson with 99 receiving yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The Catamounts had the ball to open the game and an 11-yard touchdown pass from Tyrion Adams to Terryon Robinson ended the drive. The PAT was missed, giving the Catamounts a 6-0 lead at the 12:27 mark of the first quarter. Wofford gained one first down before having to punt. The Catamount went three-and-out. The Terriers gained one first down and then faced a fourth-and-two. A touchdown pass was called back due to an illegal man downfield. David Marvin ended the drive with a school-record 57-yard field goal to cut the lead to 6-3 at 4:52. With the ball back, the Catamounts settled for a 38-yard field goal and a 9-3 lead with 29 seconds left in the first quarter.

The Terriers took over and Cole Cleary went 35-yards down the far sideline for a touchdown. On the next drive by the Catamounts, Dominique Lemon picked off Tyrion Adams and returned it to the 38-yard line. Andre Stoddard scored from three yards out to give Wofford a 17-9 lead at 6:15 in the second quarter. Western Carolina gained one first down before punting back to the Terriers, but then Wofford went three-and-out and punted. On the ensuing drive by the Catamounts, a tackle for loss by Tyler Vaughn and a sack by Terrance Morris forced a three-and-out and punt. Wofford was faced with a fourth-and-one, but a penalty ended the first half.

Wofford began the second half with the ball and had a ten-play drive capped by a Lorenzo Long touchdown from six yards out to give the Terriers a 24-9 lead at 9:11 in the third quarter. The Catamounts went three-and-out and punted on their first drive of the second half, but the Terriers followed with a three-and-out.

The Catamounts had an eight-yard touchdown pass to Terryon Robinson that made it a 24-16 game with 3:39 left in the third quarter. With the ball back Wofford gained a first down before punting. The Catamounts put together a 12-play drive that ended with a 27-yard field goal to cut the Wofford lead to 24-19 with 12:00 on the clock in the fourth quarter.

With the ball back, Lorenzo Long capped the 14-play drive with a three-yard touchdown for a 31-19 lead with 3:36 remaining. A long kickoff return gave the Catamounts the ball at midfield. A fumble was forced and recovered by Datavious Wilson and Wofford took over at the 31-yard line with 1:54 left in the game. Lorenzo Long added pair of first downs as Wofford was able to run out the clock on the win.
