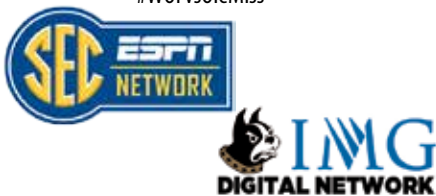

# WOFFORD (1-0, 0-0 SoCon) AT #18 OLE MISS (0-1, 0-0 SEC)

### THE OLE MISS GAME

Wofford remains on the road as the Terriers face Ole Miss on Saturday afternoon ... It will be the first meeting between the two teams ... In the season opener, Wofford earned a 21-7 road win at Tennessee Tech ... #11 Ole Miss jumped out to a 28-6 lead over No. 4 Florida State, but the Seminoles took advantage of four Rebel turnovers and scored 30 unanswered points to down the Rebels 45-34 in the Camping World Kickoff Monday night ... The Rebels were 10-3 overall last year and 6-2 in the SEC West as they made an appearance in the Sugar Bowl ... Wofford is looking for a return to the FCS Playoffs after missing the postseason in 2015 with a 5-6 overall record and a 3-4 mark in the Southern Conference ... Last season among FCS teams, Wofford finished fourth in the nation in rushing ... They were 122nd in passing offense and 66th in total offense ... On defense, Wofford was 40th in rushing defense and 91st in passing yards allowed to rank 58th in total defense ... Ole Miss is #18 in the Associated Press poll and #19 in the Amway Coaches Poll ... Wofford is receiving votes in the both the STATS FCS poll and the FCS Coaches Poll.

### TERRIER TOP TEN

Here are the top ten notes of interest heading into the Ole Miss game:

- The Terriers finished fourth in the nation in 2015 with 300.0 rushing yards per game
- Mike Ayers has 188 wins at Wofford entering his 29th season and 199 career wins in 32 seasons as a head coach
- Lorenzo Long enters the game with 2,146 career rushing yards to rank 15th in school history
- The offensive line was third in the country last season with only 0.73 sacks allowed per game.
- Wofford played two or more quarterbacks in nine of the eleven games last season, with three different QBs earning starts
- The Terriers will be without projected starter Evan Jacks at quarterback after suffering a knee injury
- In the SoCon Preseason Coaches Poll, Wofford was picked sixth. Four players were named Preseason All-SoCon.
- Anton Wahrby and David Marvin both earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors last season
- Wofford is 1-18 in games against FBS opponents, with the lone win in 2000 over Louisiana-Monroe.
- The Terriers play back-to-back road games to open the season for the fourth time in the last seven seasons.

# THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT ...

## OLE MISS LAST GAME

No. 11 Ole Miss jumped out to a lead 28-6 over No. 4 Florida State, but the Seminoles took advantage of four Rebel turnovers and scored 30 unanswered points to down the Rebels 45-34 in the Camping World Kickoff Monday night.

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly was 21-of-39 through the air for 313 yards, including four touchdowns and three interceptions. Classmate Evan Ingram caught a career-high nine passes for 121 yards and one touchdown in the setback. Freshmen D.K. Metcalf and Van Jefferson caught touchdown passes from Kelly, the first of their respective careers. Akeem Judd led Ole Miss (0-1) in rushing, accounting for 44 yards.

The fast-paced Ole Miss offense scored five touchdowns throughout the night with its longest scoring drive lasting 2:19. FSU (1-0) controlled the time of possession, holding the ball for 42:39 compared to just 17:21 for the Rebels.

Florida State was led by redshirt freshman quarterback Deondre Francois, who threw for 419 yards and also ran for 59. Dalvin Cook accounted for 192 yards (101 receiving, 91 rushing), and Jesus Wilson hauled in nine passes for 125 yards. Freshman kicker Ricky Aguayo made a school-record six field goals to account for 18 points.

## CONNECTION

Ole Miss tight end Hunter Thurley spent two years as a defensive lineman at Wofford. He was redshirted his freshman season and in his second year played in all eleven games with 19 total tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss, one sack and an interception. He returned the interception 36 yards in the contest against Presbyterian. At Ole Miss, he played in every game last year with two starts. He also played in the season opener against Florida State.

## ABOUT WOFFORD

The Terriers return a total of eight starters on offense and nine starters on defense, along with three specialists ... Wofford returns a pair of quarterbacks who started last season - Brad Butler was 14-of-25 passing with 101 rushing yards in three starts and Brandon Goodson was 3-of-8 passing with 24 rushing yards in starts at Clemson, Mercer and The Citadel ... Lorenzo Long led the team in rushing with 969 yards on 178 carries, along with eight touchdowns ... R.J. Taylor was the leading receiver with 186 yards on 14 catches ... John Patterson is the leading returning tackler, while Miles Brown is the top returner after 3.5 sacks last season ... Michael Roach had 6.5 tackles for loss last season to lead the team ... David Marvin was 10-of-13 on field goals and 30-of-34 on PATs to lead the team in scoring with 60 points.

## INJURY UPDATE

Players that missed the Tennessee Tech game to injury included QB Evan Jacks and FB Andre Stoddard. There were no significant injuries in the contest.

## MICHAEL ROACH UPDATE

A junior from Kenosha, Wisconsin, Michael Roach started the Tennessee Tech game at outside linebacker. He collapsed in the team bench area during the third quarter of the contest. He was attended to by the athletic training staff, team physicians and EMS. He was transported to Cookeville Regional Medical Center where he was alert and responsive. He stayed at CRMC on Thursday and Friday nights. On Saturday, he was released from Cookeville Regional Medical Center and returned to campus. He has been diagnosed with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy and had a procedure to place an implantable cardioverter defibrillator on Friday. He will miss the remainder of the season.

## SEASON OPENERS

After the win at Tennessee Tech, Wofford is 49-58-1 all-time in season openers since posting a 5-1 win over Furman on December 14, 1889 ... Under head coach Mike Ayers, the Terriers are 15-14 in season openers ... The loss at South Florida in 2009 ended a streak of winning five straight season openers (38-21 over Presbyterian in 2008, 38-21 over Georgetown in 2007, 28-21 over South Carolina State in 2006, 34-24 over Georgetown in 2005, 24-22 over South Carolina State in 2004) ... When Wofford opens the season at home, its record is 24-20-1.

## THE 2015 SEASON

The Terriers were 5-6 overall in 2015 and 3-4 in the Southern Conference with wins against Mercer, VMI and Furman, along with losses to The Citadel, Western Carolina, Chattanooga, and Samford ... Wofford also suffered a pair of losses to FBS teams in Idaho and Clemson ... The Tigers were 14-1, won the ACC Championship and the Orange Bowl before falling to Alabama in the national championship game ... The 5-6 record marked the second losing season in the past three years for the Terriers ... Earning first team honors from the Southern Conference Coaches was offensive lineman Anton Wahrby. Second team honors went to fullback Lorenzo Long and defensive lineman Miles Brown ... In the media voting, first team honors went to offensive lineman Anton Wahrby, with second team recognition going to fullback Lorenzo Long, defensive lineman Miles Brown, and cornerback Brion Anderson. ... Wofford was fourth in the nation in rushing offense and 66th in total offense, while the defense was 58th in the nation overall.

## 2015 ALL-SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

Wofford had four student-athletes named to All-Southern Conference teams as announced on November 24 by the league office. Earning first team honors from the Southern Conference Coaches was offensive lineman Anton Wahrby. Second team honors went to fullback Lorenzo Long and defensive lineman Miles Brown. Brown also earned All-Freshman Team honors. In the media voting, first team honors went to offensive lineman Anton Wahrby. Second team recognition went to fullback Lorenzo Long, defensive lineman Miles Brown, and cornerback Brion Anderson. The four players honored are the fewest for Wofford since the 2009 season.

## WOFFORD'S LAST GAME

Wofford opened the season with a 21-7 win at Tennessee Tech on Thursday night at Tucker Stadium. The Golden Eagles scored first, but Terriers responded with three rushing touchdowns from quarterback Brad Butler. Wofford was led by Will Gay with 116 yards on nine carries, while Lorenzo Long added 91 yards and Brad Butler had 85. The defense held Tennessee Tech to 257 total yards and had eight tackles for loss, including five sacks. The Golden Eagles were led by Brock McCoin with seven catches for 94 yards. Wofford had 388 total yards, with 346 rushing. TTU had 257 total yards, 216 of which were passing. Wofford had a 22 to 16 advantage in first downs. Wofford was 8-of-12 on third downs and 1-of-1 on fourth down. TTU was 6-of-13 on third down. Wofford was called for seven penalties to TTU's two. Wofford had a 32:30 to 27:30 time of possession advantage.

## WOFFORD AT TENNESSEE TECH GAME NOTES

Players with first career starts included Datavious Wilson, George Gbese, Devin Watson, Chris Boudreaux, and Jason Hill ... Blake Morgan's first career carry went for a first down in the second quarter ... Jason Hill had his first career catch in the second quarter ... Will Gay returned to action after missing most of last season due to injury with a 116 yard rushing performance. It was his first career 100-yard rushing game ... Wofford did not commit a turnover ... Both teams missed a pair of field goal attempts ... The defense had five sack - last season the most in a single game was four at Idaho ... Game captains were Will Gay, Jaleel Green, John Patterson and Anton Wahrby ... Attendance was 9,066 at Tucker Stadium.

## SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

The Southern Conference named Wofford senior safety Jaleel Green the Defensive Player of the Week on September 5. The players of the week are selected by the league office. Green helped Wofford preserve a 21-7 victory at Tennessee Tech last Thursday night. With the Terriers holding a 14-point lead, Green intercepted Michael Birdsong at the Wofford 5-yard line with 4:48 left in the game, allowing the Terriers' offense to run out the clock and preserve the win. Green added five tackles, including three solo stops, in the win. A native of Jacksonville, Florida, this is the first player of the week of his career.

## PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL

In the 2016 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, the conference's nine head coaches picked Chattanooga as the choice to win the league championship, while Wofford was picked to finish sixth. The Southern Conference Sports Media Association also selected Chattanooga first, with Wofford in sixth place. East Tennessee State joins the league for the 2016 season.

## PRESEASON ALL-SOCON

The Terriers had four players recognized by the league's coaches on the 2016 Preseason All-SoCon team, with two on the first team and two on the second team. Leading the Terriers on the first team were offensive lineman Anton Wahrby and defensive lineman Miles Brown. Wahrby, a senior from Karlskrona, Sweden, started all eleven games in 2015 at right tackle. Brown, a sophomore from Washington, D.C., started all eleven games as a true freshman last season. Second team honorees include running back Lorenzo Long and offensive lineman Dequan Miller.

## INJURY BUG STRIKES

The injury bug hit the team hard last season, with ten players suffering season-ending injuries. In addition, at least twelve other players missed games due to injury. Among those missing time due to injury were four Preseason All-SoCon honorees: OL T.J. Chamberlin (9 games), LB Terrance Morris (season), DL E.J. Speller (ten games), and RB/RS Will Gay (8 games).

## A FEW TURNOVERS

One common denominator over the past three seasons has been turnovers. After being +7 in turnovers during the 2012 SoCon Championship season, the Terriers have been in the negative. In 2013, Wofford was -5 (24 turnovers, 19 take-aways) and in 2014 the team was -1 (12 turnovers and 11 take-aways). This season, Wofford was -2 in the turnover column with 19 turnovers (15 fumbles lost and 4 interceptions) to 17 take-aways. The only turnover-free games during the season were against Clemson, Gardner-Webb and VMI.

## REACHING 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Wofford had four players that reached the 1,000 career rushing mark last season. Lorenzo Long added 969 yards last season to bring his total to 2,055 and he now has 2,246. He is only the 16th player in school history to reach the 2,000 yard mark. Ray Smith reached 1,000 yards against Tennessee Tech and finished his career at 1,358 rushing yards. Will Gay had also reached the 1,000 mark against Tennessee Tech and was at 1,078 yards when an injury cut his season short. He began 2016 with a 116 yard game for 1,194 career yards. Evan Jacks was the latest to reach the milestone, hitting 1,000 at Western Carolina. He has 1,366 career yards.

## FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the season opener at Tennessee Tech, LB Datavious Wilson, CB George Gbese, CB Devin Watson, DL Chris Boudreaux, and WR Jason Hill made first career starts. In 2015, Wofford had 13 players make their first starts during the season. In the 2014 season, a total of 21 players overall made first career starts.

## VETERAN CAREER STARTS

The most veteran player on the team this year is senior offensive lineman Anton Wahrby with 30 career starts. He is followed by offensive lineman Dequan Miller (23), safety Jaleel Green (22), running back Will Gay (22), center Bradley Way (22), and fullback Lorenzo Long (20).

## TRUE FRESHMEN ON THE FIELD

Seven true freshmen played in the 2016 season opener at Tennessee Tech. LB Datavious Wilson started at linebacker. Other true freshmen on the field included RB Ostin McPherson, RB Blake Morgan, LB Jireh Wilson, DL Mikel Horton, CB Dimitri Redwood, and WR Dorian Lindsey. Fifteen true freshman played during the 2015 season.

## COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

David Marvin and Anton Wahrby were named to the 2015 CoSIDA Academic All-District Football Team, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances athletically and in the classroom. Marvin played in all eleven games and led the team in scoring with 60 points. This is the second CoSIDA Academic All-District honor for the biology and chemistry double-major. Wahrby started all eleven games at right tackle and led the team in knockdown blocks. He is majoring in French. It was the 16th straight season at least one Wofford football student-athlete has been named Academic All-District.

## 2016 RECRUITING CLASS

Wofford welcomed a total of 18 student-athletes in the 2016 recruiting class. The class includes nine players on defense and nine players on offense. The student-athletes are from eight different states, including five from South Carolina, three from Georgia, two from Ohio, two from Kentucky, and one

each from Alabama, Florida, Tennessee, and Washington, D.C. On defense, the nine players include five defensive backs, three linebackers, and one lineman. On offense, the nine players include four running backs, three offensive linemen, one wide receiver and one quarterback.

## THE RETURNERS

Wofford welcomes back 20 starters. On offense, the eight players include offensive linemen Anton Wahrby, Ross Demmel, Jared Jacon-Duffy, Bradley Way and DeQuan Miller, backs Will Gay and Lorenzo Long, and quarterback Evan Jacks. On defense, the nine returners are defensive linemen Miles Brown, Boston Bryant and Steven Cornellier, safeties Jaleel Green and Nick Ward, cornerback Chris Armfield, plus linebackers Michael Roach, John Patterson and Daryl Vining. In addition, kicker David Marvin, punter Brian Sanders and long snapper Ross Hammond return. An additional 12 players who started at least one game also return.

## DEEP THOUGHTS...

Wofford's Brian Sanders punted 10 times at Clemson, the most in the school's Division I era, but did not punt at all in the next game against Tennessee Tech ... The season's opening opponent, Clemson, finished 14-1 and lost to Alabama in the national championship game ... Of the 47 scoring drives last season, 16 were for ten or more plays, while 24 went for more than 70 yards ... The Wofford red zone offense was 33-of-36 with 29 touchdowns and four field goals (91.7%) ... The Terriers were 17-of-29 on fourth down attempts, while opponents were 18-of-25 this season ... Lorenzo Long led the team with 56 rushes for a first down or touchdown, with 14 of those coming on third down ... Of the 54 receptions last season, 32 resulted in a first down or touchdown ... Ray Smith had 68 carries this season for 360 yards and 15 first downs ... Nick Colvin led the team with 13 plays of 20 or more yards ... Mercer was first in the FCS in rushing defense with only 52.0 yards allowed per game, but Wofford ran for 391 yards against the Bears ... Wofford did not have a sack in back-to-back games (The Citadel, Western Carolina) since the first two games in the 2014 season (Georgia Tech, Gardner-Webb) ... The Terriers had 131 drives last season with an average start of the 29.1 yard line, while opponents had 129 drives and a 35.9 yard line average start ... The Terriers fell behind early last season, outscored 71 to 51 in the first quarter and 168 to 127 overall in the first half.

## PLAYER INTEREST NOTES

S Devin Watson is cousins with Clemson QB Deshaun Watson, however they were never on the field at the same time in Clemson game last season ... RB Hunter Windham is among the walk-ons who earned a scholarship ... S Michael Sarafianos filled in at kicker as a freshman when David Marvin missed several games due to injury ... LS Ross Hammond's father is serving as South Carolina Secretary of State ... DL Miles Brown went to high school at Sidwell Friends, where he was classmates with President Obama's daughters ... K David Marvin is serving as the Co-President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) this year ... QB Brandon Goodson spent the summer as an intern at the Aspen Institute in Colorado ... Over 80 players spent time this season on campus and in addition to taking classes, took part in a variety of internships and jobs. Jobs included working at a local moving company, Waffle House, and on the campus grounds crew ... Four players recently took exams for post-graduate studies and all four scored above the 90th percentile: QB Brad Butler (MCAT), PK David Marvin (MCAT), RB Nick Colvin (DAT), RB Hunter Windham (LSAT).

## WOFFORD 100 YARD RUSHERS

Wofford had a 100+ yard rusher in nine of the eleven games in 2014. Through the eleven games in 2015, Wofford had seven 100-yard rushers. Evan Jacks and Lorenzo Long reached the mark at Mercer. Long added 143 yards against Chattanooga and Jacks had 109 at VMI, plus 120 against Furman. Long and Jacks both hit the mark again against Samford. Wofford began 2016 with a 100-yard game from Will Gay.

## OPPONENT 100 YARD RUSHERS

The Wofford rushing defense ended the 2014 season ranked ninth in the nation in rushing defense, allowing only 1,182 total yards on 392 carries for an average of 107.5 yards per game. A big part of that defense was not allowing an opponent to have a 100+ yard rusher. The Terriers went 17 games without allowing a 100+ rusher (last 2 games in 2013, 11 games in 2014, first four games in 2015) before allowing Tee Mitchell to go for 110 yards at Mercer on October 3. The previous 100+ rusher was Jacob Huesman of Chattanooga on November 9, 2013 with 116 yards on 18 carries. Wofford also held opponents to under 100 total rushing yards three times last year - Gardner-Webb (91), Western Carolina (89) and VMI (46). Wofford started 2016 by holding Tennessee Tech to 41 rushing yards.

## TERRIERS ON TURF

Wofford played on artificial turf three times in 2012 with a 1-2 record. In the 2013 season, Wofford played four games on turf and were 1-3. In 2014, the Terriers were 1-4 with losses on turf at Gardner-Webb, Western Carolina, Chattanooga, and Furman, plus a win at Samford. In 2015,

Wofford played only two games on artificial turf - a loss at Idaho and a win at Mercer to go 1-1. The Terriers play on artificial turf five times this season at Tennessee Tech, at Samford, at Western Carolina, at Furman and at Chattanooga.

### MAKING THE KICKS

Sophomore David Marvin kicked a 51-yard field goal in his first career game at Georgia Tech in 2014. On the year, he was 5-of-6 on field goals and had 30 kickoffs with two touch backs. In 2015, he was 10-of-13 on field goals, including a 50-yarder against Gardner-Webb. Five of his field goals (45, 45, 50, 47, 42) were from over 40 yards. He also had 52 kickoffs, with 17 touch backs, a 56.6 average, and two successful on-sides kicks.

### WOFFORD IN THE 2015 NATIONAL RANKINGS

In the 2015 final statistics, several Terriers were listed in the national rankings. David Marvin was 20th in field goal percentage, 43rd in field goals per game and 118th in scoring. Nick Colvin was 127th in combined kick returns. Lorenzo Long was 37th in rushing yards per game, 46th in yards per carry, and 62nd in rushing touchdowns. Drake Michaelson was 82nd in total tackles and 30th in solo tackles. Brion Anderson was 65th in interceptions per game. Tyler Vaughn was 26th in fumbles recovered. The team was fourth in rushing offense, 66th in total offense, third in red-zone offense, sixth in fewest penalties per game, 11th in yards per completion, third in sacks allowed, and 8th in time of possession.

### TERRIERS IN THE 2015 CONFERENCE RANKINGS

Wofford was ranked in several key categories in the conference statistics as well this season. The Terriers were second in rushing offense, first in rushing defense, third in fewest penalties, sixth in fumbles recovered, second in yards per completion, second in red zone offense, first in time of possession, and first in punt return defense. In the top conference rushers, Wofford had Lorenzo Long at 4th and Evan Jacks at 9th. Lorenzo Long was sixth in rushing touchdowns with eight, while Brian Sanders was sixth in punting. David Marvin was seventh in field goals per game and 11th in scoring, Drake Michaelson was eighth in total tackles and second in solo tackles, while Evan Jacks was eighth in total offense.

### A LITTLE MORE PASSING

In 2012, Wofford ran 854 total plays. Of those plays, 766 were rushing and 88 were pass attempts (89.7% rush offense). In the 2013 season, the Terriers ran 784 plays, 647 of which were runs and 137 pass attempts. The rush offense was down to 82.5%, or conversely the passing offense was up seven percent. In 2014, of the 688 total plays, 575 were runs and 113 were passes for a 83.6% rush offense. During the 2015 season, Wofford had 106 passes and 633 rushes for a 85.6% rushing offense.

### LESS PASSING, MORE WINS

Since the start of the 2010 season, the Terriers have been most successful when they throw the ball ten times or less in a game. With ten or fewer attempts, Wofford is 32-15 overall. With eleven or more passes per game, Wofford is 12-13 overall.

### COACHING CHANGES

During the 2015 offseason, the Terriers welcomed four new coaches to the staff. Greg Gasparato (Wofford '09) works with the inside linebackers, Dane Romero (Wofford '09) is the running backs coach, B.J. Connolly (Williams '84) works with the tight ends, while Brian Mance (Clemson '05) is the cornerbacks coach. Leading up to the 2016 season, there has only been one change to the staff, as Shiel Wood (Wofford '06) returned as safeties coach.

### COACHING STABILITY AT THE TOP

With Mike Ayers entering 29th season on the sidelines at Wofford, some of his assistants have also put in a number of years. Offensive coordinator Wade Lang leads the way at 29 years on staff. Offensive line coach Eric Nash has 14 years of experience at Wofford. Overall, the assistant coaches have 78 years of combined service at Wofford. In addition, six of the ten assistant coaches are Wofford graduates.

### WINNING SEASONS

With a 9-4 mark in 2012, Wofford had a winning record for the third straight season and the tenth time in the last eleven years in 2012. The Terriers were 5-6 in 2013, one game under the .500 mark, but rebounded with a 6-5 record in 2014. Wofford was 5-6 in 2015. Over the past twenty-seven seasons under Coach Ayers, Wofford has recorded 19 winning seasons.

### TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS

The 2016 season marks the 19th time in the last 18 seasons the Terriers have played against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A). Overall, Wofford is 1-18 in those games. In 2011, Wofford had a lead at Clemson in the third quarter. At South Carolina in 2012, the game was tied at 7-7 at the start of the fourth quarter. Wofford was down five points to Georgia Tech in 2014 with ten minutes to go in the game. In 2016, Wofford will face Ole Miss, while South Carolina (2017) and Wyoming (2018) are also on future schedules.

## HEAD COACH MIKE AYERS • 29TH SEASON

Wofford head coach Mike Ayers (Georgetown, Ky. '74), the winningest coach in school history, is in his 29th season at the Terrier helm with a record of 187-132-1. Ayers has spent 31 years as a collegiate head coach and has a record of 198-153-2 that includes a three-year stint as the head coach at East Tennessee State from 1985-87. Ayers earned Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors from the league coaches in 2000, 2003 and 2007 and by the media in 2000, '02, '03 and '10. Ayers was the 2003 recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award as Division I-AA's National Coach of the Year and also earned the 2002 Division I-AA National Coach of the Year award from the *College Sporting News* in addition to being the runner-up for the Robinson Award. Ayers is the longest tenured coach in the Southern Conference at 29 years, with Russ Huesman at Chattanooga next at seven seasons.

### WINNINGEST ACTIVE FCS COACHES

Head coach Mike Ayers has 198 wins (187 Wofford, 11 ETSU) which ranks fourth in the FCS among active coaches entering the 2016 season.

### DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense receives contributions from numerous players in 2015. Overall, 19 players recorded ten or more tackles. Eighteen players had at least a share of a tackle for loss, while ten recorded sacks. Six players have interceptions, seven had fumble recoveries and six forced fumbles.

### THE QUARTERBACK POSITION

Despite the loss of Evan Jacks, who started five games last season, Wofford returns a pair of quarterbacks who have started games. Brad Butler played in only three games in 2014, but five games last season with three starts. Brandon Goodson had three starts last season, including at Clemson, and played in five games. The third quarterback, David Howerton, did not see action at quarterback but played on special teams. Freshman Joe Newman joins the group this season. Wofford played three quarterbacks against Clemson, Tennessee Tech, and The Citadel, while Evan Jacks went the complete game against Western Carolina and VMI.

### GOING OVERTIME

The overtime game at Mercer on October 3, 2015 was only the seventh overtime game in school history. The Terriers lost the first two overtime games, then won the next two against Western Carolina and Georgia Southern. In 2012, a 24-17 double overtime loss at Samford was followed by a win over Chattanooga. After the win over Mercer, Wofford is now 4-3 all-time in overtime games.

### TERRIERS AT HOME

Wofford has won 58 of its last 75 games played in Gibbs Stadium, including going 5-0 in 2014 ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 79-31 (.733) ... Under Mike Ayers, Wofford is 87-44 (.669) in home games ... The Terriers have won 46 of 70 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium.

### THE 2015 TERRIERS GROUND ATTACK

Despite playing two FCS teams in the first three games last season, Wofford finished the season ranked fourth in the nation in rushing at 300.2 yards per game.

### ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) in eight of the last ten seasons to earn public recognition. In 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015, Wofford had the highest APR in the SoCon. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 146 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003.

Among all NCAA Division I (FBS and FCS) football teams, Wofford's APR score of 986 is 18th in the nation. The Terriers are ahead of schools such as Richmond (985), Stanford (983), Princeton (983), Navy (982), Boston College (981), Harvard (979), Virginia (974), and Wake Forest (968).

Wofford has had at least one player named CoSIDA/Capital One First Team All-District in each of the last 16 seasons. Last season David Marvin and Anton Wahrby were named Academic All-District. In addition, safety James Zotto was named an Academic All-American in 2014.

The Terriers had not lost a non-conference regular season game to a FCS opponent since dropping the 2000 season opener to Lehigh 34-14 ... The loss to Gardner-Webb in 2013 ended a nine-game streak and Wofford lost again to Gardner-Webb in 2014.

### AVOIDING THE YELLOW FLAG

Wofford was penalized 48 times last season (sixth fewest in the nation) and were ranked fourth in the nation in fewest penalties per game. Four of the ten teams with the lowest number of penalties were members of the SoCon (Mercer, Wofford, VMI, Samford).

### BRENTON BERSIN

Wide receiver Brenton Bersin signed as an undrafted free agent with the Carolina Panthers in April of 2012. He spent the 2013 season on the Panthers practice squad. He re-signed with the Panthers again in 2014 and made the 53-man roster and had his first NFL catch against Detroit on September 14. He caught his first touchdown on October 19 at Green Bay and made his first start on October 26 against Seattle. Bersin's 1-yard touchdown reception at Green Bay was the first touchdown catch by a player from Wofford since Jerry Richardson had a touchdown as a member of the Baltimore Colts at Dallas (10/30/60). In 2015, Brenton Bersin was again in camp with the Carolina Panthers, but was released prior to the start of the regular season. He rejoined the Panthers on the practice squad. Bersin was signed to the active roster on September 26 and had a career-high four catches against Tampa Bay (10/4). He remained on the roster for the remainder of the season as the Panthers won the NFC Championship and played in Super Bowl 50.

### KASEY REDFERN

Kicker/punter Kasey Redfern signed as an undrafted rookie free agent by Jacksonville in 2014. He played in four preseason games, but was waived in the final roster cutdown. He was in training camp again with the Jaguars in 2015 and played in three preseason games before being waived. He landed on the San Diego Chargers practice squad for the final game of 2015. He signed with San Diego again in 2016, but was released in camp and he signed as a free agent with the Carolina Panthers on August 16. On August 29, he was traded by the Panthers to the Cleveland Browns but was waived by the Browns on September 3.

### MR. RICHARDSON

Jerry Richardson came to Wofford in the mid-1950s as an unheralded pass receiver from Fayetteville, N.C. By the time he left to begin his pro career with the Baltimore Colts, the passing combination of Charlie Bradshaw to Jerry Richardson had received nationwide fame. Richardson was an Associated Press Little All-America selection in 1957 and '58. He still holds Wofford's single-game record with 241



receiving yards vs. Newberry in 1956 and is the record holder for touchdown receptions in a season (9 in 1958) and in a career (21). Drafted by the defending world champion Colts, Richardson played two seasons in the NFL, earning Colt Rookie of the Year honors in 1959 and finishing third in the balloting for top NFL rookie. As a senior at Wofford, he scored 72 points on nine touchdowns, 12 extra points and two field goals. Richardson calls his greatest honor being elected team captain in 1958. In 1983, he was chosen to Wofford's All-Time Football team as a receiver. He is currently the owner of the Carolina Panthers. Last year, Wofford announced the construction of two new facilities on campus donated by Richardson. Due to be completed in Spring 2017, the Rosalind S. Richardson Center for the Arts will become home to academic programs in theatre arts, visual arts and art history. Expected to open in Fall 2017, the Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium will be a 123,000-square-foot facility that will include a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 500-seat volleyball competition venue.

**CAROLINA PANTHER TRAINING CAMP**

The Carolina Panthers have held summer training camp at Wofford since their inaugural season in 1995 and it will be held on campus until at least 2019. The camp provides Wofford tremendous national exposure and visibility. Media members that visit Wofford during the camp include ESPN, Fox Sports, NFL Network, USA Today and Sports Illustrated. This year's camp drew a record crowd, finishing with a total of nearly 135,400 visitors as camp ended on Tuesday, Aug. 16. That's nearly a 75 percent increase from 2015's record 77,625 visitors.

**RECENT SUCCESS**

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in eleven of the last twelve years, winning four SoCon Championships. In the last twelve years, the Terriers have won 56 of 90 SoCon games played. Over that time, Wofford is the winningest program in the Southern Conference with a .622 win percentage.

**THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 2015**

COOKEVILLE, Tenn. — Wofford opened the season with a 21-7 win at Tennessee Tech on Thursday night at Tucker Stadium. The Golden Eagles scored first, but Terriers responded with three rushing touchdowns from quarterback Brad Butler.

Wofford was led by Will Gay with 116 yards on nine carries, while Lorenzo Long added 91 yards and Brad Butler had 85. The defense held Tennessee Tech to 257 total yards and had eight tackles for loss, including five sacks. The Golden Eagles were led by Brock McCain with seven catches for 94 yards.

The Golden Eagles began the game with an onside kick that was recovered by the kicker. After gaining a pair of first downs, the Terriers defense came up with a stop on fourth-and-one. The Wofford offense went three-and-out. TTU began their next drive at the Wofford 40-yard line. The Golden Eagles scored on a four-yard touchdown run by Kip Patton for a 7-0 lead with 6:22 left in the first quarter.

On the next drive by the Terriers, Brad Butler ran for a first down and threw to Nick Colvin for a first down. Will Gay picked up a first down on a 19-yard run, but a 42-yard field goal by David Marvin was wide right with seven seconds left in the first quarter. With the ball back, Wofford had first down runs by Blake Morgan and Lorenzo Long. Nick Colvin picked up a first down and then Brad Butler capped the drive with a 10-yard run. The point after was good and the score was tied at 7-7 with 7:37 left in the second quarter.

After a first down by the Golden Eagles, Lincoln Stewart had a sack for a loss of eleven yards. A TTU punt gave Wofford the ball back. Will Gay picked up a first down, but the Terriers had to punt. The Golden Eagles began a drive with two minutes left in the first half and gained two first downs before punting. Wofford had the ball back with 28 seconds remaining and Will Gay ran for a 34-yard first down. A 62-yard field goal try by David Marvin was wide right to end the first half.

The Golden Eagles had the ball to begin the second half. After four passing first downs, TTU was inside the 20-yard line. A roughing the passer call moved the ball to the eight-yard line. The Terriers defense held and TTU's 24-yard field goal attempt was wide left with 8:56 on the clock in the third quarter.

On the Terriers first drive of the second half, Will Gay gained 18 yards and Brad Butler went for 32 yards to move into TTU territory. Nick Colvin had a first down reception and then Brad Butler took it in from 7-yards out for a touchdown. Wofford had a 14-7 lead at 4:05 in the third quarter. The Golden Eagles then had two first downs, but a 46-yard field goal went wide left at 14:18 in the fourth quarter. The Terriers then had a 13 play drive that covered 71 yards and ended with Brad Butler running for a 21-yard touchdown. Wofford had a 21-7 lead with 7:06 left in the game. On the ensuing drive by the Golden Eagles, back-to-back sacks forced a fourth-and-17 when a long pass was intercepted at the five-yard line by Jaleel Green with 4:48 left in the game. Lorenzo Long and Will Gay added first downs as the Terriers were able to run out the clock.
