BULLDOG BITES: The Runnin' Bulldogs last defeated the Bucs in 2013, and last defeated Charleston Southern on its home field in 2010 ... GWU has suffered four of its six defeats by 10 points or less, including the last two games by an average of 5.5 points ... QB **TYRELL MAXWELL** needs 37 rushing yards to break the league's all-time quarterback rushing record of 1,785 ... LB **CHAD GETER** (323) needs two tackles to move into sole possession of eighth place in Big South history ... CB **JAYLAN FOSTER** has totaled 185 combined yards on fumbles and interceptions this season, with two TDs.



BUCCANEER BULLETS: The Buccaneers have won three of the last four meetings with GWU, including the last two by a margin of 78-14 ... CSU is looking for its 12th consecutive Big South win on Saturday, as well as its 11th straight home win and sixth consecutive home conference victory ... RB **MIKE HOLLOWAY** needs one touchdown to become the 14th player in Big South history with 30 in a career ... LB **SOLOMON BROWN** is tied for the Big South lead with 10.0 TFL ... Charleston Southern leads the Big South in rushing defense (124.3) and total defense (288.4).

- This is the first meeting between the schools, and the Owls' fourth and final first time opponent of the season.
- Kennesaw State is seeking its ninth all-time non-conference victory, as well as its sixth non-league win at home.
- KSU has surpassed 500 yards of offense in four games this season (4-0 record).
- RB **CHASTON BENNETT** has scored at least two touchdowns in each of his last four games (9 total in that span).



Monmouth Hawks (4-5) at #18 Coastal Carolina Chanticleers (6-2) Brooks Stadium • 2:00pm



- This is the fifth meeting between the schools. The Hawks have never defeated the Chanticleers.
- Monmouth is playing its second nationally-ranked opponent this season, the second straight year with two on the slate.
- LB **BRENDON WHARTON** has recorded 35 tackles in his last two games (21 vs. Liberty, 14 vs. Kennesaw State).
- The Hawks have not had an in-season four-game losing streak since 2014.

FLAMES FACTS: Liberty is looking to start 4-0 in the Big South for the first time since 2011 ... The Flames have won the last seven meetings with PC ... LU is seeking its first five-game win streak since closing out the 2013 campaign with five straight victories ... DB **CHRIS TURNER** has recorded a PBU in every game this season and is second in the conference with 1.25 passes defended per game ... WR **DANTE SHELLS** needs 63 receiving yards to become the 13th Big South player with 100 career receptions and 2,000 career yards ... A win would give Liberty 10 straight winning seasons.



BLUE HOSE BANTER: Presbyterian's last win over Liberty was a 31-28 home victory on Nov. 1, 2008 ... RB **DARRELL BRIDGES** is the only Big South player to lead his team in rushing in every game this season ... DB **ROCK YA-SIN** has nine PBUs this season, tied for first in the conference, and he is tied for third in the league with 1.12 passes defended per game ... The Blue Hose continue to lead the Big South in net punting at 39.25 yards, which ranks ninth in the country ... PC is tops in the conference in 3rd down defense, permitting teams just a 31.4 percent success rate.

FCS HEADLINES

- ◆ A total of 7 Division I teams are perfect, including two (Sam Houston State, The Citadel) in the FCS. Sam Houston State (8-0) hosts McNeese State (5-4) at 6 pm CT on ESPN3. The Citadel (8-0) hosts Samford (6-2) at 1 pm CT on ESPN3.
- ◆ STATS announced an agreement Thursday that will allow it to hand out a quartet of legacy NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) awards tied to some of the biggest names in the subdivision's history -- the Payton, Buchanan, Robinson and Rice awards will be presented Jan. 6, 2017, at the STATS Awards Banquet in Frisco.
- ◆ The NCAA Division I FCS Selection Committee unveiled its Top 10 rankings on ESPN's College Football Daily on Thursday -- 1. Jacksonville State; 2. Sam Houston State; 3. Eastern Washington; 4. North Dakota State; 5. James Madison; 6. The Citadel; 7. Richmond; 8. Chattanooga; 9. Charleston Southern; 10. Central Arkansas. The next release will be Thursday, Nov. 10, at 4 pm ET on ESPN during CFB Daily.
- ◆ The Southland Conference and Frisco CVB are working together on a new season-long promotion, the Road to Frisco. This will originate from the Frisco CVB's various social media platforms. The #RoadToFrisco FCS Game of the Week is James Madison at Richmond.
- ◆ The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame announced the finalists for the 2016 William V. Campbell Trophy, presented by Fidelity Investments® and a pair of FCS players are on the 12-player list (LB Chris Beaschler of Dayton and DL Karter Schult of Northern Iowa). The trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. The 12 finalists will each receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments. One will be declared the winner of the 27th William V. Campbell Trophy during the 59th NFF Annual Awards Dinner in New York City on Dec. 6 and have his postgraduate scholarship increased to \$25,000.

One of the greatest NFL players of all time, RB Walter Payton played at current FCS member Jackson State. The STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year is named in honor of Payton.



BIG SKY -- A matchup between two of the nation's offensive elite takes place in the Big Sky Conference this weekend, as No. 14/16 Cal Poly hosts No. 3/3 Eastern Washington on www.watchbigsky.com. Eastern Washington has the nation's top passing offense (437.5 yards per game), while Cal Poly leads the nation in rushing offense (370.3 yards per game).

Eastern Washington receiver Cooper Kupp is 17 catches from breaking the FCS record for catches, of 395, held by Elon's Terrell Hudgins. Kupp is already the leader in FCS receiving yards (5,770 yards) and receiving touchdowns (67).

Northern Arizona coach Jerome Souers is currently tied for the all-time lead in career wins with former Nevada coach Chris Ault, with 111 wins. Souers has a chance to become the all-time wins leader Saturday, when the Lumberjacks play at Weber State, in a game that kicks off at 12:00 p.m. MST on www.watchbigsky.com.

Four #BigSkyFB teams are ranked, with Eastern Washington leading the way at No. 3/3, Cal Poly at No. 14/16, North Dakota at No. 16/11, and Montana at No. 19/20.

BIG SOUTH -- Liberty is 3-0 in the Big South for the second time under head coach TURNER GILL and the seventh time overall. The Flames opened 3-0 in Gill's third season of 2014, and will seek its first 4-0 league start since 2011 and sixth overall this Saturday at Presbyterian. Meanwhile, Charleston Southern is looking to start 3-0 in Big South play for the third time in head coach JAMEY CHADWELL's four seasons at the helm this weekend.

Kennesaw State freshman DL DESMOND JOHNSON leads the Big South with 6.0 sacks, and is looking to become just the second frosh to lead the conference in the category. The previous freshman to lead the conference in QB takedowns was Gardner-Webb's PRESTON PEMASA in 2010, as he had a Big South-freshman sack record of 7.0 that year.

For the first time since 2012, the Big South has three career 2,000-yard rushers on the field in the same season, as three players eclipsed the milestone this year. Charleston Southern RB MIKE HOLLOWAY was the first (20th overall) during Week 4, and is the league's active career leading rusher with 2,359 yards (12th all-time) -- 89 away from entering the Top 10. Monmouth's LAVON CHANEY was the second (21st) during Week 7 and sits 15th in conference history at 2,243. Presbyterian's DARRELL BRIDGES entered the club this past Saturday (22nd all-time) and sits at 2,072.

CAA FOOTBALL -- No conference in the nation has a more competitive title race than CAA Football, where the top six teams in the standings are separated by only one game with three weeks to go. James Madison sits atop the CAA standings at 5-0 and New Hampshire is just a half-game back at 5-1. There is a four-way tie for third at 4-1 between Maine, Richmond, Stony Brook and Villanova. There are a pair of head-to-head matchups between the top six teams this week as JMU visits Richmond in a contest televised by Comcast SportsNet and Maine hosts Villanova in a game that will be televised by WVII and FOX College Sports.

Home teams won four of the five CAA Football games played last Saturday, but are just 16-15 in conference games for the year.

CAA Football features five players among the top 34 in the FCS in rushing. UAlbany's Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks ranks fifth with 122.6 ypg and is followed by JMU's Khalid Abdullah (118.9 ypg/7th), W&M's Kendell Anderson (96.0 ypg/18th), UNH's Dalton Crossan (89.4 ypg/29th) and JMU's Cardon Johnson (84.3 ypg/34th). 25 different CAA players have rushed for at least 100 yards in a game and all 12 CAA teams have had at least one player reach the century mark this season.

Eight CAA teams are ranked in the top 50 in FCS in scoring defense this week. Topping the list is Villanova (5th/15.9 ppg), followed by UAlbany (10th/17.9 ppg), Richmond (15th/19.8 ppg), New Hampshire (20th/20.3 ppg) and Stony Brook (21st/21.0 ppg). There are also seven teams among the top 37 in FCS in total defense, led by Villanova (259.8 ypg/2nd), Richmond (267.6 ypg/4th) and Stony Brook (286.9 ypg/10th), seven teams in the top 27 in passing defense, led by #1 Richmond (131.9 ypg), #8 Towson (162.8 ypg) and #9 Villanova (163.8 ypg) and five teams among the top 39 in rushing defense, topped by #10 Villanova (96.0 ypg).

IVY LEAGUE -- Harvard (6-1, 4-0 Ivy) and Penn (5-2, 4-0 Ivy) remain undefeated in League play after hard-fought wins over Dartmouth (3-4, 0-4 Ivy) and Brown (2-5, 1-3 Ivy), respectively.

Princeton (5-2, 3-1 Ivy) used a Princeton program record seven total touchdowns from junior quarterback John Lovett to defeat Cornell (3-4, 1-3 Ivy), 56-7, to remain a game back of the Crimson and Quakers. Lovett was a triple-threat, passing for four touchdowns, running for two and receiving one. He leads the nation in points per game (12.9). One of Lovett's passing touchdowns was a 95-yarder to senior wide receiver Isaiah Barnes, the second longest in program history, trailing only the 99-yard TD connection between Matt Verbit and Clinton Wu in 2003.

Penn junior wide receiver Justin Watson caught 11 balls for a career-high 210 yards to become the 43rd Ivy to surpass 200 receiving yards for a single game and matching the 29th-best single game total previously set by Harvard's Carl Morris on Sept. 21, 2002. Watson now stands in 21st place all-time in Ivy League history in receiving yards (2,386) and tied for 23rd in receptions (173). Watson's teammate Alek Torgersen moved into the top 10 all-time in the Ivy League record book in passing yards (10th, 6,299), completions (10th, 555) and touchdowns (10th, 49).

MEAC -- The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference enters week 10 of football action highlighted by four conference match-ups. A showdown featuring South Carolina State and North Carolina A&T State in Greensboro, N.C., highlights the match-ups as postseason implications are beginning to take shape. North Carolina A&T State and North Carolina Central remain undefeated in league play entering the first weekend of November. If both teams win out it'll set up a winner take-all showdown for the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl on Nov. 19 in Durham, N.C.

The MEAC announced recently the 88th Aggie-Eagle Classic will be shown on ESPN3/ESPNU on Nov. 19.

North Carolina A&T State leads the way in 12 of the MEAC's 31 statistical categories. Tarik Cohen is the second-leading rusher (1,168 yards) in the FCS ranks and second in yards per game (146). He is third amongst FCS backs in rush yards per carry (7.95), second in scoring (11.3 ppg) and fourth in all-purpose yardage per game (182.63). BCU's Frank Brown (18.3) and Florida A&M's Kareem Smith (18.2) rank 1-2 in punt returns while Hampton's Rashawn Proctor ranks 12th in receptions per game (7) and 13th (102.1) in receiving yards per game. SC State's Darius Leonard is the second-leading FCS tackler (12.3) in tackles per game and third in solo tackles (7.3). Savannah State's Marquis Smith leads the FCS in tackles for loss per game (2.4) and tied for third in sacks per game (1.08).

MISSOURI VALLEY -- Western Illinois' Lance Lenoir had six catches this past weekend, giving him 255 for his career, establishing a league all-time record, surpassing Tyrone Walker of Illinois State (250). Lenoir has a catch in 38-straight games, and only two in league history have bettered that.

Four MVFC teams rank among the Top 7 in the FCS, for toughest schedules (based on cumulative opposition). North Dakota State, which has played six ranked teams in its first eight games, leads the league and is ranked No. 2 overall. Meanwhile, the MVFC has four of the Top 8 teams in the FCS based on previous opposition. SDSU leads the league and is 3rd in the FCS with a .690 percentage (opponents' record of 29-13).

South Dakota State's Dallas Goedert leads all Division I tight ends in receiving yards in 2016, with 937 yards on 62 catches. His nine TD receptions match Michael Roberts of Toledo for the Division I lead but are the best in the FCS. He is 63 yards away from becoming the first TE in league history to reach 1,000 receiving yards.

NEC -- Saint Francis, which stands one win away from clinching a share of the conference crown for the first time ever, is the lone NEC team idle this week. With his 184-yard day in a 38-17 road win over Sacred Heart, SFU sophomore Kamron Lewis took over the FCS lead in receiving yards (1,038).

Duquesne freshman running back AJ Hines, who ranks fifth amongst FCS leaders in rush yards, won the NEC Rookie of the Week award for a record seventh time following the Dukes' 35-31 win over Bryant. Going over the 100-yard rushing mark for the fifth time in his last six games, Hines piled up 149 yards from scrimmage vs. Bryant.

Robert Morris, which topped Central Connecticut last week, has given a contract extension to head coach, and three-time Super Bowl champion, John Banaszak.

OHIO VALLEY -- Jacksonville State QB Eli Jenkins moved into second place in OVC history for career total offense on Saturday. He now has 10,533 yards, which trails only former Walter Payton Award winner and current New England Patriots quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo (13,089).

Austin Peay linebacker Gunnar Scholato netted his second 18-tackle performance of the season at Southeast Missouri last week. The sophomore currently leads the FCS in tackles/game (13.0).

UT Martin head coach Jason Simpson won his 70th career game in his 11th season as the Skyhawks head coach on Saturday against Eastern Kentucky. That moved him into a tie for eighth place on the OVC career wins list.

PATRIOT -- Lehigh sophomore quarterback Brad Mayes broke a program and Yale Bowl record with 524 passing yards, while tying a program record with six touchdown passes. Mayes fell 43 yards shy of Joe Lee of Towson, who passed for 567 yards against Lehigh in 1999. He was named the American Sports Network Offensive Player of the Week for his performance.

Lehigh moved into the STATS FCS Poll for the first time this season at No. 24 when it was released on Monday afternoon. The Mountain Hawks moved up three spots in the FCS Coaches Top 25 to No. 21 when that poll was released at 3 p.m. on Monday afternoon. Lehigh has won six straight, including three over Ivy League opponents and have a chance to clinch a Patriot League this weekend, holding a 4-0 League record.

Fordham junior running back Chase Edmonds has been held scoreless for three straight weeks after scoring four touchdowns per game in three games, but he did pass former Lafayette star Erik Marsh to become the second-leading rusher in PL history with 4,912 career rushing yards. With his 182-yard performance vs. Lehigh, he has now topped the 100-yard rushing mark for the seventh-straight game. He is the Patriot League's all-time leading scorer (372 points), second in rushing touchdowns (55) and third in all-purpose yards (6,157).

PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE -- Morehead State slot receiver Jake Raymond has focused his attention on the PFL's career receptions mark. He enters this week's action with 251 career receipts, second among FCS active career leaders. Raymond seeks to break the record of 254 career receptions set by Butler's Zach Watkins (2008-11).

Dayton enters Week 10 ranked among the FCS's top five in interceptions, with 14 picks in nine games this season. However, the Flyers saw their streak of nine consecutive games with an interception stopped in Week 9 as they did not nab a Stetson pass. The Flyers have three players – David Leisring, Christian Searles and Cameron Stubbs – ranked among the FCS Top 25 in interceptions per game.

Stetson's defense leads all FCS units with 10.5 team tackles for loss per game this season. The Hatters have posted 10 or tackles for loss in six of their eight games this season, including 16 tackles for loss against Jacksonville, Sept. 24. Stetson's Jeb Boudreaux is ranked third among FCS defenders with a PFL-leading 2.1 tackles for loss per game this season.

SOUTHERN -- In a matchup of ranked teams, Samford (6-2, 4-1 SoCon) visits The Citadel Saturday afternoon. The Citadel (8-0, 6-0 SoCon) can earn a share of the league's conference championship and claim the Southern Conference's automatic bid to the playoffs with a win.

Western Carolina's Detrez Newsome rushed for a school-record 277 yards and two touchdowns last week in a loss to Chattanooga. The junior eclipsed the school record set by Brad Hoover (251) in 1998.

Eight of the league's nine teams are in action Saturday (Nov. 5). Wofford travels to Furman while Samford is at The Citadel. VMI visits Western Carolina and Mercer plays host to ETSU. Chattanooga is idle.

SOUTHLAND -- ESPN3's Southland Game of the Week features McNeese at top-ranked Sam Houston State. The Cowboys and Bearcats met twice last season. In the regular season, McNeese won 27-10 as part of an undefeated conference campaign. Sam Houston was victorious in the playoffs, winning the second round game 34-29.

Sam Houston State's Ragan Henderson had not scored a touchdown since 2013, but did so twice against Texas Southern, both times on the ground. The junior tight end had three touchdown catches as a freshman in 2013 but found paydirt from the backfield twice from a yard out on Saturday and finished with 22 yards on six carries for the game. This season Henderson has carried 13 times for 80 yards, an average of 6.2 yards per rush.

The No. 18/19 Central Arkansas Bears (7-1, 6-0) won their sixth consecutive game and moved into a first-place tie with Sam Houston State in the Southland Conference standings with a 45-10 result over Southeastern Louisiana. The Bears finished with 495 yards of total offense and forced the Lions (4-4, 4-2) into four turnovers.

SWAC -- A pair of school receiving records were broken last weekend. Jackson State WR Daniel Williams finished with eight catches for 136 yards and passed Sylvester Morris (192) to become the JSU's career receptions leader. Arkansas-Pine Bluff wide out Willie Young passed Ryan Webber's mark with a 64-yard catch against Grambling State.

In the last three games, Grambling State's Devante Kincaid has completed 73 of his last 95 attempts for 1,183 yards. He's passed for a total of 1,810 yards through six games and has tossed 19 touchdowns with only one interception.

Lenorris Footman loves playing against Southern. In two games against the Jaguars, the junior quarterback has accounted for 371 yards and four touchdowns passing, and 420 yards and seven touchdowns on the ground.

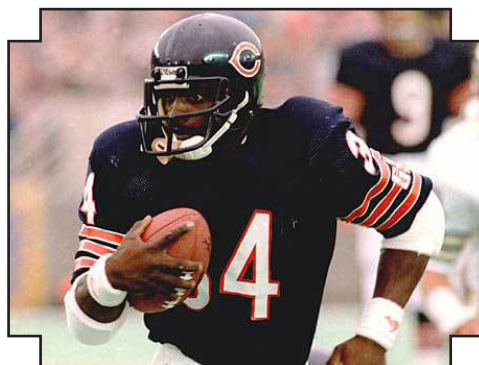
