

2017 BIG EAST WOMEN'S LACROSSE RECORD BOOK



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The BIG EAST Conference

The BIG EAST Conference moves forward in 2016-17, the fourth year of its current consortium of 10 outstanding and revered academic institutions. Founded by Dave Gavitt in 1979, the BIG EAST reorganized in 2013 and entered a new era by returning to its basketball-centric heritage. The league's 10 member schools—Butler University, Creighton University, DePaul University, Georgetown University, Marquette University, Providence College, St. John's University, Seton Hall University, Villanova University, and Xavier University—embrace a constant commitment to academic integrity, athletic excellence and community service.

Val Ackerman, who previously served as founding President of the WNBA, President of USA Basketball and U.S. representative to the International Basketball Federation (FIBA), was named fifth Commissioner of the BIG EAST in conjunction with the conference's 2013 reconfiguration. Under her leadership, the BIG EAST has maintained its reputation for top-level achievement in athletics and has continued to be influential on the national intercollegiate landscape, with many conference and school administrators currently serving on key NCAA committees.

Since its inception in 1979, the BIG EAST has been lauded as a leader in innovative concepts in promotion, particularly television, and that reputation continues with the conference's relationship with FOX Sports. The BIG EAST has a fruitful multi-year partnership with FOX Sports and its national cable network FS1. FOX's comprehensive coverage of BIG EAST men's basketball includes the broadcast of all regular season games on FOX, FS1, FS2 or FOX Regional Networks, as well as the BIG EAST Tournament at Madison Square Garden, college basketball's longest-running postseason basketball conference tourney held at the same venue. The BIG EAST and FOX also have established an annual five-game marathon in men's basketball with all 10 teams competing on the same day in league competition.

BIG EAST institutions are located in seven of the nation's top 35 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Indianapolis, Milwaukee and Cincinnati.

FOX Sports platforms carry complete coverage of women's basketball regular season play and the BIG EAST Women's Basketball Tournament. Every Olympic sport championship is also carried on the network or digital platforms. The BIG EAST has also increased the visibility of its member school programs with the expansion of the BIG EAST Digital Network (BEDN). When the conference launched BEDN in 2014-15, the league became the first collegiate conference to be hosted on the FOX Sports mobile platform, FOX Sports Go, the app that provides live streaming of FOX Sports content. BEDN will carry 225 live events in 2016-17, with an emphasis on women's basketball, soccer and Olympic sport regular season and championship events.

The BIG EAST Conference became a reality in May of 1979 through the vision of Gavitt, the former Providence College men's basketball coach and athletic director. Providence, St. John's, Georgetown, Syracuse, Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College formed the original seven-school alliance, and within the span of just a few years the conference had become a national powerhouse in men's basketball. While the composition of the BIG EAST evolved over the next three decades, the focus of its schools did not waver, reflecting a tradition of broad-based programs led by administrators and coaches who emphasize academic strength and fair play.

In December of 2012, the seven BIG EAST schools that do not compete in FBS football—DePaul, Georgetown, Marquette, Providence, St. John's, Seton Hall and Villanova—announced their intention to separate from the conference's football-playing schools and form an independent association. On March 20, 2013, the seven schools reached an agreement that enabled them to retain the BIG EAST name and assume the old conference's long-term pact with Madison Square Garden to host the BIG EAST Men's Basketball Tournament, one of the premier events in college athletics. The schools also announced the addition of three distinguished institutions sharing the same academic and athletic values

—Butler, Creighton and Xavier— and forged a landmark, long-term broadcast partnership with FOX Sports. The BIG EAST moved its headquarters from its original location in Providence, R.I., to midtown Manhattan in New York City to complete the transformation. The BIG EAST's new era officially began on July 1, 2013, its effective date as the NCAA's 32nd Division I conference.

To complement its athletic successes, the conference launched BIG EAST Serves in 2014 to align the academic, health, leadership and service missions of the 10 member institutions. Initiatives housed under the BIG EAST Serves umbrella, such as BIG EAST Serves Day, the BIG EAST Career Consortium and the national partnership with the It's On Us campaign against campus sexual assaults, reflect the conference's commitment to developing the complete BIG EAST student-athlete and making a positive contribution to the campus communities of its member schools and conference's headquarters in New York.

In the fall of 2015, the BIG EAST hosted its inaugural Freshmen Fundamentals, a unique program designed to assist men's basketball student-athletes in the transition from high school to college and the elite level of BIG EAST basketball.

BIG EAST institutions boast high graduation rates for their student-athletes, and the league has always been able to say that many of its best athletes are also its best students. Ryan Arcidiacono, the starting guard for Villanova's national champion men's basketball team and the Most Outstanding Player at the 2016 Final Four, also was one of five finalists for the 2015-16 Senior CLASS Award in his sport for excellence in classroom, community, character and competition. DePaul women's tennis standout Rebeca Mitrea was a conference nominee for NCAA Woman of the Year, an award that honors academic achievements, athletic excellence, community service and leadership. On the court, Mitrea is DePaul's all-time leader in wins with 117. She competed in the doubles of the 2016 NCAA Tennis Championship. Mitrea also was honored with the Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award from the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA).

The conference, which crowns champions in 22 sports, had league teams earn a total of 24 NCAA berths and 42 individual NCAA invitations in 2015-16. Seven different national postseason championships saw multiple BIG EAST teams participate, including five teams in men's basketball and three in women's basketball. BIG EAST schools produced 12 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including six in soccer (four male, two female).

Current BIG EAST men's basketball programs have enjoyed extraordinary success over the years. Villanova won the 2016 NCAA Championship, its second in school history. Georgetown and Marquette also have won the national title. DePaul, Providence, St. John's and Seton Hall have all made it to the Final Four. The BIG EAST placed three men's basketball teams in the Final Four in 1985—Georgetown, St. John's and Villanova—the only time this has occurred in NCAA history. Over the past 13 years, Butler, Georgetown, Marquette and Villanova have reached the Final Four, with Butler and Villanova making two trips. Xavier has advanced to the Elite Eight twice and the Sweet 16 four other times.

BIG EAST student-athletes have achieved recent success in other sports, as well. A BIG EAST team has won the NCAA women's cross country championship four of the last seven years (Villanova won twice; Providence and Georgetown once), with one runner-up finish (Providence). Creighton's men's soccer team has reached the NCAA College Cup in two of the past four seasons, with the Providence men advancing to the semifinals in 2014.

In the 37 years since the original league opened its doors, BIG EAST teams have won 39 national championships in eight different sports with 144 student-athletes winning individual national titles in the league's history. Since 2013, the BIG EAST has produced eight national champions.

BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2017 BIG EAST women's lacrosse championship is a four-team single-elimination tournament. The top four teams, seeded according to Conference game winning percentage, qualify for the championship. Georgetown University, located in Washington, D.C., will serve as host for the championship. It will be the 10th BIG EAST women's lacrosse championship and the fifth time it has been held at Georgetown. The champion receives the league's automatic bid to the 26-team NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Championship.

Selection Process

The championship provides for a field of 26 teams. Thirteen conference champions qualify automatically; the balance of the field is selected at-large by the NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Committee.

Selection Show

The 2017 NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Championship bracket will be announced the first weekend in May prior to first-round competition.

Bracketing Information

The championship bracket consists of 26 teams.

- First Round: Ten, two-team first rounds will be conducted at non-predetermined campus sites.
- Second Round: Eight, two-team second rounds will be conducted at non-predetermined campus sites.
- Quarterfinals: Four, two-team quarterfinals will be conducted at non-predetermined campus sites.

All rounds are single-elimination with four teams advancing to the Division I Women's Lacrosse Championship at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass.

The BIG EAST Digital Network, which launched in September 2014, is a dedicated section within FOX Sports GO, the mobile app that provides live streaming video of FOX Sports content at home or on-the-go. BEDN offers free, live streaming of 225 sporting events annually, in addition to the authenticated live streaming of BIG EAST events on FOX Sports networks. Women's basketball games are also a focal point of BEDN, airing every league contest not designated for a national television broadcast.

FOX Sports GO is currently available for iOS, Android, Kindle Fire tablets and Fire phones, select Windows devices, and on desktops through FOXSportsGO.com. Streaming on FOX Sports GO is also now available on several connected devices, including Apple TV, Roku and Chromecast. Fans can download the mobile app for free from the iTunes App Store, Google Play, Amazon App Store and Windows Store.

FOX Sports GO users who are also subscribers of participating video providers can live stream the BIG EAST men's and women's basketball telecasts, plus the Olympic sports championships, carried on FOX Sports 1, FOX Sports 2, FOX Sports Regional Networks, and FOX broadcast network. The BIG EAST women's basketball events and the Olympic sports contests that are not televised by FOX Sports do not require a video subscription.

2017 BIG EAST Preseason Release

BIG EAST women's lacrosse will have a new look this season with 10 teams, but the league champion is predicted to be the same for a third consecutive year as the conference's head coaches unanimously selected Florida to three-peat. The Gators earned all 81 available points and swept the preseason major awards as attackers Sammi Burgess and Lindsey Ronbeck shared BIG EAST Preseason Offensive Player of the Year plaudits and defender Caroline Fitzgerald was the undisputed pick as Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

The BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll, major awards and all-conference selections are based on ballots cast by the league's 10 head coaches, who cannot vote for their own team or student-athletes.

Connecticut garnered 68 points to finish second in the preseason poll, followed by Georgetown with 63 for third. The newest affiliate member of BIG EAST women's lacrosse, Denver claimed fourth with 55 points, followed by 2016 BIG EAST Championship runner-up Temple in fifth with 45. Marquette (sixth, 41), Vanderbilt (seventh, 40), Villanova (eighth, 31) and Cincinnati (ninth, 17) round out the returners, while Butler, in its first season of sponsoring women's lacrosse, finished in 10th with nine points. The Commodores claimed the final available first-place vote.

The Gators, who finished the 2016 season 18-2 overall and 7-0 in BIG EAST play, placed a league-high six players on the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team, including unanimous picks Burgess, Ronbeck and Fitzgerald, along with senior defender Taylor Bresnahan, junior attacker Shayna Pirreca and senior midfielder Mollie Stevens. Florida won its second consecutive BIG EAST Championship in 2016 and was the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Championship before falling in the Second Round.

Burgess and Ronbeck combined for 32 goals and 13 assists in BIG EAST play last season, with Ronbeck tying teammate Nicole Graziano for the league lead with 2.57 goals per game. Ronbeck, a sophomore attacker, led the BIG EAST with 3.86 points per game and was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Year and Inside Lacrosse National Rookie of the Year. Burgess was Co-Offensive Player of the Year in 2016 with unanimous Preseason All-BIG EAST Team pick Grace Nolan of UConn. The Florida senior attacker scored 14 goals and dished four assists in seven league games and was tabbed a First Team All-American by the IWLCA.

Fitzgerald was also an All-American in 2016, garnering second-team honors. The defender was voted BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year last season as a junior, leading the Florida defense which allowed a league-best 5.71 goals per game, outshot opponents 2-1, and led the BIG EAST with 19.29 ground balls per game. Fitzgerald collected 2.43 ground balls per contest.

Nolan, who led a Huskies team which went 12-5 overall and 6-1 in league play, was joined on the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team by teammate Cassie Ekstrom. Nolan finished her sophomore campaign third in the BIG EAST in goals (2.43/game) and second in points (3.57). Ekstrom anchored a Connecticut defense which posted the league's No. 3 save percentage (.522) and second-best caused turnover average (12.14). The second-seeded Huskies punched their BIG EAST Championship ticket for a fourth time in 2016, falling to Temple in the Semifinals.

Unanimous Preseason selection Francesca Whitehurst enters her sophomore season with Georgetown (6-11, 4-3 BIG EAST) following a rookie campaign which saw her lead the Hoyas with 11 goals and 15 points. Georgetown qualified for the BIG EAST Championship for a 10th consecutive season before being edged by the top-seeded Gators.

Redshirt-junior attacker Nicole Martindale leads Denver into its first season of BIG EAST women's lacrosse. Martindale totaled 21 goals and 11 assists over nine games after missing the first nine of the season. The Pioneers went 9-9 overall and 5-4 in the MPSF in 2016.

Temple (13-6, 4-3) earned its first BIG EAST Championship berth in 2016. Graduate student attacker Brenda McDermott led the Owls in league play with 12 goals, nine assists and 21 points, while Morgan Glassford was a pivotal midfielder with seven goals and three dishes, as both were voted to the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team.

Marquette (7-10, 4-3) narrowly missed its first postseason berth last year and has eyes on the tourney field this season with junior midfielder Allison Lane and senior attacker Julianna Shearer leading the charge. Both were named to the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team, with Lane garnering the accolade unanimously. The duo ranked fourth and fifth in the BIG EAST in goals last season, with Lane averaging 2.29 and Shearer scoring 2.14 per contest. Lane was the BIG EAST leader in draw controls per game at 3.43 per contest.

Vanderbilt went 5-11 overall and 1-6 in its second season of BIG EAST play in 2016, with Preseason All-BIG EAST honoree Callahan Kent back in the cage for 2017. Kent posted a 9.14 goals against average, a .496 save percentage and averaged 9.00 saves per contest, all of which ranked fourth among league goaltenders.

Villanova (4-13, 2-5) returns 13 letterwinners from a season ago and will look to improve upon last season's mark and qualify for the BIG EAST Championship, presented by Jeep. The Wildcats will serve as host of the league postseason tournament, slated for May 4 and 6. Cincinnati (4-13, 0-7) will look to replace its top two scorers from a season ago, with sophomore Sam Mlkvy leading the way in 2017 after scoring six goals in BIG EAST play last season. Butler begins its inaugural season of women's lacrosse with a lineup that features 16 recruits, five transfers and seven players who attended Butler prior to the establishment of the team.
