Elon junior Shay Burnett helped the Phoenix go undefeated at the Georgia State University Holiday Classic last week. Burnett was named to the All-Tournament Team after averaging 17.0 points, 9.0 rebounds, 6.0 assists and 4.5 steals in two games. She also shot 50 percent (10-for-20) from the field. She had 21 points and six steals in Elon's 65-62 win over Akron, going to the line twice in the final eight seconds and hitting two free throws that thwarted a Zips comeback. Burnett then had a double-double versus host Georgia State with 13 points and 10 rebounds while dishing out seven assists in the Phoenix's 84-67 victory. For the season, Burnett is averaging 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game.

Drexel forward Bailey Greenberg scored 13 points on 5-for-9 shooting in the win over Lafayette as the Dragons extended their winning streak to three games and improved to 7-2 on the season. The 13 points marked a career high for Greenberg, who has started all nine games for the Dragons this season. She was a perfect 3-for-3 from the free throw line and also added an assist and a steal in 24 minutes as Drexel cruised to a 42-point win and was able to rest its starters for long stretches. Greenberg is averaging 8.8 points per game so far this season, which ranks third in the CAA among all freshmen, and has scored in double figures five times this season. It is the second straight week in which a Dragon has earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors.

## #CAAHOOPS REWIND

- College of Charleston (2-8):** The Cougars split games last week, falling at home to Coastal Carolina before picking up a 79-76 win at Charleston Southern. Senior **Bre Bolden** averaged 21.5 points 7.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists with six steals last week.
- Delaware (6-5):** The Blue Hens' comeback fell just short as Hartford pulled out a 67-66 win. Four Blue Hens were in double digits, including **Nicole Enabosi**, who finished with a team-high 14 points and eight rebounds.
- Drexel (7-2):** The Dragons cruised to an 81-39 win at Lafayette. All 10 Dragons scored as Drexel took control with a 17-0 run in the first quarter and never looked back. **Jessica Pellechio** led the Dragons with 14 points. She was joined in double figures by **Bailey Greenberg** (13), **Sarah Curran** (11) and **Ana Ferariu** (10). Defensively, the Dragons forced 24 Lafayette turnovers and had 14 steals.
- Elon (7-4):** The Phoenix swept both games of the Georgia State Holiday Classic, topping Akron, 65-62, before downing the host Panthers, 84-67. The Phoenix has won three straight games. **Essence Baucom** and **Shay Burnett** were placed on the GSU Holiday Classic All-Tournament team.
- Hofstra (7-3):** The Pride won their third straight win as junior **Ashunae Durant** put up a career-high 28 points in the 75-64 victory at Saint Joseph's. Hofstra shot a season-best 54.5 to earn the victory. In addition to Durant's game-high 28 points, senior **Krystal Luciano** (13) and junior **Aleana Leon** (11) were in double-digits.
- James Madison (6-3):** The Dukes battled it out with defending Big East champion St. John's, but were clipped 74-63. **Precious Hall** led JMU with 22 points to push her double-digit scoring streak to nine games. Hall has scored at least 20 points on six occasions this season. Freshman guard **Kamiah Smalls** finished with 12 points.
- UNCW (5-5):** Madison **Raque** erupted for a career-high 28 points as the Seahawks used a record-setting effort from three-point range to earn a 91-65 victory over Catawba to close out their three-game homestand. Raque made 10-of-15 shots from the floor, including an 8-for-12 effort from long range.
- Northeastern (3-7):** The Huskies got back to their winning outlasting the University of Denver, 72-69, on the road. **Francesca Sally**, playing in front of her hometown crowd, shined for the Huskies with 23 points and 11 rebounds for her third double-double of the year. Sally also had three blocks and her perfect 8-for-8 free throw shooting afternoon helped Northeastern earn the victory in the closing seconds. **Gabby Giaccone** also had a strong outing with 18 points.
- Towson (6-4):** The Tigers have been off since December 11 and return to action on December 29 when they host Norfolk State.
- William & Mary (9-1):** The Tribe won their ninth-straight game, setting a program record, with a 73-60 decision over St. Francis (Pa.) At 9-1, W&M is off to its best 10-game start in program history. **Abby Rendle** (17pts, 12reb) and **Alexandra Masaquel** (15pts, 13reb) each had double-doubles while Rendle added six blocks. Senior **Marlena Tremba** added a team-high 18 points.

## #CAAHOOPS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- The CAA is 58-44 in non-league play this year.
- College of Charleston and Delaware have completed non-league play.
- The CAA is 8-1 against the A-10.
- The CAA is 4-0 against the Ivy League.
- From November 14-20, the CAA went 13-7, notching victories over 11 different conferences, including the a win over the Big Ten and pairs of wins over the A-10 and Big South.
- The CAA went a combined 61-56 against non-conference opponents in 2015-16.

## HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is ranked fourth in the nation in scoring at 24.8 points per game. Hall has scored in double digits in nine straight games, posting 20+ points six times.
- Cougars senior **Bre Bolden** is the CAA's career active leader in steals with 275. She is 16 steals away from checking into the all-time top-10 in CAA history.
- UNCW has outrebounded their opponents in six of the last seven games. The Seahawks are also 3-0 when allowing less than 60 points.
- The Seahawks hit 15 three-pointers against Catawba on December 19, tying them for the third most in CAA single-game history. Drexel was the last team to hit 15 three-pointers, doing so last season.
- William & Mary has held six opponent to 50 points or less. The Tribe entered the week ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, and are currently allowing just 50.7 points per game.
- The Tribe is on a nine-game winning streak, tying the program record.
- William & Mary blocked 13 shots, including seven from **Abby Rendle**, against Mount St. Mary's on December 18. Rendle is in the top-10 nationally total blocks (37) and has posted at least six blocks in her last two games.
- Hofstra's **Ashunae Durant** has posted double-doubles six out of her last eight contests but had her seven-game, double-digit rebounding streak snapped on December 22. Durant is averaging 16.9 points and 10.9 rebounds.
- Pride point guard **Krystal Luciano** has dished out 10+ assists twice this season. She handed out 11 at Sacramento State and 10 against UMass, which included the 400th of her career. She's among the top-25 nationally in assists per game (6.2).
- Drexel senior **Jessica Pellechio** is nearing her 1,000th career point. She currently has 954 points.
- Towson has scored at least 20 points off opponents' turnovers eight times this season. The Tigers have forced double-digit steals in eight of 10 games this season and are ranked nationally in steals per game (12.3).
- Drexel went 22-for-22 from the free throw line against Penn State on November 11. The percentage tied the CAA single record, but the Dragons are the only team to go 22-for-22 at the line.

## COLLEGE INSIDER MID-MAJOR POLL

- Two teams appeared in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll while a three received votes on December 20.
- James Madison remained at No. 7 while Drexel moved up to No. 14. Elon, William & Mary and Hofstra each received votes.

## #CAAHOOPS IN THE RPI

- College Basketball News RPI: The CAA was rated eighth as a conference for the fourth consecutive week on December 26. Two teams were in the top-40: Elon (27) and Drexel (38).
- NCAA.com RPI: Through games on December 23, two teams were in the top-40: Elon (27) and Drexel (48). As a conference, the CAA has an RPI of 8.

## SOLID STARTS

- At 9-1, William & Mary is off to its best 10-game start in program history. Last season, the Tribe set the program's best start when they opened the campaign 11-2.
- Towson got off to a 5-0 start, its best start to a season since the 2008-09 squad also opened the year with five straight victories. It is the fifth time in program history that a Tiger squad has opened the season with at least five straight victories (1977-78, 1979-80, 2006-07, 2008-09 and 2016-17).
- Delaware got off to a 4-0 start the year for the first time since 2010-11 when the Elena Delle Donne led team went 31-2 after a 10-0 start.

## HOME SWEET HOME

- The CAA is 30-17 at home so far this season.
- Hofstra is undefeated at home this season and has won nine-straight at the David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex, dating back to last season.
- Drexel is 5-0 at the Daskalakis Athletic Center (DAC) this season.
- William & Mary is 5-1 at Kaplan Arena this season.
- James Madison have welcomed 2,000+ fans to the Convocation Center in 42 consecutive games.
- In six seasons under Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**, the Phoenix is 55-19 at Alumni Gym and have never lost more than five home games in a single season.
- UNCW hosted its first of two "Seahawks Tomorrow" games on December 15. More than 4,400 area elementary school students attended the game.

## ROAD WARRIORS

- William & Mary which has 13 road games this season, posted its fourth consecutive road win on December 15. It marks just the second time and the first since 1926-27 that the Tribe has accomplished that feat. W&M has never won five road games to open a single-season.
- Elon had a five-game road swing spanning 32 days away from the friendly confines of Alumni Gym. Elon's last home game was November 26 against Wake Forest and finally returns home on December 28.

## USBWA NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Drexel's **Ana Ferariu** was named the USBWA National Freshman of the Week on December 20. Ferariu, who also earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors, came off the bench in the second half to score 18 points in 13 minutes in the win against Saint Joseph's.

## COACHES CORNER

- Head Coach **Tina Martin** is approaching her 400th career win. Martin, who is in her 21st season, currently holds a 398-227 (.638) all-time record as the winningest coach in UD men's and women's basketball history.
- Elon Head Coach **Charlotte Smith** is approaching her 100th career victory. She has a 94-74 record.
- Head Coach **Sean O'Regan** earned his first career victory at the helm of the James Madison in the Dukes' 83-57 victory over St. Francis Brooklyn on November 13.

## ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Three CAA student-athletes were nominated for the 2017 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team.
- William & Mary's **Alexandra Masaque**, Hofstra's **Sydni Epps** and Delaware's **Hannah Jardine** were the three nominees.
- This esteemed award honors an outstanding group of student-athletes who represent the sport's finest in the areas of community service and leadership among their peers.

## NAISMITH TROPHY WATCH LIST

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** was one of 50 players across the country named to the 2017 Naismith Women's College Player of the Year Watch List.
- This marks the second appearance on the Naismith Watch List for Hall, who was included on the 2014-15 Midseason 30 as a junior.
- The Naismith Midseason List of 30 players will be announced by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club on February 8.

## LIEBERMAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Drexel senior point guard **Meghan Creighton** was named one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Award.
- Now in its 17th year, the Nancy Lieberman Award recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. Candidates exhibit the floor leadership, play-making and ball-handling skills of Hall of Famer Nancy Lieberman.
- By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2017 Lieberman Award will be narrowed to just 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to Ms. Lieberman and the Hall of Fame's selection committee.

## THE BIG 3-0, PLUS ONE 4-0.

- Three players registered 30-point efforts.
- Towson's **Raven Bankston** posted 31 points in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell and then delivered 30 points in the 68-63 win over Cornell. Bankston is the first Tiger to have two 30+ point games in a season since Tanisha McTiller in 2013.
- Drexel's **Jessica Pellechio** dropped in a career-high 30 points, including eight three-pointers, in the 83-60 win against Penn State.
- JMU's **Precious Hall**, the CAA Preseason Player of the Year, poured in 39 points in the loss to No. 13/14 Tennessee.
- Hall scored 46 points in the double overtime at Rutgers. It was the first 40+ game in the CAA since February 26, 2015 when UNCW's Brie Mobley had 46 points against Delaware. The Seahawks' Kelda Atkins also scored 40 points that season.

## THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

- Northeastern and James Madison both competed at the 2016 Cancun Challenge in Puerto Aventuras, Mexico, November 24-26.
- The Dukes topped Idaho State, 83-53, but fell to Iowa, 90-75, in the Riviera Division in pre-set matchups. Guard **Precious Hall** earned a spot on the All-Riviera Tournament Team. It was JMU's fourth trip to the tournament.
- Northeastern played in the tournament's round-robin Mayan Division along with Stanford (L, 74-45), Purdue (L, 79-54), and Wichita State (L, 87-73). Sophomore guard Jess Genco earned a spot on the All-Mayan Tournament Team.
- The annual UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic was held November 26-27. The Seahawks fell to Providence (65-49) and La Salle (64-48) while also welcoming Miami (Ohio) to Trask Coliseum.
- Delaware headed the West Coast for the Cal State Northridge Thanksgiving Classic. The Blue Hens fell to No. 23 Michigan State, 81-64, and then to Detroit Mercy, 66-64.

## #CAAHOOPS IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Elon was the CAA's representative in the 2016 Pre-season WNIT.

- The Phoenix drew a road game at Green Bay in the first round on November 11, falling 74-53.
- Elon traveled to Mount Pleasant, Mich. for the consolation rounds.
- In their first consolation game on November 18, the Phoenix downed Eastern Washington, 76-55, behind three double-digit scoring efforts.
- Elon closed out action by knocking off host Central Michigan, 71-57. The Phoenix was led by rookie **Jada Graves'** 20-point night.
- Elon is one of 16 teams that was selected to participate in the field: Abilene Christian (Southland); Central Michigan (MAC); Colorado State (MWC); Eastern Washington (Big Sky); Fordham (Atlantic 10); Furman (Southern); Green Bay (Horizon); Little Rock (Sun Belt); Missouri (SEC); Nebraska (Big Ten); North Texas (C-USA); Notre Dame (ACC); Omaha (Summit), UT-Rio Grande Valley (WAC); and Washington (Pac-12).
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 15-16 in Preseason WNIT action.

## TIP-OFF TIME

- The CAA went a combined 9-4 on opening weekend.
- The 2016-17 season tipped off on November 11 with seven games, six of which were home games. The CAA went 5-2 in those contests, including 5-1 at home.

## LOOK WHO'S BACK

- Seven of the 15 All-CAA honorees from last year return for the 2016-17 season, including the two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year, **Bre Bolden** from CoFC. The 2014-15 CAA Player of the Year, **Precious Hall** of James Madison, returns for her final season after missing the entirety of 2015-16 with an injury.
- The offense in the CAA will be plentiful once again this season as 10 of the top-20 scorers from 2015-16 will be back on the hardwood for their respective teams. Out of that group, seven are seniors, two are juniors, and one is a sophomore.

## #CAAHOOPS PRESEASON RUNDOWN

- James Madison was predicted to finish atop the conference for the fourth consecutive season.
- It was close voting at the top with the Dukes as the overall favorite with 76 points, Elon in second with 70 points and Drexel in third with 68 points.
- It was also close among the next four teams. Hofstra (49) was picked fourth, Delaware and William & Mary were tied for fifth with 47 points apiece while Northeastern was seventh with 41 points. Rounding out the 10 teams were College of Charleston (19), UNCW (17) and Towson (16).
- After missing all of the 2015-16 season with an injury, redshirt senior guard **Precious Hall** is back to lead James Madison and was tabbed as the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Player of the Year. During 2014-15, Hall averaged 20.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game and was the unanimous choice for CAA Player of the Year.
