#CAAHOOPS PLAYER OF THE WEEK





Junior Shay Burnett surpassed the 1,000-career point mark while leading Elon to a 2-0 week. Burnett had an all-around effort last week, averaging 20.5 points on 52.0 percent shooting, 10.0 rebounds and 7.0 assists. In Friday's win over Towson, she scored a team-high 18 points to go with eight rebounds and six assists. Two

days later at UNCW, Burnett had her best game of the season with a campaign-best 23 points (19 in the second half) on 8-for-14 shooting to go with 12 rebounds for her sixth double-double of the season. She also notched eight assists, barely missing the program's first triple-double.

Senior Breanna Bolden powered College of Charleston to a 2-0 week by averaging 19.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.5 steals while going a perfect 14-for-14 from the charity stripe. Bolden never left the floor in those two games. The Cougars pulled off a huge win over Drexel led by 19 points, seven rebounds, four

assists and four steals from Bolden. She followed that up with 20 points, seven rebounds, four assist and three steals in the win over Towson.

#CAAHOOPS THE WEEK THAT WAS

- Charleston (8-14; 5-6 CAA): The Cougars went 2-0 last week with victories over Drexel and Towson. Breanna Bolden powered the Cougars once again, averaging 19.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.5 steals while going a perfect 14-for-14 from the charity stripe. Brianna Boyd averaged 13.5 points and 9.0 rebounds.
- Delaware (13-9; 7-4 CAA): The Blue Hens split games last week, topping UNCW before having their six-game winning streak snapped by Drexel. Sophomore Nicole Enabosi averaged 14.5 points and 9.5 rebounds.
- Drexel (16-6; 7-4 CAA): The Dragons split games last week, falling at Charleston before picking up a dominant road win at Delaware. Senior Sarah Curran recorded back-to-back 20 point games for the second time this season while adding 4.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game.
- Elon (18-5; 9-1 CAA): The Phoenix went 2-0 against Towson and UNCW to push their winning streak to five games to remain atop the league standings. Junior Shay Burnett averaged a double-double while notching her 1,000th career point while Jenifer Rhodes contributed 14.0 points and 9.5 rebounds per game last week.
- Hofstra (9-12; 2-8 CAA): The Pride split games last week. After falling to James Madison, Hofstra put together a big comeback to defeat William & Mary and snap a six-game skid. Junior Ashunae Durant averaged 19.0 points and 9.0 rebounds for the week, including a 23-point, 11-rebound effort against the Tribe which secured her 13th double-double of the season.
- James Madison (16-6; 9-2 CAA): The Dukes went 2-0 last week with wins at Hofstra and Northeastern. Precious Hall averaged 24.0 points per game last week, and became the eighth player in program history to record 2,000 points during her 20-point outing against the Pride. Rookie guard Kamiah Smalls averaged 11.0 rebounds per game to help the Dukes extend their winning streak to four games.
- UNCW (9-13; 4-7 CAA): The Seahawks faced two of the top-three games in the league last weekend, falling to Delaware and to Elon.
 Jasmine Steele averaged 14.5 points and 6.0 assists for UNCW last week.
- Northeastern (7-16; 3-8 CAA): The Huskies had a pair of tough losses to William & Mary and James Madison last week. Claudia Ortiz continued her strong play, averaging 19.5 points and 4.5 rebounds.
- Towson (11-11; 4-7 CAA): The Tigers dropped a pair of road games, falling to Elon and Charleston.
 Senior Raven Bankston averaged 17.0 points and 2.5 steals per game last week.
- William & Mary (14-6; 4-6 CAA): The Tribe split road games last week, notching a win at Northeastern before falling at Hofstra. Marlena Tremba delivered 14.0 points per game last week while Alexandra Masaquel averaged a doubledouble with 11.0 points and 10.5 rebounds.

- The crew has been On Campus at Towson, Delaware, Northeastern, Hofstra and Elon.

HOT SHOTS AROUND #CAAHOOPS

- James Madison's Precious Hall is ranked third in the nation in scoring at 24.0 points per game. Hall has scored in double digits in 22 straight games, posting 20+ points 14 times and 30+ points four times and 40+ points twice.
- The contest between Hofstra and William & Mary which was postponed due to Winter Storm Helena has been rescheduled for February 7 at 7 p.m. in Williamsburg, Va.
- Six of the 10 CAA teams have at least 10 wins this season.
- Four CAA players have hit 1,000 points this season while several others are approaching the milestone. Closing in are Elon's Jenifer Rhodes (986) and Drexel's Meghan Creighton (977).
- Elon has a strength of schedule of 55 (with a non-conference SOS of 34).
- The Phoenix have won 11 games away from home, the most in the CAA this season.
- Blue Hen Nicole Enabosi has registered nine straight games with at least 10 points and nine rebounds.
- Cougars senior Breanna Bolden has made 21 straight free throws and 26 of her last 27 attempts. The only missed free throw in that span came on January 22 against Delaware.
- Bolden is the CAA's career active leader in steals with 308. She also stands eighth all-time in CAA history and CofC's all-time leading scorer (1,530).
- William & Mary's Abby Rendle moved into eighth all-time in CAA history with 201 career blocks.
 She's on pace to become the eighth player in CAA history to reach the 200-block milestone.
- Rendle's 80 blocks this season are ranked sixth on the CAA single season charts. The last player to swat 80+ shots in a single season was Elena Delle Donne, who had 26 in 2011-12.
- Tribe senior Marlena Tremba has made 262 career three-point field goals and is ninth on the CAA career chart.
- Hofstra's Ashunae Durant grabbed 21 rebounds against UNCW on January 20, the most in the CAA this season. Durant has posted 13 doubledoubles this season. She's averaging 11.5 rebounds which ranks her sixth in the nation. She's also fourth in offensive rebounds per game (5.0).
- The Pride has played four overtime games, the most by a CAA squad this season.
- Towson has notched double-digit steals in 15 of 22 games this season.
- UNCW eclipsed its win total from a season ago by claiming its eighth victory of the season.

WEEKLY REPORT

CAA REVERSES OUTCOME OF TWO GAMES

- On February 2, Colonial Athletic Association Commissioner Joe D'Antonio announced his decision to reverse the outcome of a pair of conference games involving the College of Charleston, William & Mary and UNCW women's basketball teams due to the use of improper basketballs.
- The improper balls were used in the College of Charleston's home victories over William & Mary on January 6, and UNCW on January 8.
- The official results, team records (standings) and statistics from the games will not change per NCAA policy. However, William & Mary and UNCW will be awarded a win and College of Charleston will be charged with two losses for purposes of seeding the 2017 CAA Women's Basketball Championship.

WE'LL TAKE PRECIOUS HALL FOR 2000

- James Madison's Precious Hall became the eighth player in CAA history to reach score 2,000 point when she hit her historic bucket on a threepointer at Hofstra on February 3.
- The last CAA player to hit 2,000 was Hofstra's Shante Evans during 2012-13.
- Hall is just the third Duke to reach the milestone behind Tamera Young (2,121) and Dawn Evans (2,667).
- Hall currently has 2,033 points and is eighth on the CAA's all-time scoring list.

NATIONAL NOTICE

- William & Mary is ranked second in the country in blocks per game (6.7) and sixth in total blocks (140) led by Abby Rendle, who is third with 3.81 blocks a night.
- The Tribe is also 18th in steals per game (11.3).
- Drexel point guard Meghan Creighton is sixth in three-point field goal percentage (.467).
- The Dragons are tenth in three-pointers made per game (8.9), 14th in scoring defense (54.6) and have the event fewest turnovers (271).
- Two CAA players are in the top-20 in steals. CofC's Breanna Bolden is 11th in total steals (76) and ninth in steals per game (3.45) while Towson's Raven Bankston is 13th in total steals (70) and 14th in steals per game (3.18).
- Hofstra's Ashunae Durant is sixth in rebounds per game (11.5), tenth in double-doubles (13) and fourth in offensive rebounds per game (5.0).
- Northeastern's Jess Genco is fourth in minutes played per game (38.26).
- Delaware's Nicole Enabosi is 13th in free throws made (122).

#CAAHOOPS IN THE RPI

- College Basketball News RPI: The CAA was rated eighth as a conference for the ninth consecutive week on February 6. Elon moved to 26 while James Madison (41) and Drexel (73) checked into the top-100.
- NCAA.com RPI: Through games on February 5
 Elon is rated at No. 26 while James Madison (41)
 and Drexel (73) checked into the top-100. As a
 conference, the CAA has an RPI of 8.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE MID-MAJOR RANKINGS

- College Insider Mid-Major Poll: Three teams appeared in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll while one received votes on January 31. Elon remained at No. 12 while James Madison stayed at No. 13. Drexel went to No. 16.
- ESPN.com/Graham Hays Mid-Major Rankings: Two CAA teams were ranked among the top-10 mid-major programs by ESPN.com's Graham Hays on February 1. Elon appeared for the second week, this time coming in at No. 8 while James Madison made its debut at No. 9, knocking out Drexel. On January 4, Drexel was recognized as the top mid-major team in the nation.

MAKE IT 1.000

- Elon junior Shay Burnett posted her 1,000th career point on February 5 at UNCW, finishing with 23 points on the day.
- Hofstra junior Ashunae Durant notched her 1,000th career point on January 29 against Elon. She finished the day with 17 points.
- Elon senior Lauren Brown notched her 1,000th career point in the victory at William & Mary on January 22, finishing with 10 points, including the game-winning free throws.
- Drexel senior Jessica Pellechio reached the 1,000 career point milestone with a 20-point outing at Northeastern on January 8. Pellechio joins Sarah Curran in the club while Meghan Creighton nearing the milestone.

COACHES CORNER

- Head Coach Tina Martin picked up her 400th career victory with the win against Hofstra on January 15. Martin, who is in her 21st season, currently holds a 404-233 all-time record as the winningest coach in UD men's and women's basketball history.
- Elon Head Coach Charlotte Smith posted her 100th career victory in the Phoenix win over Drexel on January 15. She has a 105-75 record.
- UNCW Head Coach Adell Harris earned the 100th win of her coaching career on January 29.
 Harris has 39 victories at UNCW after compiling a 61-30 record in three years at Tusculum.
- Head Coach Sean O'Regan earned his first career victory at the helm of the James Madison in the Dukes' 83-57 victory over St. Francis Brooklyn on November 13.
