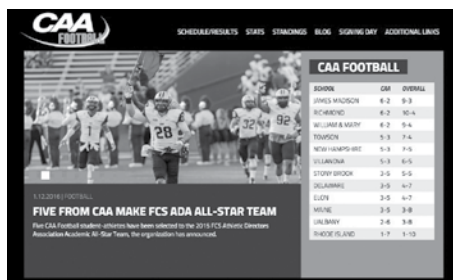

CONFERENCE NOTES:

EIGHT CAA VS. FBS MATCHUPS IN WEEK 1: The opening week of the 2016 season features eight of CAA Football's 12 teams facing FBS opponents on the road. On Thursday, Maine visits Connecticut and William & Mary travels to NC State, while on Friday, UAlbany opens at Buffalo for the second straight season. Saturday's slate includes Villanova at Pittsburgh, Richmond traveling to Virginia, Towson heading to USF, Rhode Island visiting Kansas and New Hampshire making the cross country trek to San Diego State. All 12 CAA Football teams will play at least one FBS foe during the non-conference schedule. CAA Football teams have posted 32 victories over FBS opponents in its history, including James Madison defeating SMU, 48-45, a year ago. A complete list of CAA Football wins over FBS opponents can be found on Page 15 of this release.

SIX CAA TEAMS RANKED IN PRESEASON NATIONAL POLLS: Six of CAA Football's 12 teams are ranked among the top 25 nationally in two of the three major preseason polls. The STATS Top 25 poll features #4 Richmond, #9 William & Mary, #12 James Madison, #22 New Hampshire, #23 Villanova and #24 Towson, while the HERO Sports Top 25 includes #5 Richmond, #9 William & Mary, #12 James Madison, #21 New Hampshire, #22 Villanova and #25 Towson. Four CAAFB teams are among the FCS Coaches Top 25 with #4 Richmond, #10 William & Mary, #11 James Madison and #22 Villanova.

CAA PLAYERS ON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LISTS: CAA Football had six players named to the STATS FCS Preseason Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year Watch Lists. William & Mary senior running back Kendell Anderson, Richmond junior quarterback Kyle Lauletta and Towson senior running back Darius Victor made the offensive list, while James Madison junior defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah, New Hampshire senior cornerback Casey DeAndrade and Richmond senior safety David Jones were on the defensive list. Those six players were among 14 from CAA Football who were honored on various preseason All-America squads. A complete list can be found on Page 12 of this release.

RICHMOND PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE: Richmond, which returns 19 starters from last year's 10-4 team that earned a share of the CAA title and advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA FCS playoffs, was the overwhelming choice to win the CAA Football championship in 2016. William & Mary and James Madison, who shared last year's CAA crown with the Spiders, were chosen second and third, respectively, in the poll of coaches and media relations directors. Villanova was picked fourth, followed by New Hampshire, Towson, Delaware, Stony Brook, Maine, Elon, UAlbany and Rhode Island.

UR'S LAULETTA AND JONES HEADLINE PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM: Richmond junior quarterback Kyle Lauletta was chosen as the CAA preseason Offensive Player of the Year, while Spiders' senior safety David Jones was selected as the CAA preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of the league's head coaches and media relations directors. Lauletta passed for 3,598 yards, which was the second-highest total in FCS, and 19 TD's last year, while Jones made a school-record nine interceptions, which tied for the most in FCS, and also contributed a career-high 97 tackles. LEGENDARY COACHES: Two of the three winningest active coaches in Division I football patrol the sidelines in the CAA. Villanova's Andy Talley, who enters his 32nd and final season as head coach of the Wildcats, leads all active coaches with 249 wins. William & Mary's Jimmie Laycock, who begins his 37th season with the Tribe, ranks third in victories with 238. Talley also has the most career wins in CAA Football games (137), while Laycock ranks second (106) and New Hampshire's Sean McDonnell is sixth (85).

MULTIPLE TEAMS IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS: CAA Football had four teams (James Madison, Richmond, New Hampshire and William & Mary) selected to the FCS playoffs for the second straight season in 2015. CAA Football has had multiple teams in the playoffs for

25 straight years and three or more teams in the playoff field for 10 years in a row. It was the eighth time in league history that at least four teams had been chosen. CAA Football had a league-record five teams picked in 2007, 2008 and 2011.

PLAYOFF SUCCESS: Richmond advanced to the semifinals of the FCS playoffs in 2015, which marked the third year in a row that at least one CAA Football team has reached the final four. CAA Football has had eight different teams reach the semifinals over the past decade and 22 semifinalists overall. Since 2003, CAA Football has a team in the FCS title game eight times, with four different squads capturing national titles - Delaware (2003), James Madison (2004), Richmond (2008) and Villanova (2009).

NEW HAMPSHIRE EXTENDS PLAYOFF STREAK: New Hampshire earned a berth in the FCS playoffs for the 12th consecutive year in 2015, extending the longest active streak in the nation. Under coach Sean McDonnell, the Wildcats have recorded 12 straight winning seasons with double-digit victory totals in six of them. UNH had an incredible streak of 162 straight weeks ranked in the STATS FCS Top 25 poll from Sept. 6, 2004 until Oct. 12, 2015.

CAA WELCOMES TWO NEW COACHES: CAA Football will have two new head coaches this season. Mike Houston takes over at James Madison after guiding The Citadel to a 9-4 overall record, a share of the Southern Conference title and a first-round victory in the FCS playoffs in 2015. Houston, who had a 14-11 mark in two years with the Bulldogs, was the SoCon and AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year last season. Harasymiak moves up to the head coaching role at Maine after serving as the Black Bears' defensive coordinator for the past two seasons, and he has been a member of the UM coaching staff since 2011. At 30 years old, he's the youngest head coach in Division I football.

STADIUM RENOVATIONS AT UNH AND W&M: New Hampshire and William & Mary have completed significant upgrades to their football facilities for the 2016 season. UNH will play in the new Wildcat Stadium, which has a capacity of 10,700 and features suites, a new press box, renovated concession and ticketing areas and a new video board. W&M has completed a renovation of Zable Stadium that includes a new upper deck, a new press box, suites and renovated concession areas.

TOP RUSHERS RETURN: CAA Football featured seven of the top 50 rushers in FCS football last season, and six of them return in 2016. The list includes W&M's Kendell Anderson (1,418 yds/9th), JMU's Cardon Johnson (1,037 yds/27th), Towson's Darius Victor (1,021 yds/31st), JMU's Khalid Abdullah (975 yds/36th), Delaware's Thomas Jefferson (890 yds/47th) and UNH's Dalton Crossan (885 yds/48th). Also returning after missing most of last year due to injury are Stony Brook's Stacey Bedell (1,070 yds in 2014) and Delaware's Wes Hills (952 yds in 2014).

UR'S BROWN CLOSING IN ON RECEIVING MARKS: Richmond senior wide receiver Brian Brown enters the season with 2,718 receiving yards and needs 632 more to move into the top 10 on CAA Football's career list. Brown, who is just 384 yards shy of the Spiders' school record, caught 76 passes for 1,450 yards in 2015. He also had 79 catches for 1,089 yards as a sophomore and is the first player in program history to record back-to-back 1,000-yard campaigns.

UALBANY**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Return 19 starters from last season, including all 11 regulars on offense.
- Junior quarterback DJ Crook made seven starts last season and passed for 1,168 yards and 8 TD's. The Penn State transfer threw for a season-high 261 yards in a win over Duquesne on Sept. 26.
- Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks ran for a team-high 609 yards and 2 TD's as a true freshman last season. He averaged 5.9 yards per carry and rushed for a season-best 202 yards on 25 carries at Richmond on Oct. 31.
- The Great Danes welcome back linebacker Michael Nicastro, who suffered a season-ending knee injury in the opener vs. Buffalo last year. He was a 3rd-team All-CAA pick in 2014 after recording 120 tackles.
- Linebacker Julian Cox was the CAA Co-Defensive Rookie of the Year and a 3rd-team All-CAA selection in 2015 after making a team-high 94 tackles.
- Jon Martin averaged 41.7 yards per punt last year and dropped 20 inside the 20.

DELAWARE**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Return 17 starters from last season - nine on offense and eight on defense.
- Running back Thomas Jefferson was named the CAA Co-Offensive Rookie of the Year after rushing for a team-high 890 yards and 7 TD's last season. The total was the 2nd-most ever by a UD freshman.
- Junior linebacker Charles Bell made a team-high 96 tackles last season and made the All-CAA second team. He made a career-high 11 stops four times.
- Junior defensive tackle Blaine Woodson has earned 2nd team All-CAA honors for the past two seasons. He tallied 29 tackles, 2 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss in 2015.
- UD ranked 24th nationally in total defense (329.2 ypg) last season. The Blue Hens were also 17th nationally in rush defense (123.5 ypg) and 22nd in scoring defense (20.5 ppg).
- Senior offensive lineman Connor Bozick has made 23 consecutive starts. He was a member of the All-CAA 3rd team last year.

ELON**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Return 13 starters from last season, including nine on the offensive side.
- Quarterback Connor Christiansen appeared in all 11 games and started five as a freshman last year. He threw for 1,246 yards and 7 TD's. He began his career by attempting 106 passes before throwing an interception.
- Malcolm Summers ran for a team-high 319 yards and 4 TD's as a true freshman last season.
- Wide receiver Tre Lennon made a team-best 38 catches for 436 yards in 2015. He had four grabs for a career-high 110 yards and a TD vs. Richmond.
- Senior linebacker John Silas earned 3rd team All-CAA honors last year after making 104 total tackles. He also had 7.0 TFL, 3.5 sacks and 4 pass breakups.
- Senior punter David Petroni made the All-CAA 3rd team after averaging 41.3 yards per kick last season, including 10 punts of 50+ yards.

JAMES MADISON**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Return 17 starters from last year's 9-3 team that earned a berth in the NCAA FCS playoffs the second straight season.
- Mike Houston begins his first season as head coach at JMU. In 2015, he was named SoCon Coach of the Year after guiding The Citadel to a 9-4 record, a share of the SoCon title and a berth in the FCS playoffs.
- Running backs Cardon Johnson (1,037 yds, 10 TD's) and Khalid Abdullah (975 yds, 13 TD's) were both among the CAA's top five in rushing last season.
- Receiver Brandon Ravenel made the All-CAA first team in 2015 after making a team-high 57 catches for 683 yards and 4 TD's.
- Andrew Ankrah earned 1st team All-CAA and 2nd team All-America accolades in 2015 after registering 56 tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks. He's moving from linebacker to the defensive line this year.
- Cornerback Taylor Reynolds is a two-time All-CAA selection. He had 46 tackles, 3 interceptions and a league-high 19 PBU's last year.

MAINE**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Return 17 starters from last season, including 10 on the offensive side of the ball.
- Joe Harasymiak begins his first year as Maine's head coach after serving as the defensive coordinator for the past two seasons. At 30 years old, he's the youngest head coach in Division I.
- Maine features a pair of All-CAA receivers in 2nd-team pick Micah Wright (61 rec., 818 yds., 5 TD's) and 3rd-team honoree Jordan Dunn (56 rec., 595 yds., 3 TD's).
- Quarterbacks Dan Collins and Drew Belcher have combined to play in 35 career games. Collins threw for 1,542 yds last year while Belcher passed for 728 and ran for 314.
- Senior DL Patrick Ricard made the All-CAA first team last season after leading the league with 16.5 tackles for loss and adding 7.0 sacks and three forced fumbles.
- Maine ranked 3rd in the CAA in total defense (316.8 ypg), 2nd in rushing defense (110.8 ypg) and 5th in scoring defense (21.5 ppg) last season.

NEW HAMPSHIRE**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Return 13 starters from last year's 7-5 squad that advanced to the NCAA FCS playoffs for the 12th year in a row - which is the longest active streak in the nation.
- UNH will play its first game at newly constructed Wildcat Stadium on Sept. 10. The 12,800-seat facility includes a new video board, press box and club suites.
