CAA POSTSEASON HONORS



PLAYER OF THE YEAR

NICOLE ENABOSI | DELAWARE JUNIOR | FORWARD | GAITHERSBURG, MD./OUR LADY OF GOOD COUNSEL

Nicole Enabosi also landed on the All-CAA First Team for the second consecutive season. She led the league in scoring, averaging 18.4 points per game, and in rebounding, averaged 12.2 boards per contest. Enabosi registered 22 double-doubles in 29 games played, a figure which ranks her fifth nationally. Enabosi is third in the league in field goal percentage (.515), fourth in blocks (1.4/g), sixth in steals (2.0/g), and leads all players with 155 made free throws. She is the first Blue Hen to be named CAA Player of the Year since 2013 when Elena Delle Donne took home her third such honor.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

JADA GRAVES | ELON SOPHOMORE | GUARD | ALEXANDRIA, VA. / THOMAS EDISON

Sophomore Jada Graves led the CAA in steals, posting 70 takeaways for an average of 2.5 per game. She's helped the Elon hold opponents to just 58.1 points per game this season. On the glass, she averages 4.4 caroms per contest. Offensively, she's averaging 6.8 points while dishing out a total of 61 assists.



ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

HANNAH NIHILL | DREXEL FRESHMAN | GUARD | DREXEL HILL, PA./CARDINAL O'HARA

Rookie Hannah Nihill stepped into a starting role in the Drexel backcourt, getting the nod in 27 out of 29 appearances. She leads all rookies with 5.7 points per game. SIXTH PLAYER OF THE YEAR

RA'SHIKA WHITE | ELON SOPHOMORE | CENTER | CHARLOTTE, N.C./PHILLIP O. BERRY ACADEMY

Sophomore Ra'Shika White is the first-ever recipient of the CAA Sixth Player of the Year award which is bestowed upon a player which plays a significant role off the bench and has started less than 50 percent of conference games. White, who has appeared in all 28 games off the bench, is sixth in the CAA in scoring (13.2ppg), field goal percentage (.484) and blocks (1.4/g). She's also in the top-20 in rebounding (6.1/g) and was named to the All-CAA Second Team.

#CAACHAMPS FIRST ROUND RECAP

- Towson 47, UNCW 47: No. 8 seed UNCW opened up an early lead and held off ninth-seeded Towson, 58-47. The Tigers, who trailed by as much as 22-8, trimmed the deficit to single digits by the end of the third quarter and stayed within striking distance the rest of the game. Redshirt senior **Jenny DeGraaf** led UNCW with 15 points, went 11-for-13 from the free-throw line and added eight rebounds. Mary Cuevas had a double-double for the Tigers. The senior had 14 points and 14 rebounds.
- CHARLESTON 88, Hofstra 72: The 10th-seeded College of Charleston exploded for a season-high 88 points on its way to an 88-72 win against seventh-seed Hofstra in the opening round. Darien Huff dropped in a career-high 22 points on 8-of-9 shooting. Tanisha Brown and Deja Ford added double-doubles for the Cougars. The Pride was led by E'Lexus Davis who had 16 points and six assists.

2018 CAA CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT

- Drexel, James Madison, Elon, Northeastern, Delaware and William & Mary have clinched CAA Championship Quarterfinal berths at the top six seeds
- The 2018 CAA Women's Basketball Championship tournament will be held March 7-10 at the Daskalakis Athletic Center (DAC) in Philadelphia, Pa. and will be hosted by Drexel.
- The opening round, quarterfinals and semifinals will be streamed exclusively on CAA.tv. The final will be aired on NBC Sports Washington & Philadelphia and SNY and streamed via CollegeSportsLive, as part of the conference's partnership with CBSi.
- All-Session tickets are on sale now by visiting DrexelTickets.com.
- The CAA Women's Basketball Championship returned to campus last season with James Madison hosting at the Convocation Center in Harrisonburg, Va. Delaware will host the 2019 CAA Championship at the Bob Carpenter Center in Newark.

CAA REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS

- Drexel and James Madison both finished the season at 16-2 to share the CAA Regular Season Championship.
- It is Drexel's second-ever regular season title with the first coming in 2008-09.
- It is JMU's fourth regular season title in the last five years and 11th overall.
- It is the first time in 15 years in which two teams shared the CAA Regular Season Championship. The last time was in 2002-03 when Delaware and ODU went 15-3 in league play.

CAAHOOPS IN THE MID-MAJOR POLL

Three CAA teams were recognized in the February 27 poll. Drexel moved up five spots to No.17 while James Madison fell one spot to No. 18. Elon jumped up four spots to No. 20.

#CAAHOOPS IN THE RPI

- In the NCAA RPI released on March 5, three CAA teams were in the top-65 in the NCAA RPI. Drexel had an RPI of 46 followed by Elon (47) and James Madison (64)
- As a league, the CAA was rated tenth.

CHAMPIONSHIP REPORT

NO. 1 DREXEL

- Drexel is the No. 1 seed for only the second time and first since 2009
- The Dragons are looking for their first CAA Championship title since 2009.
- Drexel has advanced to the semifinals in five of the last six seasons.
- The Dragons have made four CAA Championship final appearances (2009, 2012, 2013, 2016).
- With 24 victories, Drexel set the program record.
- The Dragons have reached the 20-win milestone for the seventh time in program history and the fifth time under Head Coach Denise Dillon. It is just the fifth time that the Dragons have 20 wins before the end of the regular season.
- Drexel is yielding just 55.9 points per game and held its last 19 of its last 20 opponents under 60 points. James Madison posted 71 points against the Dragons, the most allowed since December 9 when Syracuse had 72.
- Head Coach Denise Dillon became Drexel's alltime winningest coach, notching her 265th career victory. Dillon stands fourth all-time in CAA victories, posting 185 wins in CAA regular season/ tournament games.

NO. 2 JAMES MADISON

- The Dukes are seeking their third CAA Championship crown in the last four years.
- James Madison is appearing as the No. 2 seed for the second consecutive year.
- JMU has been the No. 2 seed 12 times in CAA history. They've been eliminated in the quarterfinals once. They've advanced to 11 semifinals, and advanced to the title game seven times. They've won just won title as the No. 2 seed (2010).
- JMU has appeared in 30 of the 33 previous CAA Championship semifinal rounds with an 18-12
- James Madison has appeared in 18 CAA Championship finals.
- James Madison secured its 13th consecutive 20win season. The longest such streak since ODU posted 17 straight.

NO. 3 ELON

- Elon is making its fourth CAA Championship appearance, and is the third seed for the first time.
- Last season, Elon was the top seed and made a run all the way to the CAA Championship title match, topping host James Madison for its first-ever title.
- In their first two CAA tournaments, the Phoenix was the No. 4 seed.
- In their first season in the league in 2015, the Phoenix advanced to the semifinals of the
- Elon has posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in its DI history
- Elon's 10-game winning streak is the longest winning streak in the program's Division I era besting last season's nine-game run.
- Elon's 97-44 win over CofC on February 11 marked the largest margin of victory (53) by the Phoenix in their DI history.
- Elon has the sixth-youngest roster in the nation with 75 percent of its players as freshmen or sophomores. The roster rounds out with just three seniors and zero juniors.
- Elon's Shay Burnett is just the sixth player in CAA history to record 1,000 points, 500 assists and 400 rebounds in a career.
- Elon's Malaya Johnson has 165 career blocks and is 11 away for the CAA's all-time top-10.

CHAMPIONSHIP REPORT

NO. 4 NORTHEASTERN

- The Huskies earned their highest seed since 2013 when they were the fourth seed.
- In the previous two tournaments, the Huskies were the No. 6 seed.
- In 2016, NU made its first-ever CAA Championship semifinal appearance and its first quarterfinal appearance since 2014 when they advanced as the No. 7 seed. Northeastern became the first No. 6 seed to advance to the semifinals since 2004, only the seventh time in CAA history that has happened.
- Northeastern junior Jess Genco has 966 career points and is closing in on the 1,000th of her
- Northeastern's Stella Clark picked up five CAA Rookie of the Week honors. She'ss the first player in CAA history to be awarded with the first three CAA Rookie of the Week honors of the year since the award's creation in 2002-03.

NO. 5 DELAWARE

- The Blue Hens have won 14 of their last 19 CAA Championship contests, dating back to March
- Delaware fell in the quarterfinals in 2017, the first time in seven-straight years in which the Blue Hens did not win their opening round game or advance to the semifinals.
- Delaware's Nicole Enabosi leads the CAA in scoring (18.4ppg) and is nationally ranked in several categories. She's ninth in total rebounds (353), seventh in rebounds per game (12.2), fourth in defensive rebounds per game (9.0), fifth in doubledoubles (22), 12th in free throws attempted (218) and 20th in free throws made (155).
- The Blue Hens finish regular season play with 18 wins, the most since the 2013-14 campaign when Delaware went 20-11.
- UD finished conference action with 11 victories, the most since going 18-0 in 2012-13.
- Delaware has reached 80+ points five times this season. The last time Delaware logged 80-plus points at least five times in a season came during the 2011-12 slate.

NO. 6 WILLIAM & MARY

- William & Mary has made three quarterfinals appearances in the last four seasons.
- In 2017, the Tribe as the No. 4 seed advanced to the semifinals for the first time since 2001.
- William & Mary's senior class Jeanne Gaumont, Jenna Green and Abby Rendle are the winningest class in school history with 66 victories.
- W&M has won 16 games, which is tied for the fourth most in school history. It also assures the Tribe of its second straight winning season. It is the first time since 2005-06 and 2006-07 that the Green and Gold has posted back-to-back winning seasons.
- Senior Jenna Green made her 114th career start in the game, which ties her for first place all-time in school history ... Green also tied the single-season assist mark with 172 helpers this season.

NO. 8 UNCW

- The Seahawks have opened the tournament with a first round game in 12 of the last 14 years. UNCW earned a first round bye in the 2011 and 2015 tournaments.
- The Seahawks have appeared in 11 of the last 12 CAA Championship quarterfinals.
- Last season, the Seahawks as the No. 7 seed advanced to the quarterfinals, but had their run stopped there.
- In both 2013 and 2014, UNCW advanced to the quarterfinals as the No. 9 seed.
- While UNCW Coach Karen Barefoot makes her return to the CAA Championship for the first time since 2011-12 when she coached ODU to quarterfinals.
- UNCW senior guard Madison Raque will miss the remainder of the 2017-18 season after sustaining an injury during the Seahawks' 64-53 victory over Towson last week. Raque averaged 10.8 points per game with 52 three-pointers before going down with an injury.

NO. 10 CHARLESTON

- The Cougars advanced to the quarterfinals for the first time since 2016 when they were the No. 8
- During their first year in the league in 2014, the Cougars were the third seed and went to the
- The Cougars have been led by Tanisha Brown, who's averaged 12.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. Her 240 rebounds on the season rank as the sixth-best rebounding year in the CofC Division
- Shiclasia Brown's 131 assists this year, as well as her 325 for her career, each rank fifth in CofC's Division I Era as well as the four-year Cougar approaches the final games of her career.

#CAAHOOPS HOT SHOTS

- For the second consecutive season, James Madison, Drexel and Elon have posted 20-wins seasons. It is the second consecutive 20-win season for both Elon and Drexel and the 13th consecutive 20-win season for JMU.
- Three CAA teams are in the top-20 nationally in blocking. William & Mary is the national leader in total blocks (217) and in blocks per game (7.5). Towson is 15th in total blocks (168) and 13th in blocks per game (8.5). James Madison is 18th in total blocks (162) and 15th in blocks per game (5.6).
- There have only been two overtime games in CAA play. Both games involved Drexel and resulted in wins for the Dragons.

- At 24-6, Drexel has set the program record for regular season victories. The previous record had been held by the 2008-09 team, which went 21-8 in the regular season. Drexel, which who went 22-11 last season, has won 20 or more games in back-to-back seasons.
- At 22-7, Elon has posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time as a Division I program and just the second time in program history. The 1979-80 and 1980-81 teams won 25 and 29 games, respectively, under Mary Jackson.
- At 20-9, James Madison has clinched its 13th consecutive 20-win season.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Drexel and Elon are both undefeated at home.
- The Dragons are 13-0 overall at the DAC and 9-0 in league play.
- The Phoenix is 13-0 overall at Alumni Gym and 9-0 in CAA action. Elon has an 18-game home winning streak dating back to last season.
- James Madison is 9-0 in league play at the Convo and have won 10-straight home games.

- Drexel held William & Mary to single digits in all four quarters on February 18. It was the first time since the NCAA went to the quarter system three years ago that Drexel held an opponent to singledigit scoring in all four quarters of a game.
- Drexel has held two opponents to just three points in a quarter this season, the lowest in the CAA. Most recently, the Dragons held Hofstra to three points in the first quarter on January 21. Drexel also held Lafayette to three points in the second quarter on December 1.

I'LL HAVE ANOTHER TRIPLE-DOUBLE

- There have been four triple-doubles in the CAA this season, the most-ever in a single season in league
- Drexel's Aubree Brown notched the third tripledouble in the league with 10 points, 10 rebounds, and 11 assists on February 4 at Charleston. It was the second-ever triple-double in Drexel history with Abby Redick doing it for the Dragons in 2014.
- Elon senior Shay Burnett recorded two tripledoubles. The first came on November 27 with 10 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists on November 27 against Coker. It was the first triple-double in Elon history. Burnett also had a triple-double against William & Mary on March 1, finishing with 14 assists, 13 points and 10 rebounds.
- William & Mary center Abby Rendle notched her third career triple-double at East Carolina on November 21. Rendle finished with a 25 points, 17 rebounds and 10 blocks.
- This is the second consecutive season in which the CAA has had multiple triple-doubles. Former Hofstra guard **Krystal Luciano** and Rendle completed the feat last year.
- Rendle has all three points-rebounds-blocks tripledoubles since 2006. Rendle also had a tripledouble against East Carolina last season (14pts, 11reb, 10blk). Rendle's first triple-double (and William & Mary's first) came in 2015-16, against UNCW (24pts, 15reb, 10blk).
- With three career triple-doubles, Rendle is tied with former ODU and WNBA standout Ticha Penicheiro for the most in CAA history.

BIG BLOCKER

- · William & Mary center Abby Rendle blocked nine shots against Old Dominion on December 17 to surpass former Delaware Blue Hen and WNBA superstar Elena Delle Donne has the CAA's career blocks leader. Rendle brought her total to 275, breaking Delle Donne's record of 273 blocks.
- Rendle blocked her 300th shot against Elon on January 14. She currently has 349 blocks and is one of only four players in the NCAA that have 300 career blocks. She joins Duke's **Bego Faz** Davalos (369), South Carólina's A'ja Wilson (350) and South Alabama's Chyna Ellis (326), and Ohio State's **Stephanie Mavunga** (306) in the 300 blocks club.
- This season, Rendle leads the nation with 4.38 blocks per game and 127 total blocks.
- Rendle's 127 total blocks, set a new standard in CAA history. On February 9, Rendle had six blocks, breaking the record of 110 set by Richmond's Amy Dorsett in 1996-97.
- Rendle tied the CAA single game record for blocks with 11 against Charleston on January 26. She tied the mark originally set by Georgia State's Marcquitta Head on December 3, 2006.
- William & Mary tied the CAA single game record with 17 block's against Charleston on January 26. Elon set the standard of 17 against ETSU on November 29, 2015.
- The Tribe has 217 blocks this season setting a CAA single season record. They broke the mark held by the 209 held by the 2008-09 Hofstra Pride.

HELPING THEM OUT

- William & Mary senior guard Jenna Green became the Tribe's career assist leader on February 11. She has 533 helpers for her career.
- Green is currently 23rd in the nation in assists per game (5.9).
- Elon's Shay Burnett is 15th with 6.6 assists per game and 19th in total blocks (184)
- Burnett has the most assists in a single game this season with 14 helpers against William & Mary on March 1. It was the most since January 2015 when Hofstra's Krystal Luciano dished out 14.
- As a team, Drexel has the most assists in a single game this year with 25 against La Salle on November 16.

20-20 CLUB

 Delaware's Nicole Enabosi recorded 23 points and 20 rebounds in the non-league final against Loyola on December 22. It was the first 20-20 game in the CAA since the 2012-13 season. That year, Hofstra's Shante Evans had 33 points and 23 boards against Mason while William & Mary's Emily Correal had 24 points and 21 rebounds in the season opener against East Carolina.

HITTING THE CENTURY MARK

- With its 106-54 win over Coker on November 27, Elon recorded the first 100-point game in the CAA since March 4, 2015 when James Madison scored 107 points against College of Charleston.
- Since 1998-99, there have been 21 games in which a CAA team has scored 100+ points.

USBWA NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CHAMPIONSHIP REPORT

- Drexel sophomore guard Aubree Brown was named the Ann Meyers Drysdale National Player of the Week by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) on February 27
- Brown averaged 21.0 points, 4.0 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game in a 2-0 week for the Drags. She netted a career-high 26 points in the win over the Dukes, her first career game with 20 or more points. Twenty of her 26 points came after halftime, including 10 points in the two overtime sessions. At Towson, Brown led the way with 16 points on 5-for-10 shooting and had five assists.

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

- William & Mary senior Jenna Green was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District Team First Team.
- In the classroom, Green is on pace to graduate with her degree in finance this May. She has won three Provost Awards for having a 3.5 GPA, or better, and has been a two-time CAA All-Academic selection.
- As a first-team honoree, Green, advances to the CoSIDA Academic All-America Team ballot with First, Second, and Third Team All-Americans being announced in March.

HEY ROOKIE!

- Clark is only the second player in CAA history to earn three consecutive nods at any point in the year; Elena Delle Donne did it twice in 2009-10 en route to her record-setting 10 CAA Rookie of the Week honors.
- Clark leads the CAA with five Rookie of the Weeks.
- Drexel's Hannah Nihill has collected four CAA rookie of the Week honors.

- Elon's Shay Burnett and UNCW's Jenny DeGraaf were selected for the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) 16th annual "So You Want To Be A Coach" program.
- Burnett and DeGraaf will participate in the threeday workshop with speakers provided by the Alliance on March 28-30 in conjunction with the WBCA Convention in Columbus, Ohio.
- The objectives of the "So" program are to increase the understanding and application of skills necessary to secure coaching positions in women's basketball, increase the understanding and awareness of competencies necessary for success in coaching, introduce female basketball players to coaches and administrators, and raise awareness of the existing talent pool of female basketball players who have a passion and interest in coaching the game of women's basketball.

CAA TIEBREAKING PROCEDURE

- If ties exist in the conference standings, the following procedure will be utilized to establish seeding for all CAA championships.
- 1) All ties will be broken 1st through 10th places in descending order.
- 2) Once one team gains an advantage in the case of a multiple-team tie, revert to the beginning of the tiebreaking policies with the remaining teams.

A. Two Team Ties

- 1) Regular season conference record.
- 2) Head-to-head competition.
- 3) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal. If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - a) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tiebreaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- 4) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index (RPI), as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 a.m., on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

B. Multiple (3 or more teams) Ties

- 1) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequa;
- 2) If procedure B1 fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in B1.
- 3) If the tie is broken by B1 or B2 regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures B1 and B2 will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- 4) If a tie still exists, the RPI, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 a.m., on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.
