**THE BUFFALOES:** Colorado is 13-4 overall and 7-3 in the Pac-12 Conference. The Buffaloes completed the season sweep of Washington State by defeating the Cougars 70-58 in the second of their back-to-back meetings. Colorado has won six of its last seven and seven of its last nine overall.

Head coach **Tad Boyle** will be in search of his 100th career conference win at Colorado, in his 11th season with the Buffaloes. He would be the second Colorado coach to reach that milestone - Sox Walseth won 148 Big 7/8 games from 1956-76.

Colorado's 7-3 conference mark equals its best 10-game record in the Pac-12 era. The 2019-20 and the 2011-12 Pac-12 Tournament championship team also started 7-3. Last year's squad won that 11th game to start 8-3.

At 3-3 in road Pac-12 contests, the Buffaloes have at least three road conference wins for the third straight season, with four more to play (CU finished 3-6 in both 2018-19 & '19-20). CU's best Pac-12 road record was 4-5 in 2012-13.

Colorado leads the nation in free throw shooting at 84.2 percent making 235 of 280 attempts. The Buffaloes were 20 of 23 against Washington State, their 17th straight game to begin the season shooting 73.3 percent or better from the line. Colorado has shot 80 percent or better in 12 games and at least 90 percent in four.

The Buffaloes, who have made at least 10 free throws in all 17 games, have 13 contests where they've missed three or fewer and six with just one or two misses. Colorado leads the Pac-12 by a wide margin in free throw shooting with second place Oregon State shooting 76.5 percent.

Along with owning the Pac-12's top spot in free throw percentage the Buffaloes lead the conference in scoring defense (63.1 ppg) and scoring margin (+12.4). Colorado also ranks second in 3-pointers made (7.7 3mpg), turnovers (10.9 tpg) and turnover margin (+3.1), third in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.3), 3-point shooting (.363) and rebounding defense (31.1 rpg) and fourth in rebounding margin (+4.8) and field goal defense (.418).

After their 1 of 18 performance from 3-point range against Washington (Jan. 20), the Buffaloes have rallied to make 16 of their last 31 3-point attempts (.516). With 10 3-pointers against WSU at home, Colorado hit double-figures for the fifth time this season. Colorado's 58.8 percent from 3-point range (10 of 17) was a season high and best since a 60.7 percent performance against Iona (17 of 28) on Dec. 29, 2019.

All-Pac-12 senior guard and Cousy Award finalist **McKinley Wright IV** leads the Buffaloes at 14.8 points, 5.8 assists and just under one steal per game. He is third in field goal shooting at 51 percent and fourth in rebounding at 4.5 per game.

Wright had a game-high 16 points and dished out seven assists against Washington State. He was 11 of 11 from the line, marking team season-highs for free throws made, and amount made without a miss. His 11 made tied his own career high.

Wright finished the game right at 600 career assists, becoming the first Buff to reach that mark and the second Pac-12 player (Payton Pritchard) to accomplish 1,600 points, 600 assists. Over the last 14 games he has dished out 85 assists while committing only 25 turnovers (3.4 a-t). Wright's 99 total assists rank sixth in the nation.

On the Pac-12 charts, Wright is second in assists, fourth in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.9), ninth in free throw shooting (.824) and 11th in scoring and field goal percentage.

**WRIGHT NEARING PAC-12 1,600-600-600 FIRST: McKinley Wright** is the Pac-12's active leader in career points (1,622) and assists (600) and is second in rebounds (582). He is one of just three Pac-12 players to reach 1,500 points, 500 assists and 500 rebounds. Wright is the only player in Colorado history to achieve those numbers.

Wright needs 18 rebounds to become the first player in Pac-12 history to reach 1,600, 600 and 600 in those categories.

**SALT LAKE CITY** — Colorado used a 15-0 run to start the second half Monday to take control, then held off Utah down the stretch to collect a 65-58 win over the Utes at the Huntsman Center.

The victory ended an eight-game losing streak at Utah for the Buffs, who improved to 9-3 overall and 3-2 in Pac-12 play. Utah fell to 4-5, 1-4.

**Tad Boyle's** Buffs had two players with double-doubles, led by **D'Shawn Schwartz's** 15-point, 15-rebound effort, his second career double-double and a career high in rebounds. CU freshman **Jabari Walker** had a 15-point, 10-rebound game for his first career double-double. **Evan Battey** had 10 points and six rebounds, and senior guard **McKinley Wright IV** had nine points and four assists. Wright is now tied with former CU great Jay Humphries for Colorado's all-time assist record with 562.

Timmy Allen led Utah with 19 points.

Colorado trailed 37-27 at intermission after a rough first half in which CU shot just 27 percent while allowing Utah to shoot nearly 55 percent. But the Buffs were a different team after intermission, starting the half with a 15-0 run to take the lead, then fighting off every Utes run the rest of the way.

Colorado dominated the boards, finishing with a 49-31 rebound edge, including 15 offensive rebounds that led to 13 second chance points.

"The offensive rebounding and our defensive energy and effort in the second half were the keys," Boyle said. "I challenged the guys at halftime. I challenged their toughness and they responded."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado trailed, 37-27, at the half, but quickly took control with a 15-0 run to start the second half.

Schwartz had back-to-back buckets early in the run, Evan Battey had a basket and two free throws, Walker had a three-point play and Jeriah Horne notched a basket inside on an assist from Wright. On the defensive end, CU forced seven straight empty Utah possessions, and with just under 15 minutes to play, the Buffs had converted a 10-point deficit into a five-point lead, 42-37.

Schwartz, who was just 1-for-7 from the field in the first half, proved to be a catalyst, hitting his first two shots to spark the run, then adding another basket off of an offensive rebound after Utah finally scored.

Utah then pulled to within one at several junctures, but the Buffs each time had an answer. Walker hit a 3-pointer with 9:15 to play, followed by a Battey hook shot that gave CU a 51-45 edge.

Walker continued to show that he has a bright future ahead, coming up with critical rebounds and baskets. He had seven points in a 10-0 CU first-half run, then hit a three-point play in Colorado's 15-0 run before his 3-pointer midway through the second half gave the Buffs a four-point cushion.

Colorado's lead was reduced to one again with 3:32 to play after back-to-back buckets from Utah's Allen, but Wright hit two free throws with 3:16 to play to push the Buffs' edge back to three, 55-52.

The Buffs then held off the Utes down the stretch — something they couldn't do just a year ago when they lost leads at the end of regulation and overtime in a defeat CU's veterans still remembered.

Colorado struggled to create consistent offense in the first half and trailed 37-27 at intermission. CU shot just 27% in the opening half (9-for-33) while the Utes were an efficient 17-for-31 that included 26 points in the paint.

Colorado led, 22-20, with 6:24 remaining in the half before the Utes closed with a 17-5 surge that included a 15-2 run. CU shot just 1-for-10 in that stretch while the Utes hit 7-of-8.



Senior **D'Shawn Schwartz** is averaging 8.7 points and 4.3 rebounds per game. He is second on the Buffaloes in 3-point shooting (.389) and is third on the team with 21 3-pointers made.

Schwartz had 15 points and career and team season high 15 rebounds at Utah. It was his second double-double of the season and second in conference play (13p-10r at USC).

Schwartz ranks 10th in the Pac-12 in 3-point percentage.

Freshman forward **Jabari Walker** is averaging 8.4 points and is third on the team in rebounds at 4.8 per game. He pitched in seven points and three rebounds in the home win over WSU.

In conference only games, Walker is third among Pac-12 players at 61.8 percent and second in 3-point shooting at 58.8 percent. Over the past six games he has made 61.9 percent from the field (26-42) and 70 percent from 3-point range (7-10).

Junior **Eli Parquet** is averaging 4.8 points while hitting 45 percent from the floor. He leads Colorado in blocked shots with 16 and ranks second on the team in steals with 15.

Parquet had a career and team-season high four blocked shots at Washington State. Nine of his 16 blocks on the season have come in the last four games.

Parquet recorded a career-high with four steals at Washington. His four steals are also a team season-high.

Parquet is ninth on the overall Pac-12 charts at 1.0 block per game. In conference only contests he is eighth in blocks (1.1 bpg) and steals (1.4 spg).

Senior **Maddox Daniels** is averaging 6.9 points and 2.7 rebounds and is second on the team in 3-pointers with 27. His 18 3-pointers during Pac-12 games are the most on the team and ranks 15th in the conference during that time frame (1.8 3mpg).

He averaged 10.5 points, hitting on 5 of 9 3-pointers, in the two wins over Stanford and California. Daniels scored in double-figures for the fifth time this season matching his CU career-high 12 points against California.

Overall, Daniels is 14th in the Pac-12 in 3-pointers made (1.6 3mpg) and 12th in percentage (.386).

**Dallas Walton** is averaging 8.5 points and 2.5 rebounds while shooting 64 percent from the field. He returned to the lineup at Washington, pitching in six points, after missing the previous six games.

Walton had a career-night in the neutral site game with the Huskies on Dec. 20 with 22 points on 6 of 7 shooting and a perfect 10 of 10 from the free throw line. It was his third straight double-figure scoring game; he had just four total in his first 61 career games.

Walton has 74 points in his last eight games; he had 45 in 28 games last year. He has made 29 of 45 shots this season and 44 of 70 dating back to last year.

Freshman guard **Keeshawn Barthelemy** averages 4.5 points while ranking second on the team in assists with 26 against only 10 turnovers.

He had a personal-best four assists with no turnovers against Omaha. Barthelemy scored 11 points and co-led the Buffaloes in rebounding with seven in his collegiate debut against South Dakota.

**ABOUT THE UTES:** Utah is 6-7 overall and 3-6 in the Pac-12. The Utes have dropped their last three including a 79-73 decision to Oregon on Jan. 9. This will be the Utes' third-straight road game. Utah averages just under 70 points per game while shooting 45.2 percent from the field. The Utes lead the Pac-12 in assists (16.1 apg) and rank second in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.3) and third in free throw shooting (.751). Utah allows 66.7 points per game while opponents are shooting 42.6 percent.

Junior forward Timmy Allen leads Utah at 16.8 points and 5.9 rebounds per game. Senior guard Alfonso Plummer averages 12.9 points and ranks fifth in the Pac-12 at 2.2 3-pointers made per game. Sophomore forward Mikael Jantunen averages 9.1 points and 4.2 rebounds while shooting 64.9 percent from the field. Sophomore guard Rylan Jones tops the Utes in assists at 4.3 per game. Jones ranks second in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.5).

**SERIES RECORDS:** This will be the 55th meeting between Colorado and Utah with the Buffaloes holding a 30-24 advantage. Colorado's 65-58 win in Salt Lake City snapped a six-game run by the home team in the series and was the Buffaloes' first win at Utah since 2012. Colorado is 20-6 all-time at home against Utah and has won the last three.

**RECORD COMEBACK:** Colorado's comeback from an 18-point deficit at Washington State tied for the fifth best since 1947 and third best in a road game. It was Colorado's best comeback in a Pac-12 regular season game. The Buffaloes own a 19-point comeback against Washington State in the first round of the 2017 Pac-12 Tournament.

**TAKING CARE OF THE BALL:** Against Washington, Colorado had a season-low five turnovers; its fewest since committing five against California on Feb. 26, 2012. Five in a road game were the Buffaloes' fewest since committing four at Iowa State on Jan. 30, 2010 – a mark which is also the all-time Colorado conference low. Colorado had no turnovers in the first half; the first time with none in a half since the second period at Utah on Jan. 20, 2019.

It was Colorado's sixth game with single-digit turnovers this season. The Buffaloes rank 25th in the nation in fewest turnovers at 10.9 per game.

**PAC-12 WEEKLY HONORS:** McKinley Wright IV has earned Pac-12 Player of the Week honors three times this season (Nov. 30, Dec. 28 and Jan. 18), the most of any conference player.

His third honor adds another first in Colorado basketball history to his resume. Eight others, including Chauncey Billups and Alec Burks, had previously won two weekly honors in one season. He already owns the school mark for most conference Player of the Week honors, with the latest being his fifth.

Wright's most recent honor, he averaged 12.0 points and 8.0 assists in three games (at Utah, Cal & Stanford) and in the process became Colorado's all-time leader in assists against Cal.

Wright's second honor came after scoring 21 points and dishing out seven assists in a 74-64 triumph over Grand Canyon at the Far West Classic in Las Vegas. He made 8 of 14 from the floor and 4 of 5 from the free throw line to help the Buffaloes to their fourth-straight win.

The first honor came after averaging 22.0 points, 5.0 assists, 4.0 rebounds and 1.5 steals at the Little Apple Classic. He shot a blistering 64.3 percent from the field (18 of 28), including 43 percent from 3-point range (3 of 7).

Wright's other two Pac-12 weekly honors came as a freshman (Jan. 8, 2018) and a junior (Jan. 6, 2020).

Jabari Walker earned Colorado's first Pac-12 Freshman of the Week honor on Jan. 18; an award in just its second year. He's the first Colorado freshman to win that type of honor since Richard Roby was the Big 12 Conference "Rookie" of the Week twice in 2004-05.

Walker averaged 16.3 points, 9.7 rebounds and 1.0 block in Colorado's three games that week. He recorded his first two career double-doubles with 15 points and 10 rebounds at Utah and followed that up with 23 points and 11 rebounds against California. He shot 60 percent overall from the field (18 of 30) including 5 of 7 from 3-point range.

The men's sweep marked the third time in the Pac-12 has had one school earn the Player and Freshman honor in the same week. Additionally, Colorado's women's basketball team, after wins over Cal and top-ranked Stanford, swept those honors as well with Mya Hollingshed (Player) and Frida Formann (Freshman). Colorado is the first school to sweep all four men's and women's basketball honors in the same week.

**NATIONAL RANKINGS:** Colorado is No. 17 in the latest NCAA Evaluation Tool rankings (NET), used by the organization to evaluate teams for the Division I Tournament, as of Jan. 29. The Buffaloes debuted at No. 14 in the initial NET rankings released on Jan. 4 and had climbed as high as No. 7 on Jan. 19 before the loss at Washington (Quadrant 3). The Buffaloes are the Pac-12's top ranked NET team.

Colorado spent one week in the USA Today/Coaches Top 25, at No. 23, on Jan. 18. The Buffaloes have received votes in the Associated Press and coaches polls the last six weeks.

**AGAINST RANKED TEAMS:** Colorado's 20 wins over ranked opponents in Boyle's 10 seasons is by far the best in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 20-34, have accounted for 31 percent of wins over ranked opponents (64) since 1949-50.

Colorado is 1-1 this season against ranked teams after its 79-72 win over No. 17/15 Oregon on Jan. 7. CU dropped its first game against a ranked team this season, falling to No. 12/16 Tennessee 56-47 on Dec. 8.

**RIGHT AT HOME:** Colorado has won 34 of its last 39, 46 of 54, 67 of 79 and 77 of 90 in the friendly confines of the CU Events Center. In the **Tad Boyle** era, Colorado is a sparkling 147-27 at the CU Events Center (.845). The Buffaloes are 460-178 (.721) all-time at the CEC. The Buffaloes, who finished 13-3 at home in 2019-20, have won at least 10 games at home each of the last 11 seasons.

**SUCCESS ON THE ROAD:** Colorado has an 19-16 record in games away from Boulder since February 2019; 10-14 on the road and 9-2 at neutral sites. Colorado is 4-4 in true road games this season and 3-0 in neutral site contests.

Colorado's seven neutral/road wins are second only to Baylor's eight among Power 5 schools (5-0 road, 3-0 neutral). Gonzaga, the nation's top ranked team out of the West Coast Conference, also has eight. Stanford is listed as having five neutral/road wins, but also has five at its temporary home in Santa Cruz, Calif.

Colorado opened the 2020-21 season with a pair of wins at the Little Apple Classic in Manhattan, Kan. Colorado cruised to an 84-61 win over South Dakota on Nov. 25 and then downed former Big Eight/Big 12 rival Kansas State, 76-58 on Nov. 27. It marked the first time since 1960-61, that the Buffs started 2-0 with both games being away from Boulder. That season started with three straight wins away from Boulder beginning with back-to-back wins at Arizona and a third at New Mexico.

**LEADERS OF THE PAC LAST TWO YEARS:** Colorado has the most overall wins (46) and the second-best winning percentage (.708) among Pac-12 teams since February 2019. Colorado was 12-4 over the final two months of the 2018-19 season, culminating in a spot in the NIT Quarterfinals. The Buffaloes were 21-11 in 2019-20, well in line for an NCAA Tournament bid before the season was shut down on March 12 due to the coronavirus pandemic.

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** With the coronavirus pandemic delaying, and thus shortening, the 2020-21 season, several scheduling rarities dot the Colorado schedule.

The season, starting two weeks later than originally planned, was shortened to a maximum of 27 games. Add in the Pac-12 Conference expanding to a 20-game schedule, a move announced in December 2019, the Buffaloes were left with seven nonconference games.

Colorado's home opener against Northern Colorado on Dec. 14 was its latest home opener since hosting Michigan on Dec. 17, 1948.

Colorado's two home nonconference games are its fewest since 1955-56, when Iowa was the lone non-Big Seven opponent to visit Boulder. The Buffaloes' 12 scheduled home regular season games will be their fewest since having 11 for the 1988-89 season.

During the Pac-12 schedule, the Buffaloes will experience a four-game home stretch (between Jan. 6-17) and a four-game road stretch (between Feb. 10-21).

It will be the first time Colorado has played four-straight conference road games since 1946-47, the Buffaloes final year in the Mountain States Conference, prior to moving to the Big Seven. Colorado will have four-straight home contests for the first time in 60 years (1960-61).

**SCHEDULE SHUFFLE TIMELINE:** Here is a timeline of pandemic related schedule shuffles that have affected Colorado in 2020-21:

**Nov. 2:** South Dakota State backs out of the Little Apple Classic, forcing Kansas State to find another opponent. South Dakota would take that spot two weeks later as the Buffs' opening opponent. Nov. 25

**Dec. 1:** Colorado temporarily pauses operations due to COVID-19, forcing the postponement of the game at Arizona (Dec. 2).

**Dec. 3:** CU resumes operations with the approval of the school's medical staff and campus health officials after two days of successful tracing and testing, allowing Buffs to prepare to host scheduled home opener vs. Washington State (Dec. 5).

**Dec. 4:** Colorado's home game with Colorado State (Dec. 8) is canceled due to COVID-19 issues in the Rams' program. Buffs replace CSU with Colorado School of Mines for the same date. Postponed game with Arizona is rescheduled for Dec. 28.

**Dec. 5:** Colorado's home opener vs. Washington State is postponed due to COVID-19 concerns in the Cougars' program. The Buffaloes cancel their home game with Colorado School of Mines, which would have been an exhibition for the Orediggers, opting to play at No. 13 Tennessee on Dec. 8 instead.

**Jan. 5:** Following a month without changes, Colorado's game scheduled for Jan. 9 against Oregon State is postponed due to COVID-19 protocols in the Beavers' program.

**Jan. 6:** With Colorado and Utah facing the prospect of one game this week after Oregon State's postponement, the travel partners decided to move their game up from Mar. 6 to Jan. 11, freeing up the final week of the season for future makeup needs. In addition, Colorado pushed its Jan. 13 home date with California back one day to Jan. 14 and rescheduled its home game with Washington State for Jan. 27.

**Jan. 22:** Colorado's Oregon State, postponed from Jan. 9, was rescheduled for Feb. 8. The move gave Colorado five-straight home

**NONCONFERENCE NUMBERS:** Colorado is 102-32 (.761) in nonconference regular season games under head coach **Tad Boyle** including a 55-15 mark (.786) since the beginning of the 2014-15 season.

Colorado is 76-5 in nonconference home games under Boyle, a record which includes a perfect 6-0 mark in postseason action.

**NOVEMBER 'REIGN':** Over the last three years few programs have had more success in the month of November than Colorado. In fact, it's one.

**FOR OPENERS:** The Buffaloes improved to 94-24 all-time in home openers and have won their last 13, making Tad Boyle a perfect 12-0 in home openers. The Buffaloes have won 18 of their last 19.

With the win over South Dakota, Colorado improved to 83-35 (.703) in all-time season openers and has won its last five. The Buffaloes are 9-2 under head coach Tad Boyle and 36-5 in overall season openers since 1980-81.

The Buffaloes began with a neutral site game for the second-straight season and third time in five years. Colorado defeated Arizona State, 81-71, in last year's Pac-12 China Game in Shanghai. In 2015-16, the eventual NCAA Tournament bound Buffaloes dropped a 68-62 decision to Iowa State in Sioux Falls, S.D.

**WRIGHT'S PRESEASON HONORS:** Senior guard **McKinley Wright IV** was named to several prestigious Watch Lists among other honors during the preseason.

For the second-straight season, Wright was named to initial preseason Watch Lists for the Cousy Award (Nation's Top Point Guard), Naismith Award, Wooden Award (National Player of the Year) and NABC Division I Player of the Year Award.

Wright was a Top 10 Finalist for the 2019-20 Cousy Award.

The Oscar Robertson Trophy Watch List, awarded by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association to the National Player of the Year has yet to be released.

**LEAGUE FOE IN A NONCONFERENCE GAME:** For the second straight season Colorado faced a Pac-12 opponent in a game that does not count in the conference standings. The Buffaloes defeated Washington 92-69 on Dec. 20 in Las Vegas, in the Far West Classic.

Washington was one of two schools that Colorado was only to face once with the league's new 20-game schedule. Adding the Huskies during the nonconference schedule leaves Arizona State as the only Pac-12 team the Buffaloes will face once during the regular season – that game taking in place in Boulder, the week of Feb. 3-7, 2021.

Ironically, it was Arizona State that the Buffaloes faced last year in a nonconference game. The two teams met in Shanghai in the 2019-20 season opener in the Pac-12 China Game.

Colorado has played league opponents in nonconference regular season games before, in fact, it was once an annual tradition. The Buffaloes were involved in the Big 7/8 Conference Christmas tournaments for more than 30 years between 1947-78. Colorado would join its Big 7/8 counterparts, and sometimes another outside team, for a three-game tournament in Kansas City each year in late December, prior to the start of the league season.

**PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL/HONORS:** Colorado was picked seventh in the annual Pac-12 Preseason Poll. The Buffaloes earned 149 points, just five shy of USC which had 154, and a first place vote.

For the first time since the 2011-12 season, UCLA was picked to win the Pac-12 title. Just 10 points separated the top three teams, with UCLA finishing with 251 points in the balloting, Arizona State with 246 and Oregon with 241. It was the closest vote among the top three teams in the 37-year history of the conference's preseason picks.

Stanford (209) and Arizona (173) rounded out the top five.

Senior **McKinley Wright IV** was named to the Preseason All-Pac-12 team while junior **Evan Battey** earned honorable mention.

**BUFFS SIGN: Quincy Allen, Julian Hammond III, Lawson Lovering and Javon Ruffin** signed National Letters of intent on Nov. 11 to continue their education and play basketball for the Buffaloes in 2021-22.

As of that date, Colorado's signing class was ranked 16th in the nation by 247Sports.com while Rivals had the class at No. 19.

**Quincy Allen, 6-7, 190, G/F, Silver Spring, Md. (Maret School):** Allen is 49th on the ESPN 100 national list and checks in at No. 68 via Rivals and No. 71 in the 247Sports composite rankings. He plays in the Mid-Atlantic Conference, regarded as one of the top private school leagues in the country.

**Julian Hammond III, 6-2, 180, G, Denver, Colo. (Cherry Creek):** Hammond averaged 22 points, seven rebounds and four assists as a junior, leading the Centennial League in scoring and helping Cherry Creek to a No. 4 seed at the state tournament. 247Sports lists him as the top player in the state of Colorado and the 30th best combo guard in the nation.

**Lawson Lovering, 7-0, 220, C, Cheyenne, Wyo. (Central):** A two-time Wyoming Class 4A All-State selection, Lovering averaged 13.6 points, 8.8 rebounds and 1.7 blocks as a junior. He shot a state-best 69 percent from the field and was named the 2020 East Conference Co-Player of the Year as Cheyenne Central finished the season at 20-3 overall.

**Javon Ruffin, 6-5, 195, G, New Orleans, La. (PHHoenix Prep)** Ruffin averaged 22.3 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists as a junior for Isidore Newman High School in his hometown of New Orleans. He helped the Greenies to a district title and the semifinals of the Division III state semifinals. An All-State selection by the Louisiana State Writers Association, Ruffin is playing his final high school season for PHHoenix Prep in Arizona.
