For the fifth time, a pitcher from North Georgia has earned the Ron Lenz national Pitcher of the Year award as Kylee Smith landed this year's honor to head Division II Collegiate Commissioners Association's All-America softball team along with Player of the Year Mariah Jameyson from Texas A&M-Commerce.

Smith, a sophomore who led the Nighthawks to the Southeast Regional championship for the fifth time, recorded an NCAA Division II-best 320 strikeouts on the season to go with a 35-1 record and 0.83 earned run average. She had a hand in 18 shutouts as well, 13 on a solo basis and five combined shutouts.

Jameyson was named as the Ron Lenz Player of the Year after hitting .510 as the catcher for the Lions, who advanced to the South Central Super Regional in just their second NCAA Tournament appearance. Jameyson was one of the top offensive players in the nation, as she belted 23 home runs and drove in 89 runs – the second-most in Division II – with a slugging percentage of 1.046.

She was one of two players with a slugging percentage of over 1.000 named to the first team, joining Southern Arkansas' Brooke Goad, who broke Division II records for home runs in a season with 32 and a career with 90 for the Central Regional titleists.

Southern Arkansas and Texas A&M-Commerce each had two first-team selections, as SAU pitcher Victoria Taylor joined Goad on the first team as did Kinsie Hebler, the designated player for Texas A&M-Commerce.

Besides Smith and the duo from Southern Arkansas, the only other first-team selection from a regional champion came from the West as Chico State second baseman Karli Skowrup landed the honor. Skowrup finished second in her conference in home runs, including one in the game that got the Wildcats the regional championship.

Skowrup was joined on the infield by first baseman Taylor Moran from Lee University, shortstop Lani Van Zyl from Winona State and third baseman Jessica Mohl from Valdosta State; the latter two were also named as their conference players of the year for the 2018 season.

The outfielders named to the first team with Goad were repeat selections from 2017 – West Texas A&M's Ashley Hardin and Colorado Mesa's Brooke Hodgson. Hodgson became the third player in NCAA Division II history to drive in at least 100 runs in a season, while Hardin became just the sixth player to make the D2CCA first team on three occasions.

California Baptist's Hannah Thieroff was the first team selection as the utility player, while Arkansas Tech's Megan Goodnight, the national leader in saves, was named as the utility-pitcher on the first team.

This is the 12th season of the All-America program which is selected by CoSIDA members from schools playing in NCAA Division II and third in which the program was solely sponsored by the Division II Collegiate Commissioners Association.
