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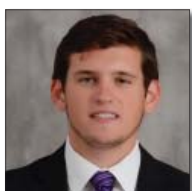

Co-Offensive Player of the Week

Zach Bednarczyk | QB | Villanova
Bednarczyk accounted for 329 yards of total offense and four touchdowns in Villanova's 42-7 road win at Elon. The sophomore quarterback completed 14-of-21 passes for 270 yards and 3 TD's and also ran for 59 yards and another score on 13 carries. All four TD's came in the opening half.



Co-Offensive Player of the Week

Bryan Schor | QB | James Madison
Schor contributed 312 yards of total offense and a career-high four touchdowns as James Madison defeated Delaware, 43-20. The junior quarterback completed 19-of-25 passes for 209 yards and a TD, and rushed for 103 yards and three scores on 15 carries. The Dukes piled up 607 yards of offense in the win.



Defensive Player of the Week

Pat Ricard | DE | Maine
Ricard recorded eight tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and a career-high three sacks in Maine's 35-31 comeback victory over Bryant. The senior defensive end helped lead a Black Bears' defense that limited Bryant to 35 yards on the ground and 10 second-half points as Maine overcame a 21-point deficit.



Special Teams Player of the Week

Oliver Graybar | P | Rhode Island
Graybar dropped four punts inside the 20-yard line in difficult weather to help Rhode Island top rival Brown, 28-13, for its first win of the year. Four of the freshman's 10 punts were 45 yards or longer, including a 67-yard boot that was the longest by a Rams' punter since 2010.



Rookie of the Week

Josh Mack | RB | Maine
Mack ran for a career-high 151 yards and 3 TD's on 21 carries as Maine rallied past Bryant, 35-31, for its first win of the year. He became the first Maine back to rush for three scores since 2011 and had the game-winning 9-yard TD with 10:36 left.

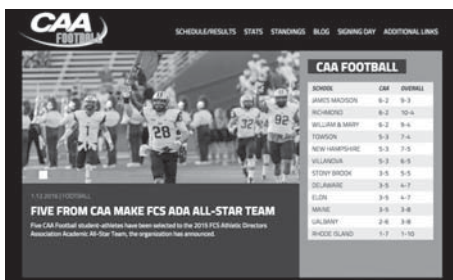

CONFERENCE NOTES:

FOUR CAA TEAMS RANKED IN NATIONAL POLLS: Four CAA Football teams are ranked among the top 17 nationally this week. The STATS Top 25 poll features #6 Richmond, #7 James Madison, #14 Villanova and #16 UAlbany, while the FCS Coaches Poll includes #6 James Madison, #7 Richmond, #12 Villanova and #17 UAlbany. Four other squads - William & Mary, Stony Brook, New Hampshire and Towson - were among other teams receiving votes in the polls.

MAINE'S MACK NAMED STATS FCS FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK: Maine running back Josh Mack was selected as the STATS FCS Freshman of the Week after rushing for a career-high 151 yards and three second-half touchdowns as the Black Bears rallied past Bryant, 35-31, last Saturday. The 151 yards were the most by a Maine back since 2013. Mack is the third CAA player to receive national Player of the Week recognition, joining Stony Brook's Jaheem Woods (Defense) and William & Mary's Corey Parker (Freshman).

HOME TEAMS 5-5 IN CAA GAMES: Home teams are now 5-5 in CAA Football action after JMU, New Hampshire and Richmond defended their home fields last week, while Villanova earned a win on the road. This Saturday features all 12 squads playing league games for the first time this season. Three contests will be televised as the American Sports Network will air Rhode Island/Villanova at Noon and Comcast SportsNet will broadcast William & Mary/James Madison at 3:30 p.m., followed by Stony Brook/Towson at 7 p.m.

CAA SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY: CAA Football teams are 17-4 this season in non-conference games against FCS opponents. The league is a combined 20-15 in non-conference action for the season, with 11 of the losses coming against FBS competition.

HOME SWEET HOME: Richmond set a school record with its 10th consecutive home victory after edging Towson, 31-28, last Saturday. New Hampshire has won 17 straight regular-season home games after topping William & Mary, 21-12, last week. UNH played that game before the largest home crowd (21,943) in school history. JMU's 43-20 triumph over Delaware was played in front of the 3rd-largest home crowd (25,236) in school history.

UR'S BROWN NEARS TOP 10 ON CAA RECEIVING LIST: Richmond's Brian Brown, who became the Spiders' career leader in receiving yards on Sept. 24, needs 108 more to move into the top 10 on CAA Football's career list. He currently had 3,242 yards and is chasing Northeastern's Cory Parks (3,350 yds) for the #10 spot. Brown caught 76 passes for 1,450 yards in 2015, had 79 catches for 1,089 yards as a sophomore and currently tops the CAA with 31 receptions for 524 yards and 5 TD's this season. He's the first player in program history to record back-to-back 1,000-yard campaigns and is on pace to make it three in a row.

SIX CAA PLAYERS AMONG TOP 36 IN RUSHING: CAA Football features six players among the top 36 in FCS in rushing. UAlbany's Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks ranks third with 138.8 ypg and is followed by JMU's Khalid Abdullah (120.6 ypg/7th) and Cardon Johnson (100.0 ypg/19th), Delaware's Wes Hills (97.0 ypg/22nd), UNH's Dalton Crossan (93.4 ypg/24th) and Towson's Darius Victor (88.5 ypg/36th). Over the first five weeks of the season, 21 different CAA players have rushed for at least 100 yards in a game and all 12 CAA teams have had at least one player reach the century mark this season.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE: Four CAA teams rank among the top 20 in FCS in turnover margin. UAlbany leads the nation in turnover margin (+13), Delaware is fourth (+7), James Madison is 18th (+6) and Villanova is 19th (+5). Five teams are also among the top 10 in FCS in interceptions. UAlbany is 2nd in the nation with nine, while Delaware, Elon, James Madison and New Hampshire are tied for 10th with seven.

DOMINANT DEFENSE: Nine CAA teams are ranked in the top 50 in FCS in scoring defense this week. UAlbany is ranked 3rd, followed by Villanova (6th), New Hampshire (23rd), Wil-

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liam & Mary (34th), Richmond (36th), Stony Brook (39th), James Madison (40th), Delaware (43rd) and Elon (50th). There are also six teams among the top 40 in FCS in total defense, led by Richmond (276.2 ypg/4th) and Villanova (298.0 ypg/9th).

CAA RECORDS TWO WINS OVER FBS FOES: CAA Football teams posted a pair of victories over FBS opponents this season as Richmond knocked off ACC member Virginia, 37-20, and UAlbany defeated Buffalo, 22-16. It was the Spiders' first triumph against the Cavaliers since 1946 and ended the ACC's 68-game win streak vs. FCS competition. The Great Danes posted their first win ever against an FBS opponent and avenged a 51-14 loss to the Bulls a year ago. CAA Football teams have recorded 34 victories over FBS foes in its history and it's the first time since 2013 that the league has won two in the same year. A complete list of CAA Football wins over FBS opponents can be found on Page 15 of this release.

RICHMOND PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE: Richmond, which earned a share of the CAA title and advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA FCS playoffs last year, was the overwhelming choice to win the CAA Football championship in 2016. William & Mary and James Madison, who shared last year's CAA crown with the Spiders, were chosen second and third, respectively, in the poll of coaches and media relations directors. Villanova was picked fourth, followed by New Hampshire, Towson, Delaware, Stony Brook, Maine, Elon, UAlbany and Rhode Island.

UR'S LAULETTA AND JONES HEADLINE PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM: Richmond junior quarterback Kyle Lauletta was chosen as the CAA preseason Offensive Player of the Year, while Spiders' senior safety David Jones was selected as the CAA preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of the league's head coaches and media relations directors. Lauletta passed for 3,598 yards, which was the second-highest total in FCS, and 19 TD's last year, while Jones made a school-record nine interceptions, which tied for the most in FCS, and also contributed a career-high 97 tackles. LEGENDARY COACHES: Two of the three winningest active coaches in Division I football patrol the sidelines in the CAA. Villanova's Andy Talley, who is in his 32nd and final season as head coach of the Wildcats, leads all active coaches with 253 wins. William & Mary's Jimmie Laycock, who is in his 37th season with the Tribe, ranks third in victories with 240. Talley also has the most career wins in CAA Football games (138), while Laycock ranks second (106) and New Hampshire's Sean McDonnell is sixth (86).

MULTIPLE TEAMS IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS: CAA Football had four teams (James Madison, Richmond, New Hampshire and William & Mary) selected to the FCS playoffs for the second straight season in 2015. CAA Football has had multiple teams in the playoffs for 25 straight years and three or more teams in the playoff field for 10 years in a row. It was the eighth time in league history that at least four teams had been chosen. CAA Football had a league-record five teams picked in 2007, 2008 and 2011.

PLAYOFF SUCCESS: Richmond advanced to the semifinals of the FCS playoffs in 2015, which marked the third year in a row that at least one CAA Football team has reached the final four. CAA Football has had eight different teams reach the semifinals over the past decade and 22 semifinalists overall. Since 2003, CAA Football has a team in the FCS title game eight times, with four different squads capturing national titles - Delaware (2003), James Madison (2004), Richmond (2008) and Villanova (2009).

NEW HAMPSHIRE EXTENDS PLAYOFF STREAK: New Hampshire earned a berth in the FCS playoffs for the 12th consecutive year in 2015, extending the longest active streak in the nation. Under coach Sean McDonnell, the Wildcats have recorded 12 straight winning seasons with double-digit victory totals in six of them. UNH had an incredible streak of 162 straight weeks ranked in the STATS FCS Top 25 poll from Sept. 6, 2004 until Oct. 12, 2015.

UALBANY**4-0 Overall/1-0 CAAFB**

- UAlbany is one of only eight remaining undefeated teams in FCS and it's just the third time the Great Danes have started 4-0 as a Division I program.
- The Great Danes moved up to #16 in this week's STATS FCS Top 25 poll. Prior to this season, UAlbany hadn't been in the Top 25 since Oct. 27, 2014.
- Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks has topped the 100-yard mark three times this season and ranks 3rd in FCS in rushing (138.8 ypg) and 2nd in rushing TD's (8).
- LB Michael Nicastro made a career-high 16 tackles vs. St. Francis. He ranks 2nd in the CAA in tackles (10.5 tpg) and has made two interceptions in the first four games.
- UAlbany ranks third in FCS in scoring defense (15.0 ppg). The Great Danes have held three of their four opponents to 16 points or less.
- UAlbany leads FCS in turnovers gained (16) and turnover margin (+13) and ranks 2nd in interceptions (9).

DELAWARE**2-2 Overall/0-1 CAAFB**

- Dropped a 43-20 decision at JMU in their CAA opener last Saturday.
- The Hens played their third straight road game last week. Combined with a bye on Sept. 24, UD has been away from home for four consecutive weeks for the first time since 1991. UD hosts Maine on Saturday.
- UD ranks 10th in FCS in rushing (259.8 ypg) and has had 3 different backs - Wes Hills, Jalen Randolph and Thomas Jefferson - top the 100-yard mark in a game this season. The trio combined for 241 yards at JMU.
- Delaware has seven interceptions this season, which ranks 10th in FCS. The Hens only had 7 pickoffs all of 2015. The Hens are also 4th in FCS in turnover margin (+7).
- Junior Diante Cherry caught six passes for a career-high 92 yards at JMU.
- QB Joe Walker threw his first interception of the season in the 3rd quarter at JMU, ending a streak of 100 straight passes without a pickoff.

ELON**2-3 Overall/1-1 CAAFB**

- Suffered a 42-7 setback to Villanova last Saturday, snapping a 2-game winning streak.
- QB Daniel Thompson was held to 33 yards passing vs. VU, but is averaging 145.6 ypg through the air and has completed 54.4% of his passes.
- Malcolm Summers ran for a career-high 120 yards and 2 TD's at W&M on Sept. 24, and tops the team with 262 rushing yards.
- John Gallagher is 8-for-8 on field goals for the season. He ranks 4th in FCS in FG's made per game (1.6) and ranks 3rd on Elon's career FG chart (43).
- Chris Blair recorded a team-high 14 tackles and intercepted a pass against Villanova. It was his 10th career game with double-digit stops.
- Daniel Everett made a pair of sacks against VU and has three for the season.
- Elon's roster includes 32 true freshmen, 17 red-shirt freshmen and 21 sophomores.

JAMES MADISON**4-1 Overall/2-0 CAAFB**

- Matched their season-high with 607 yards of total offense in a 43-20 win over Delaware last Saturday.
- Khalid Abdullah ran for a team-high 159 yards and 2 TD's on just 10 carries vs. UD. Abdullah ranks 2nd in the CAA in rushing and has topped the 100-yard mark four times. He has 8 rushing touchdowns.
- QB Bryan Schor threw for 209 yards and a TD and ran for 103 yards and 3 TD's vs. UD. He was 19-of-25 passing vs. UD and is completing 69.3% of his throws for the season.
- JMU ranks 2nd in FCS in rushing (342.0 ypg) and scoring offense (47.6 ppg) and 4th in total offense (531.2 ypg). The Dukes have had at least 430 total yards in all 5 games.
