


HISTORY OF THE GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

Academic excellence and a leadership role in NCAA's Division II make the Gulf South Conference (GSC) something special. Entering its 47th year, the GSC is a charter Division II member that prides itself as one of the first conferences to be created and administered by its CEOs.

We take pride in our 50 National Team Championships in 13 sports, one Individual Champion and more than 150 regional titles, especially because there is no sacrifice on the academic side, where GSC student-athletes graduate at a much higher rate than the general student body. The Conference started the 2015-16 season by earning its first-ever Individual Men's Cross Country Title when Shorter's Alfred Chelanga bested the field at the DII Championship. The GSC capped the year by securing its 50th national title when North Alabama claimed its first-ever NCAA Softball Crown.

The GSC sponsors 17 sports, including 16 championship events. Official sponsored sports include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's track & field and volleyball. For the second year in a row, the Conference classified women's lacrosse as an "emerging sport" needing just one more competing institution to qualify as an official sport.

In the summer of 1970, six college presidents met to discuss athletics and when the meeting ended, a new league emerged—the Mid-South Conference. Delta State, Florence State (now North Alabama), Jacksonville State, Livingston (now West Alabama), Tennessee-Martin (UTM) and Troy State (TSU) were the charter members, but scheduling problems for the 1970-71 academic year limited the Conference to only football. Southeast Louisiana (SELA) and Nicholls State (NSU) joined in 1971 and the league opened an office in Hammond, La., changed its name to the Gulf South Conference and began championships in nine men's sports. Mississippi College (MC) and Northwestern Louisiana (NWLA, now Northwestern State) joined in 1972 and two years later, NWLA left for Division I, followed by SELA and NSU in 1979.

The conference continued with seven teams until 1981, when the CEOs admitted Valdosta State and West Georgia (1983). In 1991, UTM and TSU went Division I, briefly dropping the GSC back to seven members, but an aggressive expansion resulted in 10 new members: Lincoln Memorial (1992-93); Alabama Huntsville, Henderson State, Central Arkansas and Mississippi University for Women (MUW, 1993-94); West Florida (1994-95); and Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech, Montevallo and Southern Arkansas (1995-96), Jacksonville State moved to Division I at the end of 1992-93, MC dropped to Division III at the end of 1995-96, and was replaced by Christian Brothers to keep the Conference at 16 schools. In July 2000, the GSC welcomed Harding University and Ouachita Baptist University, making it the largest NCAA-playing conference at any level with 18 schools. MUW dropped its athletics program at the end of the 2002-03 season, decreasing the membership to 17. Central Arkansas reclassified to Division I and Lincoln Memorial moved to the South Atlantic Conference following the 2006-07 year. Montevallo's departure for the Peach Belt Conference dropped the number to 14 in 2009-10.

The GSC moved away from divisional play after the 2010-11 season after its six Arkansas members broke away, dropping the membership to eight. The league implemented a five-year expansion plan in 2012 resulting in the addition of new members: Shorter University (2014-15), Union University (2014-15), Lee University (2015-16), the return of both Mississippi College (2016-17) and Montevallo (2017-18) and Auburn University at Montgomery (2019-20). The Conference also adopted affiliate memberships to boost its ranks, resulting in sport-specific members, Florida Tech (football), Young Harris College (women's lacrosse), Spring Hill College (men's and women's soccer and women's golf: 2017-18) and North Greenville (football: 2018).

Former Commissioner Jim McCullough moved the GSC office to its current location in Birmingham, Ala. in 1979. Current Commissioner Matt Wilson is in his third year at the helm. He is assisted by Assistant Commissioner for Championships and Video Michael Anderson, Assistant Commissioner for Compliance and Special Events Andrea Andreson, Assistant Commissioner for Sports Information Nick Moeller and Director of Engagement Michael Stagno. The Chair of the GSC Board of Directors is Dr. William LaForge (Delta State). Joining him on the Executive Committee are Vice-Chair Dr. Don Dowless (Shorter) and Past-Chair Dr. John Smarrelli (Christian Brothers). The Supervisors of Officials are Tom Ritter (Football), John Caldwell (Basketball), Mike McCray (Baseball), Eric Ackerman (Soccer) and Craig Stone (Softball).





ABOUT NCAA DIVISION II

Division II is a collection of more than 300 NCAA colleges and universities that provide thousands of student-athletes the opportunity to compete at a high level of scholarship athletics while excelling in the classroom and fully engaging in the broader campus experience. This balance, in which student-athletes are recognized for their academic success, athletics contributions and campus/community involvement, is at the heart of the Division II philosophy.



All three NCAA divisions emphasize athletics

and academic excellence for their student-athletes; after all, the NCAA's overall mission is to make athletics an integral part of the educational experience at all member schools. The differences among the divisions emerge primarily in how schools choose to fund their athletics programs and in the national attention they command.

What makes Division II unique:

- *Division II schools are located in 44 states, including Alaska and Hawaii, and the District of Columbia. The division also expands its membership into Canada with the NCAA's only international member institution, Simon Fraser University, and features three schools located in Puerto Rico.
- *Enrollments at Division II schools range from more than 25,000 to less than 2,500, though about 87 percent of the division's member schools have fewer than 8,000 students.
- *Division II offers a "partial-scholarship" model for financial aid in which most student-athletes' college experiences are funded through a mix of athletics scholarships, academic aid, need-based grants and/or employment earnings.
- *Division II features a high championship-participant ratio (one championship opportunity for every seven student-athletes the highest among all three NCAA divisions), an emphasis on regional competition in order to reduce missed class time, and a robust community engagement philosophy that integrates student-athletes within both their campus and regional communities.
- *Division II is the only NCAA division that conducts National Championships Festivals, an Olympic-style event in which a number of national championships are held at a single site over several days.
- *Division II student-athletes get their share of television exposure. Since 2006, the NCAA has produced regular-season Division II television broadcasts in football and men's and women's basketball. CBS Sports Network has aired more than 60 games featuring more than 100 Division II institutions in a regular-season national television broadcast. In addition, almost all Division II championship finals are either broadcast live or live-streamed online.
- *Student-athletes generally comprise a high percentage of the student body at Division II schools, which insists that athletics is an important component of the learning experience at these institutions.
- *The Division II Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) initiated a fundraising campaign with the Make-A-Wish Foundation in 2003 and has raised more than \$4 million since then for the national nonprofit, helping to fund more than 500 wishes for children with life-threatening medical conditions.






