## CAA FOOTBALL WEEK 9 AWARDS



### Offensive Player of the Week

Davis Cheek | QB | Elon

Cheek completed 24-of-35 passes for a career-high 357 yards and 2 TD's in Elon's 19-14 win at Villanova. The freshman quarterback engineered Elon's fourth 4th-quarter comeback of the year by throwing a 21-yard TD pass with 10:51 to go. Elon had 474 yards of offense against VU's nationally ranked defense.



### Defensive Players of the Week

Brandon Ginnetti | DT | Rhode Island

Ginnetti recorded five tackles, including 3.5 TFL, and made three sacks in Rhode Island's 31-14 win at UAlbany. It was the first three-sack performance by a Rams' player since 2001. URI held UA to just 125 total yards, including -7 yards rushing.



Rashad Robinson | CB | James Madison

Robinson made three tackles and returned an interception 82 yards for a TD in JMU's 21-0 shutout of New Hampshire. The interception, his CAA-best fifth of the year, was the 3rd-longest return in JMU history. JMU held UNH to 193 total yards and became the first FCS team since 2013 to keep them scoreless.



### Special Teams Player of the Week

Brandon Briggs | PK | Maine

Briggs was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goals, including a career-long 43-yarder, in Maine's 23-6 triumph over William & Mary. The 43-yard field goal was the longest for a Black Bears' kicker since 2015. Briggs has converted seven straight FG attempts.



### Rookies of the Week

Ryan Stover | QB | Towson

Stover completed 20-of-32 passes for 187 yards and two touchdowns, including a game-winning 14-yard TD pass with 35 seconds to go, to lead Towson past No. 23 Delaware, 18-17. The freshman quarterback added a team-high 56 yards rushing on just 8 carries.



Kortez Weeks | WR | Elon

Weeks set career-highs with 11 receptions for 205 yards in Elon's 19-14 victory at Villanova. He became just the third player in Phoenix history to top the 200-yard mark in a game and the yardage total was the 7th-highest in school history.

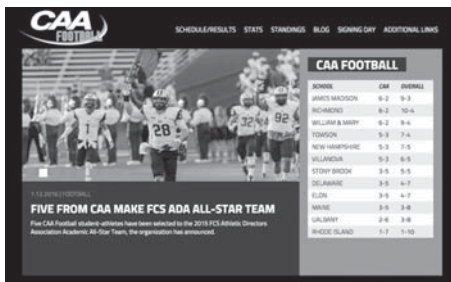

**CONFERENCE NOTES:**

**SETTING NEW STANDARDS OF SUCCESS:** Three CAA teams picked up milestone victories last week. **James Madison's** 8-0 start is the best in program history. **Elon's** 7-1 start is its best since 2009 and the team's seven-game win streak is the longest since 2008. The Phoenix's five CAA wins are more than they achieved in the past three years combined as a league member (4-20). **Stony Brook's** six overall victories are its most in the regular season since 2012 and its five CAA wins are the most since joining the conference in 2013.

**CONFERENCE GAMES MEAN CLOSE GAMES:** Close games have become the standard during conference play in CAA Football. For the season, 21 of the 31 CAA Football games (67.7%) have had margins of seven points or less in the fourth quarter, including four of the six contests last Saturday.

**JMU EXTENDS ONE WIN STREAK RECORD, TIES ANOTHER:** **James Madison** extended its overall winning streak to 20 games with a 21-0 victory over New Hampshire last Saturday. The Dukes broke Richmond's conference record of 17 consecutive wins that was set during the 2008 and 2009 seasons. JMU's 20-game streak is the longest active streak of any FBS or FCS team and is tied for the 7th-longest streak in FCS history. JMU has also won 15 straight CAA Football contests, tying the league record of 15 consecutive wins set by UMass from 1965-67.

**FIVE CAA TEAMS RANKED IN NATIONAL POLLS:** Five CAA Football teams are ranked nationally in this week's FCS Top 25 polls. **James Madison** remained No.1 in the STATS and FCS Coaches polls for the 10th straight week. **Elon** moved up to No. 7 in the STATS Poll and No. 10 in the Coaches poll, while **Stony Brook** rose to No. 14 in the STATS poll and No. 21 in the Coaches Poll. **New Hampshire** is ranked No. 19 in the Coaches poll and No. 21 in the STATS Poll and **Villanova** is ranked No. 20 in both polls. The CAA's five ranked teams are tied with the Missouri Valley for the most of any FCS conference.

**HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE:** CAA Football teams are a combined 32-13 at home this season, including 14-0 in non-conference play.

**DOMINANT DEFENSE:** Seven CAA teams are ranked in the top 26 in FCS in total defense, six are among the top 29 in rushing defense and six are in the top 29 in scoring defense. **James Madison** is ranked #1 in FCS in scoring defense (10.0 ppg), and #2 in total defense (227.6 ypg) and pass defense (132.4 ypg). **Villanova** is #2 in rush defense (57.8 ppg), #7 in scoring defense (16.0 ppg) and #20 in total defense (311.6 ypg). **UAlbany** is #13 in total defense (297.4 ypg), #15 in scoring defense (18.1 ppg) and #19 in rush defense (106.9 ypg). **Delaware** is #11 in scoring defense (17.1 ppg) and #16 in total defense (308.4 ypg). **Stony Brook** is #19 in total defense (311.1 ypg) and #13 in rush defense (94.9 ypg). **William & Mary** is #18 in total defense (310.0 ypg), while **Maine** is #22 in scoring defense (19.7 ppg) and #26 in total defense (319.6 ypg). A list of CAA teams among NCAA statistical leaders is included in the column to the left.

**PICKING THEM OFF:** Three of the 11 players tied for the FCS lead with five interceptions play in the CAA. Delaware's **Nasir Adderley** and JMU's **Jordan Brown** and **Rashad Robinson** have each picked off five passes in 2017. Three other players - Richmond's **Daniel Jones**, JMU's **Jimmy Moreland** and Stony Brook's **Travon Reid-Segure** - have four interceptions.

**LAULETTA CLIMBS CAA CAREER CHARTS:** Richmond quarterback **Kyle Lauletta** has moved up to 6th on the CAA's career passing yardage list (9,681 yds), 8th on the CAA's career total offense list (9,828 yds) and 10th on the CAA's career passing TD's list (71). This season, Lauletta leads the nation in passing (369.1 ypg), passing TD's (26) and total offense (375.5 ypg). He has thrown for over 300 yards and at least 2 TD's in seven of eight games, including 546 yards vs. Sam Houston State and six TD passes vs. Howard.

**MACK TOP FCS IN RUSHING:** Maine sophomore **Josh Mack** is the leading rusher in FCS this season, averaging 139.9 ypg. He's the first Maine player since 1989 to run for over 200 yards twice in a season, tallying 255 yards vs. Bryant on Sept. 9 and 248 yards vs. Rhode Island on Oct. 14. Four of the top nine rushing performances in FCS this season

have been by CAA players. Along with Mack's two efforts, Elon's **Malcolm Summers** ran for 298 yards vs. Richmond and JMU's **Cardon Johnson** rushed for 265 yards at East Carolina. Unfortunately, Summers and Johnson have since suffered season-ending injuries.

**NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS:** CAA Football teams are 20-3 against non-conference FCS opponents this season, which is the best non-conference FCS winning percentage (.870) of any league. Making the numbers even more impressive is the fact that six of the victories have been on the road. CAA Football teams went 24-7 in non-conference games against FCS opponents last season, which was the best winning percentage by an FCS conference.

**MULTIPLE FBS WINS AGAIN:** **New Hampshire** knocked off Georgia Southern, 22-12, on Sept. 9 for its first win over an FBS opponent since 2009. It was the second victory against a FBS opponent for CAA Football this season as **James Madison** rolled past East Carolina, 34-14, on Sept. 2. It's the second year in a row that CAA Football has recorded multiple wins versus FBS opponents and the league has seven FBS victories in the past five years and 36 in its history. A complete list of CAA Football victories over FBS opponents can be found on Page 15 of this release.

**JMU PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE:** James Madison, which returned 14 starters from last year's 14-1 team that captured the 2016 NCAA FCS National Championship, was the overwhelming choice to win the CAA Football title in 2017. Richmond, Villanova and New Hampshire, who also earned berths in the FCS playoffs a year ago, took the next three spots in the poll of coaches and media relations directors. Delaware was picked fifth, followed by UAlbany, William & Mary, Stony Brook, Maine, Towson, Elon and Rhode Island.

**CAA GAME OF THE WEEK ON COLLEGE SPORTS LIVE:** The CAA signed an agreement with CBS Sports Digital to stream a "Game of the Week" package which can be seen for free on CollegeSportsLive.com. The 12-game package continues on Saturday with a matchup between Delaware and Maine. Scott Sudikoff handles the play-by-play duties and former NFL player Brandon Noble serves as the analyst. FOX Sports Go will air a CAA game each week for the remainder of the season, including this week's contest between Richmond and Villanova. Matt Janus will provide play-by-play and Ken Dunek is the analyst.

**MULTIPLE TEAMS IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS:** For the third year in a row, four CAA Football teams (James Madison, New Hampshire, Richmond and Villanova) were chosen to the NCAA Division I Football Championship field, and all four advanced to the second round in 2016. CAA Football has had multiple teams in the playoffs for 26 straight years and three or more teams in the playoff field for 11 years in a row. It was the ninth time in league history that at least four teams were chosen. CAA Football had a league-record five teams picked in 2007, 2008 and 2011.

**PLAYOFF SUCCESS:** James Madison became the sixth CAA Football member to capture the FCS National Championship last January when it defeated Youngstown State, 28-14. Since 2003, CAA Football has had a team in the FCS title game nine times, with five different teams winning national titles - Delaware (2003), JMU (2004, 2016), Richmond (2008) and Villanova (2009). CAA Football has had four different teams advance to the semifinals of the playoffs over the past four years - Towson (2013), New Hampshire (2014), Richmond (2015) and JMU (2016) - and 23 semifinalists overall.

**NEW HAMPSHIRE EXTENDS PLAYOFF STREAK:** New Hampshire earned a berth in the FCS playoffs for the 13th consecutive year in 2016, extending the longest active streak in the nation. Under coach Sean McDonnell, the Wildcats have recorded 13 straight winning seasons with double-digit victory totals in six of them. UNH had an incredible streak of 162 straight weeks ranked in the STATS FCS Top 25 poll from Sept. 6, 2004 until Oct. 12, 2015.

**W&M'S LAYCOCK CLIMBS WIN CHART:** William & Mary head coach Jimmie Laycock is in his 38th season with the Tribe, which is the longest tenure at one school among active Division I head coaches. With 245 career wins, he trails only Columbia's Al Bagnoli for the most victories among active NCAA Division I coaches.



**UALBANY****3-5 Overall/1-4 CAAFB**

- Fell 31-14 to Rhode Island last week.
- LB Nate Hatalsky set a UAlbany Div. I record by making 21 tackles vs. URI and also forced a fumble. He leads the CAA with 89 stops (11.1 ppg) for the season.
- UAlbany ranks 13th in FCS in total defense (297.4 ypg), 15th in scoring defense (18.1 ppg) and 19th in rush defense (106.9 ypg).
- LB Eli Mencer returned a fumble 69 yards for a TD against URI. He had an 80-yard fumble return for a TD in an OT win over Villanova earlier this season.
- UAlbany has held its opponent to less than 300 total yards in five of eight games.
- Freshman RB Karl Mofor picked up his team-leading 5th rushing TD against URI. Mofor ranks 5th in the CAA in rushing for the season with 468 yards.
- Donovan McDonald leads the CAA in kickoff returns (25.5 avg.) and ranks second in punt returns (10.6 avg.).

**DELAWARE****5-3 Overall/3-2 CAAFB**

- Edged 18-17 at Towson last week, ending a three-game winning streak.
- The Blue Hens held Towson to 304 total yards and forced 3 TO's. UD ranks 11th in FCS in scoring defense (17.1 ppg), 16th in total defense (308.4 ypg) and 21st in rushing defense (107.9 ypg).
- DB Nasir Adderley made 8 tackles and a one-handed interception at TU. He's tied for the CAA lead with 5 interceptions for the year, including four in the past three games.
- RB Kani Kane topped the 100-yard mark for the 2nd straight game with a career-high 113 yards on 22 carries.
- UD ran for 229 yards at Towson, which was its 5th game with 200+ yards on the ground.
- Frank Raggo kicked a 26-yard field goal at Towson and is 8-for-12 on the season. He has converted 57 straight extra points.
- WR Jamie Jarmon has made at least one reception in 13 straight games.

**ELON****7-1 Overall/5-0 CAAFB**

- Rallied past No. 13 Villanova, 19-14. Elon is on a 7-game winning streak for the first time since 2008. Four of those of victories have come against nationally ranked foes.
- Elon's last seven games have been decided by a total of 28 points. The Phoenix's 5 CAA victories are more than their combined CAA win total (4) over the past three years.
- QB Davis Cheek was 24-of-35 passing for a career-high 357 yards and 2 TD's at VU. It was his third 300-yard passing effort.
- Kortez Weeks set career-highs with 11 catches for 205 yards. He's the third receiver in EU history to top the 200-yard mark.
- DeSean McNair ran for 90 yards on 20 carries vs. VU's #1-ranked rush defense. He's picked up 216 yards over the past 2 games.
- LB Warren Messer had 5 tackles, 3.0 TFL and 2 sacks at Villanova. He's 2nd in the CAA with 76 tackles (9.5 pg).
- Elon has recorded fourth-quarter comebacks to win four games this season.

**JAMES MADISON****8-0 Overall/5-0 CAAFB**

- Defeated No. 13 New Hampshire, 21-0, last week. Off to the best start in school history.
- JMU won its CAA-record 20th straight game, which is the longest streak in Div. I, and tied the league record for consecutive conference victories with 15.
- JMU, which posted its first shutout since 2015, has held its last 7 opponents under 300 total yards. The Dukes rank #1 in FCS in scoring defense (10.0 ppg), #2 in total defense (227.6 ypg), #2 in pass defense (132.4 ypg) and #14 in rush defense (95.3 ypg).
- QB Bryan Schor was 20-of-27 passing for 176 yards and 2 TD's vs. UNH and set a JMU record for career TD passes with 53.
- JMU ranks 7th in FCS in scoring offense (38.3 ppg), 12th in rushing offense (229.6 ypg) and 15th in total offense (453.9 ypg).
- JMU forced three UNH turnovers and scored a defensive TD for the 4th straight game. The Dukes lead the CAA in TO margin (+11).
- Jordan Brown and Rashad Robinson are tied for the CAA lead with 5 interceptions.

**MAINE****4-3 Overall/3-3 CAAFB**

- On a three-game winning streak after beating William & Mary, 23-6, last week.
- Maine's defense held W&M to 199 total yards, including 57 yards passing. Maine hasn't allowed an offensive TD over the last eight quarters.
- Josh Mack ran for 99 yards and a TD on 24 carries vs. W&M. Mack leads FCS in rushing with 139.9 ypg and has topped the 100-yard mark in five of his seven games.
- Chris Ferguson was 13-of-22 passing for 192 yards and a TD vs. W&M. He's thrown 7 TD passes with no pickoffs in the last 3 games.
- Kayon Whitaker ranks 4th in the CAA in sacks (5.5) and 8th in TFL (9.0).
- Brandon Briggs kicked three FG's vs. W&M, including a career-long 43-yarder. He's made his last seven FG's and is 7-for-8 for the year.
- Freshman LB Jaron Grayer made a career-high 12 tackles vs. W&M. He has a team-best 59 stops (8.4 pg) for the season.

**NEW HAMPSHIRE****5-3 Overall/3-2 CAAFB**

- Suffered a 21-0 setback at No. 1 James Madison last week. It was the first time UNH has been shut out by an FCS foe since 2013.
- QB Trevor Knight ranks 19th in FCS in total offense (275.4 ypg) and 16th in passing (255.1 ypg). He's thrown for 14 TD's over the last six games but failed to have a TD pass for the first time all season at JMU.
- Neil O'Connor made 3 catches for 53 yards at JMU. He ranks 5th in FCS in receptions (7.9 pg), 7th in receiving yards (117.0 ypg) and 6th in receiving TD's (9).
- UNH limited JMU's nationally ranked offense to 339 total yards and a pair of second-quarter touchdowns.
- DT Rick Holt recorded a career-high 10 tackles at JMU, while LB Quinlen Dean had 10 tackles and 2.0 TFL. Dean leads the Wildcats with 71 tackles for the season.
- Safety Evan Horn made a career-high 8 tackles, intercepted a pass in the end zone and had a 17-yard punt return at JMU.



**RHODE ISLAND****2-6 Overall/1-4 CAAFB**

- Picked up a 31-14 victory at UAlbany last week for their first CAA win of the year.
- URI's defense limited UA to 125 total yards, including -7 yards rushing. The Rams made 7 sacks and upped their season total to 24.
- JaJuan Lawson passed for 123 yards and 2 TD's and ran for 57 yards at UA. He's tallied 507 yards of total off. in the past 2 games.
- Aaron Parker caught 5 passes for 69 yards at UA but saw his URI-record streak of 9 straight games with a TD catch end. Parker is 19th in FCS in receiving yards (93.4 ypg) and has a reception in 16 straight games.
- URI rushed for a season-high 209 yards, led by Harold Cooper with 77 yards and 2 TD's.
- DL Brandon Ginnetti had 5 tackles, 3.5 TFL and 3 sacks at UAlbany. It was the most sacks by a URI player since 2001.
- DB Kwadir Brown had a team-high 7 tackles, a sack, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and an interception in the win at UAlbany.

**RICHMOND****4-4 Overall/2-3 CAAFB**

- Fell 27-24 to Stony Brook last week. Four of UR's five CAA games have been decided by 7 points or less, with two going to 2 OT.
- Kyle Lauletta was 33-of-52 passing for 310 yards and 3 TD's vs. SBU. He leads FCS in passing yards (369.1 ypg), passing TD's (26) and total offense (375.5 ypg).

- Daniel Jones made a team-high 12 tackles vs. SBU and has 4 interceptions for the year.

**STONY BROOK****6-2 Overall/5-1 CAAFB**

- Earned a 27-24 win at No. 17 Richmond last week. SBU's five CAA victories are its most since joining the league in 2013.
- Ray Bolden made a career-high 13 catches for 118 yards and 2 TD's at UR. He ranks 3rd in the CAA in receptions (51), 5th in receiving yards (654) and is tied for 1st in receiving TD's (9). He has a TD catch in 6 of 8 games and has four 100+ yard games.
- Joe Carbone passed for 161 yards and 2 TD's at UR. He's thrown 14 TD passes with just one interception over the last 7 games.
- Stacey Bedell ran for a team-high 69 yards at UR. He's third in the CAA in rushing with 653 yards and has 6 rushing TD's.

- Ryan Stover was 20-of-32 passing for 187 yards and 2 TD's and also ran for a team-high 56 yards on 8 carries vs. UD. He ranks 5th in the CAA in total offense (197.8 ypg).
- Sam Gallahan made the game-winning 14-yard TD reception with 35 seconds left. He finished with 4 catches for 33 yards.
- John Tsimis had a season-best 5 receptions for 79 yards and a TD against Delaware.
- Towson held UD to 264 total yards, including just 35 yards passing.
- Aidan O'Neill is 10-for-14 on FG's, which is tied for the most FG's in the CAA.
- LB Robert Heyward made a team-high 12 tackles and 1.5 TFL against Delaware.
- All-CAA RB Shane Simpson saw his first action since Sept. 16 and had 33 yards on 8 carries.

**VILLANOVA****4-4 Overall/2-3 CAAFB**

- Dropped a 19-14 decision to No. 10 Elon last week. It was VU's first home loss.
- VU is #2 in FCS in rushing defense (57.8 ypg) and has held nine of its last 10 opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground.
