Senior guard Meghan Creighton helped Drexel to a 2-0 week and set some personal records in the process. In the Dragons win over UNCW, the point guard set a program record and tied a CAA record with 10 three-pointers (10-for-14). The 10 threes tied the most by a single player in NCAA Division I women's basketball this season. Her 30 points established a new career high and helped her reach the 1,000 career point milestone. She also became just the fourth player in CAA history to reach 1,000 points, 500 assists and 400 rebounds. She opened the week with 10 points against William & Mary to go along with a season-high three steals. For the week, Creighton averaged 20.0 points on 59.1 percent shooting (13-for-22) and 61.9 percent from long range (13-for-21).

Junior Amber Porter had an efficient week for the Dukes, averaging 16.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, and 2.0 blocks while shooting 60 percent from the field, to help them to a pair of wins. In the battle for first place against Elon, Porter needed just 19 minutes on the floor to go 7-of-11 from the field and 6-of-7 from the charity stripe en route to her best scoring night since arriving at JMU. She finished with a game-high 20pts, adding three rebounds and a pair of blocks. She began the week with 12 points and seven rebounds in the Dukes' win over Delaware.

Rookie forward Bailey Greenberg averaged 9.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game in two victories for the Dragons over the weekend. She was 9-for-11 (.818) from the floor for the week. In the win over UNCW, Greenberg finished with 11 points, going 5-for-6 from the field, six rebounds and added three assists. In the win over William & Mary, she chipped in eight points on 4-of-5 shooting with four boards in that contest. Greenberg has now started all 24 games for Drexel and is currently fourth on the team (behind three seniors) in scoring at 8.2 points per game average and is second on the team at 4.5 boards per contest.

#CAAHOOPS THE WEEK THAT WAS

- Charleston (8-16; 5-8 CAA):** The Cougars had a pair of road losses, falling at Hofstra and at Northeastern. Senior **Breanna Bolden** averaged 16.5 points, 11.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists per game while **Shiclasia Brown** averaged 15.5.
- Delaware (14-10; 8-5 CAA):** The Blue Hens split games last week, falling at James Madison before topping Hofstra. After missing Friday night with the flu, **Nicole Enabosi** returned to the lineup to deliver 21 points and 11 rebounds in the victory over Hofstra.
- Drexel (18-6; 9-4 CAA):** The Dragons went 2-0 with home victories against William & Mary and UNCW. **Meghan Creighton** had a big week, averaging 20.0 points, including a 30-point effort against UNCW in which she tied a CAA single game record for three-pointers (10) and posted her 1,000th career point. **Sarah Curran** (13.0) and **Jessica Pellechio** (12.0) also averaged double figures for the week.
- Elon (19-6; 11-2 CAA):** The Phoenix split game last week, downing Northeastern before being edged by James Madison on the road. The Phoenix is now tied with the Duke for first place in the standings. **Malaya Johnson** scored in double figures in both games for the Phoenix, averaging 13.5 points and 5.5 rebounds while shooting 55 percent from the field.
- Hofstra (10-14; 3-10 CAA):** The Pride went 1-2 last week, picking up an exciting win over College of Charleston and falling to William & Mary and Delaware. Junior **Ashunae Durant** averaged 20.3 points and 10.0 rebounds per game with double-doubles against Charleston and Delaware. Rookie **Marianne Kalin** had a solid week, including a 16-points night against William & Mary.
- James Madison (18-6; 11-2 CAA):** The Dukes went 2-0 with victories over Delaware and Elon, which moved them into a tie for first place in the standings. **Amber Porter** averaged 16.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, and 2.0 blocks while **Precious Hall** averaged 16.5 points per game and extended her double-digit scoring streak to 24 games.
- UNCW (10-14; 4-9 CAA):** The Seahawks went 1-1, topping Towson before falling at Drexel. **Madison Raque** averaged 10.0 points per game while **Jasmine Steele** averaged 9.0 points and 4.0 assists per game.
- Northeastern (8-17; 4-9 CAA):** The Huskies, plagued by travel woes, split games, falling at Elon before returning home to defeat College of Charleston. **Claudia Ortiz** had another solid week, averaging 14.0 points, including a 23-point effort in the win over CofC. **Francesca Sally** averaged 10.0 points and 9.5 rebounds, including a 13-point, 15-rebound effort in the win over the Cougars.
- Towson (11-13; 4-9 CAA):** The Tigers dropped a pair of games to UNCW and William & Mary. Senior **Raven Bankston** averaged 11.5 points for the week while **Sianni Martin** contributed 11.0 points and 5.5 rebounds per game.
- William & Mary (16-7; 6-7 CAA):** The Tribe went 2-1 on the week, picking up wins over Hofstra and Towson but falling to William & Mary. Senior **Marlena Tremba** led the way by averaging 13.0 points and 3.0 assists per game.

HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is ranked fourth in the nation in scoring at 23.3 points per game. Hall has scored in double digits in 24 straight games, posting 20+ points 14 times and 30+ points four times and 40+ points twice.
- Five of the 10 CAA teams have at least 15 wins.
- Drexel and James Madison are both out-scoring opponents at home by 14.9. Elon is out-scoring opponents by 13.8 points at home this season.
- Six CAA players have hit the 1,000th career point milestone this season.
- Elon has a strength of schedule of 60 (with a non-conference SOS of 40).
- The Phoenix have won 11 games away from home, the most in the CAA this season.
- UD's **Nicole Enabosi** has registered 10 straight games with at least 10 points and nine rebounds.
- Delaware's **Makeda Nicholas** blocked her 100th shot on February 10.
- Drexel point guard **Meghan Creighton** tied a CAA single game record with 10 three-pointers against UNCW on February 12. It also ties an NCAA Division I single-game high this season.
- Creighton also became just the fourth player in CAA history to reach 1,000 points, 500 assists and 400 rebounds during their career. The last player to accomplish the feat was VCU's Rochelle Luckett (1999-02).
- Senior **Sarah Curran** has scored in double figures in 12 straight games and in 22 of 24 games.
- Hofstra's **Ashunae Durant** grabbed 21 rebounds against UNCW on January 20, the most in the CAA this season. Durant has posted 14 double-doubles this season. She's averaging 11.3 rebounds which ranks her seventh in the nation. She's also fourth in offensive rebounds (5.0/g).
- Hofstra senior **Krystal Luciano** has the only two point-assist double-doubles in the CAA this season. She notched one in November and then against on February 10 with 20 points and 10 helpers against CofC.
- The Pride has played four overtime games, the most by a CAA squad this season.
- Cougars senior **Breanna Bolden** has made 31 of her last 33 attempts. Her streak of 25 straight free throws made was snapped on February 12.
- Bolden is the CAA's career active leader in steals with 321. She also stands eighth all-time in CAA history and CofC's all-time leading scorer (1,563).
- William & Mary's **Abby Rendle** moved into seventh all-time in CAA history with 206 career blocks. She's only the eighth player in CAA history to reach the 200-block milestone.
- Rendle's 85 blocks this season are ranked sixth on the CAA single season charts. The last player to swat 80+ shots in a single season was Elena Delle Donne, who had 86 in 2011-12.
- Tribe senior **Marlena Tremba** has made 273 three-point field goals and is tenth on the CAA career chart.
- Towson has notched double-digit steals in 15 of 24 games this season.

CAA REVERSES OUTCOME OF TWO GAMES

- On February 2, Colonial Athletic Association Commissioner Joe D'Antonio announced his decision to reverse the outcome of a pair of conference games involving the College of Charleston, William & Mary and UNCW women's basketball teams due to the use of improper basketballs.
- The improper balls were used in the College of Charleston's home victories over William & Mary on January 6, and UNCW on January 8.
- The official results, team records (standings) and statistics from the games will not change per NCAA policy. However, William & Mary and UNCW will be awarded a win and College of Charleston will be charged with two losses for purposes of seeding the 2017 CAA Women's Basketball Championship.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE RPI

- College Basketball News RPI:** The CAA was rated eighth as a conference for the tenth consecutive week on February 13. Elon moved to 32, James Madison to 39 and Drexel to 68.
- NCAA.com RPI:** Through games on February 12, three CAA teams are in the top-100. Elon is rated at No. 32 while James Madison (39) and Drexel (68) As a conference, the CAA has an RPI of 8.

NATIONAL NOTICE

- William & Mary is ranked fourth in the country in blocks per game (6.3) and third in total blocks (155) led by **Abby Rendle**, who is fifth with 3.54 blocks a night.
- Drexel point guard **Meghan Creighton** is third in three-point field goal percentage (.490).
- The Dragons are ranked in nine different team categories including seventh in three-pointers made per game (9.2), 11th in scoring defense (54.2) and the tenth fewest turnovers per game (12.2).
- Two CAA players are in the top-15 in steals. CofC's **Breanna Bolden** is seventh in total steals (86) and seventh in steals per game (3.58) while Towson's **Raven Bankston** is 13th in both total steals (75) and steals per game (3.13).
- Hofstra's **Ashunae Durant** is seventh in rebounds per game (11.3), eighth in double-doubles (15) and fourth in offensive rebounds per game (5.0).
- Pride point guard **Krystal Luciano** is 21st in assists per game (6.0).
- Northeastern's **Jess Genco** is third in minutes played per game (38.40).
- Delaware's **Nicole Enabosi** is 18th in free throws made (127).

THREES PLEASE

- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** tied a CAA single game record with 10 three-pointers against UNCW on February 10. Two other players have hit 10 threes in a single game: **Alyssa Frye** of CofC (1/19/14) and **TJ Jordan** of ODU (2/8/07).
- Drexel hit 15 three-pointers against UNCW on February 12, tying them for the third-most in a CAA single game history.
- UNCW also hit 15 three-pointers this season against Catawba on December 19.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE MID-MAJOR RANKINGS

- College Insider Mid-Major Poll:** Three teams appeared in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll while one received votes on February 7. Elon jumped seven spots to No. 5 while James Madison moved up five to No. 8. Drexel went to No. 21.
- ESPN.com/Graham Hays Mid-Major Rankings:** Two CAA teams were ranked among the top-10 mid-major programs by **ESPN.com's Graham Hays** on February 1. Elon appeared for the second week, this time coming in at No. 8 while James Madison made its debut at No. 9, knocking out Drexel. On January 4, Drexel was recognized as the top mid-major team in the nation.

CAA CHAMPIONSHIP HEADS TO CAMPUS

- The CAA Women's Basketball Championship is returning to campus sites for the next three seasons, beginning with the 2017 tournament.
- James Madison** hosting in 2017, **Drexel** hosting in 2018, and **Delaware** hosting in 2019.
- The CAA Women's Basketball Championship has been held at 10 different sites in the league's 31 years.
- The tournament was last held on campus in 2010 before moving to the Show Place Arena in 2012.
- James Madison has hosted the CAA Championship on six occasions, with the last time coming in 2010. Delaware has hosted the CAA Championship twice in 2007 and 2008. This will be the first time Drexel has hosted CAA postseason action.

MAKE IT 1,000

- On February 10, Elon's **Jenifer Rhodes** and Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** both scored their 1,000th career points in their respective games. Rhodes is the third Phoenix to reach the milestone this season while Creighton is the second Dragon this year to achieve it.
- Elon junior **Shay Burnett** posted her 1,000th career point on February 5 at UNCW, finishing with 23 points on the day.
- Hofstra junior **Ashunae Durant** notched her 1,000th career point on January 29 against Elon. She finished the day with 17 points.
- Elon senior **Lauren Brown** notched her 1,000th career point in the victory at William & Mary on January 22, finishing with 10 points, including the game-winning free throws.
- Drexel senior **Jessica Pellechio** reached the 1,000 career point milestone with a 20-point outing at Northeastern on January 8. Pellechio joins **Sarah Curran** in the club while **Meghan Creighton** nearing the milestone.

WE'LL TAKE PRECIOUS HALL FOR 2000

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** became the eighth player in CAA history to reach score 2,000 point when she hit her historic bucket on a three-pointer at Hofstra on February 3.
- The last CAA player to hit 2,000 was Hofstra's Shante Evans during 2012-13.
- Hall is just the third Duke to reach the milestone behind Tamera Young (2,121) and Dawn Evans (2,667).
- Hall currently has 2,051 points and is eighth on the CAA's all-time scoring list.

COACHES CORNER

- Drexel Head Coach **Denise Dillon** recorded her 250th career win on February 10 in the Dragons' victory over William & Mary.
- Head Coach **Tina Martin** picked up her 400th career victory with the win against Hofstra on January 15. Martin, who is in her 21st season, currently holds a 406-233 all-time record as the winningest coach in UD basketball history.
- Elon Head Coach **Charlotte Smith** posted her 100th career victory in the Phoenix win over Drexel on January 15. She has a 106-756 record.
- UNCW Head Coach **Adell Harris** earned the 100th win of her coaching career on January 29. Harris has 39 victories at UNCW after compiling a 61-30 record in three years at Tusculum.
- Head Coach **Sean O'Regan** earned his first career victory at the helm of the James Madison in the Dukes' 83-57 victory over St. Francis Brooklyn on November 13.

HOME SWEET HOME

Home courts have been defended well this season with the home teams forging a 74-44 record.

- In non-league play, the CAA went 34-18.
- Drexel is 11-1 at the Daskalakis Athletic Center (DAC) this season.
- James Madison have welcomed 2,000+ fans to the Convocation Center in 50 consecutive games. The Dukes are 9-2 at home this season.
- In six seasons under Head Coach **Charlotte Smith**, the Phoenix is 61-20 at Alumni Gym and have never lost more than five home games in a single season.
- The Phoenix set a women's basketball attendance record on January 20 against James Madison, welcoming 1,412 fans at Alumni Gym.
- UNCW hosted its first of two "Seahawks Tomorrow" games on December 15. More than 4,400 area elementary school students attended the game. The second game on January 6, saw 3,207 students take over Trask.

BIG ON THE BOARDS

- Hofstra's **Ashunae Durant** grabbed 21 rebounds against UNCW on January 20, the most in the CAA this season.
- The 21 rebounds are tied for sixth most in CAA single-game history, a mark that was achieved last season.
- The CAA single game record for rebounds is 24 set by American's Mary Klima in 1994.

40 IS THE NEW 30

- JMU's **Precious Hall** scored 46 points in the double overtime at Rutgers. It was the first 40+ game in the CAA since February 26, 2015 when UNCW's Brie Mobley had 46 points against Delaware. The Seahawks' Kelda Atkins also scored 40 points that season.
- Hall recorded her second such effort on January 20 at Elon, tallying 41 points.
- Hall is one of two players in CAA history to score 40+ points twice in a single season. Elena Delle Donne is the other one. She scored 40+ points four times during the 2011-12 season.
- Hall is one of three players in CAA history to have multiple 40-point games in a career. Delle Donne had six 40-point games in her career. Gabriela Marginean (Drexel) had three 40-point games.

THE BIG 3-0

Four players registered 30-point efforts.

- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** posted a career-high 30 points against UNCW on February 12 after going 10-for-14 from three-point range.
- Towson's **Raven Bankston** posted 31 points in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell and then delivered 30 points in the 68-63 win over Cornell. Bankston then notched 31 points at Delaware on January 29.
- Drexel's **Jessica Pellechio** dropped in a career-high 30 points, including eight three-pointers, in the 83-60 win against Penn State.
- JMU's **Precious Hall** poured in 39 points in the loss to No. 13/14 Tennessee. She also had 35 points in the win over Wake Forest.

THANKS FOR THE CHARITY

- Drexel went 22-for-22 from the free throw line against Penn State on November 11. The percentage tied the CAA single record, but the Dragons are the only team to go 22-for-22.
- The Dragons have also gone 12-for-12 and 11-for-11 from the line this season.
- James Madison had a perfect day on the line at William & Mary on January 29, connecting on all 18 free throw attempts.
- Delaware made a season-best 34 free throws against Towson on January 29. The Blue Hens attempted a season-high 40 free throws.

HELPING THEM OUT

- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** dished out her 500th career assist on January 20. She became just the second Dragon in program history to reach that milestone.
- Northeastern sophomore **Jess Genco** recorded her 200th career assist against Delaware on January 20.
- Hofstra's **Krystal Luciano** has dished out 10+ assists three times this season. She handed out 11 at Sacramento State and 10 against UMass, which included the 400th of her career. She handed out 10 against against CofC.
- William & Mary's **Jenna Green** picked up 11 assists at Charleston. She also dished out her 200th assist on January 27 against Delaware.

BLOCK PARTY

- William & Mary's **Abby Rendle** tied a career-high with 10 blocked shots against East Carolina on December 28. It also tied the second-highest single game total in CAA history. Former ODU standout Marquitta Head holds the record (11).
- Rendle's 85 blocks this season are ranked sixth on the CAA single season charts. The last player to swat 80+ shots in a single season was Elena Delle Donne, who had 26 in 2011-12.
- The CAA single season blocking record is 110, set by Amy Dorsett during the 1996-97 season.
- William & Mary has blocked 13 shots twice this season against Mount St. Mary's (12/18) and East Carolina (12/28). The 13 blocks are tied for eighth most in CAA single-game history.
- Elon holds the single game record with 17 blocks which was set against ETSU in 2015.

SO YOU WANT TO BE A COACH

- Three CAA student-athletes were chosen for the 15th annual "So You Want To Be A Coach."
- College of Charleston's **Nola Henry**, Elon's **Essence Baucom** and UNCW's **Amber Reeves** will represent the CAA at the three-day workshop held March 29-31 in conjunction with the WBCA National Convention in Dallas.
- Participants will learn about recruiting, the administrative side to coaching, how to get hired, skill development, the importance of knowing the rules, and how to balance work and life.
- Qualified candidates must have exhausted their final year of basketball eligibility. In addition, the candidate's head coach has to nominate them and must be an active WBCA member. Each participant is selected based on her academics, contributions to women's basketball on and off the court, professional resume and a written recommendation from their head coach.

MESSSED AROUND AND GOT A TRIPLE-DOUBLE

- William & Mary center **Abby Rendle** posted her second career triple-double with 14 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks against East Carolina on December 28.
- Rendle posted the Tribe's first triple-double in program history last season.
- There have only been two triple-doubles in the CAA since 2014, and the two points-rebounds-blocks triple-doubles since 2006; Rendle holds both of those.

SOLID STARTS

- William & Mary wrapped up non-league play with a 10-1 record, setting the program record for wins. Last season, the Tribe set the program's best start when they opened the campaign 11-2 and has surpassed that start.
- At 12-3, the Dragons got off to its best 15-game start in program history. Drexel is 14-4 for just the second time ever.
- The Dragons had a perfect month of December, going 6-0, including four road victories. It was the Dragons' first undefeated month during the regular season since going 5-0 in November to start the 2010-11 season.
- Towson got off to a 5-0 start, its best start to a season since the 2008-09 squad also opened the year with five straight victories.
- The Tigers wrapped up non-conference play above .500 and its most league wins since the 2011-12 squad went 9-3. The seven non-league wins were also the most under Head Coach **Niki Reid Geckeler**.
- Delaware got off to a 4-0 start the year for the first time since 2010-11 when the Elena Delle Donne led team went 31-2 after a 10-0 start.

#CAAHOOOPS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- The CAA went 66-46 in non-league play.
- The CAA went 11-1 against the A-10.
- The CAA went 4-0 against the Ivy League.
- From November 14-20, the CAA went 13-7, notching victories over 11 different conferences, including the a win over the Big Ten and pairs of wins over the A-10 and Big South.
- The CAA went a combined 61-56 against non-conference opponents in 2015-16.

USBWA NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Drexel's **Ana Ferariu** was named the USBWA National Freshman of the Week on December 20. Ferariu, who also earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors, came off the bench in the second half to score 18 points in 13 minutes in the win against Saint Joseph's.

- Three CAA student-athletes were nominated for the 2017 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team.
- William & Mary's **Alexandra Masaquel**, Hofstra's **Sydni Epps** and Delaware's **Hannah Jardine** earned the honor.
- This esteemed award honors an outstanding group of student-athletes who represent the sport's finest in the areas of community service and leadership among their peers.

LIEBERMAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Drexel senior point guard **Meghan Creighton** was named one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Award.
- In its 17th year, the Nancy Lieberman Award recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. Candidates exhibit the floor leadership, play-making and ball-handling skills of the Hall of Famer.

THANKSGIVING TOURNAMENT TIME

- Northeastern and James Madison both competed at the 2016 Cancun Challenge in Puerto Aventuras, Mexico, November 24-26.
- The Dukes topped Idaho State, 83-53, but fell to Iowa, 90-75, in the Riviera Division in pre-set matchups. Guard **Precious Hall** earned a spot on the All-Riviera Tournament Team. It was JMU's fourth trip to the tournament.
- Northeastern played in the tournament's round-robin Mayan Division along with Stanford (L, 74-45), Purdue (L, 79-54), and Wichita State (L, 87-73). Sophomore guard Jess Genco earned a spot on the All-Mayan Tournament Team.
- The annual UNCW Hampton Inn Thanksgiving Classic was held November 26-27. The Seahawks fell to Providence (65-49) and La Salle (64-48) while also welcoming Miami (Ohio) to Trask Coliseum.
- Delaware headed the West Coast for the Cal State Northridge Thanksgiving Classic. The Blue Hens fell to No. 23 Michigan State, 81-64, and then to Detroit Mercy, 66-64.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE PRESEASON WNIT

Elon was the CAA's representative in the 2016 Pre-season WNIT.

- The Phoenix drew a road game at Green Bay in the first round on November 11, falling 74-53.
- Elon traveled to Mount Pleasant, Mich. for the consolation rounds.
- In their first consolation game on November 18, the Phoenix downed Eastern Washington, 76-55, behind three double-digit scoring efforts.
- Elon closed out action by knocking off host Central Michigan, 71-57. The Phoenix was led by rookie **Jada Graves'** 20-point night.
- Elon is one of 16 teams that was selected to participate in the field: Abilene Christian (Southland); Central Michigan (MAC); Colorado State (MWC); Eastern Washington (Big Sky); Fordham (Atlantic 10); Furman (Southern); Green Bay (Horizon); Little Rock (Sun Belt); Missouri (SEC); Nebraska (Big Ten); North Texas (C-USA); Notre Dame (ACC); Omaha (Summit), UT-Rio Grande Valley (WAC); and Washington (Pac-12).
- Since 1997, CAA teams are 15-16 in Preseason WNIT action.

TIP-OFF TIME

- The CAA went a combined 9-4 on opening weekend.
- The 2016-17 season tipped off on November 11 with seven games, six of which were home games. The CAA went 5-2 in those contests, including 5-1 at home.

LOOK WHO'S BACK

- Seven of the 15 All-CAA honorees from last year return for the 2016-17 season, including the two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year, **Breanna Bolden** from CoFC. The 2014-15 CAA Player of the Year, **Precious Hall** of James Madison, returns for her final season after missing the entirety of 2015-16 with an injury.
- The offense in the CAA will be plentiful once again this season as 10 of the top-20 scorers from 2015-16 will be back on the hardwood for their respective teams.

#CAAHOOPS PRESEASON RUNDOWN

- James Madison was predicted to finish atop the conference for the fourth consecutive season.
- It was close voting at the top with the Dukes as the overall favorite with 76 points, Elon in second with 70 points and Drexel in third (68).
- After missing all of the 2015-16 season with an injury, redshirt senior guard **Precious Hall** is back to lead James Madison and was tabbed as the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Player of the Year. During 2014-15, Hall averaged 20.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game and was the unanimous choice for CAA Player of the Year.
- It was also close among the next four teams. Hofstra (49) was picked fourth, Delaware and William & Mary were tied for fifth with 47 points apiece while Northeastern was seventh with 41 points. Rounding out the 10 teams were College of Charleston (19), UNCW (17) and Towson (16).

- The Tigers swept James Madison this season, making them the first team since the 2012-13 Blue Hens to do so. Towson also picked up its first-ever win in Harrisonburg.
- Towson topped Norfolk State on December 29 to match their win total from a year ago. Last year, the Tigers didn't earn their seventh win of the season until March 9 in the CAA Tournament.
- Towson started the year at 5-0, the program's best start since the 2008-09 team opened the year with five straight victories.
- The Tigers wrapped up non-conference play above .500 and its most league wins since the 2011-12 squad went 9-3. The seven wins were the most under Head Coach **Niki Reid Geckeler**.
- With Lil Wayne performing on November 19 in SECU Arena, Towson hosted Cornell at the Towson Center, the first official basketball competition in the Arena since March 3, 2013.
- Towson held Wagner to 40 points on November 17. It was the lowest point total that the Tigers held an opponent to since 2009.
- Towson dropped in 90 points in the season-opener against UMass Lowell. It was the most points scored by the Tigers since 2003-04.
- The Tigers were picked to finish tenth in the 2016-17 CAA Preseason Poll. Senior guard **Raven Bankston** was a 2016-17 Preseason All-CAA Second Team selection.
- Towson returns four starters from 2015-16 and a team that went 7-24 (3-15 CAA).
- As a No. 10 seed, Towson advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2016 CAA Championship, falling to Drexel, 71-54.
