Junior Ashunae Durant once again led the Pride in both games this weekend, averaging 21.5 points and 8.0 rebounds. She also shot a blistering 70.4 percent from the floor (19-for-27). She put up 18 points and seven rebounds in the loss to the Tigers before going 10-for-12 for 25 points in the win over the Dragons. Sunday's performance was her ninth game with 20 or more points this season

and third with at least 25. She also finished one rebound off a double-double and was 5-for-5 from the free throw line.

Senior Alexandra Masaquel nearly registered a double-double for the week at 14.5 points and 9.0 rebounds on 55.0 percent shooting as the Tribe went 2-0, which including a huge win at James Madison. Masaquel notched her eighth double-double of the season on Senior Day with 14 points and 12 rebounds and added four assists, two blocks, and a steal in the victory over UNCW. On Sunday,

Masaquel went a perfect 6-for-6 from the field finishing with 15 points, six rebounds, one assist, and four steals to help the Tribe hand James Madison its first loss in nine games and to their first win at the Convocations Center since 1999.

#CAAHOOPS REWIND

- **Charleston (9-19; 6-11 CAA):** The Cougars had a pair of tough losses at home, falling to Northeastern and Delaware. Senior **Breanna Bolden** led the Cougars in scoring (25.5ppg) and rebounding (8.5rpg) once again. **Tanisha Brown** had another solid week, averaging 14.0 points and 6.5 rebounds.
- **Delaware (15-13; 9-8 CAA):** The Blue Hens split games, falling to Elon before topping Charleston on the road. Sophomore **Nicole Enabosi** posted back-to-back double-doubles, averaging 19 points and 14 rebounds and shooting better than 59 percent from the field.
- **Drexel (20-6; 11-6 CAA):** The Dragons lost back-to-back games for the first time all season, falling to Elon, in only their second home loss this season, and at Hofstra. Senior **Sarah Curran** was the only Dragon to average double figures at 16.0 points per game.
- **Elon (23-6; 15-2 CAA):** The Phoenix went 2-0 with road wins against Delaware and Towson. Senior **Jenifer Rhodes** led the Phoenix in scoring in both games with 11 points at Delaware and 18 on 8-of-12 shooting against Towson.
- **Hofstra (12-16; 5-12 CAA):** The Pride split games last week, falling to Towson before picking up a crucial victory over Drexel. Junior **Ashunae Durant** had another strong weekend for the Pride, averaging 21.5 points on 70 percent shooting, and 8.0 rebounds.
- **James Madison (21-7; 14-3 CAA):** The Dukes split games last week, topping Drexel on the road before falling at home to William & Mary. Senior **Precious Hall** averaged a double-double for the week with 18 points and 10 rebounds and moved into fourth all-time on the CAA career scoring chart.
- **UNCW (11-17; 5-12 CAA):** The Seahawks split games, falling at William & Mary before returning home to defeat Northeastern. **Jenny DeGraaf** averaged 12.5 points per game while **Rebekah Banks** averaged 8.0 rebounds.
- **Northeastern (11-18; 7-10 CAA):** The Huskies had their four-game winning streak snapped, with a loss to UNCW after defeating Charleston on Friday. Senior **Francesca Sally** averaged 26.0 points and 9.5 rebounds, while shooting better than 58 percent for the week. Sally notched a career-best 30 points in the win over Charleston.
- **Towson (12-16; 5-12 CAA):** The Tigers snapped an eight-game losing skid with a win at Hofstra on Friday but was edged by Elon on Sunday. **Raven Bankston** averaged 19.0 points and 5.0 rebounds while **Sianni Martin** averaged 18.0 points, 7.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists.
- **William & Mary (18-10; 8-9 CAA):** The Tribe picked up a pair wins, downing UNCW before picking up a huge win at James Madison. It was the Tribe's first win at the Convo since 1999.

CAA REVERSES OUTCOME OF TWO GAMES

- On February 2, Colonial Athletic Association Commissioner Joe D'Antonio announced his decision to reverse the outcome of a pair of conference games involving the College of Charleston, William & Mary and UNCW women's basketball teams due to the use of improper basketballs.
- The improper balls were used in the College of Charleston's home victories over William & Mary on January 6, and UNCW on January 8.
- The official results, team records (standings) and statistics from the games will not change per NCAA policy. However, William & Mary and UNCW will be awarded a win and College of Charleston will be charged with two losses for purposes of seeding the 2017 CAA Women's Basketball Championship.

#CAACHAMPS SEEDING SCENARIOS

- **No. 1/No. 2 Seeds:** James Madison is the No. 1 Seed with a Win and an Elon loss. Elon is the No. 1 Seed with a win.
- **No. 3 Seed:** Drexel has secured the No. 3 Seed.
- **No. 4/5 Seeds:** If Delaware and William & Mary finish tied for fourth at 10-8 or 9-9, the two teams split their head-to-head matchup. William & Mary is the No. 4 seed based on its win over James Madison.
- **No. 6 Seed:** Northeastern is the No. 6 seed with a win. If Northeastern and UNCW finish tied for sixth at 7-11, the two teams split their head-to-head matchup. UNCW is the No. 6 seed based on their win over Elon.
- **No. 7 Seed: If UNCW and Hofstra finish tied for seventh at 6-12:** The two teams split their head-to-head matchup. Hofstra is the No. 7 seed based on their win over Drexel. **If UNCW and Towson finish tied for seventh at 6-12:** UNCW is the No. 7 seed based on its sweep of the season series with Towson. **If UNCW, Hofstra and Towson finish tied for seventh at 6-12:** UNCW is the #7 seed based on its 3-1 record against Hofstra and Towson. Hofstra is the #8 seed based on its 2-2 record against UNCW and Towson and Towson is the #9 seed based on its 1-3 record against UNCW and Hofstra.
- **No. 8 Seed: If Hofstra and Towson finished tied for eighth at 5-13:** The two teams split their head-to-head matchup. Towson is the No. 8 seed based on their 2-0 record against James Madison. **If Charleston, Hofstra and Towson finish tied for eighth at 5-13:** The three teams all have a 2-2 record against each other. Towson is the No. 8 seed based on its 2-0 record against James Madison. Charleston is the #9 seed based on its 1-1 record against JMU and Hofstra is the #10 seed based on its 0-2 record against JMU.
- **No. 9/10 Seeds:** With a loss, Charleston is the No. 10 seed. **If Charleston and Hofstra finish tied for ninth at 5-13:** The two teams split their head-to-head matchup. Charleston is the #9 seed based on their win over James Madison. **If Charleston and Towson finish tied for ninth at 5-13:** The two teams split their head-to-head matchup. Towson is the No. 9 seed based on their 2-0 record against James Madison.

HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS

- Elon received a vote in the WBCA Coaches Poll on February 21. It's the first time all season in which a CAA team has been recognized.
- The Phoenix have won 13 games away from home, the most in the CAA this season.
- Elon's 15th conference win of the season marks the most league wins for the Phoenix in their NCAA Division I history. Elon has never won a regular season championship during their time as a DI program.
- James Madison's **Precious Hall** is ranked seventh in the nation in scoring at 23.2 points per game. Hall has scored in double digits in 28 straight games, posting 20+ points 17 times and 30+ points four times and 40+ points twice.
- Hall is the CAA's career active scoring leader with 2,156 points, which ranks her fourth all-time in league history.
- James Madison was held without a three-pointer against William & Mary on February 26. It was the first that's happened since November 2012.
- Drexel point guard **Meghan Creighton** is just the fourth player in CAA history to reach 1,000 points, 500 assists and 400 rebounds during their career. The last player to accomplish the feat was VCU's Rochelle Luckett (1999-02).
- Hofstra's **Krystal Luciano** is on pace to join the same club as Creighton, she has 989 points, 523 assists and 417 rebounds.
- Drexel's Senior **Sarah Curran** has scored in double figures in 26 of 29 games.
- William & Mary's **Alexandra Masaquel** (996) and **Krystal Luciano** (989) are approaching the 1,000 career-point milestone.
- Cougars senior **Breanna Bolden** has made 54 of her last 57 free throw attempts. Her streak of 25 straight free throws made was snapped on February 12. She went 11-for-11 from the line against Delaware on February 26.
- Bolden is the CAA's career active leader in steals with 331, which ranks her seventh all-time in CAA history, and rebounds leader (829). Bolden is also CofC's all-time leading scorer (1,651).
- William & Mary's **Abby Rendle** moved into fourth all-time in CAA history with 215 career blocks. She's only the eighth player in CAA history to reach the 200-block milestone.
- Rendle's 94 blocks this season are ranked fourth on the CAA single season charts. The last player to swat 90+ shots in a single season was Hofstra's Jess Fuller who had 97 in 2008-9 and 103 in 2009-10.
- The Tribe has blocked 13 shots three times this season which is tied for eighth on the CAA single game chart.
- William & Mary has out-rebounded opponents in seven of its last eight games and are 13-3 this season when they win the board battle.
- The Tribe's 18 wins are third most in program history. W&M has eight road wins, tying the single season program record.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE RPI

- College Basketball News RPI:** After 11 straight weeks of being rated eighth, the CAA dropped one spot to No. 9 in the conference RPI on February 20 and remained there the following week. Elon moved up to 25, James Madison remained at 39 while Drexel moved down to 75.
- NCAA.com RPI:** Through games on February 26 three CAA teams are in the top-100. Elon is rated at No. 25 while James Madison (39) and Drexel (75). As a conference, the CAA has an RPI of 9.

ROLLING ON 20s

- Elon, Drexel and James Madison have each secured 20-win seasons.
- The Phoenix has recorded just their second-ever 20-win season in their NCAA Division I history and surpassed the 20-win mark for just the first time. The only other time was in 2010-11 when the Phoenix went 20-13 overall.
- The Dragons have reached the 20-win milestone for the sixth time in program history and the fourth time under Head Coach **Denise Dillon**. It is just the fourth time that the Dragons have 20 wins before the end of the regular season, and they will have three opportunities to tie or surpass the program record of 21 wins before the start of postseason play.
- The Dukes have notched their 12th consecutive 20-win season.
- The CAA record for consecutive 20-win seasons stands at 17, which was achieved by Old Dominion from 1991-92 until 2007-08.

CAA CHAMPIONSHIP HEADS TO CAMPUS

- The 2017 CAA Women's Basketball Championship will be held, March 8-11, at the JMU Convocation Center in Harrisonburg, Va., The top six teams receive first round byes.
- Beginning with the 2017 CAA Women's Basketball Championship, the postseason event returns to campus sites for the next three seasons. Drexel is hosting in 2018, and Delaware hosting in 2019.
- The CAA Women's Basketball Championship has been held at 10 different sites in the league's 31 years.
- The tournament was last held on campus in 2010 before moving to the Show Place Arena in 2012.
- James Madison has hosted the CAA Championship on six occasions, with the last time coming in 2010. Delaware has hosted the CAA Championship twice in 2007 and 2008. This will be the first time Drexel has hosted CAA postseason action.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE MID-MAJOR RANKINGS

- College Insider Mid-Major Poll:** Three teams appeared in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll while one received votes on February 21. James Madison vaulted up three spots to No. 2 while Elon moved up three spots to No. 8. Drexel remained up to No. 20.
- ESPN.com/Graham Hays Mid-Major Rankings:** Two CAA teams were ranked among the top-10 mid-major programs by ESPN.com's **Graham Hays** on February 15. Elon appeared for the second week, coming in at No. 8 while James Madison moved up four spots to No. 5 in its second week being ranked. On January 4, Drexel was recognized as the top mid-major team.

- Hofstra's **Krystal Luciano** has dished out 10+ assists four times this season. She handed out 11 at Sacramento State and 10 against UMass, which included the 400th of her career. She handed out 10 against CoFC then 10 at UNCW, which included the 500th of her career.
- William & Mary's **Jenna Green** picked up 11 assists at Charleston. She also dished out her 200th assist on January 27 against Delaware.

MESSED AROUND AND GOT A TRIPLE-DOUBLE

- There have been two triple-doubles in the CAA this season.
- Hofstra senior **Krystal Luciano** recorded the first-ever triple-double for the Pride finishing with 21 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists at UNCW on February 19.
- It was the first points-rebounds-assists triple-double since **Abby Redick** of Drexel had 12 points, 10 rebounds, 12 assists on January 16, 2014 against William & Mary.
- William & Mary center **Abby Rendle** posted her second career triple-double with 14 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocks against East Carolina on December 28.
- Rendle posted the Tribe's first triple-double in program history last season.
- There have only been two points-rebounds-blocks triple-doubles since 2006; Rendle holds both of those.

COACHES CORNER

- Drexel Head Coach **Denise Dillon** recorded her 250th career win on February 10 in the Dragons' victory over William & Mary.
- Head Coach **Tina Martin** picked up her 400th career victory with the win against Hofstra on January 15. Martin, who is in her 21st season, currently holds a 407-236 all-time record as the winningest coach in UD basketball history.
- Elon Head Coach **Charlotte Smith** posted her 100th career victory in the Phoenix win over Drexel on January 15. Smith has guided Elon to just its second-ever 20-win season and first during her tenure. The Phoenix has won at least 18 games in four out of the last five seasons.
- UNCW Head Coach **Adell Harris** earned the 100th win of her coaching career on January 29. Harris has 39 victories at UNCW after compiling a 61-30 record in three years at Tusculum.
- Head Coach **Sean O'Regan** earned his first career victory at the helm of the James Madison in the Dukes' 83-57 victory over St. Francis Brooklyn on November 13.

- The Phoenix set a women's basketball attendance record on January 20 against James Madison, welcoming 1,412 fans at Alumni Gym.
- UNCW hosted its first of two "Seahawks Tomorrow" games on December 15. More than 4,400 area elementary school students attended the game. The second game on January 6, saw 3,207 students take over Trask.

THREES PLEASE

- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** tied a CAA single game record with 10 three-pointers against UNCW on February 10. Two other players have hit 10 threes in a single game: **Alyssa Frye** of CoFC (1/19/14) and **TJ Jordan** of ODU (2/8/07).
- Drexel hit 15 three-pointers against UNCW on February 12, tying them for the third-most in a CAA single game history.
- UNCW also hit 15 three-pointers this season against Catawba on December 19.
- Elon has hit three-pointers in all but two games over the last six seasons. The only two occurrences came on January 22, 2016 against College of Charleston (0-for-14) and February 9, 2

WE'LL TAKE PRECIOUS HALL FOR 2000

- James Madison's **Precious Hall** became the eighth player in CAA history to reach score 2,000 point when she hit her historic bucket on a three-pointer at Hofstra on February 3.
- The last CAA player to hit 2,000 was Hofstra's **Shante Evans** during 2012-13.
- Hall is just the third Duke to reach the milestone behind Tamera Young (2,121) and Dawn Evans (2,667).013, at Chattanooga (0-for-12).

MAKE IT 1,000

- On February 10, Elon's **Jenifer Rhodes** and Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** both scored their 1,000th career points in their respective games. Rhodes is the third Phoenix to reach the milestone this season while Creighton is the second Dragon this year to achieve it.
- Elon junior **Shay Burnett** posted her 1,000th career point on February 5 at UNCW, finishing with 23 points on the day.
- Hofstra junior **Ashunae Durant** notched her 1,000th career point on January 29 against Elon. She finished the day with 17 points.
- Elon senior **Lauren Brown** notched her 1,000th career point in the victory at William & Mary on January 22, finishing with 10 points, including the game-winning free throws.
- Drexel senior **Jessica Pellechio** reached the 1,000 career point milestone with a 20-point outing at Northeastern on January 8.

BIG ON THE BOARDS

- Hofstra's **Ashunae Durant** grabbed 21 rebounds against UNCW on January 20, the most in the CAA this season.
- The 21 rebounds are tied for sixth most in CAA single-game history, a mark that was achieved last season.
- The CAA single game record for rebounds is 24 set by American's Mary Klima in 1994.

40 IS THE NEW 30

- JMU's **Precious Hall** scored 46 points in the double overtime at Rutgers. It was the first 40+ game in the CAA since February 26, 2015 when UNCW's Brie Mobley had 46 points against Delaware. The Seahawks' Kelva Atkins also scored 40 points that season.
- Hall recorded her second such effort on January 20 at Elon, tallying 41 points.
- Hall is one of two players in CAA history to score 40+ points twice in a single season. Elena Delle Donne is the other one. She scored 40+ points four times during the 2011-12 season.
- Hall is one of three players in CAA history to have multiple 40-point games in a career. Delle Donne had six 40-point games in her career. Gabriela Marginean (Drexel) had three 40-point games.

THE BIG 3-0

Five players registered 30-point efforts.

- Northeastern's **Francesca Sally** joined the 30-point club, dropping in a career-best 30 points in the win at UNCW on February 24.
- Drexel's **Meghan Creighton** posted a career-high 30 points against UNCW on February 12 after going 10-for-14 from three-point range.
- Towson's **Raven Bankston** posted 31 points in the 90-56 win over UMass Lowell and then delivered 30 points in the 68-63 win over Cornell. Bankston then notched 31 points at Delaware on January 29.
- Drexel's **Jessica Pellechio** dropped in a career-high 30 points, including eight three-pointers, in the 83-60 win against Penn State.
- JMU's **Precious Hall** poured in 39 points in the loss to No. 13/14 Tennessee. She also had 35 points in the win over Wake Forest.

THANKS FOR THE CHARITY

- Drexel went 22-for-22 from the free throw line against Penn State on November 11. The percentage tied the CAA single record, but the Dragons are the only team to go 22-for-22.
- The Dragons have also gone 12-for-12 and 11-for-11 from the line this season.
- James Madison had a perfect day on the line at William & Mary on January 29, connecting on all 18 free throw attempts.
- Delaware made a season-best 34 free throws against Towson on January 29. The Blue Hens attempted a season-high 40 free throws.
- JMU's **Amber Porter** had a streak of 17 made free throws while CofC's **Breanna Bolden** had the longest streak of the year, making 25 straight free throws.

BLOCK PARTY

- William & Mary's **Abby Rendle** tied a career-high with 10 blocked shots against East Carolina on December 28. It also tied the second-highest single game total in CAA history. Former ODU standout Marquitta Head holds the record (11).
- Rendle's 93 blocks this season are ranked fourth on the CAA single season charts. The last player to swat 90+ shots in a single season was Hofstra's Jess Fuller who had 97 in 2008-9 and 103 in 2009-10.
- The CAA single season blocking record is 110, set by Amy Dorsett during the 1996-97 season.
- William & Mary has blocked 13 shots three times this season against Mount St. Mary's (12/18), East Carolina (12/28) and CofC (2/17). The 13 blocks are tied for eighth most in CAA single-game history.
- Elon holds the single game record with 17 blocks which was set against ETSU in 2015.

SOLID STARTS

- William & Mary wrapped up non-league play with a 10-1 record, setting the program record for wins. Last season, the Tribe set the program's best start when they opened the campaign 11-2 and has surpassed that start.
