## PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - WEEK 7 HONOREES

### OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - JAKE MCKENZIE, KENNESAW STATE, RB, R-Jr (MONROEVILLE, ALA.)

McKenzie rushed for a career-high 111 yards and a key fourth quarter touchdown to help the Owls to a 42-28 win at Liberty. With Kennesaw State ahead by seven, he iced the game with a 30-yard TD run with 3:13 remaining to cap a 12-play, 75-yard drive that soaked 5:53 off the clock. McKenzie, who averaged 6.2 yards per carry, gained 45 yards on four rushes during the final drive.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - ANTHONY ELLIS, CHARLESTON SOUTHERN, DL, Sr (APOPKA, FLA.)

Ellis recorded a season-high seven tackles (six solo) with 2.5 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble in the Buccaneers' shutout victory at Presbyterian. His first sack caused a fumble at the PC 33-yard line that CSU recovered. Ellis' second sack led to a 19-yard loss that pushed the Blue Hose out of CSU territory.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK - KYLE REIGHARD, CHARLESTON SOUTHERN, P, R-Soph (SALEM, VA.)

Reighard was integral in the field position battle against Presbyterian, as he averaged 44.0 yards on six punts with two landing inside the 20-yard line. Just two of his six punts were returned, while four traveled at least 45 yards -- including two 52-yarders.

### FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK - SHAQUIL TERRY, KENNESAW STATE, RB, R-Fr (BESSEMER, ALA.)

Terry contributed a team and career-high 126 rushing yards and a touchdown in Kennesaw State's Big South-opening victory at Liberty. He carried just nine times for a 14.0 yards per carry average, and scored on a 26-yard burst that put KSU ahead 21-7 in the second quarter. Terry had three rushes of at least 20 yards, including a 31-yarder that set up the Owls' first TD of the game.

## BIG SOUTH CO-FAVORITES OPEN 1-0 IN LEAGUE PLAY

Big South preseason co-favorites Charleston Southern and Kennesaw State won their respective conference openers this past Saturday. The Bucs downed PC, 7-0, to open 1-0 for the third straight year, while Kennesaw State defeated Liberty for the first time, 42-28, for its second 1-0 open in three years of existence. Charleston Southern has opened Big South play 2-0 each of the past two years. Kennesaw State is seeking its first-ever 2-0 start.

## OPENING DAY FOR GARDNER-WEBB AND MONMOUTH

Gardner-Webb and Monmouth open their respective league slates this Saturday, as the Hawks host Liberty and the Runnin' Bulldogs visit Kennesaw State. GWU is seeking its third consecutive 1-0 start to the Big South season, while Monmouth is looking to win its Big South opener for the first time. Below is a breakdown of how each squad has fared in its respective conference openers:

## BUCS SCORE RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE BIG SOUTH ROAD WINS

Charleston Southern opened Big South play with a 7-0 win at Presbyterian for its eighth consecutive Big South road win, setting the conference record. The old mark of seven was first accomplished by Liberty from Nov. 18, 2006 to Nov. 14, 2009. CSU's current streak began Nov. 1, 2014.

## NIGHT OWLS

Kennesaw State rolled up a conference-game record 498 rushing yards this past Saturday at Liberty, surpassing its old league record of 482 set last season against Monmouth. The Owls have now eclipsed 400 rushing yards five times in its existence, and leads the nation in rushing yards per game with 335.3 -- the second-highest single-season average in league history.

## IF THE SCHU FITS

Gardner-Webb senior kicker **PAUL SCHUMACHER** became the ninth kicker in Big South history with 30 career field goals when he reached the milestone this past Saturday at N.C. Central. Schumacher, who is the third GWU kicker on the league's all-time list, needs four to move into a tie for eighth-place.

## RECORDS SET IN CHARLESTON SOUTHERN-PRESBYTERIAN GAME

Charleston Southern's 7-0 win over Presbyterian this past Saturday set the Big South single-game record for fewest combined points scored in a league contest. The teams held the previous mark of 10, set on Oct. 18, 2014 when PC defeated the Bucs, 7-3. A second record set in this past Saturday's game was the fewest combined total yards in a conference game -- 399. The old record was 417, again held by CSU and PC in their 2015 match-up.

## ELLIS ISLAND

Charleston Southern DL, Buck Buchanan Award candidate and Big South Preseason Defensive Player of the Year **ANTHONY ELLIS** became just the third player in Big South history with 40 career tackles-for-loss and 20 career sacks this past Saturday during the Presbyterian game. He is now tied for second with 20.5 career sacks, and is third with 42.0 career TFL. Ellis joins Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** (53.5 TFL, 20.5 SK) and Liberty's **CHIMA UZOWIHE** (44.0 TFL, 25.0 SK) in this exclusive club. Ellis is second in the Big South with 5.5 sacks, and is 1.5 away from joining Uzowihe as the only players in league annals with three 7.0 sack seasons.

## MAXWELL HOUSE

Gardner-Webb QB, Walter Payton Award candidate and Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year **TYRELL MAXWELL** is the first Big South QB in league history with 20 career rushing touchdowns and 20 career passing TDs. He broke the quarterback record of 19 rushing TDs this past Saturday with two scores at N.C. Central to give him 20. Maxwell, who has thrown 21 career scoring strikes, is the Big South's all-time leading rusher among quarterbacks with 2,566 yards -- the only signal-caller above the 2,000-yard threshold.

## MONUMENTAL

The 5-1 Monmouth Hawks have scored 30 points in all five victories. The last time the Hawks posted five 30-point games was in 2008 -- which was also the last time MU scored 30 points in five wins. The conference record for most 30-point games in a season is 13 established by Coastal Carolina in 2014.

**MAGIC MIKE**

Monmouth DB and Buck Buchanan Award candidate **MIKE BASILE** is the Big South's all-time leader for career solo tackles with 244, as he broke the record of 243 in Week 6 with a Big South single-game record 17 solo hits at Holy Cross. Basile's 375 career total stops are fourth-most in the Big South record book, and 25 away from becoming just the fourth Big South player with 400 career tackles. Meanwhile, Basile is tied for second in league history with five career blocked kicks. The all-time record is nine, which is held by Presbyterian College's and three-time NFL Pro Bowler **JUSTIN BETHEL**.

**BIRDS OF PREY**

Kennesaw State and Monmouth rank sixth and 11th, respectively, in the nation in rushing defense. The Owls are permitting just 70.5 rushing yards per game and have held four foes to less than 100 yards on the ground -- tied for the fourth-most times in league history. The Hawks have allowed an average of 82.8 rushing yards per game. The Big South single-season record for rushing defense is 101.0 yards per game set by Stony Brook in 2011.

**TORRANCE THE TERRIFIC**

Presbyterian College freshman RB **TORRANCE MARABLE** is the first Big South freshman ever to score a touchdown in five consecutive games, as he tallied a team-leading five (three rushing, two receiving) during Weeks 2-6. Marable leads the Big South with 592 rushing yards and is looking to become the first Blue Hose player and just the second Big South frosh to lead the conference in rushing.

**BURKS BREAKS THROUGH**

Kennesaw State QB **CHANDLER BURKS** has scored a rushing TD in three consecutive games, including three in Week 6 vs. Texas Southern. It was his third career 3-TD rushing game -- tied with former teammate **TREY WHITE** for the most by a Big South quarterback in league history. Burks has 15 career rushing touchdowns, which ranks 10th all-time in league history among quarterbacks, and is eighth with 1,256 career rushing yards. He needs 31 yards to move into sixth-place on the QB career rushing list.

**KENYATTA WILL GET-YA**

Gardner-Webb senior LB **KENYATTA DUNBAR** is tied for second in the FCS with 2.1 TFL per game and tied for third with 12.5 total tackles-for-loss. He posted a TFL in five consecutive games -- including three straight with at least 3.0 TFL during Weeks 2-4 (10.0 total) to be the first Big South player to record three-straight 3.0+ TFL games since Gardner-Webb All-American DL **HAROLD WELLS** in 2004. Wells posted 10.5 tackles-for-loss during his streak (4.5, 3.0, 3.0). Dunbar entered the season with just 1.5 career stops behind the line.

**STRETCH ARMSTRONG**

Kennesaw State R-freshman LB **BRYSON ARMSTRONG** leads the Big South with 6.0 sacks -- just one away from tying the league's freshman record of 7.0 set by Gardner-Webb's **PRESTON PEMASA** in 2010 and tied by Charleston Southern LB **SOLOMON BROWN** in 2015. Armstrong, who has been the STATS National Freshman of the Week (Week 3) and three-time Honorable Mention for the weekly award (Weeks 1, 2 & 6), also ranks in the Big South top five in fumble recoveries (T-1st), tackles per game (4th), TFL (5th), interceptions (T-3rd) and passes defended (T-3rd).

**BIG BEN**

Presbyterian College R-junior QB **BEN CHEEK** already has set career-highs in a season for rushing yards (267) and passing TDs (4), and is approaching his personal-best for season passing yards. With 763, he is 74 away from his current-high of 837 set last year. Cheek's 61.2 completion percentage and 122.7 efficiency rating this year are already ahead of his previous highs.

**ALLS WELLS THAT ENDS WELLS**

Liberty junior DL **JUWAN WELLS** has posted a TFL in four of six games this season and in 17 of his 27 career appearances (=63.0 percent). He has 24.0 TFLs in his career with 13.0 sacks. Wells ranks first among all Big South defensive linemen with 7.3 tackles per game (sixth overall) and has led the Flames in tackles three times this season.

**THREE-LEGGED RACE**

Kennesaw State QB **CHANDLER BURKS** became the 10th quarterback in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards when he reached the milestone in Week 3 at Alabama State. He was the third player in Kennesaw State's young history to reach the benchmark, behind former teammates **CHASTON BENNETT** (1,321) and **TREY WHITE** (1,059). RBs **DARNELL HOLLAND** (1,071) and **JAKE MCKENZIE** (1,047) surpassed the milestone this past Saturday at Liberty to give the Owls three active players with 1,000 career rushing yards.

## BIG SOUTH'S EXCLUSIVE ESPN3 PACKAGE CONTINUES SATURDAY

The Big South's exclusive seven-game TV package on ESPN3 continues this Saturday with Gardner-Webb at Kennesaw State live from Fifth Third Bank Stadium at 7:00pm. **MIKE HOGEWOOD** (play-by-play) and **RENALDO WYNN** (analyst) have the call from Kennesaw. ESPN3 is carrying a Big South game each week the remainder of the season, including a "Wildcard" selection the final week of the regular-season. Coverage of that game will be determined 14-21 days in advance.

## BIG SOUTH COVERAGE ON STADIUM NETWORK RESUMES OCT. 28

Big South football on the new Stadium Network resumes next Saturday with the Liberty at Gardner-Webb contest live at 12:00pm. **MIKE HOGEWOOD** (play-by-play) and **RENALDO WYNN** (analyst) have the call from Spangler Stadium. The Big South will appear on Stadium three times this season, which will all be noon kickoffs. The third and final broadcast will be the Nov. 11 Gardner-Webb at Monmouth match-up.

## TV GUIDE

The Big South Conference's 2017 television slate features 45 games spanning every week of the campaign -- nearly 90 percent of the entire schedule -- with 14 total games exclusively on **ESPN3**, **STADIUM** and **7COMM/PRINCETON MEDIA GROUP**. 7Comm/Princeton Media Group is a new television partner in 2017, and will produce and air four football broadcasts on a new regional network of broadcast TV stations called "*College Football Down South*." The first 7Comm broadcast is the Oct. 28 Kennesaw State at Presbyterian contest.

## HOMEWARD BOUND

Presbyterian College is in the midst of a *SEVEN-GAME* homestand, the longest streak of consecutive home games in Big South history. The Blue Hose will host eight games at Bailey Memorial Stadium this season after the Week 2 PC at The Citadel game was moved to Clinton due to Hurricane Irma. Presbyterian is 3-3 on the current stand, and will remain at home through Saturday, Oct. 28. The Big South's previous longest homestand was four games, which occurred six times and most recently by Gardner-Webb in 2016.

## CALL IN THE CALVERTY

Liberty sophomore QB **STEPHEN CALVERT**, who is the first Big South quarterback in league history to open the season with three consecutive 3-TD pass games, as well as the second overall to throw at least three scoring strikes in back-to-back-to-back games, leads the Big South with 1,845 passing yards and 16 TDs. His 307.5 passing yards per game is pacing way ahead of the league record of 274.7 (Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006), and is on track for 3,383 yards, which is just shy of the Big South single-season record of 3,389. Calvert could also become the first QB in conference annals to throw 30 touchdown passes in a season, as he is 14 away with five games to play. He tied the Big South single-game record with five touchdown passes in Week 2, and has tossed a TD pass in eight consecutive games dating back to last season.

## KING OF THE HILL

Liberty junior WR **DAMIAN KING** has caught a league-high 40 passes for 368 yards through six games. In his first two years in Lynchburg, he had 24 career receptions for 206 yards in 16 appearances. King already has two 10-reception games in 2017, the first Liberty player with this achievement since **DARRIN PETERSON** in 2014.

## REG-GIE, REG-GIE

Monmouth junior WR **REGGIE WHITE JR.** has 143 career receptions for 1,798 receiving yards with 16 TDs. Last season's Big South leader in receptions, receptions per game and receiving yards, White is 202 receiving yards shy of becoming the 14th Big South player with 2,000 in a career, and seven catches away from 150.

## DUMAS DOES MORE

Monmouth DB **KAMAU DUMAS** returned a punt 89 yards for a touchdown in Week 6 at Holy Cross -- the second-longest punt return in Big South history. He later intercepted a pass and returned it 39 yards for a score to become the just the second player in the conference record book with a punt return TD and pick-six in the same game. Presbyterian College's **JUSTIN BETHEL** was the first in 2011, when he returned a blocked punt and interception for scores at California on Sept. 17.

## RUSH HOUR

Charleston Southern's defense held Mississippi Valley State to minus-24 yards rushing on 27 attempts in Week 5, the fewest allowed to a Division I opponent in Big South history and the second-fewest overall in a game. The overall league record is minus-25 yards, set by Gardner-Webb vs. Virginia State in 2011.

## 2,000-YARD RUSHING ODYSSEY

Gardner-Webb QB **TYRELL MAXWELL** is the Big South's active career rushing leader with 2,566 -- good for ninth all-time in league history and 66 away from moving into seventh-place. He needs 434 rushing yards to become just the sixth player with 3,000 in a career. Maxwell led the Big South in rushing in 2016 with 965 yards -- the first quarterback in league history to finish as the conference's leading rusher -- and is second this year with 552, just 40 off the top spot.

## POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 139. Monmouth holds the second-longest active streak at 31 games, just ahead of Kennesaw State's streak of 28 games.

## RANK AND FILE

The Big South's streak of 83 consecutive weeks with a nationally-ranked football member ended Oct. 2 entering Week 6. It was the first time the Big South was outside the two major Top 25 polls since Week 8 of the 2011 season (Oct. 17). This week, Kennesaw State sits on the cusp of the FCS Coaches Top 25, as the Owls landed in the 28th position. KSU was also the league's highest vote-getter in this week's STATS FCS poll at No. 35 in that ranking.

## GANDY DANCER

Liberty WR **ANTONIO GANDY-GOLDEN** has caught 38 passes for a league-best 638 yards and five TDs in six games this season. In 11 games as a freshman in 2016, he had 21 catches for 315 yards and three scores. Gandy-Golden has three 100-yard receiving games -- including two with at least 170 receiving yards to be the first Big South receiver with this distinction since former Flame WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** in 2011. Meanwhile, Gandy-Golden's 106.3 receiving yards per game is just under Summers' league record of 108.1. Gandy-Golden is on pace for 1,170 receiving yards, which would be the third-highest single-season total in Big South annals.

## COMING FULL CIRCLE

Liberty, in its final year as a Big South football member, is league's all-time winningest program in conference action, as the Flames are 53-21 all-time in Big South contests (71.6 percent). Charleston Southern is third with 35 league victories, just ahead of Gardner-Webb (34). Meanwhile, the Flames have scored a point in all 74 of its Big South games, the longest such streak in league annals. Of those 74 games, the last 62 have been in double digits. Charleston Southern's current streak of 48 conference games with a point scored is the third-longest all-time.

## ROMAN EMPIRE

Kennesaw State R-senior **DB KEON ROMAN** became just the second player in Big South history with at least two interceptions in back-to-back games when he picked off two passes in Week 5 against North Greenville after collecting two INTs in the team's previous outing at Alabama State in Week 3. Roman joined former Charleston Southern DB **CHARLES JAMES** as the only Big South players to achieve this feat. James' two consecutive multi-INT games occurred in 2010 (five total).

## TRY TO KEEP UP WITH THIS JONES

Monmouth junior RB **DEVELL JONES** leads the Big South with seven rushing touchdowns. The short-yardage specialist has carried the ball a total of 28 times for 133 yards -- with a long of 42 -- and has scored on runs of 6, 6, 8, 4, 1, 3 and 4 yards for the Hawks. Jones is just the eighth Big South player to score a rushing TD in the first five games of a season.

## TURNING HEADS

Liberty R-junior DB **CHRIS TURNER** has 26 career passes defended (18 PBU and 8 INT). He is four away from becoming the 12th player in Big South history with 30. Turner has recorded a PD in four of six contests this season, and in 14 of his last 17 games dating back to last season. He is two picks shy of becoming the 11th Big South player with 10 career interceptions.

## COVER 2

Monmouth R-senior DB **TEDDIE MARTINEZ** posted his second multi-interception game this season with two picks at Bucknell in Week 5, and is tied for the league-lead with four. He now has eight career interceptions during his time in the Big South and is two picks shy of becoming the 11th Big South player with 10 career INTs.

## KAMERON KAN

Charleston Southern R-sophomore WR **KAMERON BROWN** connected with R-sophomore QB **SHANE BUCENELL** on an 87-yard touchdown pass against Mississippi Valley State in Week 5, tied for the fourth-longest pass play in Big South history. In just 16 career games, Brown has caught 38 career passes for 776 yards -- a 20.42 career yards per catch average -- and eight scores.

## BIG BROWN

Charleston Southern junior LB **SOLOMON BROWN** has recorded 29.5 TFL and 11.5 sacks in his two-plus seasons in the Big South. He needs 2.5 sacks to equal the conference linebacker sack record of 14.0, which is held by **MAURICE SIMPKINS** (Coastal Carolina, 2003-05), and is 0.5 TFL shy of becoming the 18th player in league annals with 30.

## MAD MAX

Gardner-Webb QB **TYRELL MAXWELL** posted his 10th career game with 100 yards rushing and 100 yards passing this past Saturday at N.C. Central to extend his Big South career record. He finished with 165 yards on the ground and 138 through the air against the Eagles. It was Maxwell's 11th career 100-yard rushing game -- the eighth-most by any Big South player.

## THE FORCE IS STRONG WITH THIS ONE

Charleston Southern senior DL **ANTHONY ELLIS** forced his third fumble of the season this past Saturday at Presbyterian. He has forced seven fumbles in his career, tied for the third-most in Big South history. That record is nine, set by Coastal Carolina's **QUINN BACKUS**.

## BLOCK PARTY

Presbyterian blocked two kicks in its Week 6 win over St. Francis (Pa.), the squad's first multi-block game since 2009. **KJ PRESLEY** blocked a 30-yard field goal attempt, followed by **ROD HAYGOOD**'s blocked punt that **MALACHI BROWN** returned 17 yards for a touchdown. It was the league's first blocked punt TD return since 2014 when Charleston Southern's **LARENZO MATHIS** achieved the feat at Vanderbilt. It was PC's first such occurrence since 2011 when **JUSTIN BETHEL** did it twice that season.

## CHARLESTON SOUTHERN, KENNESAW STATE TIE FOR TOP PRESEASON SPOT

For the first time, two teams finished as the favorite in the annual Big South preseason football poll, as two-time defending conference champion Charleston Southern University and third-year program Kennesaw State University claimed the top spot in the 2017 preseason rankings as voted by the league's head coaches and media panel. Both teams received nine first-place votes, eight second-place votes and one third-place vote to finish atop the poll with 80 points each. The Owls will host the Buccaneers on Saturday, Nov. 11.

## BIG SOUTH COLLECTS FIRST-EVER WIN OVER POWER 5 MEMBER

The Big South scored its sixth win over an FBS opponent with Liberty's 48-45 triumph over Big 12 member Baylor in Week 1. It was the conference's first-ever win over a Power 5 member, as well as the league's first FBS victory in a season-opener. The Big South's six FBS wins have all come since 2010.

## CALVERT GETS BIG SOUTH PASSING RECORD TRIFECTA IN BAYLOR WIN

Liberty sophomore QB **STEPHEN CALVERT** set three Big South single-game passing records during the Flames' Week 1 win at Baylor. He established new marks for completions (44), attempts (60) and yardage (447) against the Bears. Calvert's effort bested the previous records of 37 completions (Presbyterian's **TIM WEBB** at Wofford in 2008), 57 attempts (Webb at Appalachian State in 2008) and 430 yards (Gardner-Webb's **LUCAS BEATTY** at VMI in 2014). Calvert's 447 yards of offense at Baylor is the fourth-most in a game in Big South history.

## HELLOS

The Big South football membership will feature the addition of Campbell University in 2018, as the school announced on Nov. 14, 2016, that it will begin scholarship football that season, and make the subsequent move to the Big South. Campbell is already a full-time conference member, and is playing its final season of non-scholarship football in the Pioneer Football League. Meanwhile, the University of North Alabama will join Big South Football in 2019 as an associate member, a direct result of the Big South's collaboration agreement with the ASUN Conference in which ASUN members playing scholarship football have an automatic home in the Big South.

## GOOD-BYES

Liberty University is playing its final football season in the Big South this fall, as the Flames received a waiver from the NCAA to transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision as an independent. With Liberty's transition underway, the Flames are ineligible for the Big South championship and FCS Playoffs, and thus are not eligible for the conference's preseason poll nor the FCS Coaches Top 25 poll. The Flames remain a part of the conference schedule this season and will be considered a league opponent, but will be listed at the bottom of the standings.
