### **#CAAHOOPS PLAYER OF THE WEEK**



SARAH CURRAN Senior | Forward | Media, Pa. Drexel University



Senior Sarah Curran was named the Most Valuable Player of the FIU Holiday Classic after leading the Dragons to a pair of wins and the tournament title. She averaged 24.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists. She shot nearly 57 percent (17-for-30) from the field, including a 50 percent clip from long range (7-for-14)

for the week. She began the week with 29 points against George Mason, going 10-for-15 from the floor, 4-for-5 from three-point range and 5-for-5 from the free throw line in that game. She scored nine straight for Drexel after Mason had whittled a 16-point lead down to three in the fourth quarter by holding the Dragons without a field goal for over six minutes. Curran wrapped up the tournament with 20 points in the win over UMass. The games were her first 20+ point outings of the season.

Junior Abby Rendle recorded William & Mary's second-ever triple-double (both are hers) as the Tribe won its tenth-in-a-row with an 82-72 victory against the American Athletic Conference's East Carolina. Rendle tallied 14 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks. She went 6-for-8 from the field and added an assist and two steals in the victory. For the season, the center is averaging 8.3 points, 5.9

rebounds, and leads the nation with 4.3 blocks a game.

Freshman guard Lexie Barrier had a big week for the Dukes, averaging 16.0 points to help them to a 2-0 week. From the field, Barrier went 12-for-21 (.571) and was hot from three-point land, connecting on six of her 10 attempts. In the win at Saint Joseph's, she poured in a career-best 13 points (5-for-8) before halftime

and finished the game with a career-high 22 points against the Hawks. She went 9-for-16 from the floor, including 3-for-5 from three-point range, to reach career marks. Barrier followed that up with 10 points and three assists in the win against ACC foe Wake Forest.

### **#CAAHOOPS REWIND**

- College of Charleston (3-8): The Cougars were off last week.
- Delaware (6-5): The Blue Hens were off last week.
- Drexel (9-2): The Dragons, winners of six straight games, captured the FIU Holiday Classic by topping a pair of A-10 foes in George Mason (82-71) and UMass (65-47). Senior Sarah Curran was named the tournament MVP, averaging 24.5 points on 57 percent shooting.
- Elon (8-4): The Phoenix wrapped up non-league play with a 93-47 rout of King. Jenifer Rhodes notched her third-straight double-figure game with a team-high 14 points and also down six rebounds. Elon rejected 12 shots in the win.
- Hofstra (7-4): The Pride had their three-game winning streak snapped with a tough 69-67 overtime loss to Hartford. Ashunae Durant led the Pride with 16 points and 16 rebounds, while Sydni Epps posted her first career doubledouble with 13 points and 12 rebounds.
- James Madison (7-4): The Dukes went 2-0 last week, picking up an 85-72 win at Saint Joseph's before knocking off ACC foe Wake Forest, 83-76. Precious Hall notched her third 30-point game of the season against Wake, finishing the night with 35 points.
- UNCW (5-6): The Seahawks fell at Tennessee in their non-league finale. Junior center Rebekah Banks led UNCW in the loss with 10 points while junior forward Jenny DeGraaf added nine points and eight rebounds
- Northeastern (4-8): The Huskies wrapped up non-conference play with a 61-50 win over Siena. Claudia Ortiz led the Huskies with 13 points, Jess Genco had 12 points while Francesca Sally registered 11 points and seven boards.
- Towson (7-4): Sophomore guard Sianni Martin's layup with 10 seconds to play helped Towson rally for a 61-58 win over Norfolk State at SECU Arena. The Tigers, who trailed by 10 points with 7:47 to play, snapped a three-game losing streak with the victory. Martin finished with 16 points to help Towson to its seventh non-league win of the year.
- William & Mary (10-1): The Tribe won a program recording-setting tenth-straight game by knocking off American foe East Carolina, 82-72.
   Junior Abby Rendle posted her second career triple-double with 14 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks. Marlena Tremba led all players with 27 points.

### #CAAHOOPS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- The CAA went 66-46 in non-league play this year.
- The CAA went 11-1 against the A-10.
- The CAA went 4-0 against the Ivy League.
- From November 14-20, the CAA went 13-7, notching victories over 11 different conferences, including the a win over the Big Ten and pairs of wins over the A-10 and Big South.
- The CAA went a combined 61-56 against nonconference opponents in 2015-16.

#### NATIONAL NOTICE

- William & Mary is ranked third in the country in blocks per game (7.2) led by Abby Rendle, who is the national leader with 4.7 blocks a night.
- Drexel is 11th in assist-turnover ratio (1.36) led by point guard Meghan Creighton, who is second in the country (4.00). The Dragons are also third in fewest turnovers (127).
- The Dragons are also seventh in three-pointers made per game (9.5).
- Towson is 20th in steals per game (11.8) led by Raven Bankston, who is tied for eighth in steals per game (3.6). She's tied with CofC's Bre Bolden.

### **HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS**

- Drexel point guard Meghan Creighton has gone five full games and 178 minutes of court time without a turnover.
- The Dragons had a perfect month of December, going 6-0, including four road victories. It was the Dragons' first undefeated month during the regular season since going 5-0 in November to start the 2010-11 season.
- William & Mary's Abby Rendle posted her second career triple-double with 14 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks in the win over East Carolina on December 28. Rendle is the national leader in blocks per game (4.3) and third in total blocks (47). She has posted at least six blocks in her last three games.
- William & Mary has held six opponents to 50 points or less. The Tribe entered the week ranked 11th nationally in scoring defense, and are currently allowing just 52.5 points per game.
- James Madison's Precious Hall is ranked second in the nation in scoring at 25.0 points per game.
   Hall has scored in double digits in 11 straight games, posting 20+ points seven times and 30+ points three times.
- Cougars senior Bre Bolden is the CAA's career active leader in steals with 275. She's also third on the NCAA DI active career leaders list.
- Hofstra's Ashunae Durant has posted seven double-doubles this season. She's averaging 16.8 points and 11.0 rebounds which ranks her tenth in the nation.
- Pride point guard Krystal Luciano has dished out 10+ assists twice this season. She handed out 11 at Sacramento State and 10 against UMass, which included the 400th of her career. She's among the top-20 nationally in assists per game (6.4)
- Drexel senior Jessica Pellechio is nearing her 1,000th career point with 976 points.
- Towson topped Norfolk State on December 29 to match their win total from a year ago. Last year, the Tigers didn't earn their seventh win of the season until March 9 in the CAA Tournament.
- The Tigers have forced double-digit steals in eight of 10 games this season.

### COLLEGE INSIDER MID-MAJOR POLL

- Two teams appeared in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll while a three received votes on December 27.
- James Madison moved to No. 9 while Drexel moved up to No. 11. Elon, William & Mary and Hofstra each received votes.

### **#CAAHOOPS IN THE RPI**

- College Basketball News RPI: The CAA was rated eighth as a conference for the fifth consecutive week on January 2. Two teams were in the top-50: Elon (28) and Drexel (50).
- NCAA.com RPI: Through games on January 1, two teams were in the top-50: Elon (28) and Drexel (50). As a conference, the CAA has an RPI of 8.

#### **SOLID STARTS**

- William & Mary wrapped up non-league play with a 10-1 marking, setting the program record for wins. Last season, the Tribe set the program's best start when they opened the campaign 11-2.
- Drexel is 9-2 on the year, their best 11-game start in program history.
- Towson got off to a 5-0 start, its best start to a season since the 2008-09 squad also opened the year with five straight victories.
- The Tigers wrapped up non-conference play above .500 and its most league wins since the 2011-12 squad went 9-3. The seven non-league wins were also the most under Head Coach Niki Reid Geckeler.
- Delaware got off to a 4-0 start the year for the first time since 2010-11 when the Elena Delle Donne led team went 31-2 after a 10-0 start.

### **HOME SWEET HOME**

Home courts have been defended well this season.

- In non-league play, the CAA went 34-18 at home.
- Drexel is 5-0 at the Daskalakis Athletic Center (DAC) this season.
- William & Mary is 6-1 at Kaplan Arena this season.
- James Madison have welcomed 2,000+ fans to the Convocation Center in 43 consecutive games.
- In six seasons under Head Coach Charlotte Smith, the Phoenix is 56-19 at Alumni Gym and have never lost more than five home games in a single season.
- UNCW hosted its first of two "Seahawks Tomorrow" games on December 15. More than 4,400 area elementary school students attended the game.

### **ROAD WARRIORS**

- William & Mary which has 13 road games this season, posted its fourth consecutive road win on December 15. It marks just the second time and the first since 1926-27 that the Tribe has accomplished that feat. W&M has never won five road games to open a single-season.
- Elon had a five-game road swing spanning 32 days away from the friendly confines of Alumni Gym. Elon's last home game was November 26 against Wake Forest and finally returns homeon December 28.

### TRIPLE-DOUBLE THE FUN

- William & Mary center Abby Rendle posted her second career triple-double with 14 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks against East Carolina on December 28.
- Rendle posted the Tribe's first triple-double in program history last season.
- There have only been two triple-doubles in the CAA since 2014, and the two points-reboundsblocks triple-doubles since 2006; Rendle holds both of those.

### **COACHES CORNER**

- Head Coach Tina Martin is approaching her 400th career win. Martin, who is in her 21st season, currently holds a 398-227 (.638) alltime record as the winningest coach in UD men's and women's basketball history.
- Elon Head Coach Charlotte Smith is approaching her 100th career victory. She has a 95-74 record.
- Head Coach Sean O'Regan earned his first career victory at the helm of the James Madison in the Dukes' 83-57 victory over St. Francis Brooklyn on November 13.

### THE BIG 3-0, PLUS ONE 4-0.

- Three players registered 30-point efforts.
- Towson's Raven Bankston posted 31 points in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell and then delivered 30 points in the 68-63 win over Cornell. Bankston is the first Tiger to have two 30+ point games in a season since Tanisha McTiller in 2013.
- Drexel's Jessica Pellechio dropped in a careerhigh 30 points, including eight three-pointers, in the 83-60 win against Penn State.
- JMU's Precious Hall, the CAA Preseason Player of the Year, poured in 39 points in the loss to No. 13/14 Tennessee. She also had 35 points in the win over Wake Forest.
- Hall scored 46 points in the double overtime at Rutgers. It was the first 40+ game in the CAA since February 26, 2015 when UNCW's Brie Mobley had 46 points against Delaware. The Seahawks' Kelva Atkins also scored 40 points that season.

### **BLOCK PARTY**

- William & Mary's Abby Rendle tied a career-high with 10 blocked shots against East Carolina on December 28. It also tied the second-highest single game total in CAA history.
- Former ODU standout Marquitta Head holds the record (11).
- William & Mary has blocked 13 shots twice this season against Mount St. Mary's (12/18) and East Carolina (12/28). The 13 blocks are tied for eighth most in CAA single-game history.
- Elon holds the single game record with 17 blocks which was set against ETSU in 2015.

### THANKS FOR THE CHARITY

 Drexel went 22-for-22 from the free throw line against Penn State on November 11. The percentage tied the CAA single record, but the Dragons are the only team to go 22-for-22 at the line.

### THREES PLEASE

- UNCW hit 15 three-pointers against Catawba on December 19, tying them for the third most in CAA single-game history.
- Drexel was the last team to hit 15 three-pointers, doing so last season.

- This esteemed award honors an outstanding group of student-athletes who represent the sport's finest in the areas of community service and leadership among their peers.

### **NAISMITH TROPHY WATCH LIST**

- James Madison's Precious Hall was one of 50 players across the country named to the 2017 Naismith Women's College Player of the Year Watch List.
- This marks the second appearance on the Naismith Watch List for Hall, who was included on the 2014-15 Midseason 30 as a junior.
- The Naismith Midseason List of 30 players will be announced by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club on February 8.

#### LIEBERMAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Drexel senior point guard Meghan Creighton was named one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Award.
- Now in its 17th year, the Nancy Lieberman Award recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. Candidates exhibit the floor leadership, playmaking and ball-handling skills of Hall of Famer Nancy Lieberman.
- By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2017 Lieberman Award will be narrowed to just 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to Ms. Lieberman and the Hall of Fame's selection committee.

- Northeastern and James Madison both competed at the 2016 Cancun Challenge in Puerto Aventuras, Mexico, November 24-26.
- The Dukes topped Idaho State, 83-53, but fell to lowa, 90-75, in the Riviera Division in pre-set matchups. Guard Precious Hall earned a spot on the All-Riviera Tournament Team. It was JMU's fourth trip to the tournament.
- Northeastern played in the tournament's round-robin Mayan Division along with Stanford (L, 74-45), Purdue (L, 79-54), and Wichita State (L, 87-73). Sophomore guard Jess Genco earned a spot on the All-Mayan Tournament Team.
- The annual UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic was held November 26-27. The Seahawks fell to Providence (65-49) and La Salle (64-48) while also welcoming Miami (Ohio) to Trask Coliseum.
- Delaware headed the West Coast for the Cal State Northridge Thanksgiving Classic. The Blue Hens fell to No. 23 Michigan State, 81-64, and then to Detroit Mercy, 66-64.

### **#CAAHOOPS IN THE PRESEASON WNIT**

Elon was the CAA's representative in the 2016 Preseason WNIT.

- The Phoenix drew a road game at Green Bay in the first round on November 11, falling 74-53.
- Elon traveled to Mount Pleasant, Mich. for the consolation rounds.
- In their first consolation game on November 18, the Phoenix downed Eastern Washington, 76-55, behind three double-digit scoring efforts.
- Elon closed out action by knocking off host Central Michigan, 71-57. The Phoenix was led by rookie Jada Graves' 20-point night.
- telon is one of 16 teams that was selected to participate in the field: Abilene Christian (Southland); Central Michigan (MAC); Colorado State (MWC); Eastern Washington (Big Sky); Fordham (Atlantic 10); Furman (Southern); Green Bay (Horizon); Little Rock (Sun Belt); Missouri (SEC); Nebraska (Big Ten); North Texas (C-USA); Notre Dame (ACC); Omaha (Summit), UT-Rio Grande Valley (WAC); and Washington (Pac-12).
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 15-16 in Preseason WNIT action.

### **TIP-OFF TIME**

- The CAA went a combined 9-4 on opening weekend.
- The 2016-17 season tipped off on November 11 with seven games, six of which were home games. The CAA went 5-2 in those contests, including 5-1 at home.

### **LOOK WHO'S BACK**

- Seven of the 15 All-CAA honorees from last year return for the 2016-17 season, including the two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year, Bre Bolden from CofC. The 2014-15 CAA Player of the Year, Precious Hall of James Madison, returns for her final season after missing the entirety of 2015-16 with an injury.
- The offense in the CAA will be plentiful once again this season as 10 of the top-20 scorers from 2015-16 will be back on the hardwood for their respective teams. Out of that group, seven are seniors, two are juniors, and one is a sophomore.

### **#CAAHOOPS PRESEASON RUNDOWN**

- James Madison was predicted to finish atop the conference for the fourth consecutive season.
- It was close voting at the top with the Dukes as the overall favorite with 76 points, Elon in second with 70 points and Drexel in third with 68 points.
- It was also close among the next four teams. Hofstra (49) was picked fourth, Delaware and William & Mary were tied for fifth with 47 points apiece while Northeastern was seventh with 41 points. Rounding out the 10 teams were College of Charleston (19), UNCW (17) and Towson (16).
- After missing all of the 2015-16 season with an injury, redshirt senior guard Precious Hall is back to lead James Madison and was tabbed as the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Player of the Year. During 2014-15, Hall averaged 20.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game and was the unanimous choice for CAA Player of the Year.
