Senior Lauren Brown led Elon in scoring to help the Phoenix remain undefeated in league play and extend their winning streak to nine games. Brown averaged 17.5 points on 50 percent shooting (11-for-22) from the field, which included eight three-pointers. She began the week with 16 points, two assists, a block

and a steal in the road win at Charleston. In the win against Drexel, Brown recorded 19 points and two steals without turnover in 37 minutes of action. She sparked a crucial 11-2 run in the third period to help Elon pull away from the Dragons and then hit a key bucket late in the fourth quarter to help stave off a Drexel comeback. For the year, Brown is averaging 12.0 points per game.

KAMIAH SMALLS Freshman | Guard | Philadelphia, Pa. James Madison University



Freshman guard continued her strong play, averaging 12.0 points, 4.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists last week. Smalls shots 58.3 percent from the floor, connecting on seven of the 12 shots she took and went 9-for-10 from the free throw line. In the win against Delaware, Smalls tallied six points and dished out a career-high

five assists. She followed that up by tying a career-best with 18 points and eight rebounds to help the Dukes to the win over Northeastern. Small has scored in double figures 12 times this season and is averaging 11.4 points and 5.6 rebounds this season.

#CAAHOOPS REWIND

- Charleston (5-11; 2-3 CAA): The Cougars had a pair of tough losses to Elon and Towson last week. Dajah Logan shot 54.2 percent for the week and averaged 14.0 points while senior Bre Bolden averaged a double-double with 12.0 points and 10.0 rebounds per game.
- Delaware (8-8; 2-3 CAA): The Blue Hens split games last week, falling to James Madison before picking up the road win at Hofstra. Sunday's win marked the 400th for Head Coach Tina Martin. Nicole Enabosi averaged 18.0 points and 14.5 rebounds and extended her double-double streak to three games.
- Drexel (12-4; 3-2 CAA): The Dragons split a pair of road games last week, downing UNCW before falling to Elon. Sarah Curran averaged 16.0 points for the week while Jessica Pellechio posted 12.0 points per game, which included 24 points against Elon.
- Elon (13-4; 5-0 CAA): The Phoenix remained perfect in CAA play, notching wins over Charleston and Drexel to extend their winning streak to nine. The streak is the longest in the DI history of the Phoenix. Senior Lauren Brown led Elon in scoring in both games this week. The Phoenix not only completed the season sweep of Drexel on Sunday, but Head Coach Charlotte Smith picked up her 100th career victory.
- Hofstra (8-7; 1-3 CAA): The Pride split games, notching their first CAA win of the year at Towson before falling at home to Delaware. Senior Krystal Luciano averaged 16.5 points and 6.5 assists per game while junior Ashunae Durant averaged 14.5 points and 13.5 rebounds.
- James Madison (11-5; 4-1 CAA): The Dukes returned to the win column, with victories over Delaware and Northeastern. Precious Hall averaged 23.0 points and 9.0 rebounds and brought her career point total to 1,879 which ranks her eighth all-time in CAA history.
- UNCW (5-11; 0-5 CAA): The Seahawks had a tough week, with losses to Drexel and William & Mary. Jordan Henry had a solid week, averaging 11.5 points and 8.5 rebounds per game. Rebekah Banks continued to be solid on the glass, averaging 10.0 rebounds for the week.
- Northeastern (6-11; 2-3 CAA): The Huskies dropped a pair of road games to William & Mary and James Madison. Senior Francesca Sally averaged a double-double, with 15.0 points and 12.5 rebounds per games. Sally has notched double-doubles in each of her last three games.
- Towson (9-7; 2-3 CAA): The Tigers split a pair of home games, falling to Hofstra before edging Charleston. Raine Bankston had a solid week, averaging 12.0 points and 5.0 rebounds.
- William & Mary (13-2; 3-1 CAA): The Tribe went 2-0 topping Northeastern at home before picking up the road win at UNCW. Senior Alexandra Masaquel averaged 15.0 points and 7.0 rebounds for the week and extended her double-digit scoring streak to 10 games. Rookie Victoria Reynolds averaged 7.0 points and 2.5 boards

HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS

- Two players are approaching the 1,000 point milestone. Elon's Lauren Brown enters the week with 986 points while Hofstra's Ashunae Durant is next with 947.
- Elon's 5-0 start to conference play is the best start to a CAA season for Elon to date. Elon's best start to conference play as a Division I team came during the 2001-02 season as a member of the Big South when it opened at 6-0.
- The Phoenix has a strength of schedule of 26.
- James Madison's Precious Hall is ranked fifth in the nation in scoring at 23.3 points per game.
 Hall has scored in double digits in 16 straight games, posting 20+ points nine times and 30+ points three times.
- Hall has 1,879 career points and has moved into eighth all-time on the CAA career scoring chart.
- JMU guard Lexie Barrier has gone 244 consecutive minutes of court time without a turnover. Drexel point guard Meghan Creighton had a similar streak, going 201 consecutive minutes before it ended on January 2.
- William & Mary's Abby Rendle moved into ninth all-time in CAA history with 181 career blocks.
 Rendle third in the country in blocks per game (4.0) and fifth in total blocks (60).
- William & Mary has held eight opponents to 50 points or less.
- Tribe senior Marlena Tremba has made 248 career three-point field goals. She's two away from entering the top-10 on the CAA career chart.
- Cougars senior Bre Bolden is the CAA's career active leader in steals with 290. She's one away from entering the top-10 on the CAA career chart.
- Hofstra's Ashunae Durant has posted nine double-doubles this season. She's averaging 16.0 points and 10.9 rebounds which ranks her 11th in the nation. She's also third in offensive rebounds per game (5.0).
- Towson held JMU to a season-low 21 first-half points on January 8.
- The Tigers have notched double-digit steals in 11 of 16 games this season.
- UNCW's Rebekah Banks has grabbed 10 or more rebounds in eight of the last 11 games.
- Northeastern's Francesca Sally has posted three consecutive double-doubles and is averaging 13.7 points and 11.7 rebounds in that span.

MAKE IT 1,000

 Drexel senior Jessica Pellechio reached the 1,000 career point milestone with a 20-point outing at Northeastern on January 8. Pellechio joins Sarah Curran in the club while Meghan Creighton nearing the milestone.

NATIONAL NOTICE

- William & Mary is ranked second in the country in blocks per game (7.0) and ninth in total blocks (105) led by Abby Rendle, who is third with 4.00 blocks a night.
- The Tribe is also eighth in scoring defense, allowing just 53.2 points per game, tenth in fewest turnovers (205) and 20th in steals (11.7/g).
- Drexel point guard Meghan Creighton is sixth in three-point field goal percentage (.482).
- The Dragons are tenth in three-pointers made per game (9.0), 14th in scoring defense (54.6) and have the fourth fewest turnovers (187).
 They've also moved to 21st in assist-turnover ratio (1.26).
- Two CAA players are in the top-20 in steals. CofC's Bre Bolden in tenth in steals per game (3.44) and 15th in total steals (55) while Towson's Raven Bankston is ranked 12th in steals per game (3.38) and 18th in total steals (54).
- Hofstra's Ashunae Durant is 11th in rebounds per game (10.9), 12th in double-doubles (10) and third in offensive rebounds per game (5.0).
- Northeastern's Jess Genco is fourth in minutes played per game (38.18).

#CAAHOOPS IN THE MID-MAJOR RANKINGS

- College Insider Mid-Major Poll: Three teams appeared in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll while one received votes on January 10. James Madison moved to No. 9 while Drexel moved to No. 14. Elon re-entered the poll at NO. 24 while William & Mary received votes.
- ESPN.com/Graham Hays Mid-Major Rankings: Drexel was recognized on January 4 as the top mid-major team in the nation by ESPN.com's Graham Hays. Hays, who has published four top-10 lists during the 2016-17 regular season, has had the Dragons ranked fourth or higher in each of them and has now made them the fourth different team to earn No. 1 honors.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE RPI

- College Basketball News RPI: The CAA was rated eighth as a conference for the seventh consecutive week on January 16. Elon moved up to 22 while Drexel (64) and James Madison (77) checked into the top-100.
- NCAA.com RPI: Through games on January 15, Elon is rated at No. 22 while Drexel (64) and James Madison (77) checked into the top-100. As a conference, the CAA has an RPI of 8.

COACHES CORNER

- Head Coach Tina Martin picked up her 400th career victory with the win against Hofstra on January 15. Martin, who is in her 21st season, currently holds a 400-232 (.633) all-time record as the winningest coach in UD men's and women's basketball history.
- Elon Head Coach Charlotte Smith posted her 100th career victory in the Phoenix win over Drexel on January 15. She has a 100-74 record.
- Head Coach Sean O'Regan earned his first career victory at the helm of the James Madison in the Dukes' 83-57 victory over St. Francis Brooklyn on November 13.

SOLID STARTS

- William & Mary wrapped up non-league play with a 10-1 record, setting the program record for wins. Last season, the Tribe set the program's best start when they opened the campaign 11-2 and has surpassed that start.
- At 12-3, the Dragons got off to its best 15-game start in program history.
- The Dragons had a perfect month of December, going 6-0, including four road victories. It was the Dragons' first undefeated month during the regular season since going 5-0 in November to start the 2010-11 season.
- Towson got off to a 5-0 start, its best start to a season since the 2008-09 squad also opened the year with five straight victories.
- The Tigers wrapped up non-conference play above .500 and its most league wins since the 2011-12 squad went 9-3. The seven non-league wins were also the most under Head Coach Niki Reid Geckeler.
- Delaware got off to a 4-0 start the year for the first time since 2010-11 when the Elena Delle Donne led team went 31-2 after a 10-0 start.

HOME SWEET HOME

Home courts have been defended well this season with the home teams forging a 46-30 record.

- In non-league play, the CAA went 34-18 at home.
- Drexel is 6-1 at the Daskalakis Athletic Center (DAC) this season.
- William & Mary is 7-1 at Kaplan Arena this season.
- James Madison have welcomed 2,000+ fans to the Convocation Center in 46 consecutive games.
- In six seasons under Head Coach Charlotte Smith, the Phoenix is 59-19 at Alumni Gym and have never lost more than five home games in a single season.
- UNCW hosted its first of two "Seahawks Tomorrow" games on December 15. More than 4,400 area elementary school students attended the game. The second game on January 6, saw 3,207 elementary school students take over Trask.

ROAD WARRIORS

- William & Mary which has 13 road games this season, posted its fourth consecutive road win on December 15. It marks just the second time and the first since 1926-27 that the Tribe has accomplished that feat. W&M has never won five road games to open a single-season.
- Elon had a five-game road swing spanning 32 days away from the friendly confines of Alumni Gym. Elon's last home game was November 26 against Wake Forest and finally returns homeon December 28.

HELPING THEM OUT

- Hofstra's Krystal Luciano has dished out 10+ assists twice this season. She handed out 11 at Sacramento State and 10 against UMass, which included the 400th of her career.
- William & Mary's Jenna Green picked up 11 assists at Charleston.

THE BIG 3-0, PLUS ONE 4-0.

- Three players registered 30-point efforts.
- Towson's Raven Bankston posted 31 points in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell and then delivered 30 points in the 68-63 win over Cornell. Bankston is the first Tiger to have two 30+ point games in a season since Tanisha McTiller in 2013.
- Drexel's Jessica Pellechio dropped in a careerhigh 30 points, including eight three-pointers, in the 83-60 win against Penn State.
- JMU's Precious Hall, the CAA Preseason Player of the Year, poured in 39 points in the loss to No. 13/14 Tennessee. She also had 35 points in the win over Wake Forest.
- Hall scored 46 points in the double overtime at Rutgers. It was the first 40+ game in the CAA since February 26, 2015 when UNCW's Brie Mobley had 46 points against Delaware. The Seahawks' Kelva Atkins also scored 40 points that season.

- William & Mary's Abby Rendle tied a career-high with 10 blocked shots against East Carolina on December 28. It also tied the second-highest single game total in CAA history.
- Former ODU standout Marquitta Head holds the record (11).
- William & Mary has blocked 13 shots twice this season against Mount St. Mary's (12/18) and East Carolina (12/28). The 13 blocks are tied for eighth most in CAA single-game history.
- Elon holds the single game record with 17 blocks which was set against ETSU in 2015.

THANKS FOR THE CHARITY

- Drexel went 22-for-22 from the free throw line against Penn State on November 11. The percentage tied the CAA single record, but the Dragons are the only team to go 22-for-22.
- The Dragons have also gone 12-for-12 and 11for-11 from the line this season.

THREES PLEASE

- UNCW hit 15 three-pointers against Catawba on December 19, tying them for the third most in CAA single-game history.
- Drexel was the last team to hit 15 threepointers, doing so last season.

#CAAHOOPS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- The CAA went 66-46 in non-league play.
- The CAA went 11-1 against the A-10.
- The CAA went 4-0 against the Ivy League.
- From November 14-20, the CAA went 13-7, notching victories over 11 different conferences, including the a win over the Big Ten and pairs of wins over the A-10 and Big South.
- The CAA went a combined 61-56 against nonconference opponents in 2015-16.

USBWA NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

 Drexel's Ana Ferariu was named the USBWA National Freshman of the Week on December 20. Ferariu, who also earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors, came off the bench in the second half to score 18 points in 13 minutes in the win against Saint Joseph's.

ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Three CAA student-athletes were nominated for the 2017 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team.
- William & Mary's Alexandra Masaquel, Hofstra's Sydni Epps and Delaware's Hannah Jardine were the three nominees.
- This esteemed award honors an outstanding group of student-athletes who represent the sport's finest in the areas of community service and leadership among their peers.

NAISMITH TROPHY WATCH LIST

- James Madison's Precious Hall was one of 50 players across the country named to the 2017 Naismith Women's College Player of the Year
- This marks the second appearance on the Naismith Watch List for Hall, who was included on the 2014-15 Midseason 30 as a junior.
- The Naismith Midseason List of 30 players will be announced by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club on February 8.

WEEKLY REPORT

LIEBERMAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Drexel senior point guard Meghan Creighton was named one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Award.
- Now in its 17th year, the Nancy Lieberman Award recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. Candidates exhibit the floor leadership, playmaking and ball-handling skills of Hall of Famer Nancy Lieberman.
- By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2017 Lieberman Award will be narrowed to just 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to Ms. Lieberman and the Hall of Fame's selection committee.

THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

- Northeastern and James Madison both competed at the 2016 Cancun Challenge in Puerto Aventuras, Mexico, November 24-26.
- The Dukes topped Idaho State, 83-53, but fell to Iowa, 90-75, in the Riviera Division in pre-set matchups. Guard Precious Hall earned a spot on the All-Riviera Tournament Team. It was JMU's fourth trip to the tournament.
- Northeastern played in the tournament's round-robin Mayan Division along with Stanford (L, 74-45), Purdue (L, 79-54), and Wichita State (L, 87-73). Sophomore guard Jess Genco earned a spot on the All-Mayan Tournament Team.
- The annual UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic was held November 26-27. The Seahawks fell to Providence (65-49) and La Salle (64-48) while also welcoming Miami (Ohio) to Trask Coliseum.
- Delaware headed the West Coast for the Cal State Northridge Thanksgiving Classic. The Blue Hens fell to No. 23 Michigan State, 81-64, and then to Detroit Mercy, 66-64.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Elon was the CAA's representative in the 2016 Preseason WNIT.

- The Phoenix drew a road game at Green Bay in the first round on November 11, falling 74-53.
- Elon traveled to Mount Pleasant, Mich. for the consolation rounds.
- In their first consolation game on November 18, the Phoenix downed Eastern Washington, 76-55, behind three double-digit scoring efforts.
- Elon closed out action by knocking off host Central Michigan, 71-57. The Phoenix was led by rookie Jada Graves' 20-point night.
- Elon is one of 16 teams that was selected to participate in the field: Abilene Christian (Southland); Central Michigan (MAC); Colorado State (MWC); Eastern Washington (Big Sky); Fordham (Atlantic 10); Furman (Southern); Green Bay (Horizon); Little Rock (Sun Belt); Missouri (SEC); Nebraska (Big Ten); North Texas (C-USA); Notre Dame (ACC); Omaha (Summit), UT-Rio Grande Valley (WAC); and Washington (Pac-12).
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 15-16 in Preseason WNIT action.

TIP-OFF TIME

- The CAA went a combined 9-4 on opening weekend.
- The 2016-17 season tipped off on November 11 with seven games, six of which were home games. The CAA went 5-2 in those contests, including 5-1 at home.

LOOK WHO'S BACK

- Seven of the 15 All-CAA honorees from last year return for the 2016-17 season, including the two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year, Bre Bolden from CofC. The 2014-15 CAA Player of the Year, Precious Hall of James Madison, returns for her final season after missing the entirety of 2015-16 with an injury.
- The offense in the CAA will be plentiful once again this season as 10 of the top-20 scorers from 2015-16 will be back on the hardwood for their respective teams. Out of that group, seven are seniors, two are juniors, and one is a sophomore.

#CAAHOOPS PRESEASON RUNDOWN

- James Madison was predicted to finish atop the conference for the fourth consecutive season.
- It was close voting at the top with the Dukes as the overall favorite with 76 points, Elon in second with 70 points and Drexel in third with 68 points.
- It was also close among the next four teams. Hofstra (49) was picked fourth, Delaware and William & Mary were tied for fifth with 47 points apiece while Northeastern was seventh with 41 points. Rounding out the 10 teams were College of Charleston (19), UNCW (17) and Towson (16).
- After missing all of the 2015-16 season with an injury, redshirt senior guard Precious Hall is back to lead James Madison and was tabbed as the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Player of the Year. During 2014-15, Hall averaged 20.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game and was the unanimous choice for CAA Player of the Year.
