Redshirt senior guard Precious Hall averaged 22.0 points and went a perfect 11-11 from the free throw line to help JMU to a 2-0 week. In a key match-up against Drexel, Hall posted 17 points to help the Dukes to the victory over the Dragons. In the win at William & Mary, Hall scored in double figures for the 20th consecutive game, finishing with 27 points in addition to eight rebounds, four assists and three steals. She also went 7-for-7 from the line against the Tribe. Hall is ranked among the top-five in the nation in scoring and has tallied 20+ points 12 times this season. She is also approaching her 2,000th career point, entering the week with 1,984. This is Hall's fourth CAA Player of the Week honor this season.

Senior forward Jordan Henry averaged a double-double as UNCW won back-to-back games for the first time this season. She averaged 10.0 points and 12.5 rebounds per contest while making 9-of-13 field goal attempts. In addition, she tallied five blocked shots in two games. Henry scored eight points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the win over Towson on Friday night while adding four blocked shots. In the win over College of Charleston on Sunday, Henry recorded her fourth double-double of the season with 12 points and 13 rebounds, which tied her career high. Henry is averaging 7.6 points and 7.9 rebounds per game for the Seahawks, who have won three of their last four games after an 0-5 start in league play.

Rookie guard Abby Gonzales helped Delaware extend its winning streak to five games last week by averaging 11.5 points, 3.5 assists, and 3.0 rebounds in victories over William & Mary and Towson. She opened the week by tying a career-high with 16 points on 5-for-7 shooting from the field along with five assists and three steals. Against Towson, she had a balanced effort with seven points, four rebounds, and two assists. For the year, Gonzales is averaging 5.9 points, 2.0 assists and 2.0 rebounds per game.

#CAAHOOPS THE WEEK THAT WAS

- **Charleston (6-14; 3-6 CAA):** The Cougars split games, topping Hofstra before falling at UNCW. Senior **Breanna Bolden** became CofC's all-time leading scorer on Friday with 21 points and 13 rebounds. She also came away with her 300th career steal. For the week, she averaged 19.5 points and 10.5 rebounds.
- **Delaware (12-8; 6-3 CAA):** The Blue Hens extended their winning streak to five games with road wins at William & Mary and Towson. Sophomore **Nicole Enabosi** averaged another double-double with 12.0 points and 10.5 boards.
- **Drexel (15-5; 6-3 CAA):** The Dragons split games last week, falling at James Madison before topping Northeastern. **Sarah Curran** led the way with 18.0 points per game on 57.7 percent shooting, including 24 points on a 10-for-15 effort against the Huskies. Rookie **Aubree Brown** had a solid all-around effort, averaging 5.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.5 steals.
- **Elon (16-5; 8-1 CAA):** The Phoenix went 2-0 last week and pushed their winning streak to three games to remain atop the league standings. Junior **Shay Burnett** averaged 13.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 5.5 assists. At 16-5 this season, Elon's .762 winning percentage is its best through 21 games as a D-I program.
- **Hofstra (8-11; 1-7 CAA):** The Pride had a pair of tough losses last week falling to Charleston and Elon. Junior **Ashunae Durant** averaged a double-double with 20.0 points and 13.5 rebounds for the week. In addition, Durant recorded her 1,000th career point against the Phoenix. Durant has grabbed double-double digit rebounds in seven straight games.
- **James Madison (14-6; 7-2 CAA):** The Dukes went 2-0 last week and moved into second place in the standings with wins over Drexel and William & Mary. **Precious Hall** averaged 22.0 points and scored in double figures for the 20th consecutive game. Rookie guard **Kamiah Smalls** was a solid presence, averaging 7.5 points and 8.0 rebounds including her third career double-double.
- **UNCW (8-12; 3-6 CAA):** The Seahawks went 2-0 last week, picking up home wins against Towson and Charleston. **Jordan Henry** averaged a double-double as UNCW won back-to-back games for the first time this season. She posted 10.0 points, 12.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game. Head Coach **Adell Harris** earned her 100th career coaching victory on Sunday.
- **Northeastern (7-14; 3-6 CAA):** The Huskies took on two of the top-three teams in the league, falling to Elon and Drexel. **Claudia Ortiz** had an impressive weekend for the Huskies, contributing 16.0 points per game and going 10-for-12 from the free throw line.
- **Towson (11-9; 4-5 CAA):** The Tigers were edged by UNCW and Delaware last week. Senior guard **Raven Bankston** had another big week, averaging 22.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.5 steals per game. She also dropped in 31 points against the Blue Hens, the second time this season in which she's posted 30+ points.
- **William & Mary (13-6; 3-5 CAA):** The Tribe had a pair of home losses to Delaware and James Madison. Senior **Alexandra Masaquel** averaged 14.0 points and 9.0 rebounds for the week. Junior **Abby Rendle** collected six blocks, to bring her season total to 75, which ranks eighth all-time on the CAA single season chart.

HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is ranked fourth in the nation in scoring at 23.9 points per game. Hall has scored in double digits in 20 straight games, posting 20+ points 12 times and 30+ points four times and 40+ points twice.
- Hall has 1,984 career points and has moved into eighth all-time on the CAA career scoring chart. Hall is approaching the 2,000 point mark and will become the eighth player in CAA history to reach the mark. **Shante Evans** (Hofstra) was the last one to hit 2,000 doing so during 2012-13.
- The contest between Hofstra and William & Mary which was postponed due to Winter Storm Helena has been rescheduled for February 7 at 7 p.m. in Williamsburg, Va.
- Six of the 10 CAA teams have at least 10 wins this season.
- Several players are approaching the 1,000 career point milestone. Closing in are Elon's **Shay Burnett** (974) and **Jennifer Rhodes** (958), and Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** (955).
- Elon has a strength of schedule of 40.
- The Phoenix have won 10 games away from home, the most in the CAA this season.
- Elon is 13-1 when leading at half time.
- At 16-5 this season, Elon's .762 winning percentage is its best through 21 games as a D-I program. Their 8-1 league record is also the best in program history.
- Delaware's **Nicole Enabosi** had her posted six-game double-double streak snapped on January 29. She is second in the CAA with 11 double-doubles this season.
- Delaware made a season-best 34 free throws against Towson on January 29. The Blue Hens attempted a season-high 40 free throws. As a team, UD is shooting a league-best 76.1 percent from the line this season.
- Drexel has won 15 of its first 20 games since the 1986-87 season. That year, they improved to 17-5 before finishing with a 20-7 mark.
- Cougars senior **Breanna Bolden** is the CAA's career active leader in steals with 304. She also stands eighth all-time in CAA history.
- Bolden became CofC's all-time leading scorer on January 27. She currently has 1,491 points.
- William & Mary's **Abby Rendle** moved into eighth all-time in CAA history with 196 career blocks. Rendle is second in the country in blocks per game (3.95) and total blocks (75).
- Rendle's 75 blocks rank eighth on the CAA single season charts. The last player to swat 75+ shots in a single season was Georgia State's Cody Paulk, who had 77 in 2012-13.
- Tribe senior **Marlena Tremba** has made 256 career three-point field goals and is ninth on the CAA career chart.
- Hofstra's **Ashunae Durant** grabbed 21 rebounds against UNCW on January 20, the most in the CAA this season. Durant has posted 12 double-doubles this season. She's averaging 11.7 rebounds which ranks her fourth in the nation. She's also second in offensive rebounds per game (5.0).
- The Pride has played four overtime games, the most by a CAA squad this season.
- Towson has notched double-digit steals in 13 of 20 games this season.
- UNCW eclipsed its win total from a season ago by claiming its eighth victory of the season.

SO YOU WANT TO BE A COACH

- Three CAA student-athletes were chosen for the 15th annual "So You Want To Be A Coach" program.
- College of Charleston's **Nola Henry**, Elon's **Essence Baucom** and UNCW's **Amber Reeves** will represent the CAA at the three-day workshop held March 29-31 in conjunction with the WBCA National Convention in Dallas.
- Participants will learn about recruiting, the administrative side to coaching, how to get hired, skill development, the importance of knowing the rules, and how to balance work and life.
- Qualified candidates must have exhausted their final year of basketball eligibility. In addition, the candidate's head coach has to nominate them and must be an active WBCA member. Each participant is selected based on her academics, contributions to women's basketball on and off the court, professional resume and a written recommendation from their head coach.

- William & Mary is ranked second in the country in blocks per game (7.0) and fifth in total blocks (133) led by **Abby Rendle**, who is second with 3.95 blocks a night.
- The Tribe is also 15th in steals per game (11.6).
- Drexel point guard **Meghan Creighton** is sixth in three-point field goal percentage (.472).
- The Dragons are 13th in three-pointers made per game (8.7), eighth in scoring defense (54.0) and have the sixth fewest turnovers (245).
- Two CAA players are in the top-20 in steals. CofC's **Breanna Bolden** is ninth in total steals (69) and in steals per game (3.45) while Towson's **Raven Bankston** is 15th in total steals (65) and 12th in steals per game (3.25).
- Hofstra's **Ashunae Durant** is fourth in rebounds per game (11.7), tenth in double-doubles (12) and second in offensive rebounds per game (5.0).
- Northeastern's **Jess Genco** is fifth in minutes played per game (38.33).
- Delaware's **Nicole Enabosi** is 16th in free throws made (109).

- Elon senior **Lauren Brown** notched her 1,000th career point in the victory at William & Mary on January 22, finishing with 10 points, including the game-winning free throws.
- Drexel senior **Jessica Pellechio** reached the 1,000 career point milestone with a 20-point outing at Northeastern on January 8. Pellechio joins **Sarah Curran** in the club while **Meghan Creighton** nearing the milestone.

COACHES CORNER

- Head Coach **Tina Martin** picked up her 400th career victory with the win against Hofstra on January 15. Martin, who is in her 21st season, currently holds a 403-232 all-time record as the winningest coach in UD men's and women's basketball history.
- Elon Head Coach **Charlotte Smith** posted her 100th career victory in the Phoenix win over Drexel on January 15. She has a 103-75 record.
- UNCW Head Coach **Adell Harris** earned the 100th win of her coaching career on January 29. Harris has 39 victories at UNCW after compiling a 61-30 record in three years at Tusculum.

Home courts have been defended well this season with the home teams forging a 56-39 record.

- In non-league play, the CAA went 34-18.
- Drexel is 9-1 at the Daskalakis Athletic Center (DAC) this season.
- James Madison have welcomed 2,000+ fans to the Convocation Center in 48 consecutive games.
- In six seasons under Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**, the Phoenix is 59-20 at Alumni Gym and have never lost more than five home games in a single season.
- The Phoenix set a women's basketball attendance record on January 20 against James Madison, welcoming 1,412 fans at Alumni Gym.
- UNCW hosted its first of two "Seahawks Tomorrow" games on December 15. More than 4,400 area elementary school students attended the game. The second game on January 6, saw 3,207 students take over Trask.

BIG ON THE BOARDS

- Hofstra's **Ashunae Durant** grabbed 21 rebounds against UNCW on January 20, the most in the CAA this season.
- The 21 rebounds are tied for sixth most in CAA single-game history, a mark that was achieved last season.
- The CAA single game record for rebounds is 24 set by American's Mary Klima in 1994.

THE BIG 3-0

Three players registered 30-point efforts.

- Towson's **Raven Bankston** posted 31 points in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell and then delivered 30 points in the 68-63 win over Cornell. Bankston then notched 31 points at Delaware on January 29.
- Drexel's **Jessica Pellechio** dropped in a career-high 30 points, including eight three-pointers, in the 83-60 win against Penn State.
- JMU's **Precious Hall** poured in 39 points in the loss to No. 13/14 Tennessee. She also had 35 points in the win over Wake Forest.

40 IS THE NEW 30

- JMU's **Precious Hall** scored 46 points in the double overtime at Rutgers. It was the first 40+ game in the CAA since February 26, 2015 when UNCW's Brie Mobley had 46 points against Delaware. The Seahawks' Kelva Atkins also scored 40 points that season.
- Hall recorded her second such effort on January 20 at Elon, tallying 41 points.
- Hall is one of two players in CAA history to score 40+ points twice in a single season. Elena Delle Donne is the other one. She scored 40+ points four times during the 2011-12 season.
- Hall is one of three players in CAA history to have multiple 40-point games in a career. Delle Donne had six 40-point games in her career. Gabriela Marginean (Drexel) had three 40-point games.

HELPING THEM OUT

- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** dished out her 500th career assist on January 20. She became just the second Dragon in program history to reach that milestone.
- Northeastern sophomore **Jess Genco** recorded her 200th career assist against Delaware on January 20.
- Hofstra's **Krystal Luciano** has dished out 10+ assists twice this season. She handed out 11 at Sacramento State and 10 against UMass, which included the 400th of her career.
- William & Mary's **Jenna Green** picked up 11 assists at Charleston. She also dished out her 200th assist on January 27 against Delaware.

THREES PLEASE

- UNCW hit 15 three-pointers against Catawba on December 19, tying them for the third most in CAA single-game history.
- Drexel was the last team to hit 15 three-pointers, doing so last season.

BLOCK PARTY

- William & Mary's **Abby Rendle** tied a career-high with 10 blocked shots against East Carolina on December 28. It also tied the second-highest single game total in CAA history. Former ODU standout Marquitta Head holds the record (11).
- Rendle's 75 blocks this season rank eighth on the CAA single season charts. The last player to swat 75+ shots in a single season was Georgia State's Cody Paulk, who had 77 in 2012-13.
- The CAA single season blocking record is 110, set by Amy Dorsett during the 1996-97 season.
- William & Mary has blocked 13 shots twice this season against Mount St. Mary's (12/18) and East Carolina (12/28). The 13 blocks are tied for eighth most in CAA single-game history.
- Elon holds the single game record with 17 blocks which was set against ETSU in 2015.

MESSED AROUND AND GOT A TRIPLE-DOUBLE

- William & Mary center **Abby Rendle** posted her second career triple-double with 14 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks against East Carolina on December 28.
- Rendle posted the Tribe's first triple-double in program history last season.
- There have only been two triple-doubles in the CAA since 2014, and the two points-rebounds-blocks triple-doubles since 2006; Rendle holds both of those.

SOLID STARTS

- William & Mary wrapped up non-league play with a 10-1 record, setting the program record for wins. Last season, the Tribe set the program's best start when they opened the campaign 11-2 and has surpassed that start.
- At 12-3, the Dragons got off to its best 15-game start in program history. Drexel is 14-4 for just the second time ever.
- The Dragons had a perfect month of December, going 6-0, including four road victories. It was the Dragons' first undefeated month during the regular season since going 5-0 in November to start the 2010-11 season.
- Towson got off to a 5-0 start, its best start to a season since the 2008-09 squad also opened the year with five straight victories.
- The Tigers wrapped up non-conference play above .500 and its most league wins since the 2011-12 squad went 9-3. The seven non-league wins were also the most under Head Coach **Niki Reid Geckeler**.
- Delaware got off to a 4-0 start the year for the first time since 2010-11 when the Elena Delle Donne led team went 31-2 after a 10-0 start.

#CAAHOOPS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- The CAA went 66-46 in non-league play.
- The CAA went 11-1 against the A-10.
- The CAA went 4-0 against the Ivy League.
- From November 14-20, the CAA went 13-7, notching victories over 11 different conferences, including the a win over the Big Ten and pairs of wins over the A-10 and Big South.
- The CAA went a combined 61-56 against non-conference opponents in 2015-16.

USBWA NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Drexel's **Ana Ferariu** was named the USBWA National Freshman of the Week on December 20. Ferariu, who also earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors, came off the bench in the second half to score 18 points in 13 minutes in the win against Saint Joseph's.

ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Three CAA student-athletes were nominated for the 2017 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team.
- William & Mary's **Alexandra Masaquel**, Hofstra's **Sydni Epps** and Delaware's **Hannah Jardine** were the three nominees.
- This esteemed award honors an outstanding group of student-athletes who represent the sport's finest in the areas of community service and leadership among their peers.

USBWA ANN MEYERS DRYSDALE AWARD MIDSEASON WATCH LIST

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** was named to USBWA Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Midseason Watch List.
- The award honors the nation's best women's basketball player and Hall is one of 28 to be on the midseason watch list.

NAISMITH TROPHY WATCH LIST

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** was one of 50 players across the country named to the 2017 Naismith Women's College Player of the Year Watch List.
- This marks the second appearance on the Naismith Watch List for Hall, who was included on the 2014-15 Midseason 30 as a junior.

LIEBERMAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Drexel senior point guard **Meghan Creighton** was named one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Award.
- Now in its 17th year, the Nancy Lieberman Award recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. Candidates exhibit the floor leadership, play-making and ball-handling skills of Hall of Famer Nancy Lieberman.
- By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2017 Lieberman Award will be narrowed to just 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to Ms. Lieberman and the Hall of Fame's selection committee.

THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

- Northeastern and James Madison both competed at the 2016 Cancun Challenge in Puerto Aventuras, Mexico, November 24-26.
- The Dukes topped Idaho State, 83-53, but fell to Iowa, 90-75, in the Riviera Division in pre-set matchups. Guard **Precious Hall** earned a spot on the All-Riviera Tournament Team. It was JMU's fourth trip to the tournament.
- Northeastern played in the tournament's round-robin Mayan Division along with Stanford (L, 74-45), Purdue (L, 79-54), and Wichita State (L, 87-73). Sophomore guard Jess Genco earned a spot on the All-Mayan Tournament Team.
- The annual UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic was held November 26-27. The Seahawks fell to Providence (65-49) and La Salle (64-48) while also welcoming Miami (Ohio) to Trask Coliseum.
- Delaware headed the West Coast for the Cal State Northridge Thanksgiving Classic. The Blue Hens fell to No. 23 Michigan State, 81-64, and then to Detroit Mercy, 66-64.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Elon was the CAA's representative in the 2016 Pre-season WNIT.

- The Phoenix drew a road game at Green Bay in the first round on November 11, falling 74-53.
- Elon traveled to Mount Pleasant, Mich. for the consolation rounds.
- In their first consolation game on November 18, the Phoenix downed Eastern Washington, 76-55, behind three double-digit scoring efforts.
- Elon closed out action by knocking off host Central Michigan, 71-57. The Phoenix was led by rookie **Jada Graves'** 20-point night.
- Elon is one of 16 teams that was selected to participate in the field: Abilene Christian (Southland); Central Michigan (MAC); Colorado State (MWC); Eastern Washington (Big Sky); Fordham (Atlantic 10); Furman (Southern); Green Bay (Horizon); Little Rock (Sun Belt); Missouri (SEC); Nebraska (Big Ten); North Texas (C-USA); Notre Dame (ACC); Omaha (Summit); UT-Rio Grande Valley (WAC); and Washington (Pac-12).
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 15-16 in Preseason WNIT action.

TIP-OFF TIME

- The CAA went a combined 9-4 on opening weekend.
- The 2016-17 season tipped off on November 11 with seven games, six of which were home games. The CAA went 5-2 in those contests, including 5-1 at home.

LOOK WHO'S BACK

- Seven of the 15 All-CAA honorees from last year return for the 2016-17 season, including the two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year, **Breanna Bolden** from CoFC. The 2014-15 CAA Player of the Year, **Precious Hall** of James Madison, returns for her final season after missing the entirety of 2015-16 with an injury.
- The offense in the CAA will be plentiful once again this season as 10 of the top-20 scorers from 2015-16 will be back on the hardwood for their respective teams. Out of that group, seven are seniors and two are juniors.

#CAAHOOPS PRESEASON RUNDOWN

- James Madison was predicted to finish atop the conference for the fourth consecutive season.
- It was close voting at the top with the Dukes as the overall favorite with 76 points, Elon in second with 70 points and Drexel in third with 68 points.
- It was also close among the next four teams. Hofstra (49) was picked fourth, Delaware and William & Mary were tied for fifth with 47 points apiece while Northeastern was seventh with 41 points. Rounding out the 10 teams were College of Charleston (19), UNCW (17) and Towson (16).
- After missing all of the 2015-16 season with an injury, redshirt senior guard **Precious Hall** is back to lead James Madison and was tabbed as the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Player of the Year. During 2014-15, Hall averaged 20.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game and was the unanimous choice for CAA Player of the Year.

- The CAA Women's Basketball Championship is returning to campus sites for the next three seasons, beginning with the 2017 tournament.
- James Madison** hosting in 2017, **Drexel** hosting in 2018, and **Delaware** hosting in 2019.
- The CAA Women's Basketball Championship has been held at 10 different sites in the league's 31 years.
- The tournament was last held on campus in 2010 before moving to the Show Place Arena in 2012.
- James Madison has hosted the CAA Championship on six occasions, with the last time coming in 2010. Delaware has hosted the CAA Championship twice in 2007 and 2008.
