WEEK THREE RECAP

Three weeks of the 2016 Gulf South Conference football season have come and gone, with last week being the first full week of conferences matchups.

Delta State had its second straight meeting with a national power, traveling to Carrollton to take on West Georgia. The two teams traded leads throughout the game, but UWG was able to pull away at the end and earn the 34-24 victory. Trailing 18-13 in the third quarter, West Georgia scored three straight touchdowns on three **Will Gardner** passes to ensure a 1-0 start to GSC play.

Florida Tech continued its torrid start to conference play, earning a second straight shutout with a 40-0 win at Shorter. In two conference games for the Panthers, they have outscored opponents 81-0.

After a pair of hard luck losses, West Alabama got in the win column with a convincing win on the road at Mississippi College. The conference's leading rusher, **Lakendric Thomas**, ran for 147 yards and a touchdown in the win for the Tigers.

In a matchup of perennial powers, storied rivals, and Top 25 teams, North Alabama was able to get the win at home over Valdosta State. The Lions were able to force four turnovers and get timely stops to get the victory, despite the Blazers racking up more yards.

West Florida suffered its first loss of the season on the road against Chowan. The Argonauts continued to be an offensive juggernaut, gaining 459 yards in the game, but it was not enough to defeat the Hawks.

WEEK FOUR PREVIEW

Delta State will look to rebound after two straight losses by hosting Shorter, a team that has yet to win a game this year.

Mississippi College will venture outside of the conference and host Cumberland (TN) from NAIA. MC has had two tough conference losses, but is undefeated in non-conference play this season.

The Argonauts have their first conference game in program history and will be traveling to Valdosta to face the Blazers. Both teams are coming off of losses last week.

Florida Tech and West Georgia both will be on the road and out of the conference this week. FIT will travel up to South Carolina to face Division I-FCS opponent Presbyeterian, while UWG will stay in Georgia and face the Albany State Golden Rams out of the SIAC.

The GSC Game of the Week this week will be in Livingston, as both North Alabama and West Alabama will be looking to go 2-0 in conference games. That game can be streamed live on WatchESPN and the ESPN app.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

West Florida WR Anas Hasic

Hasic caught nine passes for 190 yards and three touchdowns in the road loss for the Argonauts. The three touchdowns are tied for the second most in a Division II game this season. Through three weeks of GSC action, the 190 yards and three touchdowns are both top marks in the league. Overall, Hasic is second in the conference in receiving yards per game, averaging 113.0 yards per game.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

West Georiga DE Dylan Donahue

Donahue was all over the field in the West Georgia win. He had nine tackles in the game, three of which were behind the line of scrimmage. His three tackles for loss totaled 18 yards. He added a pair of sacks and a quarterback rush. Donahue also displayed versatility, dropping into coverage and breaking up a pass. Donahue averages one sack per game, which is tied for the most in the GSC.



SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

West Georgia CB Marcus Sayles

Sayles recorded the 12th and 13th blocked kicks of his career in the UWG win over Delta State. He blocked a PAT on DSU's first score and later blocked a punt that led to a return for a touchdown. That touchdown gave West Georgia the lead.



FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK West Alabama LB Jordan Jones

In the win at Misssissippi College, Jones recorded seven tackles to lead the Tigers. Of those seven stops, five were solo tackles. He also made two tackles for loss. Jones' impact was not limited to the defensive side of the ball, as he also blocked a punt in the 38-13 conference victory. Jones averages 7.3 tackles per game, tied for eighth most in the league.



Florida Tech has an impressive start to the fourth season in program history, but will face a big road challenge when the Panthers venture outside of the Gulf South play and travel to Division I-FCS Presbyterian. FIT is undefeated in conference play this year, racking up two wins with back-to-back shutouts over GSC foes. The Panthers boast the top offense in the league, averaging 41 points and 550.7 yards per game. The rushing attack for the Panthers averages more than 275 yards per game and features and trio of standout runners. **Antwuan Hayes**, **Trevor Sand**, and **Gary Holmes** all rank in the Top 10 of the league in rushing yards per game.

2016 FLORIDA'S SPACE COAST GSC-TV ON ESPN

The Gulf South Conference has officially announced the schedule for the 12th edition of its Florida's Space Coast GSC Football Game of the Week featured live on ESPN 3.

ESPN3 serves as the exclusive carrier of the league's package for the third consecutive season. This year's 10-game slate includes nine Saturday games and one Thursday night contest and kicks off on September 17 when Shorter University hosts Florida Tech in Rome, Ga.

"The Gulf South Conference's Game of the Week package has been a leader in Division II since its inception. Continuing our relationship with ESPN provides unparalleled exposure and distribution for the GSC," said Commissioner Matt Wilson.
