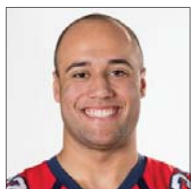
CAA FOOTBALL WEEK 2 AWARDS



Offensive Player of the Week

Christian Summers | WR | Towson

Summers made six receptions for 232 yards and 2 TD's as Towson rallied past St. Francis (Pa.), 35-28, last Saturday. The senior wide receiver tied the game at 28-28 late in the third quarter with a 94-yard TD reception, and made a diving 43-yard TD catch with 2:21 left that was the game-winner. The 232 yards were the fifth-most in school history.



Defensive Player of the Week

Brandon Waller | DL | Richmond

Waller recorded a career-high nine tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, 2 quarterback hurries and a sack as Richmond blanked Norfolk State, 34-0, last Saturday. The junior defensive lineman led a Spiders' defense that held NSU to just 122 total yards and recorded their first shutout since 2014.



Special Teams Player of the Week

Rashard Davis | PR | James Madison

Davis returned a punt 75 yards for a touchdown as James Madison defeated Central Connecticut State, 56-21, last Saturday. It was the second consecutive week that Davis has taken a punt to the end zone after having a 76-yard TD return a week ago against Morehead State.



Rookie of the Week

Pop Lacey | S | New Hampshire

Lacey recorded a game-high 14 tackles, including 12 solo, as New Hampshire came from behind to defeat Holy Cross, 39-28, last Saturday. The true freshman safety also had a pass breakup as the Wildcats limited the Crusaders to seven second-half points.

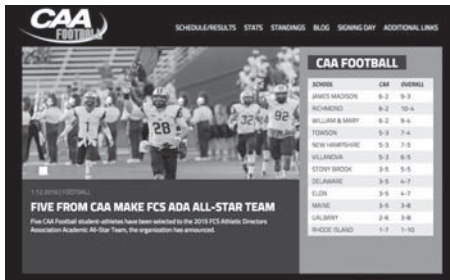

CONFERENCE NOTES:

CAA GOES 7-0 AGAINST FCS TEAMS LAST WEEK: CAA Football teams were a perfect 7-0 in FCS non-conference games last week and improved to 10-1 on the season. The league is a combined 12-10 in non-conference contests for the season, with nine of the 10 setbacks coming against FBS competition.

CAA RECORDS TWO WINS OVER FBS FOES: CAA Football teams have posted a pair of victories over FBS opponents this season as Richmond knocked off ACC member Virginia, 37-20, and UAlbany defeated Buffalo, 22-16. It was the Spiders' first triumph against the Cavaliers since 1946 and ended the ACC's 68-game win streak vs. FCS competition. The Great Danes posted their first win ever against an FBS opponent and avenged a 51-14 loss to the Bulls a year ago. CAA Football teams have recorded 34 victories over FBS foes in its history and it's the first time since 2013 that the league has won two in the same year. A complete list of CAA Football wins over FBS opponents can be found on Page 15 of this release.

SIX CAA TEAMS RANKED IN NATIONAL POLLS: Six of CAA Football's 12 teams are ranked among the top 25 nationally again this week. The STATS Top 25 poll features #2 Richmond, #11 James Madison, #13 William & Mary, #21 Villanova, #22 New Hampshire and #25 UAlbany, while the HERO Sports Top 25 includes #2 Richmond, #12 James Madison, #14 William & Mary, #21 New Hampshire, #22 Villanova and #25 UAlbany. Five CAAFB teams are among the FCS Coaches Top 25 with #2 Richmond, #8 James Madison, #14 William & Mary, #18 Villanova and #25 UAlbany. Three other squads - Towson, Stony Brook and Delaware - were among other teams receiving votes in the various polls.

UALBANY CAPTURES CAA OPENER: UAlbany defeated Rhode Island 35-7 last Saturday in the first CAA Football contest of the season. Sophomore Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks rushed for 178 yards and 3 TD's to lead the Great Danes. Four more teams will open league action on Saturday as Richmond visits Stony Brook in a game televised by the American Sports Network at Noon and Villanova entertains Towson at 3:30 p.m. in a game televised by Comcast SportsNet.

SIX CAA PLAYERS AMONG TOP 30 IN RUSHING: CAA Football features six players among the top 30 in FCS in rushing. UAlbany's Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks ranks second with 141.0 ypg and is followed by UNH's Dalton Crossan (118.5 ypg/9th), JMU's Cardon Johnson (112.5 ypg/14th), Delaware's Wes Hills (106.5 ypg/21st) and Thomas Jefferson (97.0 ypg/28th) and Villanova's Javon White (96.0 ypg/30th).

JMU PILES UP THE POINTS: JMU leads the nation in scoring (68.0 ppg) after tallying a school-record 80 points in its season-opening win over Morehead State and following with 56 points in last week's victory over Central Connecticut State. The Dukes scored touchdowns on their first seven drives vs. MSU and their first five drives against CCSU. JMU also tops FCS in rushing (405.0 ypg) after having three players top the 100-yard mark on the ground in the opener and two more do it last week.

UR'S BROWN CLOSING IN ON RECEIVING MARKS: Richmond senior wide receiver Brian Brown made four catches for 71 yards at Virginia last Saturday. He currently has 2,877 career receiving yards and needs 473 more to move into the top 10 on CAA Football's career list. Brown, who is just 225 yards shy of the Spiders' school record, caught 76 passes for 1,450 yards in 2015. He also had 79 catches for 1,089 yards as a sophomore and is the first player in program history to record back-to-back 1,000-yard campaigns.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE: Maine is one of only five teams in FCS that hasn't committed a turnover yet this season. UAlbany and Delaware are tied for the national lead in turnover margin (+6) and pass interceptions (8).

JMU SETS PUNT RETURN MARK: James Madison tied a CAA single-game record by returning two punts for touchdowns against Central Connecticut State last week. **Rashard Davis** had a 75-yard TD return in the third quarter and **John Miller** followed with a 56-yard return in the fourth. Davis also had a 76-yard punt return for a score vs. Morehead State in the opener. JMU is averaging a nation's-best 69.0 yards on punt returns this season.

RICHMOND PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE: Richmond, which returns 19 starters from last year's 10-4 team that earned a share of the CAA title and advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA FCS playoffs, was the overwhelming choice to win the CAA Football championship in 2016. William & Mary and James Madison, who shared last year's CAA crown with the Spiders, were chosen second and third, respectively, in the poll of coaches and media relations directors. Villanova was picked fourth, followed by New Hampshire, Towson, Delaware, Stony Brook, Maine, Elon, UAlbany and Rhode Island.

UR'S LAULETTA AND JONES HEADLINE PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM: Richmond junior quarterback Kyle Lauletta was chosen as the CAA preseason Offensive Player of the Year, while Spiders' senior safety David Jones was selected as the CAA preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of the league's head coaches and media relations directors. Lauletta passed for 3,598 yards, which was the second-highest total in FCS, and 19 TD's last year, while Jones made a school-record nine interceptions, which tied for the most in FCS, and also contributed a career-high 97 tackles. LEGENDARY COACHES: Two of the three winningest active coaches in Division I football patrol the sidelines in the CAA. Villanova's Andy Talley, who is in his 32nd and final season as head coach of the Wildcats, leads all active coaches with 250 wins. William & Mary's Jimmie Laycock, who is in his 37th season with the Tribe, ranks third in victories with 239. Talley also has the most career wins in CAA Football games (137), while Laycock ranks second (106) and New Hampshire's Sean McDonnell is sixth (85).

MULTIPLE TEAMS IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS: CAA Football had four teams (James Madison, Richmond, New Hampshire and William & Mary) selected to the FCS playoffs for the second straight season in 2015. CAA Football has had multiple teams in the playoffs for 25 straight years and three or more teams in the playoff field for 10 years in a row. It was the eighth time in league history that at least four teams had been chosen. CAA Football had a league-record five teams picked in 2007, 2008 and 2011.

PLAYOFF SUCCESS: Richmond advanced to the semifinals of the FCS playoffs in 2015, which marked the third year in a row that at least one CAA Football team has reached the final four. CAA Football has had eight different teams reach the semifinals over the past decade and 22 semifinalists overall. Since 2003, CAA Football has a team in the FCS title game eight times, with four different squads capturing national titles - Delaware (2003), James Madison (2004), Richmond (2008) and Villanova (2009).

NEW HAMPSHIRE EXTENDS PLAYOFF STREAK: New Hampshire earned a berth in the FCS playoffs for the 12th consecutive year in 2015, extending the longest active streak in the nation. Under coach Sean McDonnell, the Wildcats have recorded 12 straight winning seasons with double-digit victory totals in six of them. UNH had an incredible streak of 162 straight weeks ranked in the STATS FCS Top 25 poll from Sept. 6, 2004 until Oct. 12, 2015.

STADIUM RENOVATIONS AT UNH AND W&M: New Hampshire and William & Mary have completed significant upgrades to their football facilities for the 2016 season. UNH will play in the new Wildcat Stadium, which has a capacity of 10,700 and features suites, a new press box, renovated concession and ticketing areas and a new video board. W&M has completed a renovation of Zable Stadium that includes a new upper deck, a new press box, suites and renovated concession areas.

UALBANY**2-0 Overall/1-0 CAAFB**

- Topped Rhode Island 35-7 last week in their CAA opener. Improved to 2-0 on the road.
- The Great Danes are ranked #25 nationally this week, marking the first time since Oct. 27, 2014 they have been in the top 25.
- Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks ran for 178 yards and 3 TD's on 27 carries at URI. It was his second straight 100+-yard effort and the fourth of his career. He ranks 2nd in FCS in rushing.
- Linebacker Michael Nicastro, who missed nearly all of last year with a knee injury, had 11 tackles and an interception vs. Buffalo and returned a fourth-quarter interception 80 yards for a TD at URI.
- Cornerback Rayshan Clark also had a 25-yard interception return for a TD at URI. UAlbany is tied for the FCS lead with six pickoffs this season.
- UAlbany's season-opening win at Buffalo (22-16) was its first-ever over an FBS foe.
- Punter Jon Martin is averaging 43.1 yards this season with 3 kicks over 50 yards.

DELAWARE**2-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Earned a 24-6 win at Lafayette last week. Off to a 2-0 start for the third time in five years.
- Running backs Thomas Jefferson (124 yds) and Jalen Randolph (105 yds) both topped the century mark at Lafayette. The Blue Hens rank fourth in FCS in rushing (335.5 ypg) this season.
- Wes Hills ran for a career-high 212 yards and 2 TD's in the opener vs. DSU, but suffered an elbow injury at Lafayette. It was the 9th-highest rushing total in UD history and Hills' fifth career 100+-yard effort.
- UD limited Lafayette to 189 total yards and Delaware State to 184 total yards. The Blue Hens rank 3rd nationally in total defense, 4th in scoring defense and 8th in rushing defense.
- Delaware is tied for the FCS national lead with six interceptions this season after picking off only seven passes a year ago.
- Frank Raggo kicked a 43-yard field goal at Lafayette, which was the 2nd-longest of his career.

ELON**0-2 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Dropped a 47-14 decision at FBS foe Charlotte last Saturday.
- Quarterback Daniel Thompson set career-highs for completions (29), pass attempts (50) and pass yardage (322) at Charlotte.
- True freshmen wide receivers Cole Taylor, Jeremiah Bridges and De'Sean McNair combined to make 16 catches for 222 yards at Charlotte.
- Junior Brandon Gentry ran for a team-high 56 yards on 9 carries at Charlotte. His 2-yard TD run capped a 12-play, 99-yard drive on Elon's opening possession.
- Senior kicker John Gallagher ranks third on Elon's career field goals chart with 37.
- Elon's 97-player roster includes 32 true freshmen, 17 red-shirt freshmen and 21 sophomores. The Phoenix only have nine seniors on this year's squad.
- Elon starting quarterback Connor Christiansen suffered a season-ending shoulder injury in the opener vs. Gardner-Webb.

JAMES MADISON**2-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Topped Central Connecticut 56-21 last week. JMU leads FCS in scoring (68.0 ppg) and its 136 points over a two-game span are the most in school history.
- Cardon Johnson (121 yds) topped the 100-yard mark for the second straight game and Khalid Abdullah added 113 yards to eclipse the 2,000-yard rushing mark for his career.
- Junior QB Bryan Schor completed his first 12 passes vs. CCSU and finished 17-of-21 for 205 yards and 3 TD's. He's completing 78.1% of his passes for the season.
- JMU leads FCS in rushing (405.0 ypg) and has had four different players run for over 100 yards during the first two games.
- JMU's defense limited CCSU to 224 total yards and the Dukes rank 5th in FCS in total defense, 11th in rush defense and 13th in scoring defense.
