QUICKLY

CU is now **23-8** overall (finished 14-6 in the Pac-12 play for third place); **18-3** when leading at halftime, **18-3** when scoring 90 or more points, **12-1** in games decided by 10 points or more and **4-1** as a ranked team ... Pac-12 teams are now **3-0** (*USC, UCLA and Oregon play later today*) ... This was the first-ever meeting between CU and Georgetown; the Buffaloes are now **13-10** against current members of the Big East Conference (GU was the eighth school in the league to line up against the Buffs).

GAME FLOW NOTES

- ▶ Colorado led a **9-7** at the first media timeout (15:28); shooting 4-of-6 from the field, all four baskets were assisted (three by **McKinley Wright**, one by **D'Shawn Schwartz**).
- ▶ First back-to-back scores were by Colorado that fueled a **10-0** run for a **17-7** lead at the 12:01 mark. At this point, CU was **7-of-12** from the field, with six assists.
- ▶ Georgetown went **6:13** between field goals; score went from 7-7 tie to a 17-12 CU lead in that span (10:34 mark).
- ▶ After Georgetown cut the lead to 20-14 with 9:49 to go, CU outscored the Hoyas **27-9** the rest of the half.
- ▶ A 10-4 run to open the second half pushed the lead to 30 (**57-27**); the closest G-town got from that point on was 18 (68-50 and 91-73).
- ▶ At the 13:27 mark of the second half, CU led **62-36**, matching one of the most significant scores in school history: CU's 62-36 win over BCS #1/AP# 3 Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2001.
- ▶ Georgetown knocked the lead back down to **71-52** (9:24 to go), but the Buffs then reeled off a **13-0** run over the next 3:06 to take a 32-point lead (6:18 left).

COLORADO GAME SUPERLATIVES

- ▶ Colorado had season-highs for points (**96**), field goals made (**34**), field goal percentage (**60.7**), three-point percentage (**.640**) and assists (**27**, the most in a game since Dec. 22, 2009 (27 in a 92-58 win over CSU-Northridge).
- ▶ Colorado became the 10th team to make **16** 3-pointers in a first round game (tied for the fourth-most).

- ▶ Colorado set **12** school records for NCAA tournament play; see page three for complete list.
- ▶ Colorado set tournament highs (through 17 games) for points (**96**) and three-pointers (**16**).

BUFFALOES IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT Colorado is now **11-16** in the NCAA Tournament (**3-6** since seeding began in 1979 when the tournament expanded from 32 to 40 teams, **1-2** as the higher seed (8, 8 & 5), **3-4** in first round games and **2-4** in those decided in double figures).

▶ Including three games in this tournament, the No. 5 seed is now **92-51** against the No. 12 seed (**2-1** so far this year; Creighton plays Santa Barbara at 3:30 ET/1:30 MT in the fourth 5-12 game).

MOST WINS / SEASON Colorado is enjoying its 12th **20**-win season in its history (eight under Tad Boyle). A closer look:

NEUTRAL SITES With the win, CU on a neutral court this season is now **6-1**; that ties the most ever a neutral site; the '11-12 Buffs, in Tad Boyle's second year, was 6-3. (*CU, with a 6-6 road record, won its most road games since going 6-7 in 2003-04 and finished .500 or better - 6-6 -- for the first time since '00-01*).

▶ The **12** wins away from home are the most in CU history; topping 10 in each of the 1941-42, 1954-55 and 2011-12 seasons (*the 11 in the regular season tied for the seventh-most in the NCAA*).

FIRST HALF CU had a boatload of first half notes:

- ▶ The **24**-point lead is a school-best for a halftime lead, topping the 51-31 score at halftime vs. Texas A&M in 1969. It also matched the largest lead CU has ever had in an NCAA game (led by **24** points four different times in 80-62 win over Indiana in 1997).
- ▶ Colorado was **11-of-17** (64.7%) from 3-point range; Georgetown made just eight baskets overall. The 11 threes are the fourth time CU has made that many in a half (last: vs. Iona, Dec. 29, 2019).
- ▶ The 13th time CU scored 40-plus points in the first half; 47 tied for the second-most points (record: **10-3**).
- ▶ CU's bench outscored Georgetown, **17-2**.
- ▶ Colorado's **15** assists (on 16 baskets) were its most-ever for an NCAA game, accomplished in just one half (old high was 13 against Baylor in 2012). McKinley Wright had 8, old high was 5.
- ▶ Georgetown had allowed just **31.7** points in the first half.

O-FER UNTIL CU did not have an offensive rebound until there were 31 second left in the game, then had two; Nique Clifford made a three on the second one; the previous low was three against Grand Canyon (when CU shot 50 percent; CU shot 61 percent today).

OBSCURE NOTE OF THE DAY Colorado's only two previous connections to Hinkle Fieldhouse: in 1951, future Buff **Tom Harrold** was on Muncie Central, the Indiana state champion with the title game at Hinkle; and in 2014, when **Gene Hackman** (Coach Normal Dale in *Hoosiers* attended the CU-Oregon State football game at Folsom Field as a guest of OSU assistant **Jack Del Rio**).

FREEBIES The Buffaloes were **12-of-14** from the free throw line, and are now **431-of-524** for the season (**82.25**); CU entered today second in the nation in FT shooting (82.16), behind Oral Roberts (82.17). CU has made at least **71.4** percent in 30 of 31 games this season (and now 20 times at or over **80** percent and five times over **90**). The breakdown by half in 2020-21:

INDIVIDUAL LINER NOTES

McKINLEY WRIGHT (12 PTS, 5 REB, 13 AST, 0 TO) He had one more assist than the Georgetown team ... The **13** assists marked the 10th double-figure assist game of his career ... He has now scored **1,847** points in his career, sixth all-time, within 30 points now of the top five (Shaun Vandiver had 1,876). He remains the sixth player in the NCAA Division I to score 1,800, with 600 or rebounds and assists (see chart below).

► **Season Assists:** he now has **181** on the season; that ranks second all-time; he has four of the top nine in school history (175 in '17-18, third; 167 in '18-19, seventh and 159 in '19-20, ninth). He trails only the 194 Jose Winston had in 2000-01.

► **Assist-to-Turnover Ratio:** on the season, he now owns a **2:87-1** (181 assists/63 turnovers). He is the first player since 2008 in an NCAA game to have at least **13** assists and no turnovers (Jason Richards, Davidson).

JABARI WALKER (24 PTS, 3 REB, 2 BLK; 9-10 FGA, 5-5 3 PT) He made a career-high five three-pointers (old best was 3-for-3 when he scored his previous career-high before today, 23 points on Jan. 13 in a win over Cal). His 9-of-10 shooting performance was the best this season on the team for a player with more than six shots in a game (and tied for the fourth-most made in a game).

D'SHAWN SCHWARTZ (18 PTS, 3 REB, 4 AST) He became the 37th player in school history to score 1,000 career points (hitting the mark with his second three of the game); finishing the game with **1,013** (passing Andre Roberson into 36th—Roberson had 1,012). He is the third member of the 2017 recruiting class to hit 1,000 (joining McKinley Wright and Tyler Bey).

► **Threes:** He enjoyed his best game of the season, draining 5-of-7 threes after entering with a high of three on four occasions (he has now made 10-of-15 in the last three games).

DALLAS WALTON (9 PTS, 0 REB) He made 3-of-4 field goals (1—1 3-Pt; 2-of-2 FT). He is now 56-of-100 (.560) from the field, 9-of-19 from three (.474) and 49-of-58 (.845). That's a combined **114-of-177 (64.4)** for all his shots.

The 1,800/600/600 Club

McKinley Wright is now the sixth player in NCAA history with 1,800 points, 600 rebounds and 600 assists for a career (and one of 10 in the 1,600/600/600 club and one of seven in the 1,700/600/600). He was the 10th to attain 1,600/600/600, and the seventh to reach 1,700/600/600 (since 1985-86; there could be a handful of others at most, but there was no 3-pointer prior, no shot clock for most of that time, and freshmen weren't eligible between 1955 and 1971):
