Senior Breanna Bolden powered the Cougars to 2-1 opening week of conference play, averaging 22.0 points and 12.0 rebounds. Bolden logged a pair of double-doubles and very nearly registering a third while adding nine steals and eight assists for the week. Bolden notched 23 points, nine rebounds, four assists

and three steals in the road-affair with first-place Elon, and followed that up by setting a career-high with 15 boards and tallying 24 points to help snap William & Mary's 11-game winning streak. Bolden wrapped the week up with 19 points and 12 rebounds in the victory over UNCW. Bolden leads the CAA in steals (49) and is second in the league in scoring (17.8ppg) and fifth in rebounding (7.9ppg) this season.

In her first week of CAA play, rookie Kamiah Smalls shined for James Madison. She averaged 11.3 points on 65.2 percent shooting (15-for-23) and 6.3 rebounds to help the Dukes to a 2-1 week. She saw 78 minutes of court time last week, committing just two turnovers while dishing out four assists. She opened the

week with a double-double (10pts, 10reb) in the victory over UNCW. She then went 5-for-7 from the floor in the win against Hofstra, coming away with 14 points and five rebounds. Against Towson, she went 5-for-7 from the field once more, tallying 10 points to go along with four boards and two assists. Smalls has reached double figures 11 times in 14 games to start her career and is averaging 11.4 points and 5.7 rebounds this season.

#CAAHOOPS REWIND

- Due to the winter weather that hit the Virginia coast, the game between Hofstra and William & Mary in Williamsburg has been postponed. A make-up date will be announced at a later time.
- Charleston (5-9; 2-1 CAA): The Cougars opened CAA play with a bang, going 2-1 and picking up wins over William & Mary and UNCW. Senior Bre Bolden averaged a double-double while Tanisha Brown posted 13.0 points per game for the week.
- Delaware (7-7; 1-2 CAA): The Blue Hens fell to William & Mary and Elon but picked up a road win at UNCW last week. Nicole Enabosi averaged a double-double for the week with 14.0 points and 10.0 rebounds while Sade Chatman added 12.0 points and 8.3 rebounds per contest.
- Drexel (11-3; 2-1 CAA): The Dragons went 2-1 last week, topping Towson and Northeastern and falling to Elon. Jessica Pellechio had a solid week Drexel, 11.3 points per game and notching her 1,000th career point during a 20-point performance at Northeastern.
- Elon (11-4; 3-0 CAA): The Phoenix opened CAA play with a 3-0 record, downing Charleston, Drexel and Delaware. Shay Burnett averaged 9.7 points, 10.7 rebounds, and 4.7 assists and posted back-to-back double-doubles. It's the first time Elon has opened CAA play with a 3-0 record since joining the league.
- Hofstra (7-6; 0-2 CAA): The Pride had a pair of tough losses, falling to Northeastern in overtime and at James Madison. Junior Ashunae Durant averaged 13.0 points and 9.5 rebounds while Sandra Dongmo posted 9.5 rebounds and 9.0 points per game.
- James Madison (9-5, 2-1 CAA): The Dukes opened the week with wins over UNCW and Hofstra, but had their 22-game winning streak against league opponents snapped by Towson on Sunday. Amber Porter averaged 15.0 points while Kamiah Smalls averaged 11.3 points on 65.2 percent shooting for the week.
- UNCW (5-9; 0-3 CAA): The Seahawks had a tough week, with losses to JMU, Delaware and Charleston. Rebekah Banks grabbed 11 rebounds in every contest last week while Jasmine Steele averaged 10.3 points per game.
- Northeastern (6-9; 2-1 CAA): The Huskies opened CAA play with a 2-1 record, topping Hofstra and Towson before falling to Drexel. Claudia Ortiz averaged 13.3 points and 9.7 rebounds while going 11-for-14 from the free throw line during the week.
- Towson (8-6; 1-2 CAA): The Tigers bounced back from a pair of losses to Drexel and Northeastern and topped James Madison, 54-51, to close out the week. It was the first win over the Dukes since 2011. Raven Bankston had a solid week, averaging 13.3 points and 5.3 rebounds per game while adding eight assists and eight steals.
- William & Mary (11-2; 1-1 CAA): Senior Alexandra Masaquel averaged a double-double (18.5ppg, 11.0reb) as the Tribe split the opening week of CAA play against Delaware and Charleston. Against the Cougars, Masaquel had a season-high 24 points and grabbed a careerhigh 17 boards.

HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS

- Elon's 3-0 start to conference play is the best start to a CAA season for Elon to date. Elon's best start to conference play as a Division I team came during the 2001-02 season as a member of the Big South when it opened at 6-0.
- Elon has held its opponent to below 30 percent shooting in three out of its last four games and has held opponents under 40 percent from the floor in seven straight contests.
- The Phoenix has a strength of schedule of 26.
- James Madison's Precious Hall is ranked fourth in the nation in scoring at 23.4 points per game.
 Hall has scored in double digits in 14 straight games, posting 20+ points eight times and 30+ points three times.
- Hall has 1,833 career points and is 18 points away from checking into the tenth spot on the CAA's all-time scoring list.
- JMU has out-rebounded opponents in 10 contests this season.
- Drexel point guard Meghan Creighton went 201 consecutive minutes of court time without a turnover. The streak began on December 3 and ended in the third period of play against Towson on January 2.
- Drexel senior Jessica Pellechio reached the 1,000 career point milestone with a 20-point outing at Northeastern on January 8. Pellechio joins Sarah Curran in the club while Meghan Creighton nearing the milestone.
- William & Mary's Abby Rendle posted her second career triple-double with 14 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks in the win over East Carolina on December 28. Rendle is the national leader in blocks per game and second in total blocks (52).
- William & Mary has held seven opponents to 50 points or less.
- Cougars senior Bre Bolden is the CAA's career active leader in steals with 284. She's also third on the NCAA DI active career leaders list.
- Hofstra's Ashunae Durant has posted eight double-doubles this season. She's averaging 16.2 points and 10.5 rebounds which ranks her among the top-20 in the nation.
- Towson held JMU to a season-low 21 first-half points on January 8.
- The Tigers have notched double-digit steals in 10 of 14 games this season.
- Northeastern's Claudia Ortiz is averaging 12.8 points and 7.4 rebounds over her last five games.
- UNCW's Rebekah Banks has grabbed 10 or more rebounds in seven of the last nine games, including back-to-back-back 11-rebound efforts.

- William & Mary is ranked third in the country in blocks per game (7.0) and 13th in total blocks (91) led by Abby Rendle, who is the national leader with 4.0 blocks a night.
- The Tribe is also ninth in scoring defense, allowing just 53.6 points per game.
- Drexel point guard Meghan Creighton is third in three-point field goal percentage (.514).
- The Dragons are tenth in three-pointers made per game (6.43), 14th in scoring defense (54.4) and have the fifth fewest turnovers (168).
- Two CAA players are in the top-20 in steals. CofC's Bre Bolden in tenth in steals per game (3.50) and 16th in total steals (49) while Towson's Raven Bankston is ranked 13th in steals per game (3.43) and 18th in total steals (48).
- Hofstra's Ashunae Durant is 17th in rebounds per game (10.5), 18th in double-doubles (8) and fourth in offensive rebounds per game (5.0).
- Northeastern's Jess Genco is sixth in minutes played per game (37.93).

#CAAHOOPS IN THE MID-MAJOR RANKINGS

- College Insider Mid-Major Poll: Three teams appeared in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll while one received votes on January 3. James Madison moved up to No. 8 while Drexel moved up to No. 10. William & Mary checked into the poll at No. 25 while Elon received votes for the fifth-consecutive week.
- ESPN.com/Graham Hays Mid-Major Rankings: Drexel was recognized on January 4 as the top mid-major team in the nation by ESPN.com's Graham Hays. Hays, who has published four top-10 lists during the 2016-17 regular season, has had the Dragons ranked fourth or higher in each of them and has now made them the fourth different team to earn No. 1 honors.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE RPI

- College Basketball News RPI: The CAA was rated eighth as a conference for the sixth consecutive week on January 9. Elon moved up to 24 while Drexel (67), James Madison (87) and William & Mary (97) checked into the top-100.
- NCAA.com RPI: Through games on January 8, Elon moved up to 24 while Drexel (67), James Madison (87) and William & Mary (97) checked into the top-100. As a conference, the CAA has an RPI of 8.

COACHES CORNER

- Head Coach Tina Martin is approaching her 400th career win. Martin, who is in her 21st season, currently holds a 399-231 (.634) alltime record as the winningest coach in UD men's and women's basketball history.
- Elon Head Coach Charlotte Smith is approaching her 100th career victory. She has a 98-74 record.
- Head Coach Sean O'Regan earned his first career victory at the helm of the James Madison in the Dukes' 83-57 victory over St. Francis Brooklyn on November 13.

SOLID STARTS

- William & Mary wrapped up non-league play with a 10-1 record, setting the program record for wins. Last season, the Tribe set the program's best start when they opened the campaign 11-2 and matched that record this season.
- At 11-3, the Dragons tied the 1986-87 squad for best 14-game start in program history.
- The Dragons had a perfect month of December, going 6-0, including four road victories. It was the Dragons' first undefeated month during the regular season since going 5-0 in November to start the 2010-11 season.
- Towson got off to a 5-0 start, its best start to a season since the 2008-09 squad also opened the year with five straight victories.
- The Tigers wrapped up non-conference play above .500 and its most league wins since the 2011-12 squad went 9-3. The seven non-league wins were also the most under Head Coach Niki Reid Geckeler.
- Delaware got off to a 4-0 start the year for the first time since 2010-11 when the Elena Delle Donne led team went 31-2 after a 10-0 start.

HOME SWEET HOME

Home courts have been defended well this season with the home teams forging a 42-24 record.

- In non-league play, the CAA went 34-18 at home.
- Drexel is 6-1 at the Daskalakis Athletic Center (DAC) this season.
- William & Mary is 6-1 at Kaplan Arena this season.
- James Madison have welcomed 2,000+ fans to the Convocation Center in 46 consecutive games.
- In six seasons under Head Coach Charlotte Smith, the Phoenix is 58-19 at Alumni Gym and have never lost more than five home games in a single season.
- UNCW hosted its first of two "Seahawks Tomorrow" games on December 15. More than 4,400 area elementary school students attended the game. The second game on January 6, saw 3,207 elementary school students take over Trask.

ROAD WARRIORS

- William & Mary which has 13 road games this season, posted its fourth consecutive road win on December 15. It marks just the second time and the first since 1926-27 that the Tribe has accomplished that feat. W&M has never won five road games to open a single-season.
- Elon had a five-game road swing spanning 32 days away from the friendly confines of Alumni Gym. Elon's last home game was November 26 against Wake Forest and finally returns homeon December 28.

- Hofstra's Krystal Luciano has dished out 10+ assists twice this season. She handed out 11 at Sacramento State and 10 against UMass, which included the 400th of her career.
- William & Mary's Jenna Green picked up 11 assists at Charleston.

THE BIG 3-0. PLUS ONE 4-0.

- Three players registered 30-point efforts.
- Towson's Raven Bankston posted 31 points in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell and then delivered 30 points in the 68-63 win over Cornell. Bankston is the first Tiger to have two 30+ point games in a season since Tanisha McTiller in 2013.
- Drexel's Jessica Pellechio dropped in a careerhigh 30 points, including eight three-pointers, in the 83-60 win against Penn State.
- JMU's Precious Hall, the CAA Preseason Player of the Year, poured in 39 points in the loss to No. 13/14 Tennessee. She also had 35 points in the win over Wake Forest.
- Hall scored 46 points in the double overtime at Rutgers. It was the first 40+ game in the CAA since February 26, 2015 when UNCW's Brie Mobley had 46 points against Delaware. The Seahawks' Kelva Atkins also scored 40 points that season.

BLOCK PARTY

- William & Mary's Abby Rendle tied a career-high with 10 blocked shots against East Carolina on December 28. It also tied the second-highest single game total in CAA history.
- Former ODU standout Marquitta Head holds the
- William & Mary has blocked 13 shots twice this season against Mount St. Mary's (12/18) and East Carolina (12/28). The 13 blocks are tied for eighth most in CAA single-game history.
- Elon holds the single game record with 17 blocks which was set against ETSU in 2015.

- William & Mary center Abby Rendle posted her second career triple-double with 14 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks against East Carolina on December 28.
- Rendle posted the Tribe's first triple-double in program history last season.
- There have only been two triple-doubles in the CAA since 2014, and the two points-reboundsblocks triple-doubles since 2006; Rendle holds both of those.

#CAAHOOPS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- The CAA went 66-46 in non-league play.
- The CAA went 11-1 against the A-10.

- Three CAA student-athletes were nominated for the 2017 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team.
- William & Mary's Alexandra Masaquel, Hofstra's Sydni Epps and Delaware's Hannah Jardine were the three nominees.
- This esteemed award honors an outstanding group of student-athletes who represent the sport's finest in the areas of community service and leadership among their peers.

NAISMITH TROPHY WATCH LIST

- James Madison's Precious Hall was one of 50 players across the country named to the 2017 Naismith Women's College Player of the Year Watch List.
- This marks the second appearance on the Naismith Watch List for Hall, who was included on the 2014-15 Midseason 30 as a junior.
- The Naismith Midseason List of 30 players will be announced by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club on February 8.

LIEBERMAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Drexel senior point guard Meghan Creighton was named one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Award.
- Now in its 17th year, the Nancy Lieberman Award recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. Candidates exhibit the floor leadership, playmaking and ball-handling skills of Hall of Famer Nancy Lieberman.
- By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2017 Lieberman Award will be narrowed to just 10. In March, five finalists will be presented to Ms. Lieberman and the Hall of Fame's selection committee.

- Northeastern and James Madison both competed at the 2016 Cancun Challenge in Puerto Aventuras, Mexico, November 24-26.
- The Dukes topped Idaho State, 83-53, but fell to Iowa, 90-75, in the Riviera Division in pre-set matchups. Guard **Precious Hall** earned a spot on the All-Riviera Tournament Team. It was JMU's fourth trip to the tournament.
- Northeastern played in the tournament's round-robin Mayan Division along with Stanford (L, 74-45), Purdue (L, 79-54), and Wichita State (L, 87-73). Sophomore guard Jess Genco earned a spot on the All-Mayan Tournament Team.
- The annual UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic was held November 26-27. The Seahawks fell to Providence (65-49) and La Salle (64-48) while also welcoming Miami (Ohio) to Trask Coliseum.
- Delaware headed the West Coast for the Cal State Northridge Thanksgiving Classic. The Blue Hens fell to No. 23 Michigan State, 81-64, and then to Detroit Mercy, 66-64.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Elon was the CAA's representative in the 2016 Preseason WNIT.

- The Phoenix drew a road game at Green Bay in the first round on November 11, falling 74-53.
- · Elon traveled to Mount Pleasant, Mich. for the consolation rounds.
- In their first consolation game on November 18, the Phoenix downed Eastern Washington, 76-55, behind three double-digit scoring efforts.
- Elon closed out action by knocking off host Central Michigan, 71-57. The Phoenix was led by rookie Jada Graves' 20-point night.
- Elon is one of 16 teams that was selected to participate in the field: Abilene Christian (Southland); Central Michigan (MAC); Colorado State (MWC); Eastern Washington (Big Sky); Fordham (Atlantic 10); Furman (Southern); Green Bay (Horizon); Little Rock (Sun Belt); Missouri (SEC); Nebraska (Big Ten); North Texas (C-USA); Notre Dame (ACC); Omaha (Summit), UT-Rio Grande Valley (WAC); and Washington (Pac-12).
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 15-16 in Preseason WNIT action.

TIP-OFF TIME

- The CAA went a combined 9-4 on opening
- The 2016-17 season tipped off on November 11 with seven games, six of which were home games. The CAA went 5-2 in those contests, including 5-1 at home.

LOOK WHO'S BACK

 Seven of the 15 All-CAA honorees from last year return for the 2016-17 season, including the two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year, Bre Bolden from CofC. The 2014-15 CAA Player of the Year, Precious Hall of James Madison, returns for her final season after missing the entirety of 2015-16 with an injury.

• The offense in the CAA will be plentiful once again this season as 10 of the top-20 scorers from 2015-16 will be back on the hardwood for their respective teams. Out of that group, seven are seniors, two are juniors, and one is a sophomore.

#CAAHOOPS PRESEASON RUNDOWN

- James Madison was predicted to finish atop the conference for the fourth consecutive season.
- It was close voting at the top with the Dukes as the overall favorite with 76 points, Elon in second with 70 points and Drexel in third with 68 points.
- It was also close among the next four teams. Hofstra (49) was picked fourth, Delaware and William & Mary were tied for fifth with 47 points apiece while Northeastern was seventh with 41 points. Rounding out the 10 teams were College of Charleston (19), UNCW (17) and Towson (16).
- After missing all of the 2015-16 season with an injury, redshirt senior guard Precious Hall is back to lead James Madison and was tabbed as the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Player of the Year. During 2014-15, Hall averaged 20.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game and was the unanimous choice for CAA Player of the Year.

CAA CHAMPIONSHIP HEADS TO CAMPUS

- The CAA Women's Basketball Championship is returning to campus sites for the next three seasons, beginning with the 2017 tournament.
- James Madison hosting in 2017, Drexel hosting in 2018, and Delaware hosting in 2019.
- The CAA Women's Basketball Championship has been held at 10 different sites in the league's 31 years.
- The tournament was last held on campus in 2010 before moving to the Show Place Arena
- James Madison has hosted the CAA Championship on six occasions, with the last time coming in 2010. Delaware has hosted the CAA Championship twice in 2007 and 2008. This will be the first time Drexel has hosted CAA postseason action.

- Towson topped Norfolk State on December 29 to match their win total from a year ago. Last year, the Tigers didn't earn their seventh win of the season until March 9 in the CAA Tournament.
- Towson started the year at 5-0, the program's best start since the 2008-09 team opened the year with five straight victories.
- The Tigers wrapped up non-conference play above .500 and its most league wins since the 2011-12 squad went 9-3. The seven wins were the most under Head Coach Niki Reid Geckeler.
- With Lil Wayne performing on November 19 in SECU Arena, Towson hosted Cornell at the Towson Center, the first official basketball competition in the Arena since March 3, 2013.
- Towson held Wagner to 40 points on November 17. It was the lowest point total that the Tigers held an opponent to since 2009.
- Towson dropped in 90 points in the seasonopener against UMass Lowell. It was the most points scored by the Tigers since 2003-04.
- The Tigers were picked to finish tenth in the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Poll.
- Senior guard Raven Bankston was a 2016-17 Preseason All-CAA Second Team selection.
- Towson returns four starters from 2015-16 and a team that went 7-24 (3-15 CAA).
