ALL NINE GSC SQUADS TAKE THE FIELD THIS WEEK

Gulf South Conference football kicks off 2016 with four games on Thursday, September 1, and five games on Saturday, September 3.

Five GSC squads are being recognized in the national polls, led by West Georgia, who is second in both the AFCA Division II Coaches' Poll and the D2Football.com Poll. The Wolves were Super Region 2 Champions last year and fell to the eventual national champions (Northwest Missouri State) in the national semifinals last season. NW Missouri State is the top team in each poll.

North Alabama won a share of the conference crown last year and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. UNA is again expected to be a national power, earning Top 15 rankings in each poll. The Lions will have a big test to start the season, squaring off with former GSC member Jacksonville State.

Valdosta State is ranked 23rd in the D2Football.com Poll and is receiving votes in the coaches' poll. VSU opens the season against Albany State for the third straight season.

Delta State and Florida Tech are each receiving votes in the coaches' poll and have expectations of being at the top of the conference standings at the end of the year, with FIT third in the preseason poll and DSU fourth in the poll.

West Florida begins its inaugural year with a game at Ave Marie. Coach Pete Shinnick recently named Kaleb Nobles as the starting quarterback for week one.

Mississippi College is officially back in the Gulf South and Division II this season, and the Choctaws were picked to finish seventh in the conference.

Shorter opens the year on the road at Tennessee-Chattanooga, while West Alabama will travel to future GSC football member North Greenville on Thursday night.

Game Breakdown: Delta State enters the 2016 season picked to finish fourth in the GSC. The Statesmen will be led by QB Tyler Sullivan, a Harlon Hill Trophy candidate and Preseason All-Gulf South Conference selection. Sullivan missed four games with an injury last season, but led the league in passing yards per game (304.0 yards).

Under head coach Todd Cooley, DSU is 10-1 in September games and will look to build upon that record with another win over KWC. The Panthers lose last year's QB, but return Keelan Cole, a D2Football. com Preseason All-American.

Game Breakdown: After a thrilling overtime loss in 2013, UNA will travel to Jacksonville looking to extract some revenge on former GSC rival

The UNA/JSU rivalry dates back to 1949 and the squads were both charter members of the GSC in 1971, playing every season until the Gamecocks reclassified to Division I after the 1992 season. North Alabama will have a strong test to start a season that holds high expectations for the Lions. UNA is currently No. 15 in the AFCA Division II Coaches' Poll and No. 8 in the D2Football.com poll. WR Dre Hall returns for the Lions after catching 10 TDs in 2015. Hall was a unanimous selection to the GSC Preseason All-Conference Team.

UNA will have to focus on shutting down JSU's dynamic quarterback, Eli Jenkins. Jenkins ran for more than 1,000 yards last year, while throwing for nearly 3,000 yards.

Game Breakdown: Shorter travels to Chattanooga to face the Mocs to start the 2016 season. UTC qualified for the DI FCS Playoffs last season, eventually falling to Jacksonville State.

Shorter's **B.J. McCoy** was spectacular in 2015, rushing for nearly 1,500 yards and getting in the endzone 10 times. McCoy is the leading returning rusher in the Gulf South Conference and was named to the conference's preseason all-conference teams.

Tennessee-Chattanooga also returns a dangerous weapon in the backfield, as Derrick Craine ran for 1,251 yards last season.
