CAA WEEKLY AWARDS

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Denzel Ingram • UNCW

Sr., G, 6-0, 175 - Chapel Hill, N.C./Chapel Hill

Ingram scored a team-high 19 points, including the game-winning jumper with 1.9 seconds left, as UNCW earned an 81-80 victory at St. Bonaventure last Saturday. The senior guard finished 7-of-14 from the floor, including 5-of-11 from 3-point range, and also dished out five assists as the Seahawks won their fifth straight game. It was the second game-winning shot of the season for Ingram, who is averaging 12.4 ppg and 6.3 apg.



PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Rodney Williams • Drexel

Sr., F, 6-7, 225 - Richmond, Va./St. Christopher's

Williams poured in a career-high 29 points and pulled down a team-best 10 rebounds in Drexel's narrow 72-71 loss to Saint Joseph's on Sunday. The senior forward was 9-of-17 from the floor and hit 11-of-16 from the free throw line. It was the fourth 20-point effort of the season for Williams, who topped his previous career-best of 24 points set against Rutgers, and his first double-double. He's averaging 16.7 ppg and 6.4 rpg for the year.



ROOKIE OF THE WEEK: Ryan Daly • Delaware

Fr., G, 6-4, 185 - Ardmore, Pa./Archbishop Carroll

Daly came off the bench to score a career-high 20 points and grab a career-best nine rebounds in Delaware's 81-63 setback at Yale on Sunday afternoon. The freshman guard was 7-of-15 from the floor, including 5-of-9 from three-point range, and also contributed two assists and two steals. It was the fourth double-digit scoring performance in the past six games for Daly, who is averaging 10.0 ppg for the season.

CONFERENCE NOTES:

UNCW CLIMBS TO #11 IN LATEST RPI REPORT: UNCW has climbed to #11 in the RPI rankings according to the latest report released by Collegiate Basketball News (rpiratings.com) through games of Dec. 15. The Seahawks extended their winning streak to six with a 96-75 victory at Campbell on Wednesday and are 6-1 this season away from home. College of Charleston, which improved to 8-3 and increased its winning streak to five with a 53-35 victory at East Carolina on Thursday, is #43 in the RPI. The CAA is ranked 12th out of the nation's 32 Division I conferences.

CAA LEADS THE NATION IN ROAD VICTORIES: CAA teams have won 20 true road games and are 8-6 on neutral courts against non-conference foes this season. The 20 road wins are the most of any Division I conference through games of Dec. 15. Eight CAA teams have recorded multiple road victories and seven have at least a .500 mark on the road. Four of the road setbacks and one of the neutral court losses were against nationally ranked teams. Last season, CAA teams recorded 21 wins in true road games, which was the 3rd-most among all conferences.

SOLID START FOR CAA TEAMS: It's been a solid start to the season in CAA men's basketball as the league's 10 teams have combined for a 55-44 record. UNCW is off to a 9-1 start, which is its best 10-game mark in school history. The Seahawks are riding a six-game winning streak, which is tied for the 17th-longest in the nation currently. College of Charleston (8-3) is off to its best start since 2011-12 and has won its past fIVE contests. **Towson** (6-4) has captured three of its last four after victories over Loyola and FDU last week. Eight of the league's 10 teams have .500 or better overall records.

HOFSTRA'S GUSTYS TOPS DIVISION I IN REBOUNDS: Hofstra junior Rokas Gustys leads the nation with 13.4 rebounds per game as of Dec. 15. He grabbed 25 rebounds in the Pride's 65-57 win over South Dakota on Nov. 23, which is the most by any NCAA Div. I player this season, and had 23 rebounds in Hofstra's season-opening victory over Coppin State. Last season, Gustys had six games with at least 20 boards and ranked second nationally with 13.0 rpg. He's had 10 or more rebounds in eight contests this season and has recorded four double-doubles. The 25 rebounds tied Navy All-American David Robinson (1986) for the second-most rebounds in a game in CAA history and was just one off the conference mark of 26 set by William & Mary's David Cully in 1996.

UNCW's CACOK, NU'S WILLIAMS AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS: UNCW forward Devontae Cacok ranks third in Division I in field goal percentage (78.9%) and 33rd in rebounding (10.0 rpg) according to the latest NCAA stats through games of Dec. 15. Northeastern guard T.J. Williams, who has tallied 20+ points seven times this season, ranks 20th nationally in scoring (21.9 ppg) and 25th in assists (6.0 apg).

CLEANING THE GLASS: Nine of the CAA's 10 teams are out-rebounding their opponents so far this season. Delaware, which ranks 14th nationally, leads the league with a +9.1 rebound margin, while Towson, which is 16th in Division I, has a +8.9 margin.

SIX CAA PLAYERS NOMINATED FOR GOOD WORKS TEAM: Six CAA men's basketball players are nominees for the Allstate NABC Good Works Team. Nominees are CofC's Evan Bailey, Elon's Luke Eddy, Hofstra's Rokas Gustys, UNCW's Chris Flemmings, Towson's Eddie Keith II and W&M's Paul Rowley. The Allstate NABC Good Works Teams® recognize players at all levels of college basketball whose charitable involvement and altruistic acts stand out amongst all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

FRESHMEN MAKE IMMEDIATE IMPACT: The future appears to be bright based on performances from freshmen around the conference. Drexel guard Kurk Lee has scored double figures in all nine games this season and ranks 6th in the league in scoring (16.3 ppg) and 5th in assists (4.6 apg). Hofstra guard Eli Pemberton has reached the 20-point mark four times, including 22 points at FAU, and ranks 8th in the CAA with 14.6 ppg. CofC guard Grant

Riller, who poured in a career-high 26 points vs. Navy, is averaging 10.3 ppg. Delaware's **Ryan Daly** tallied career-highs of 20 points and nine rebounds at Yale and is averaging 10.0 ppg. William & Mary forward **Nathan Knight** had 14 points and seven rebounds against #12 Louisville and 11 points at #6 Duke. Drexel's **Kari Jonsson** is 2nd in the CAA with 2.3 treys per game and is averaging 9.7 ppg.

UNCW, CHARLESTON RANKED IN LATEST MID-MAJOR POLL: UNCW is ranked 5th and **College of Chareston** is ranked #25 in the latests CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll that was released on December 12. **Elon** was among other teams receiving votes in the poll.

UNCW PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE: UNCW, which returns three starters from last year's 25-win team that captured its first CAA championship since 2006, has been picked to win the CAA men's basketball championship in 2016-17 according to a vote of the league's coaches, media relations directors and media members. The Seahawks were followed in the voting by Towson, William & Mary and College of Charleston. Chosen fifth was James Madison, followed by Hofstra, Northeastern, Elon, Drexel and Delaware.

EIGHT ALL-CONFERENCE PLAYERS RETURN: The CAA welcomes back eight players who earned all-conference honors in 2015-16, including three first-team honorees in UNCW guard **Chris Flemmings**, Hofstra forward/center **Rokas Gustys** and William & Mary guard/forward **Omar Prewitt**. Back from the second team is Towson forward **William Adala Moto**. Returning from the third team are College of Charleston forward **Jarrell Brantley**, UNCW guard **Denzel Ingram**, College of Charleston guard **Cameron Johnson** and Towson guard **Mike Morsell**.

MAJORITY OF STARTERS ARE BACK: There will be plenty of familiar faces around the CAA as the league's 10 teams return 60% (30-of-50) of their starters from last season. College of Charleston returns all five regulars from 2015-16, while Elon and James Madison have four starters back and UNCW, Towson and William & Mary return three starters.

EIGHT CAA TEAMS RANKED IN TOP HALF OF FINAL RPI: Eight CAA teams were ranked in the top half of the final NCAA RPI report in 2015-16. UNCW led all CAA squads at #52, followed by Hofstra (#57), William & Mary (#72), James Madison (#106), Northeastern (#114), College of Charleston (#138), Towson (#156) and Elon (#162). The CAA was ranked #9 among the nation's 32 Division I conferences, which matched the highest ranking (2010-11) in CAA history.

CAA WELCOMES NEW COACHES: The CAA welcomes three new head coaches to the conference this season. **Zach Spiker** takes over at Drexel after spending the past seven seasons as head coach at Army West Point. With the Cadets, he compiled 102 victories, including a 19-14 mark in 2015-16. **Louis Rowe** returns as head coach James Madison, where was an All-CAA player for the Dukes (1993-94 and 1995-96) and also served as an assistant coach. He was most recently an assistant coach at Bowling Green. Delaware will be led by new head coach **Martin Ingelsby**, who spent the past 13 years as an assistant at Notre Dame for former Blue Hens' coach Mike Brey. During his time with the Irish, Ingelsby helped guide the team to eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

PILING UP THE WINS: Five CAA teams (Hofstra, UNCW, James Madison, Towson and William & Mary) reached the 20-win mark last season and eight squads had at least 16 victories. It was the first time in the 31-year history of the CAA that the conference had eight teams with at least 16 overall wins. UNCW's 25 wins tied a school record, while Hofstra's 24 wins were the most since 2005-06. James Madison reached 20 wins for the fourth time in eight years, Towson hit 20 wins for the second time in the last three seasons, and William & Mary reached 20 wins for the third straight year.

VARIETY OF CHAMPIONS: Six different schools have won the CAA Men's Basketball Championship over the past six years. The most recent champions are Old Dominion (2011), VCU (2012), James Madison (2013), Delaware (2014), Northeastern (2015) and UNCW (2016).

INCREDIBLE BALANCE: The 2015-16 CAA regular season was one of the most competitive in league history. Of the 20 games over the final two weeks, 13 were decided by six points or less. Over the final seven weeks, half (35-of-70) of all CAA games had margins of six points or less, including eight overtime contests.

CAA SHOWS OVERALL STRENGTH: Showing its overall quality and depth, all 10 CAA members have competed in post-season play over the last five years. The list with the most recent appearance is as follows: College of Charleston (2013/CIT), Delaware (2014/NCAA), Drexel (2012/NIT), Elon (2013/CIT), Hofstra (2016/NIT), James Madison (2015/CIT), UNCW (2016/NCAA), Northeastern (2015/NCAA), Towson (2016/Vegas) and William & Mary (2015/NIT).

CAA MEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP MOVES TO CHARLESTON: The CAA Men's Basketball Championship moves to the North Charleston Coliseum in North Charleston, S.C. on March 3-6. It's the first year of a three-year agreement for the CAA to bring its showcase event to the Lowcountry after a three-year run in Baltimore, Md. Known for rich history, well-preserved architecture, a celebrated restaurant community and mannerly people, the Charleston area has been recognized as a world-class top travel destination by a number of publications, including Condè Nast Traveler and Travel + Leisure. Most recently, it was recognized as the No. 1 Small U.S. City by Condè Nast Traveler 2015 Readers' Choice Awards. Tickets are currently on sale at TicketMaster.com.

OUTSTANDING BROADCAST PACKAGE: The CAA will feature an outstanding broadcast package for the upcoming season. The conference will have more than 80 televised games thanks in large part to the conference's agreements with the NBC Sports Regional Networks, which includes CSN Mid-Atlantic, CSN Philadelphia, CSN New England, The Comcast Network and SNY, and the American Sports Network. CAA fans will also be provided with internet broadcasts of hundreds of additional games through CAA.TV, the conference's digital network. CAA.TV will provide coverage of any non-televised conference games. Games can also be viewed via the CAA.TV channel on the Roku platform.

PILING UP POSTSEASON WINS: CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. During that period, the CAA has had two teams reach the NCAA Final Four, one reach the semifinals of the NIT, and has had squads capture championships of the CBI and CIT.

- On a five-game winning streak after a 53-35 victory at East Carolina on Thursday.
- Joe Chealey scored a team-high 14 points and dished out 4 assists at ECU. He's tallied double figures six times this season and has eclipsed the 20-point mark twice.
- Jarrell Brantley had 11 points and 8 rebounds at ECU. He's scored double figures in 23 of his past 24 games and ranks 3rd in the CAA in rebounding (8.3 rpg).
- Freshman Grant Riller chipped in 8 points at ECU. He's reached double digits four times and ranks third on the team with 10.3 ppg.
- Nick Harris tied his career-high with 13 rebounds at ECU. He's 5th in the CAA in rebounds (7.4 rpg) and 2nd in blocks.
- CofC limited ECU to 35 points, which was the fewest scored by an opponent in its Div. I history. CofC has held 10 of its 11 foes under 70 points this season and tops the CAA and ranks 8th nationally in scoring defense (58.6 ppg).

- Fell 81-63 at Yale on Sunday, ending a twogame winning streak.
- Ryan Daly scored a career-high 20 points and grabbed a career-best 9 rebounds at Yale. He was 5-of-9 from 3-point range after hitting just six treys in his first seven games.
- Chivarsky Corbett added 10 points at Yale, which was his fourth straight game in double figures. He's averaging 13.8 ppg over that stretch.
- Eric Carter had 9 points and a team-high 10 rebounds at Yale. It was his fourth game with double-digit boards. He ranks 4th in the CAA with 8.0 rpg.
- Anthony Mosley made three steals at Yale and is tied for the CAA lead with 2.1 spg.
- UD, which leads the CAA in rebounding margin (+9.1 rpg), was beaten on the glass (37-30) for just the 2nd time at Yale.
- Yale was 13-of-28 from 3 against a UD defense that leads the league in 3-point FG percentage defense (27.9%).

DREXEL 4-6 Overall/0-0 CAA



- Beaten 90-82 at Rider on Friday.
- Rodney Williams poured in a team-high 23 points in 27 minutes at Rider, which was his 5th 20+-point effort of the season. He's 5th in the CAA in scoring (17.3 ppg) and 10th in rebounding (6.4 rpg).
- Kurk Lee contributed 19 points and 4 assists at Rider. Lee has reached double figures in all 10 games and is 6th in the CAA in scoring (16.3 ppg) and 5th in assists (4.6 apg).
- Kari Jonsson ranks 2nd in the CAA with 2.3 treys per game and is shooting 40.4% from beyond the arc.
- Sammy Mojica hit 2-of-4 threes and chipped in 10 points and 7 rebounds at Rider. He's making 39.3% of his 3-point attempts.
- Austin Williams ranks 6th in the CAA in rebounding with 7.1 rpg after grabbing a team-high 9 boards at Rider.
- Miles Overton came off the bench to score 15 points in 20 minutes at Rider. He was 6-of-10 from the floor and hit two treys.

- Dropped a 78-67 decision to UNC Asheville and lost 68-56 at Radford last week.
- Tyler Seibring scored a career-high 21 points with 7 rebounds vs. UNCA and had 9 points and 9 boards at Radford. He's tallied double digits in 6 of 10 games and leads the team in rebounding (6.3 rpg).
- Brian Dawkins tallied 10 points and 7 rebounds at RU. He's averaging 11.9 ppg and is 2nd in the CAA in FG percentage (58.3%).
- Luke Eddy chipped in 12 points and 5 assists vs. UNCA. He's reached double figures in five of the last six games and ranks sixth in the CAA in assists (4.3 apg).
- Dainan Swoope scored 12 points off the bench vs. UNCA and poured in a team-high 13 points at Radford.
- Elon has made at least seven 3-pointers in all 10 games this season. The Phoenix lead the CAA with 9.4 treys per game.
- Elon was held below 70 points for the first time all season by UNCA and Radford.
