Senior Marlena Tremba continued to have the hot hand, averaging 17.0 points on 66.7 percent shooting, as William & Mary extended its winning streak to eight consecutive games. Tremba went 12-for-18 from the floor, including 8-of-14 (.571) from three-point range. She also handled the ball well, committing just one turnover while dishing four assists in two games. Against Norfolk State, Tremba turned a game-high 15 points, while adding three rebounds and three assists. She went onto score a game-high 19 points with three steals and a pair of rebounds as the Tribe topped Mount St. Mary's on Sunday. Tremba, who has been in double-figures in all but one game this season, leads the team in scoring (13.9) while adding 2.3 rebounds a night, 24 assists, 12 steals, and a block.

Rookie Ana Ferariu provided a spark off the bench in Drexel's win against Saint Joseph's on Sunday. Having played limited minutes in just three games entering Sunday, Ferariu checked in during the second half against the Hawks and delivered 18 points in 13 minutes. She went 5-for-6 from the field and 7-for-8 from the foul line. She capitalized on opportunities in key situations to shift the momentum towards the Dragons. She added four rebounds and a late steal that helped lock up the victory.

#CAAHOOPS REWIND

- **College of Charleston (2-7):** The Cougars had a pair of tough road losses to No. 8 Louisville and Western Kentucky last week. **Bri Boyd** made a splash in her CofC debut against Louisville, tallying 14 points and 10 rebounds. **Bre Bolden** dropped in 23 points with five steals against Western Kentucky.
- **Delaware (6-4):** The Blue Hens have been off since December 11 and are set to resume play on December 21 against Hartford.
- **Drexel (6-2):** The Dragons went 2-0 last week, topping Niagara, 69-57, before downing city rival Saint Joseph's, 60-49. Drexel moved to 5-0 at home and extended its winning streak to three games. **Kelsi Lidge** averaged 11.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game while rookie **Bailey Greenburg** added 8.5 points and 7.5 rebounds last week.
- **Elon (5-4):** The Phoenix captured their only game of the week, knocking off East Tennessee State, 79-51, on the road. Four players scored in double figures including **Shay Burnett**, who had a game-high 19 points, and **Ra'Shika White**, who notched her first career double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds.
- **Hofstra (6-3):** The Pride has been off since December 10 and returns to the court on December 22 at Saint Joseph's.
- **James Madison (5-3):** The Dukes have been off since December 5 and gets back on the hardwood on December 21 at St. John's.
- **UNCW (4-5):** The Seahawks split games against a pair of SoCon foes last week. UNCW topped Furman, 56-52, but was clipped by Wofford, 71-67. **Madison Raque** averaged 10.5 points while **Rebekah Banks** notched consecutive 10-rebound games. The Seahawks will play their third game in five games on Monday night, hosting Catawba.
- **Northeastern (2-8):** The Huskies fell at Michigan State in its only game of the week. Sophomore **Jess Genco** paced Northeastern with 18 points which included her 400th career point.
- **Towson (6-4):** The Tigers have been off since December 11 and return to action on December 29 when they host Norfolk State.
- **William & Mary (8-1):** The Tribe pushed its winning streak to eight games, knocking off Norfolk State, 65-62, and Mount St. Mary's, 68-46. Senior **Marlena Tremba** averaged 17.0 points on 66.7 percent shooting for the week while classmate **Alexandra Masaquel** averaged 11.0 points, 7.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists. **Abby Rendle** collected 11 blocks on the week to bring her season total to 31. Rookie **Victoria Reynolds** had another solid week averaging 7.0 points per game and 3.5 rebounds in two wins.

#CAAHOOPS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- The CAA is 50-41 in non-league play this year.
- The CAA is 7-1 against the A-10.
- The CAA is 3-1 against the America East.
- The CAA is 4-0 against the Ivy League.
- From November 14-20, the CAA went 13-7, notching victories over 11 different conferences, including the a win over the Big Ten and pairs of wins over the A-10 and Big South.
- The CAA went a combined 61-56 against non-conference opponents in 2015-16.

HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS

- Elon has a strength of schedule of 14 this season, which includes three ACC opponents and a Big Ten opponent. Drexel has a strength of schedule of 34, which includes clashes against two Big Ten teams, one ACC and one SEC opponent.
- Hofstra's **Ashunae Durant** has posted double-doubles six out of her last seven contests, and has grabbed 10+ rebounds in seven consecutive games. Durant is averaging 15.7 points and 11.3 rebounds. Nationally, she's ranked first in offensive rebounds per game (6.0), eighth in rebounds per game, and ninth in double-doubles (6).
- Pride point guard **Krystal Luciano** has dished out 10+ assists twice this season. She handed out 11 at Sacramento State and 10 against UMass, which included the 400th of her career. She enters the week ranked 17th nationally in assists per game (6.6).
- Drexel senior **Jessica Pellechio** is nearing her 1,000th career point. She enters the week with 940 points.
- The Dragons enter the week ranked 23rd in assist-turnover ratio (1.26) as a team while **Meghan Creighton** is 15th individually (3.25).
- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is ranked third in the nation in scoring at 25.1 points per game and is among the top-20 in five other offensive categories.
- Towson senior **Raven Bankston** is the CAA's second-leading scorer (19.1ppg). Bankston also enters the week ranked 11th nationally in free throw percentage (.921) and eighth in steals (36).
- Towson has scored at least 20 points off opponents' turnovers eight times this season. The Tigers have forced double-digit steals in eight of 10 games this season and are ranked nationally in steals per game (12.3).
- Cougars senior **Bre Bolden** is the CAA's career active leader in steals with 269. She's also third on the NCAA DI active career leaders list. Bolden enters the week ranked sixth in steals per game (3.78).
- UNCW has outrebounded their opponents in five of the last six games. The Seahawks are also 3-0 this season when allowing less than 60 points.
- William & Mary has held six of its last eight opponents to 50 points or less. The Tribe is ranked third nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 49.6 points per game.
- The Tribe is on a eight-game winning streak, tying the program record.
- William & Mary blocked 13 shots, including seven from **Abby Rendle**, against Mount St. Mary's on December 18. Rendle is fifth nationally in blocks per game (3.44) and tenth in total blocks (31).
- Drexel went 22-for-22 from the free throw line against Penn State on November 11. The percentage tied the CAA single record, but the Dragons are the only team to go 22-for-22 at the line.

COLLEGE INSIDER MID-MAJOR POLL

- Two teams appeared in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll while a three received votes on December 13.
- James Madison moved to No. 7 while Drexel moved to No. 18. Elon, William & Mary and Hofstra each received votes.

CAAHOOPS IN THE RPI

- College Basketball News RPI: The CAA was rated eighth as a conference for the third consecutive week on December 19. Two teams were in the top-40 - Drexel (2) and Elon (36) - while Hofstra moved into the top-100, coming in at No. 97.
- NCAA.com RPI: Through games on December 18, two teams were in the top-40: Drexel (20) and Elon (36) while Hofstra cracked the top-100 at 97. The CAA had a conference RPI of 8.

SOLID STARTS

- William & Mary is off to a 8-1 start for the second straight season. It is the first time since the 1976-77 and 1977-78 seasons in which the Tribe has posted back-to-back 8-1 starts.
- Towson got off to a 5-0 start, its best start to a season since the 2008-09 squad also opened the year with five straight victories. It is the fifth time in program history that a Tiger squad has opened the season with at least five straight victories (1977-78, 1979-80, 2006-07, 2008-09 and 2016-17).
- Delaware got off to a 4-0 start the year for the first time since 2010-11 when the Elena Delle Donne led team went 31-2 after a 10-0 start.

HOME SWEET HOME

- The CAA is 24-14 at home so far this season.
- Hofstra is undefeated at home this season and has won nine-straight at the David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex, dating back to last season.
- Drexel is 5-0 at the Daskalakis Athletic Center (DAC) this season.
- James Madison have welcomed 2,000+ fans to the Convocation Center in 42 consecutive games.
- In six seasons under Head Coach Charlotte Smith, the Phoenix is 55-19 at Alumni Gym and have never lost more than five home games in a single season.
- UNCW hosted its first of two "Seahawks Tomorrow" games on December 15. More than 4,400 area elementary school students attended the game.

ROAD WARRIORS

- William & Mary which has 13 road games this season, posted its fourth consecutive road win on December 15. It marks just the second time and the first since 1926-27 that the Tribe has accomplished that feat. W&M has never won five road games to open a single-season.
- Elon is in the middle of a five-game road swing spanning 32 days away from the friendly confines of Alumni Gym. Elon's last home game was November 26 against Wake Forest and won't return home until December 28.

COACHES CORNER

- Head Coach Tina Martin is approaching her 400th career win. Martin, who is in her 21st season, currently holds a 398-226 (.638) all-time record as the winningest coach in UD men's and women's basketball history.
- Elon Head Coach Charlotte Smith is approaching her 100th career victory. She has a 92-74 record.
- Head Coach Sean O'Regan earned his first career victory at the helm of the James Madison in the Dukes' 83-57 victory over St. Francis Brooklyn on November 13.

ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Three CAA student-athletes were nominated for the 2017 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team.
- William & Mary's Alexandra Masaquel, Hofstra's Sydni Epps and Delaware's Hannah Jardine were the three nominees.
- This esteemed award honors an outstanding group of student-athletes who represent the sport's finest in the areas of community service and leadership among their peers.

NAISMITH TROPHY WATCH LIST

- James Madison's Precious Hall was one of 50 players across the country named to the 2017 Naismith Women's College Player of the Year Watch List.
- This marks the second appearance on the Naismith Watch List for Hall, who was included on the 2014-15 Midseason 30 as a junior.
- The Naismith Midseason List of 30 players will be announced by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club on February 8.

LIEBERMAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Drexel senior point guard Meghan Creighton was named one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Award.
- Now in its 17th year, the Nancy Lieberman Award recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. Candidates exhibit the floor leadership, play-making and ball-handling skills of Hall of Famer Nancy Lieberman.
- By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2017 Lieberman Award will be narrowed to just 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to Ms. Lieberman and the Hall of Fame's selection committee.

THE BIG 3-0, PLUS ONE 4-0.

- Three players registered 30-point efforts.
- Towson's Raven Bankston posted 31 points in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell and then delivered 30 points in the 68-63 win over Cornell. Bankston is the first Tiger to have two 30+ point games in a season since Tanisha McTiller in 2013.
- Drexel's Jessica Pellechio dropped in a career-high 30 points, including eight three-pointers, in the 83-60 win against Penn State.
- JMU's Precious Hall, the CAA Preseason Player of the Year, poured in 39 points in the loss to No. 13/14 Tennessee.
- Hall scored 46 points in the double overtime at Rutgers. It was the first 40+ game in the CAA since February 26, 2015 when UNCW's Brie Mobley had 46 points against Delaware. The Seahawks' Kelva Atkins also scored 40 points that season.

THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

- Northeastern and James Madison both competed at the 2016 Cancun Challenge in Puerto Aventuras, Mexico, November 24-26.
- The Dukes topped Idaho State, 83-53, but fell to Iowa, 90-75, in the Riviera Division in pre-set matchups. Guard **Precious Hall** earned a spot on the All-Riviera Tournament Team. It was JMU's fourth trip to the tournament.
- Northeastern played in the tournament's round-robin Mayan Division along with Stanford (L, 74-45), Purdue (L, 79-54), and Wichita State (L, 87-73). Sophomore guard Jess Genco earned a spot on the All-Mayan Tournament Team.
- The annual UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic was held November 26-27. The Seahawks fell to Providence (65-49) and La Salle (64-48) while also welcoming Miami (Ohio) to Trask Coliseum.
- Delaware headed the West Coast for the Cal State Northridge Thanksgiving Classic. The Blue Hens fell to No. 23 Michigan State, 81-64, and then to Detroit Mercy, 66-64.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Elon was the CAA's representative in the 2016 Pre-season WNIT.

- The Phoenix drew a road game at Green Bay in the first round on November 11, falling 74-53.
- Elon traveled to Mount Pleasant, Mich. for the consolation rounds.
- In their first consolation game on November 18, the Phoenix downed Eastern Washington, 76-55, behind three double-digit scoring efforts.
- Elon closed out action by knocking off host Central Michigan, 71-57. The Phoenix was led by rookie **Jada Graves'** 20-point night.
- Elon is one of 16 teams that was selected to participate in the field: Abilene Christian (Southland); Central Michigan (MAC); Colorado State (MWC); Eastern Washington (Big Sky); Fordham (Atlantic 10); Furman (Southern); Green Bay (Horizon); Little Rock (Sun Belt); Missouri (SEC); Nebraska (Big Ten); North Texas (C-USA); Notre Dame (ACC); Omaha (Summit); UT-Rio Grande Valley (WAC); and Washington (Pac-12).
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 15-16 in Preseason WNIT action.

TIP-OFF TIME

- The CAA went a combined 9-4 on opening weekend.
- The 2016-17 season tipped off on November 11 with seven games, six of which were home games. The CAA went 5-2 in those contests, including 5-1 at home.

LOOK WHO'S BACK

- Seven of the 15 All-CAA honorees from last year return for the 2016-17 season, including the two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year, **Bre Bolden** from CoFC. The 2014-15 CAA Player of the Year, **Precious Hall** of James Madison, returns for her final season after missing the entirety of 2015-16 with an injury.
- The offense in the CAA will be plentiful once again this season as 10 of the top-20 scorers from 2015-16 will be back on the hardwood for their respective teams. Out of that group, seven are seniors, two are juniors, and one is a sophomore.

#CAAHOOPS PRESEASON RUNDOWN

- James Madison was predicted to finish atop the conference for the fourth consecutive season.
- It was close voting at the top with the Dukes as the overall favorite with 76 points, Elon in second with 70 points and Drexel in third with 68 points.
- It was also close among the next four teams. Hofstra (49) was picked fourth, Delaware and William & Mary were tied for fifth with 47 points apiece while Northeastern was seventh with 41 points. Rounding out the 10 teams were College of Charleston (19), UNCW (17) and Towson (16).
- After missing all of the 2015-16 season with an injury, redshirt senior guard **Precious Hall** is back to lead James Madison and was tabbed as the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Player of the Year. During 2014-15, Hall averaged 20.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game and was the unanimous choice for CAA Player of the Year.
