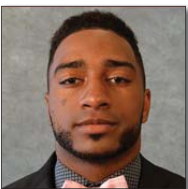
CAA FOOTBALL WEEK 4 AWARDS



Offensive Players of the Week

Trevor Knight | QB | New Hampshire

Knight completed 23-of-34 passes for a career-high 420 yards and three touchdowns and also rushed for 19 yards and another TD in New Hampshire's 28-14 win over Rhode Island. The junior quarterback matched his career-high for TD passes with fourth-quarter strikes of 76 and 24 yards after the Rams had pulled within one.



Malcolm Summers | RB | Elon

Summers ran for a career-high 294 yards on a career-best 40 carries as Elon picked up a 36-33 win at No. 6 Richmond. The rushing total was the 10th-highest in CAA Football history and the most by any player in FCS this season. Summers became the first Elon back since 2002 to top 200 yards and the first to exceed the 100-yard mark in back-to-back games since 2009.



Defensive Player of the Week

Eli Mencer | LB | UAlbany

Mencer recorded seven tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and sealed UAlbany's 19-10 triumph over No. 8 Villanova by forcing a fumble and returning it 80 yards for a TD in overtime. The sophomore linebacker was part of a Great Danes' defense that held Villanova to just 254 total yards. It was UAlbany's first win ever over a Top 10-ranked opponent.



Special Teams Player of the Week

Alex Lucansky | PK | Stony Brook

Lucansky kicked a career-best four field goals, including two in the fourth quarter, in Stony Brook's 25-17 victory over Towson. The junior connected on kicks of 21, 42, 26 and 23 yards and is now 6-for-6 on field goals for the season.



Rookie of the Week

Ezrah Archie | WR | James Madison

In his first career start, Archie made a team-high eight receptions for 90 yards and a TD in JMU's 28-10 win over Maine. The freshman wide receiver, who had made just three catches all season, had a long reception of 31 yards and snared a 3-yard TD pass in the fourth quarter to help clinch the victory.

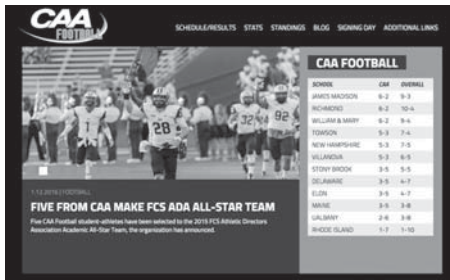

CONFERENCE NOTES:

CONFERENCE GAMES MEAN CLOSE GAMES: The first full Saturday of conference play in CAA Football produced plenty of exciting action. All five league games last week, and six of the seven CAA Football contests played this season, had margins of four points or less in the fourth quarter.

JMU CLOSURES IN ON WIN STREAK RECORD: Reigning FCS national champion James Madison extended its winning streak to 16 games, which is the longest active of streak of any FBS or FCS team in the nation. With a victory at Delaware on Saturday, the Dukers would match Richmond's conference record of 17 consecutive victories, which was set during the 2008 and 2009 seasons.

SEASON-HIGH SIX CAA TEAMS RANKED IN NATIONAL POLL: A season-high six CAA Football teams are ranked nationally in this week's STATS FCS Top 25 poll and five are ranked in the FCS Coaches poll. **James Madison** remained No.1 in both polls after defeating Maine, 28-10. **New Hampshire** moved up to No. 14 in the Coaches poll and stayed at No. 15 in the STATS poll after its 28-14 win over Rhode Island. **Villanova** slipped to No. 14 in the STATS poll and No. 17 in the Coaches Poll after a 19-10 overtime loss at UAlbany. **Richmond** fell to No. 15 in the Coaches poll and No. 16 in the STATS poll after a 36-33 loss to Elon. **UAlbany** returned to the Top 25, coming in at No. 19 in the STATS poll and No. 22 in the Coaches poll after its victory over Villanova. **Elon**, which is nationally ranked for the first time since 2010, vaulted to #23 in the STATS poll after its victory at Richmond. **Stony Brook** is the top team in "receiving votes" in both polls this week. **Delaware, Towson** and **William & Mary** also received votes in at least one of the two polls.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS: CAA Football teams are 19-2 against non-conference FCS opponents this season, which is the best non-conference FCS winning percentage (.905) of any league. Making the numbers even more impressive is the fact that six of the victories have been on the road. CAA Football teams went 24-7 in non-conference games against FCS opponents last season, which was the best winning percentage by an FCS conference.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: CAA Football teams are a combined 18-2 at home this season, including 13-0 in non-conference play.

DOMINANT DEFENSE: Seven CAA teams are ranked in the top 30 in FCS in scoring defense and six are among the top 25 in total defense. James Madison is ranked #4 in FCS in both scoring (12.0 ppg) and total defense (231.8 ypg) and UAlbany is #8 in scoring (13.8 ppg) and total (246.3 ypg) defense. There are also four CAA teams in the top 10 in rushing defense, led by #4 Villanova (60.0 ypg) and #5 Delaware (62.0 ypg). A list of CAA teams among NCAA statistical leaders is included in the column to the left.

MULTIPLE FBS WINS AGAIN: New Hampshire knocked off Georgia Southern, 22-12, on Sept. 9 for its first win over an FBS opponent since 2009. It was the second victory against a FBS opponent for CAA Football this season as James Madison rolled past East Carolina, 34-14, on Sept. 2. It's the second year in a row that CAA Football has recorded multiple wins versus FBS opponents and the league has seven FBS victories in the past five years and 36 in its history. A complete list of CAA Football victories over FBS opponents can be found on Page 15 of this release.

SPIDER SUCCESS THROUGH THE AIR: Richmond quarterback Kyle Lauletta tops the nation in passing (417.5 ypg), total offense (422.5 ypg) and passing TD's (14), while Spiders' receivers Cortrelle Simpson (141.3 ypg) and Dejon Brissett (128.0 ypg) rank first and second in FCS in receiving yards per game.

TOP PERFORMANCES: Three of the top six rushing performances in FCS this season have come from CAA Football. Elon's Malcolm Summers tallied a career-high 294 yards at Richmond last Saturday, which is the most by any FCS player. JMU's Cardon Johnson ranks fifth with a career-high 265 yards against East Carolina on Sept. 2, and Maine's Josh Mack followed in sixth after a career-best 255 yards versus Bryant on Sept. 9. ence also has the 2nd-best passing (546 yards by UR's Kyle Lauletta) effort, the 3rd-best receiving yardage total (232 yards by UNH's Neil O'Connor) and 3rd-best receptions total (13 by Towson's Jabari Greenwood).

JMU PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE: James Madison, which returned 14 starters from last year's 14-1 team that captured the 2016 NCAA FCS National Championship, was the overwhelming choice to win the CAA Football title in 2017. Richmond, Villanova and New Hampshire, who also earned berths in the FCS playoffs a year ago, took the next three spots in the poll of coaches and media relations directors. Delaware was picked fifth, followed by UAlbany, William & Mary, Stony Brook, Maine, Towson, Elon and Rhode Island.

JMU'S SCHOR, VU'S ROLLE HEADLINE PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM: James Madison senior quarterback Bryan Schor was chosen as the CAA preseason Offensive Player of the Year, while Villanova senior safety Rob Rolle was selected as the CAA preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of the league's head coaches and media relations directors. Schor, the 2016 CAA Offensive Player of the Year, led FCS in completion percentage (73.1%) and pass efficiency (186.2) last season. He threw for 3,022 yards and 29 TD's and also ran for 569 yards and 10 TD's. Rolle registered 63 tackles and topped the conference with seven interceptions. He also had five pass breakups, a fumble recovery and scored two defensive TD's. The entire preseason All-CAA team can be found on Page 11 of this release.

CAA GAME OF THE WEEK ON COLLEGE SPORTS LIVE: The CAA has signed an agreement with CBS Sports Digital to stream a "Game of the Week" package which can be seen for free on CollegeSportsLive.com. The 12-game package continues on Saturday with a Top 25 battle between #19 UAlbany and #23 Elon. All 12 teams will appear at least once during the season. Scott Sudikoff handles the play-by-play duties and former NFL player Brandon Noble serves as the analyst.

MULTIPLE TEAMS IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS: For the third year in a row, four CAA Football teams (James Madison, New Hampshire, Richmond and Villanova) were chosen to the NCAA Division I Football Championship field, and all four advanced to the second round in 2016. CAA Football has had multiple teams in the playoffs for 26 straight years and three or more teams in the playoff field for 11 years in a row. It was the ninth time in league history that at least four teams were chosen. CAA Football had a league-record five teams picked in 2007, 2008 and 2011.

PLAYOFF SUCCESS: James Madison became the sixth CAA Football member to capture the FCS National Championship last January when it defeated Youngstown State, 28-14. Since 2003, CAA Football has had a team in the FCS title game nine times, with five different teams winning national titles - Delaware (2003), JMU (2004, 2016), Richmond (2008) and Villanova (2009). CAA Football has had four different teams advance to the semifinals of the playoffs over the past four years - Towson (2013), New Hampshire (2014), Richmond (2015) and JMU (2016) - and 23 semifinalists overall.

NEW HAMPSHIRE EXTENDS PLAYOFF STREAK: New Hampshire earned a berth in the FCS playoffs for the 13th consecutive year in 2016, extending the longest active streak in the nation. Under coach Sean McDonnell, the Wildcats have recorded 13 straight winning seasons with double-digit victory totals in six of them. UNH had an incredible streak of 162 straight weeks ranked in the STATS FCS Top 25 poll from Sept. 6, 2004 until Oct. 12, 2015.

W&M'S LAYCOCK CLIMBS WIN CHART: William & Mary head coach Jimmie Laycock is in his 38th season with the Tribe, which is the longest tenure at one school among active Division I head coaches. With 245 career wins, he's just one behind Columbia's Al Bagnoli for the most victories among active NCAA Division I coaches. His 109 victories in CAA Football are second only to Villanova's Andy Talley (142).

AFCA COACH TO CURE MD: On September 30, several schools from the CAA will be wearing special arm patches in honor of the AFCA's Coach to Cure MD program. This is the 10th year coaches around the country join together to raise funds and awareness for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. Fans are encouraged to donate by texting "CURE" to 50555 or visiting CoachtoCureMD.org.

UALBANY**3-1 Overall/1-0 CAAFB**

- Beat Villanova, 19-10 in OT, in their CAA opener last Saturday.
- The win over Villanova was UAlbany's first-ever against a Top 10-ranked FCS foe.
- Will Brunson was 24-of-36 passing for a career-high 221 yards vs. VU. He's completed 67.2% of his throws in the past 2 weeks.
- WR Jerod Diggs ranks 10th in the CAA in receiving yards (14 rec., 236 yds).
- UAlbany limited Villanova to 254 total yards, including 61 on the ground. The Great Danes rank 8th in FCS in total defense (246.3 ypg), 8th in scoring defense (13.8 ppg) and 8th in rush defense (70.3 ypg).
- LB Eli Mencer had 7 tackles, 1.5 TFL and returned a fumble 80 yards for a TD in overtime to clinch the victory over VU.
- Malachi Hoskins had 3.5 TFL, 2 sacks and a forced fumble vs. VU.
- LB Nate Hatalaky ranks second in the CAA with 44 tackles.

JAMES MADISON**4-0 Overall/1-0 CAAFB**

- Pulled away for a 28-10 victory over Maine in their CAA opener last week.
- JMU has won 16 straight games - which is the longest Div. I streak in the nation. Can match Richmond's CAA record of 17 consecutive victories in 2008-09 with a win.
- Bryan Schor was 21-of-31 passing for 281 yards and 4 TD's vs. Maine. He has 12 TD passes this season and 48 for his career, which is three shy of the JMU career mark.
- JMU ranks 5th in FCS in total offense (560.0 ypg) and rushing offense (298.8 ypg) and 6th in scoring offense (47.3 ppg).
- JMU held Maine to 299 total yards. JMU ranks 4th in FCS in total defense (231.8 ypg) 4th in scoring defense (12.0 ppg), 11th in pass defense and 14th in rush defense.
- Marcus Marshall ran for a team-high 135 yards vs. Maine. He's the 4th different JMU back to go over the 100-yard mark in 2017.
- Freshman Ezra Archie caught 8 passes for 90 yards and a TD in his first start vs. UM.

DELAWARE**2-1 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Off last week. Have a 2-0 home record heading into Saturday's game with JMU.
- UD ranks 2nd in the CAA in rush defense (62.0 ypg), 3rd in total defense (280.7 ypg) and 4th in scoring defense (14.7 ppg). The Hens are among the top 16 in FCS in all three categories.
- Joe Walker was 20-of-30 passing for a career-high 202 yards and 2 TD's in UD's win over Cornell. The 20 completions were also a career-best.
- Kareem Williams ran for a game-high 121 yards vs. Cornell. It was his third career 100-yard effort. He's 6th in the CAA in rushing.
- UD had over 200 yards rushing and 200 yards passing in the same game vs. CU for the first time since 2013. The Hens' balanced offense is averaging 186.0 ypg rushing and 174.7 ypg passing for the season.
- All-CAA LB Charles Bell leads the Blue Hens with 24 stops this season.
- UD is +5 in TO margin for the season.

MAINE**1-2 Overall/0-2 CAAFB**

- Fell 28-10 at No. 1 James Madison last week. Led 10-7 in the 3rd quarter.
- Josh Mack rushed for a team-high 144 yards and a TD on 24 carries at JMU. It was his 3rd straight game with 100+ yards. Mack ranks 2nd in FCS in rushing (167.3 ypg) and 3rd in all-purpose yards (187.7 ypg).
- Freshman QB Chris Ferguson threw for 162 yards at JMU but was picked off 3 times. He ranks 6th in the CAA in passing (183.7 ypg) and has thrown 6 TD passes this season.
- LB Sterling Sheffield recorded 8 tackles, 2.5 sacks and an interception at JMU. He's tied for the team lead in tackles (24), ranks 2nd in the CAA in sacks (3.5) and has at least one tackle for loss in 6 straight games.
- Maine leads the CAA and ranks 3rd in FCS in turnover margin (+7).
- Earnest Edwards tops the CAA with a 28.3 KOR average.
- Taji Lowe made a career-high 10 tackles at JMU.

ELON**3-1 Overall/1-0 CAAFB**

- Knocked off No. 6 Richmond, 36-33, last week in their CAA opener. Off to a 3-1 start for the first time since 2011.
- Elon has won back-to-back games against Top 25 foes for the first time since 2008.
- Malcolm Summers ran for a career-high 294 yards on a career-best 40 carries at UR. It was the 10th-most yards in CAA history and the most by any FCS player this season. He's the first Elon back to go over 200 yards in a game since 2002.
- LB Warren Messer made a team-high 15 tackles, forced a fumble and had an interception at UR. He's had double-digit stops in all four games this season and leads the CAA with 48 tackles.
- Freshman QB Davis Cheek threw 3 TD passes for the second time this season at UR. He's 34th in FCS in pass efficiency.
- Elon's last three games have been decided by three points or less. The three-game win streak is the longest since 2011.
