WEEK 10 RECAP

Valdosta State was ranked second in the original regional poll, but fell all the way to seventh after a loss to Florida Tech. VSU responded with a win over West Alabama, who was ranked fifth, and has catapulted all the way up to third in the rankings.

Similarly, Florida Tech was on the outside looking in when it was ranked ninth in the first regional poll. Since then, the Panthers have won two straight games over regionally ranked teams, defeating UWG last weekend, and are now all the way up to fifth.

After multiple close calls, Mississippi College finally broke through and got its first GSC win since 1995, defeating Shorter. **Marcel Newson** returned the opening kickoff for a touchdown, and the Choctaws never looked back.

North Alabama was dominant in its 51-3 win over West Florida. The Lions jumped out to a 48-3 lead before halftime and, with West Alabama's loss, claimed its fourth straight conference championship. UNA has been the top team in all three iterations of the regional rankings.

WEEK 11 PREVIEW

As we enter the final week of the regular season, there are still a lot of questions surrounding the postseason fate of several GSC schools. The top seven seeds in the region qualify for the postseason, and based off of the last set of rankings, that would include three GSC teams (North Alabama, Valdosta State, and Florida Tech). West Alabama and West Georgia are currently on the outside looking in, ranked #9 and #10, respectively.

West Georgia will look to end its regular season on a high note, traveling to West Florida for the program's first meeting with the Argonauts.

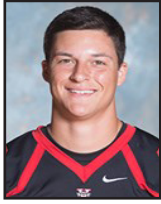
Delta State will take the long trip to Melbourne to square off with Florida Tech. This matchup is the GSC's Game of the Week and can be streamed live on the WatchESPN App. DSU's **Chris Robinson** is currently tied for the all-time conference record in total touchdowns in a season and will be looking to sit atop the list with a score on Saturday.

West Alabama will host Malone, rounding out the regular season in a non-conference bout. With its GSC slate finished, UWA will finish second in the league with a 6-2 conference record. This is the first year since 2013 that the Tigers finish with a winning conference record.

GSC Champions North Alabama will be on the road in its final regular season game. The Lions will meet Mississippi College, who earned its first GSC win since 1995 and its first shutout win since 2006 last weekend.

Shorter will be on the road at Valdosta State, looking to end its season with an upset win and avoid a winless 2016 campaign. VSU sits third in the SR2 Rankings and would cement its place in the postseason with a victory.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Valdosta State QB Adam Robles

Robles completed a season-high 34 passes for 353 passing yards and three touchdowns in the big win for Valdosta State over West Alabama. He was sacked just once in the contest and added 18 rushing yards. The win for the Blazers keeps their playoff aspirations alive, as VSU was ranked seventh in the latest set of regional rankings, while UWA was fifth.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Florida Tech LB Chris Stapleton

Stapleton spearheaded the Panthers' defensive effort in the 45-21 win over West Georgia. In this pivotal matchup for playoff positioning, Stapleton had a game-high 13 tackles. His 13 stops are tied for the most by any FIT player this season. Stapleton also had a sack in the game and helped hold the Wolves to just 272 yards of total offense.



SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Mississippi College KR Marcel Newson

Newson is winning GSC Special Teams Player of the Week for the second time this season. In the shutout win over Shorter, Newson provided the Choctaws with all the points needed for a win on the first play, taking the opening kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown. It was the first conference win of the year for MC. Newson added 30 punt return yards in the game and also had a receiving and a rushing touchdown. He is currently fourth in the nation in all-purpose yards (189.5).



FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Valdosta State RB Cedric Hollingshed

Hollingshed has now been named the GSC Freshman of the Week four times in 2016. In the win over West Alabama, Hollingshed had 17 carries for 43 yards and a touchdown. He also had three receptions for 27 yards. The freshman currently sits eighth in the league in rushing yards per game (56.0) and is tied for seventh in the rushing touchdowns (6).

Game Breakdown

West Georgia heads into this matchup with West Florida still alive in the hunt for the Division II Playoffs. UWG suffered a big blow last week, falling to Florida Tech, a team also fighting for its postseason life. The bright spot from that game came from **Dylan Donahue**, who tied the conference record for sacks in a season (13.5). Donahue will have a chance to break the record against the pass-happy attack of the Argonauts, who have attempted more passes this year than anyone else in the league. UWF averages 331.7 yards passing per game, most in the conference, while West Georgia only allows 203.8 yards through the air in each contest.

Game Breakdown

Florida Tech currently sits fifth in the regional rankings, and with the top seven teams making the postseason, the Panthers should be right where they want to be if they are able to defeat Delta State on Saturday. DSU's **Chris Robinson** has scored 24 total touchdowns this year (19 rushing and 5 receiving), which is tied for the most in conference history. If Robinson is to break the record, he will have to do it against the stoutest rush defense in the GSC. FIT has only surrendered five rushing touchdowns in nine games, and opponents are averaging just 92.6 yards on the ground per game.

Game Breakdown

For the fourth straight season, North Alabama finds itself at the top of the GSC, claiming a conference championship last weekend after a convincing win over West Florida. The Lions have not lost a game in Division II this season and are poised to be the top seed in the region with a win in Clinton. UNA has the top scoring offense and the top scoring defense in the league. In conference games, the Lions average 43.0 points per game, while allowing just 11.8 points per game. They will have to stop one of the most dynamic players in all of the league this weekend, as **Marcel Newson** has been electric for Mississippi College. Newson is currently third in the country in all-purpose yards per game (189.5).

Game Breakdown

This will be the first ever meeting between the Pioneers and the Tigers, and UWA is hoping that it will not be the final game of its season. The Tigers suffered a tough loss last weekend to Valdosta State that dropped them from #5 to #9 in the regional rankings. It also snapped their five-game winning streak. With a 6-2 GSC record, West Alabama will finish second in the league and will finish with its first winning season in conference play since 2013. **Austin Grammer** now leads the conference in passing yards per game, throwing for 297.8 yards in each contest. Grammer has thrown 17 touchdowns this year and just six interceptions.

2016 FLORIDA'S SPACE COAST GSC-TV ON ESPN

The Gulf South Conference has officially announced the schedule for the 12th edition of its Florida's Space Coast GSC Football Game of the Week featured live on ESPN 3.

ESPN3 serves as the exclusive carrier of the league's package for the third consecutive season. This year's 10-game slate includes nine Saturday games and one Thursday night contest and kicks off on September 17 when Shorter University hosts Florida Tech in Rome, Ga.

"The Gulf South Conference's Game of the Week package has been a leader in Division II since its inception. Continuing our relationship with ESPN provides unparalleled exposure and distribution for the GSC," said Commissioner Matt Wilson.
