## CAA FOOTBALL WEEK 2 AWARDS



### Offensive Player of the Week

Josh Mack | RB | Maine  
Mack rushed for a career-high 255 yards and three touchdowns on only 13 carries (19.6 ypc) as Maine rolled past Bryant, 60-12. He became the first Maine player since 2003 to eclipse the 200-yard mark in a game. Mack broke loose for scoring runs of 66, 13 and 60 yards and had a 21-yard reception.



### Defensive Players of the Week

Andrew Clyde | DL | Richmond  
Clyde recorded a career-high 10 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and two pass breakups in Richmond's 20-17 win at No. 25 Colgate. One of the junior's deflections resulted in an interception and he helped force a three-and-out with a sack, a breakup and a TFL which set up UR's game-winning drive.



### Special Teams Player of the Week

Owen Johnson | PK | Elon  
Johnson kicked the first two field goals of his career, including a game-winning 36-yarder with five seconds remaining, in Elon's 34-31 win at Furman. Johnson also booted a game-tying 23-yard field goal in the third quarter and was 4-for-4 on extra points.



### Rookie of the Week

Davis Cheek | QB | Elon  
Cheek completed 26-of-35 passes for a career-high 301 yards and three touchdowns to lead Elon to a 34-31 victory at Furman. The freshman quarterback became the first Phoenix quarterback to throw for three TD's in a game since 2014 and engineered a game-winning drive in the final minute.

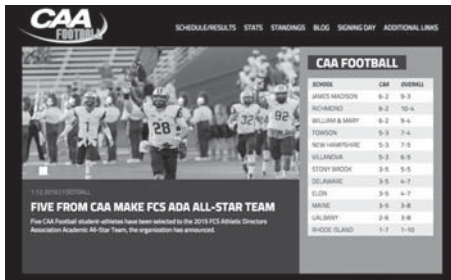

**CONFERENCE NOTES:**

**NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS CONTINUES:** CAA Football teams were a perfect 6-0 against FCS competition last Saturday and are now 9-1 for the season, which is the best non-conference FCS winning percentage of any conference. Making the numbers even more impressive is the fact that six of those 10 games have been on the road. CAA Football teams went 24-7 in non-conference games against FCS opponents last season, which was the best winning percentage by an FCS conference.

**MULTIPLE FBS WINS AGAIN:** New Hampshire knocked off Georgia Southern, 22-12, last Saturday for its first win over an FBS opponent since 2009. It was the second victory against a FBS opponent for CAA Football this season as James Madison rolled past East Carolina, 34-14, on Sept. 2. It's the second year in a row that CAA Football has recorded multiple wins versus FBS opponents and the league has seven FBS victories in the past five years and 36 in its history. A complete list of CAA Football victories over FBS opponents can be found on Page 15 of this release.

**FOUR CAA TEAMS RANKED IN NATIONAL POLLS:** Four CAA Football teams are ranked among the top 11 nationally in this week's STATS FCS and FCS Coaches Top 25 polls. James Madison remained No.1 in both polls after extending its winning streak to 14 by topping ETSU, 52-10. Richmond moved to No. 6 in the Coaches poll and is No. 8 in the STATS poll after winning 20-17 at No. 25 Colgate. Villanova is ranked No. 7 in the STATS poll and No. 8 in the Coaches Poll after a narrow 16-13 setback at Temple. New Hampshire jumped to No. 9 in the STATS poll and No. 11 in the Coaches poll after knocking off FBS foe Georgia Southern, 22-12. Six other CAAFB teams (UAlbany, Delaware, Maine, Stony Brook, Towson and William & Mary) received votes in at least one of the two polls.

**WELCOME HOME:** After spending the first two weeks on the road, six of CAA Football's 12 teams will finally get a home-field advantage. UAlbany, Elon, Richmond, Stony Brook, Villanova and William & Mary all play their home openers on Saturday. CAA teams are 4-0 in home non-conference games this season.

**WE'RE #1:** Several CAA players lead FCS in a variety of statistical categories after Week 2 of the season. Richmond's Kyle Lauletta tops the nation in passing (426.0 ypg) and total offense (432.0 ypg), Maine's Josh Mack tops FCS in rushing (179.0 ypg), Richmond's Dejon Brissett is #1 in receptions (10.5 rpg) and receiving yards (165.5 ypg) and JMU's John Miller leads the nation in punt returns (27.7 avg).

**RUNNING WILD:** Two of the top three rushing performances in FCS this season have come from CAA Football. JMU's Cardon Johnson ran for a career-high 265 yards against East Carolina on Sept. 2 and Maine's Josh Mack followed with a career-best 255 yards versus Bryant on Sept. 9. The conference also has the top passing (546 yards by UR's Kyle Lauletta) and receiving (204 yards by UR's Cortrelle Simpson) performances in FCS in 2017.

**STONY BROOK JOINS UNH ATOP STANDINGS:** Stony Brook earned a 35-18 victory at Rhode Island last Saturday to join New Hampshire atop the CAA Football standings at 1-0. This Saturday is the only week all season that no conference games will be played. There are five league contests on September 23.

**JMU PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE:** James Madison, which returns 14 starters from last year's 14-1 team that captured the 2016 NCAA FCS National Championship, was the overwhelming choice to win the CAA Football title in 2017. Richmond, Villanova and New Hampshire, who also earned berths in the FCS playoffs a year ago, took the next three spots in the poll of coaches and media relations directors. Delaware was picked fifth, followed by UAlbany, William & Mary, Stony Brook, Maine, Towson, Elon and Rhode Island.

**JMU'S SCHOR, VU'S ROLLE HEADLINE PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM:** James Madison senior quarterback Bryan Schor was chosen as the CAA preseason Offensive Player of the Year, while Villanova senior safety Rob Rolle was selected as the CAA preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of the league's head coaches and media relations directors. the 2016 CAA Offensive Player of the Year, led FCS in completion percentage (73.1%) and pass efficiency (186.2) last season. He threw for 3,022 yards and 29 TD's and also ran for 569 yards and 10 TD's. Rolle registered 63 tackles and topped the conference with seven interceptions. He also had five pass breakups, a fumble recovery and scored two defensive TD's. The entire preseason All-CAA team can be found on Page 11 of this release.

**CAA PARTNERS WITH CBS SPORTS DIGITAL:** The CAA has signed an agreement with CBS Sports Digital to stream a "Game of the Week" package which can be seen for free on CollegeSportsLive.com. The 12-game package continues on Saturday with Charleston Southern at Elon. All 12 teams will appear at least once during the season. Scott Sudikoff handles the play-by-play duties and former NFL player Brandon Noble serves as the analyst.

**CAA PLACES 14 ON PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAM:** A total of 14 CAA Football players from nine different teams were honored on the STATS preseason FCS All-America squad. Receiving first-team honors were UAlbany RB Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks, Stony Brook OL Timon Parris, James Madison OL Aaron Stinnie and Villanova safety Rob Rolle. Named to the second team were UAlbany FB Anthony Manzo-Lewis, JMU DL Andrew Ankrach, Richmond PK Griffin Trau, Towson RB/KOR Shane Simpson and Rhode Island RB Harold Cooper. Selected to the third team were Maine OL Jamil Demby, William & Mary OL Chris Durant, JMU TE Jonathan Kloosterman, Richmond RB Deontez Thompson and JMU safety Raven Greene.

**MULTIPLE TEAMS IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS:** For the third year in a row, four CAA Football teams (James Madison, New Hampshire, Richmond and Villanova) were chosen to the NCAA Division I Football Championship field, and all four advanced to the second round in 2016. CAA Football has had multiple teams in the playoffs for 26 straight years and three or more teams in the playoff field for 11 years in a row. It was the ninth time in league history that at least four teams were chosen. CAA Football had a league-record five teams picked in 2007, 2008 and 2011.

**PLAYOFF SUCCESS:** James Madison became the sixth CAA Football member to capture the FCS National Championship last January when it defeated Youngstown State, 28-14. Since 2003, CAA Football has had a team in the FCS title game nine times, with five different teams winning national titles - Delaware (2003), JMU (2004, 2016), Richmond (2008) and Villanova (2009). CAA Football has had four different teams advance to the semifinals of the playoffs over the past four years - Towson (2013), New Hampshire (2014), Richmond (2015) and JMU (2016) - and 23 semifinalists overall.

**NEW HAMPSHIRE EXTENDS PLAYOFF STREAK:** New Hampshire earned a berth in the FCS playoffs for the 13th consecutive year in 2016, extending the longest active streak in the nation. Under coach Sean McDonnell, the Wildcats have recorded 13 straight winning seasons with double-digit victory totals in six of them. UNH had an incredible streak of 162 straight weeks ranked in the STATS FCS Top 25 poll from Sept. 6, 2004 until Oct. 12, 2015.

**CAA WELCOMES NEW COACHES:** Four CAA Football teams have new head coaches this season, but three of them already have ties to the conference. Danny Rocco, who guided Richmond to the FCS playoffs for the past three seasons, is the new head coach at Delaware. Russ Huesman, who was the defensive coordinator at Richmond during its national championship run in 2008, returns as head coach of the Spiders after leading Chattanooga to three straight FCS playoff appearances. After 30 seasons as a member of the coaching staff at Villanova under legendary mentor Andy Talley, Mark Ferrante takes over as head coach of the Wildcats in 2017. Elon named Curt Cignetti as its new head coach after he posted an impressive a 53-17 mark in six seasons at Indiana (Pa.). He's also a former assistant to Nick Saban at Alabama.

**W&M'S LAYCOCK CLIMBS WIN CHART:** William & Mary head coach Jimmie Laycock is in his 38th season with the Tribe, which is the longest tenure at one school among active Division I head coaches. With 244 career wins, he's tied with Columbia's Al Bagnoli for the most victories among active NCAA Division I coaches. His 109 victories in CAA Football are second only to Villanova's Andy Talley (142).

**UALBANY****1-1 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Posted a 26-0 victory at Morgan State last week. It was UAlbany's first shutout since beating Central Connecticut 19-0 in 2014.
- Freshman RB Karl Mofor ran for a team-high 98 yards and 2 TD's on 18 carries at MSU. He's 4th in the CAA in rushing (98.5 ypg).
- UAlbany's defense limited MSU to 234 total yards and 11 first downs. The Great Danes lead the CAA and rank 11th in FCS in total defense (259.5 ypg).
- UAlbany, which ranked 4th in FCS in TO margin (+16) last season, has won the turnover battle in its first two games and is +3 in turnover margin in 2017.
- LB Nate Hatalsky made a team-high 9 tackles, including 3.0 TFL, at MSU. He's tied for 3rd in the CAA with 21 tackles this season.
- Ethan Stark made field goals of 32 and 41 yards and is 3-for-3 on the season.
- All-America RB Elijah Ibitokun-Hanks (1,388 yds/16 TD's) missed his 2nd game due to a knee injury, but could return this week.

**JAMES MADISON****2-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Defeated ETSU, 52-10, in their home opener last Saturday.
- JMU has won 14 straight games - which is the longest Division I streak in the nation.
- QB Bryan Schor completed 25-of-33 passes for 304 yards and a school-record tying 5 TD's vs. ETSU. He moved into a tie for 3rd place in career TD passes (42) at JMU.
- Riley Stapleton made a career-high 8 catches for 64 yards and 2 TD's vs. ETSU, while Ishmael Hyman tied a career-high with 6 catches for 93 yards and 2 TD's.
- JMU held ETSU to 175 total yards, including 57 on the ground. JMU leads the CAA and ranks in the top 11 in FCS in rush defense (63.5 ypg) and scoring defense (12.0 ypg).
- JMU recorded 8 TFL's, led by Darrious Carter (2.5 TFL) and Ron'Dell Carter (2 TFL).
- John Miller averaged 42.0 ypr on 2 punt returns vs. ETSU, including a 41-yarder for a TD in the 3rd quarter. Miller leads the nation with a 27.7 avg for the season.

**DELAWARE****1-1 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Dropped a 27-0 decision at 18th-ranked Virginia Tech last Saturday.
- UD's defense held VT to 303 total yards, including 81 on the ground, and gave up only two offensive touchdowns.
- UD ranks 2nd in the CAA in rush defense (70.0 ypg), total defense (263.5 ypg) and scoring defense (15.0 ypg). The Hens are among the top 20 in FCS in all 3 categories.
- WR Diante Cherry, who leads UD in catches (7) and receiving yards (124) this season, went over 1,000 career receiving yards at VT and is one reception shy of 100.
- QB Joe Walker accounted for 142 of UD's 223 yards of total offense at VT. He threw for 116 yards and ran for 26.
- DB Nasir Adderley had 6 tackles and a blocked FG at VT, while DL Bilal Nichols added 5 tackles and a sack.
- The crowd of 62,526 at VT was the largest the Blue Hens have ever played in front of.

**MAINE****1-1 Overall/0-1 CAAFB**

- Rolled past Bryant, 60-12, last Saturday in their home opener.
- Josh Mack rushed for a career-high 255 yards and 3 TD's on only 13 carries (19.6 ypc) vs. Bryant. It was the first 200-yard effort by a Maine player since 2003. Mack leads the nation in rushing (179.0 ypg).
- Redshirt freshman Chris Ferguson completed 8-of-17 passes for 150 yards vs. Bryant and threw 3 TD passes for the second straight game. His 6 TD's are tied for the most among CAA quarterbacks.
- Maine's 536 yards of total offense vs. Bryant were the most since 2013 and its 43 first-half points were the most since 2003.
- Maine's defense forced 8 turnovers vs. Bryant, including 5 interceptions. Darrius Hart and Sinmisola Demuren each returned interceptions for touchdowns.
- WR Earnest Edwards caught 2 TD passes vs. Bryant and also had a 46-yard kickoff return. He leads the CAA with a 29.5 KOR average.

**ELON****1-1 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Scored 10 points in the final 3 minutes and rallied for a 34-31 win at Furman last week. Led 21-0 after the first quarter.
- Freshman QB Davis Cheek completed 26-of-35 passes for 301 yards and 3 TD's at Furman. It was the first three touchdown outing by an Elon quarterback since 2014.
- WR Tre Lennon caught 9 passes for 82 yards and 2 TD's at Furman. It was the most receptions by an Elon receiver since 2014.
- Elon's 34 points were the most in a game since 2013.
- Freshman PK Owen Johnson booted the game-winning 36-yard FG with 5 seconds left. He also made a 23-yarder.
- DB Tyler Campbell, a transfer from Army West Point, recorded a team-high 15 tackles, a sack and 2.0 TFL at Furman.
- RB Brelynd Cyphers ran for a team-high 75 yards on 20 carries at Furman. He has a rushing TD in each of the first two games.

**NEW HAMPSHIRE****2-0 Overall/1-0 CAAFB**

- Earned a 22-12 victory vs. Georgia Southern in Birmingham, Ala. It was UNH's first win over a FBS opponent since 2009.
- Neil O'Connor made a career-high 11 receptions for 118 yards and 2 TD's at GSU. He ranks second in the CAA with 15 catches and is 6th in all-purpose yards (131.5 ypg).
- Trevor Knight was 13-of-22 passing for 129 yards and 2 TD's and also ran for 55 yards at GSU. He ranks 6th in the CAA in total offense (210.5 ypg) for the season.
- Evan Gray ran for a career-high 77 yards and a TD on 13 carries at GSU.
- UNH never trailed at GSU, scoring on 3 of its first 4 drives to take a 22-0 lead.
- Safety Rick Ellison matched a career-high with 10 tackles at GSU and Josh Kania had a career-best nine stops
- UNH recorded 8 TFL's, including five sacks. LB Michael Balsamo had a team-best 3.0 TFL's and one sack.

**RHODE ISLAND****0-2 Overall/0-1 CAAFB**

- Fell 35-18 to Stony Brook in their home and CAA opener last Saturday.
- Tyler Harris was 15-of-32 passing for 185 yards and 1 TD vs. SBU. He ranks 4th in the CAA in passing yards (234.5 ypg).
- RB Harold Cooper had 123 all-purpose yards, which was his sixth straight game and 19th overall with 100+ all-purpose yards.
- WR Aaron Parker made 4 receptions for 96 yards and a TD. He's only the sixth player in URI history with a TD catch in four straight games and the first since 2009.

- Zach Bendarczyk was 27-of-41 passing for a career-high 382 yards and a TD at TU. He's 2nd in the CAA and among the top 15 in FCS in passing (295.5 ypg), pass efficiency (161.8) and total offense (327.0 ypg).
- WR Taurus Phillips (9 rec., 191 yds) and TE Ryan Bell (11 rec., 166 yds) rank 3rd and 4th in the CAA in receiving yards. Both made six catches against Temple.
- WR Changa Hodge had 4 receptions for 100 yards at Temple, which was the first 100-yard outing of his career.
- VU's defense limited Temple to 111 total yards and six points in the second half.
- LB Jeff Steeb made a team-high 8 tackles and added a sack and pass breakup at TU.
- PK Drew Kresge kicked two field goals at Temple and is 3-for-4 on FG's and 6-for-6 on extra points for the season.

- W&M's defense held NSU to only 273 total yards and a pair of field goals. The Tribe ranks 20th in FCS in scoring defense (17.0 ppg) and 25th in total defense (313.5 ypg).
