THE BIG LEAD

Kansas will open the 2014 season on Saturday, Sept. 6, when it plays host to Southeast Missouri State at Memorial Stadium at 6 p.m. The game will be televised live on the Jayhawk Television Network. Tickets are available by calling 800-34-HAWKS or by visiting the Kansas ticket office at KUAthletics.com.

KANSAS-SEMO CONNECTIONS

The state of Missouri boasts the third-most players on KU's roster with 11 total members hailing from the 'Show Me State.' Southeast Missouri has its fair share of Kansas ties as head coach Tom Matukewicz is originally from Silver Lake, Kan. Matukewicz attended college in the state of Kansas as well graduating from Fort Hays State University in 1997. Three assistant coaches on the SEMO staff also went college in Kansas. DC Bryce Saia (Fort Hays State), Ricky Coon, DL (Bethel College), Matt Martin, RB and ST (Emporia State). SEMO LB Brad Ivey attended Bishop Miege high school as did KU QB Montell Cozart and WRs Justin McCay and Tre' Parmalee. East St. Louis high school is the alma mater of SEMO guard Luther Wright and KU LB Kyron Watson and WR Tony Pierson.

SCOUTING THE SEMO OFFENSE

The Redhawks used a potent rushing attack to gash Missouri Baptist for 304 yards on the ground in the highest scoring output in SEMO's history with a 77-0 victory where the offense totaled 516 yards. Junior running back DeMichael Jackson, who led Southeast Missouri in rushing a year ago with 977 yards from scrimmage, led the way in total offense with eight carries for 82 yards and one score, as well as one reception for 66 yards, for a game-high 148 all-purpose yards. SEMO had two different quarterbacks combine to complete 12 of 14 passes for 212 yards and two touchdowns. Senior QB Kyle Snyder did a majority of the damage in the Redhawks' aerial assault accounting for 10 completions on 12 tries, tossing the two lone touchdowns through the air in the game. A former high school all-state selection in Ohio, Snyder accounted for 8,233 yards of total offense. Against Missouri Baptist, Snyder once again showcased his ability to be a dual threat quarterback carrying six times for 33 yards and a career-high two touchdowns on the ground.

SCOUTING THE SEMO DEFENSE

Southeast Missouri set several defensive records after notching its first shutout over a non-conference opponent in the program's Division I era against Missouri Baptist. The Redhawks' last overall shutout was in 1997, while the Missouri Baptist game marked the third shutout Southeast Missouri has recorded since joining the Football Championship Subdivision. SEMO stuffed Missouri Baptist in the backfield 11 times for a loss of 59 yards helping to set a new team record holding the Spartans to 81 yards of total offense (42 rushing and 39 passing). The 81 yards SEMO allowed erased the previous low of 137 yards set in 1993. Linebacker Roper Garrett led the field with 10 total tackles. Garrett had one sack and 2.5 tackles for a loss of 10 yards, while also forcing two fumbles.

CREDENTIALS

All credential requests can be made on-line at www.KUathletics.com/media. Credentials requested after Monday of the game week will not be mailed. Instead, they will be available for pickup at a location agreeable to both parties. The Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium Media Will Call distribution location is at the base of the elevator, below the pressbox, on the West side of the stadium. Working space in Kansas' Memorial Stadium press box will be allotted on the following basis: (1) Daily newspapers covering for Sunday publication and television stations covering for weekend news programs; (2) Sports editors of Kansas daily newspapers; (3) Radio personnel for an originating broadcast; (4) Official school daily newspapers (5) Television sports directors and approved special coverage; (6) Press and TV working photographers, weekly press representatives, non-broadcasting radio representatives and internet sites whose primary purpose is to gather news and disseminate it.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Credentials for sideline photographers will be issued on the basis of circulation, with priority granted to agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis. All photographers must pick up a photo sticker in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be done at the gate at the southwest corner of Memorial Stadium.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the Mississippi Street Parking Garage just south of the Kansas Union on the southeast side of Memorial Stadium. The garage is approximately two blocks away from the stadium.

PRESSBOX AND GAMEDAY SERVICES

The Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium pressbox is located on the West side of the stadium. Entrance is at the base of the elevator located just off of Maine Street. Level eight is reserved for the print media, home and visiting radio, home and visiting booths for coaches and athletics directors, along with game and scoreboard operations. Level nine serves as the photo deck and the location for television booths. Packets with pregame information will be distributed in advance of kickoff on the day of the game. Play-by-play, quarter, halftime, final statistics, coaches and player quote sheets, are all regular services on game day. Television monitors are part of the fixtures in both home and visiting radio booths and in the main pressbox area.

NOTEWORTHY

SOUTHEAST MISSOURI STATE HEAD COACH TOM MATUKEWICZ

First-year Southeast Missouri State head coach Tom "Tuke" Matukewicz is used to transforming programs into winners and he did just that as an assistant at Northern Illinois (2008-2011) and Southern Illinois (2001-07). While at NIU, Matukewicz helped lead the Huskies to the Mid-American Conference West title in 2010 and an outright MAC Championship in 2011. Before that, Matukewicz spent seven seasons at SIU. As linebackers coach and run-game coordinator, he had a big hand in three Missouri Valley Football Conference championships (2003, 2004, 2005) and five NCAA Football Championship Subdivision playoff berths (2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007). Matukewicz made one more stop at the University of Toledo prior to accepting his first head coaching job at Southeast. At Toledo, Matukewicz was defensive coordinator and linebackers coach for the 2012 and 2013 seasons. In 2012, Matukewicz helped guide a defense that ranked among the top 25 in the nation in fourth-down conversion (9th), red-zone defense (10th), interceptions (18th) and turnovers forced (25th). The Rockets went 9-4 and earned a trip to the 2012 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. A native of Silver Lake, Kan., Matukewicz completed his undergraduate work at Fort Hays State. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1997 and then earned his master's degree in administration at Pittsburg State. Matukewicz coached at Fort Hays State (1996-97), Pittsburg State (1997-99), Coffeyville Community College (1999-2000) and Emporia State (2000-01) prior to his NCAA Division I football tenure.

SCOUTING THE KU OFFENSE

Kansas returns plenty of pieces of its offense heading into the 2014 campaign, with no shortage of targets for sophomore Montell Cozart—who was named starting quarterback after a successful spring. With 13 returning lettermen, the Jayhawks have a good amount of experience on the offensive side of the ball. Head coach Charlie Weis has handed over the play calling duties to first-year offensive coordinator and offensive line coach John Reagan. This will mark Reagan's second stint at KU, as he previously spent five years as an assistant coach (2005-09) in Lawrence, helping lead the Jayhawks to their best season in school history in 2007.

Cozart takes over the reins at quarterback after earning three starts as a true freshman in 2013 and a decisive spring performance. He is a multidimensional quarterback, as he proved in 2013 finishing as KU's third-leading rusher. A true dual threat, Cozart will look to use both his arm and his legs to lead the Jayhawks on offense in 2014.

The offensive line protecting Cozart in 2014 consists of four returning lettermen, including All-Big 12 honorable mention honoree Ngalu Fusimalohi at guard, as well as several highly-touted newcomers. Junior college transfer Keyon Haughton, who manned the center position in the spring, is right at home anchoring an offensive line as he played his previous two seasons at Georgia Military College where the Bulldogs' domination on the line resulted in the top rushing offense in the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA).

With the departure of KU's third all-time leading rusher, James Sims, who graduated, and season-ending injuries to Kansas' top two lettermen at the running back position (Braondon Bourbon and Taylor Cox), the Jayhawks will be looking to junior college standout De'Andre Mann and true freshman Corey Avery to carry the load. The talented duo has performed at a high level in fall camp, while freshman Joe Dineen moved to running back from safety following the injuries and will provide depth at the position.

Kansas welcomes assistant coach Eric Kiesau to the program as its wide receivers coach. Kiesau, a veteran coach with more than 14 years of experience mentoring wide receivers, will have the talented Nick Harwell at his disposal. After sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, Harwell brings a wealth of skills and experience to a receiving unit that also includes explosive senior Tony Pierson. Pierson recorded KU's longest touchdown of 2013 with a 77-yard score at Rice. Junior receiver Rodriguez Coleman looks to build on a productive 2013 campaign in which he led KU with 26.0 yards per catch. Also joining the Jayhawks at wide receiver will be Maryland transfer Nigel King, who joined the team for the start of fall camp after graduating from UM in July. King led the Terrapins with four receiving touchdowns in 2013.

Senior Jimmy Mundine returns as arguably the top tight end in the Big 12. Mundine led Kansas with five receiving TDs in 2013 and was second on the team in receiving yards. Fellow senior Trent Smiley also returns at tight end, while KU adds depth to the position along with redshirt freshman Ben Johnson.

SCOUTING THE KU DEFENSE

The Kansas defense enters the 2014 season returning nine of 11 starters from a much-improved 2013 squad. For the second-straight season, the Jayhawks will play in a 3-4 defense using a BUCK linebacker and a nickelback as their base formation, under defensive coordinator and linebackers coach Clint Bowen. Kansas will be led on defense by its heart, linebacker Ben Heeney, and soul, four returning starters in the secondary.

Up front, Kansas returns 2013 starters Keon Stowers and Ben Goodman. Stowers is one of the top returning interior defensive linemen in the Big 12, while Goodman moves to the strong end position after starting all 12 game last season at BUCK. Also returning to the KU defensive line is senior BUCK Michael Reynolds, who led KU in sacks last season with 6.5. Senior Tedarian Johnson returns on the defensive line for fifth year assistant coach Buddy Wyatt, while fellow senior Victor Simmons has moved to the BUCK position after starting xx games at nickelback in 2013.

Heeney, a two-time All-Big 12 performer, returns to the KU linebacking crew for his senior season. The Hutchinson, Kansas native has amassed 200 tackles over the last two seasons, making him one of four players in the NCAA to enter the 2014 season with more than 200 tackles and 25.0 tackles-for-loss in their career. Junior Jake Love returns at the other linebacker position after starting eight games as a sophomore. Also back this fall is junior Schyler Miles, who had a strong spring performance.

Kansas returns arguably the top secondary in the Big 12 Conference as all four starters from last season are back, led by 2013 Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year, Isaiah Johnson. Johnson, a junior strong safety, led KU and tied for second in the

Big 12 last season with five interceptions. Senior Cassius Sendish plays alongside Johnson at free safety. Sendish finished the 2013 season ranked third on the team with 68 stops. Kansas' ballhawking duo of cornerbacks, seniors Dexter McDonald and JaCorey Shepherd, return as do their 27 passes defended from last season. McDonald tallied 10 breakups and two interceptions, while Shepherd contributed 13 breakups and two interceptions to go along with 45 tackles. Shepherd's 15 passes defended ranked second in the Big 12 and 17th nationally in 2013. Also joining the Crimson and Blue mix this fall will be sophomore cornerback/nickelback Greg Allen, who was one of the top performers at nickelback for the Jayhawks during the spring, along with sophomore safeties Tevin Shaw and Fish Smithson and cornerbacks junior Ronnie Davis and freshman Matthew Boateng.

SCOUTING THE KU SPECIAL TEAMS

Kansas' 2014 special teams will look for continued progress after making strides in several areas last season. In 2013, Kansas made vast improvements in its punting, kickoffs, both punt returns and kickoff returns, with some growth visible in the place kicking.

Kansas will be led by senior Trevor Pardula, who mans both the kickoff and punting duties for the Jayhawks. Pardula exploded onto the scene in his first year at Kansas the way the ball explodes off of the 6-5, 212-pounder's foot, garnering All-Big 12 honors by the league's coaches and etching his name onto several KU punting records. As well as being awarded All-Big 12 honors in 2013, Pardula was also considered for the conference's Special Teams Player of the Year award ending up with an honorable mention bid as voted by the league coaches. Pardula not only handled punting duties for Kansas last fall, but was relied on to pin the ball deep on kickoffs, as well registering averaging 60.2 yards-per-kick and 21 touchbacks on 42 attempts.

Sophomore Matthew Wyman returns at place kicker after connecting on 5-of-10 field goals in 2013. Wyman's career-long make of 52 yards proved to be the game-winner over Louisiana Tech. Freshman John Duvic joins the mix at place kicker and is currently listed as the starter after a strong fall camp performance. Sophomore John Wirtel is back as KU's long snapper and will man both the place kicking and punting snaps.

A wealth of players will get a shot in the return game. Senior JaCorey Shepherd was the top Jayhawk return man in kickoff returns last season, collecting 547 yards on 24 returns, with a 69-yard return to his credit. Also in the mix for kickoff returns will be senior Nick Harwell and freshman Bobby Hartzog, Jr.. KU lost its primary punt returner from 2013, Connor Embree, but a bevy of quality candidates are available in junior Isaiah Johnson and freshmen Derrick Neal and Hartzog.

THIS DAY IN KANSAS FOOTBALL HISTORY

The Jayhawks own a 3-0 overall mark in games played on Sept. 6. KU first played on Sept. 6 in 1997, taking a 17-10 win over TCU in Lawrence. Kansas also defeated UNLV, 46-24, on Sept. 6, 2003 and claimed a 29-0 win over Louisiana Tech on Sept. 3, 2008. KU has played all three of its previous games on Sept. 6 in Lawrence.

KU IN SEASON OPENERS

Kansas is 70-47-7 (.593 winning percentage) in season openers. The Jayhawks are also 89-31-4 (.734 winning percentage) in home openers. Kansas is opening its season at home for the 12th-straight year (9-2 in last 11 home openers). The Jayhawks have won nine of their last 10 season openers dating back to the 2004 campaign.

KU VS. NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

KU has won 27 of its last 30 non-conference home games dating back to the start of the 2003 season. KU is 27-8 in its last 35 games against non-Big 12 opponents, including bowl victories against Houston (2005), Virginia Tech (2007 season) and Minnesota (2008).

KU VS. OVC FOES

Kansas has faced just two current Ohio Valley Conference opponents in its 124-year history, owning wins over Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State. KU defeated EIU, 44-20, while it knocked off JSU, 41-6, on Sept. 20, 2003. Both victories came in games played in Lawrence.

IN RARE COMPANY

A season ago Kansas had the fourth-best defense in the nation when it came to opponents converting fourth downs against the Jayhawks, holding teams to a fourth-down conversion percentage of .286, the fourth-best percentage in the country. Opposing teams rarely moved the chains as the Jayhawks stuffed offenses on fourth downs, only allowing a first down twice on the year. KU finished the season one spot behind third-ranked perennial power Alabama and above the likes of the notoriously stingy defenses of Michigan State and LSU in that category.

HEENEY A PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 SELECTION

Kansas senior linebacker Ben Heeneey was named to the 2014 Preseason All-Big 12 Football team as selected by members of the media. Heeneey, who was an All-Big 12 Second Team selection in 2013, is heading into 2014 as the conference's leading returning tackler. Last year the Hutchinson, Kansas native recorded a team-high 88 tackles and finished fourth in the conference with 8.7 tackles-per-game. Heeneey also recorded double-digit tackles in six of his 10 games played a season ago and is one of six active linebackers with 200 tackles and 20 tackles for loss in the last two seasons.

THE WAIT IS OFFICIALLY OVER

The season opening game against Southeast Missouri State can't come fast enough for senior wide receiver Nick Harwell. Harwell, who played his first three seasons at Miami (Ohio), was forced to sit out last season after transferring to Kansas after the 2012 season. The last time Harwell played in an actual game was Nov. 23, 2012. When Sept. 6 rolls around it will have been 653 days since Harwell officially played in a game. Harwell has been forced to wait 93 weeks... 15,672 hours... 940,230 minutes... and 56,419,200 seconds to get back on the field.

PUNTING PARDULA

In 2013, Kansas senior punter Trevor Pardula punted 84 times for 3,668 yards, both of which set KU single-season records. Perhaps a more impressive feat is that Pardula became only the eighth Jayhawk punter since 1937, and the first since 1999, to average 43 or more yards-per-punt. He ended the 2013 season averaging the sixth-best yards-per-attempt in Kansas history with 43.7 yards-per-punt, good for third in the conference and 18th in the nation. Pardula consistently backed-up opposing offenses deep in their own territory after pinning 25 punts inside the 20-yard line and booting 25 balls 50 yards or more.

NUMBERS NEVER LIE

The 10 members of the Kansas coaching staff have combined for 121 years of collegiate coaching experience. In those 121 years, the 10 coaches have also had a large hand in helping 146 players attain their dream of playing in the National Football League.

WIDE RECEIVERS RANKS

Bolstered by a pair of transfers, the Kansas wide receiver corps ranks among the nations best in terms of production returning to the lineup in 2014. The Jayhawk pass catchers rank fourth in the NCAA and tops in the Big 12 in career yards returning. KU ranks seventh in the NCAA and again tops the Big 12 schools in career receptions returning, while tying for sixth and leading the Big 12 in career receiving TDs returning. 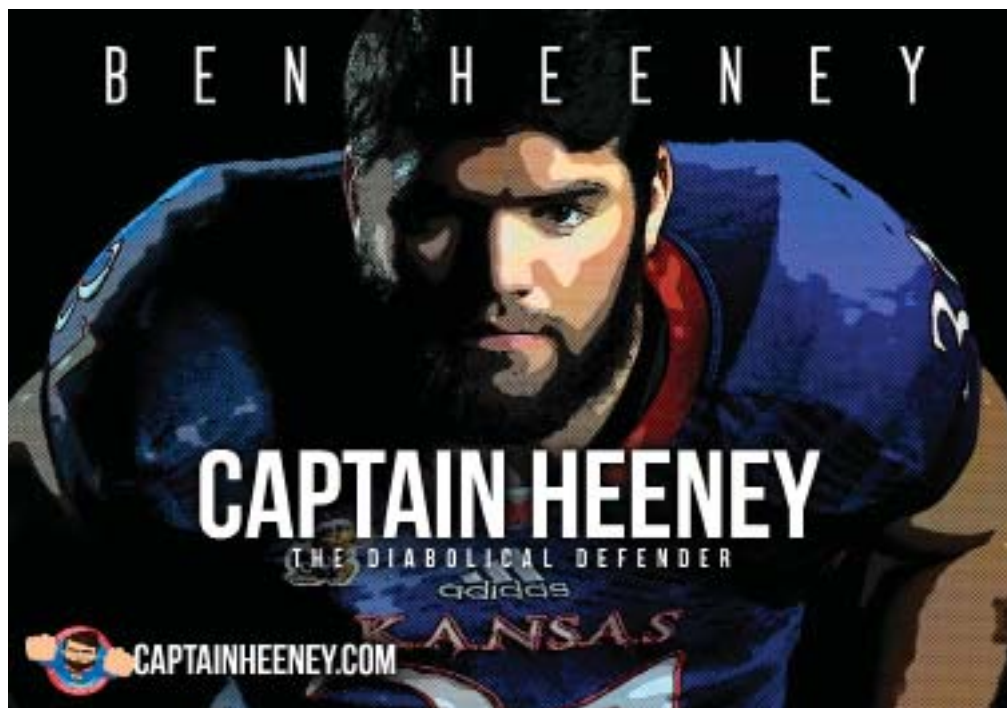

KU O-LINE LOOKING TO OVERCOME LACK OF STARTS

Kansas enters the 2014 campaign looking to replace three starters on the offensive line. The KU offensive line is one of the least experienced groups in the nation. The Jayhawks only have a combined 31 starts along the offensive line which is tied for 10th -fewest in the country. Along with returning starters at guard in seniors Ngalu Fusimalohi (12 career starts) and Mike Smithburg (8 career starts), KU lists senior Pat Lewandowski (6 career starts) and juniors Damon Martin (5 career starts) and Keyon Haughton (newcomer) as starters on the offensive line.

BEST OF THE BIG 12

Kansas returns seven players who were honored as members of the all-conference team a season ago. The Jayhawk defense will be led by First Team All-Big 12 senior linebacker Ben Heeney, along with the conference's Defensive Newcomer of the Year, Isaiah Johnson. Senior corners Dexter McDonald and JaCorey Shepherd both nabbed honorable mention honors in 2013. Offensively, senior offensive lineman Ngalu Fusimalohi was named honorable mention by league coaches after helping Kansas rush for 154.1 yards-per-game. Senior tight end Jimmay Mundine was another honorable mention honoree after leading Kansas in touchdown receptions a season ago. Rounding out the conference honorees was honorable mention senior punter Trevor Pardula whose 43.7 yards-per-punt ranked third in the Big 12 and 18th in the country.



WATCH US

The preseason watch lists kept a keen eye on several Jayhawk players during the offseason. In all, Kansas has six players nominated for an array of different national awards. STUDENTS FIRST, ATHLETES SECOND

In 2013, 20 Jayhawks were honored for their hard work and outstanding academic achievement by the Big 12 Conference. Out of the 20 total players honored, 14 were named to the Academic All-Big 12 First Team by attaining a GPA of 3.20 or higher. KU's 14 first-team selections gave the Jayhawks three more players on the conference's first team than any other school in the Big 12.

#ONETEAM

Out of the 50 states in America, the Jayhawks have the fifth most diverse roster in the country after nearly capturing a player from half of the states. In total, KU has players from 23 different states and one foreign country.

TEAM CAPTAINS

A trio of seniors in wide receiver Nick Harwell, linebacker Ben Heeney and safety Cassius Sendish were selected by their peers as the 2014 team captains, while three other players were appointed as members of the team leadership council. Kansas conducted a players vote during fall camp and head coach Charlie Weis announced the results at his weekly press conference on August 20. Members of the leadership council include seniors offensive lineman Pat Lewandowski and defensive linemen Keon Stowers and sophomore quarterback Montell Cozart.

REWARDED FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS

Kansas head coach Charlie Weis awarded three scholarships to walk-on players in the summer and fall based on their continued contributions to the program. Weis granted redshirt freshman center Joe Gibson a scholarship in June and announced that junior defensive linemen T.J. Semke would receive a scholarship on fall camp reporting day, Aug. 7. Gibson, a Prairie Village, Kansas, native is currently listed as second on the KU depth chart at center, Semke, who hails from Lee's Summit, Missouri, is named a co-starter at defensive tackle.

PATIENTLY WAITING

The Kansas Jayhawks will again feature one of the most talented scout team offenses in the country with quarterback transfer T.J. Millweard (UCLA) and wide receiver transfer Nick Harwell (Miami (Ohio)) sitting out due to NCAA transfer residency requirements. KU starters Jake Heaps and Justin McCay built reprieve and tortured the first team defense while running the scout team last season. Millweard was slated to be the back-up in Westwood after redshirting as a freshman in 2012. The former top-100 Texas recruit from Colleyville, Texas, will be a redshirt sophomore in 2014 and have three seasons of eligibility remaining. Harwell, a 2011 Biletnikoff Award Watch List member and All-MAC First Team selection, brings an impressive resume to Kansas with 229 career receptions, 3,166 yards and 23 receiving touchdowns over three seasons with the Redhawks. The Missouri City, Texas native will have one year of eligibility remaining for next season.

UP NEXT

Following Saturday's season-opener against SEMO, the Jayhawks will hit the road to take on Duke in Durham, North Carolina. Kansas is 1-0 all-time versus the Blue Devils, with a 44-16 win over Duke in Lawrence in 2009 to its credit. The Kansas-Duke game will be broadcast by the ACC's Regional Sports Network. The ACC Regional Sports Networks (RSN) include Fox Sports South, Fox Sports Carolinas, Fox Sports Florida or Sun Sports, Comcast Sports Net Mid-Atlantic, New England Sports Network (NESN), the YES Network or MSG Network in New York and Root Sports in Pennsylvania. In addition, the game will be shown locally on FOX Sports Midwest Plus.

HEAD COACH



Charlie Weis arrived at the University of Kansas on December 9, 2011, armed with an impressive legacy of success at the highest level of collegiate and professional football. He has his sights set on engineering the effort to turn the KU program into a consistent winner.

The 35-year coaching veteran coached 16 years in the NFL and assisted two of the greatest coaches in NFL history - Bill Parcells and Bill Belichick. Weis owns four Super Bowl rings and has played an integral role for teams that have appeared in six AFC Championship Games. As a head coach, the 2005 National College Coach of the Year led Notre Dame to back-to-back BCS Bowl Games in 2005 (Fiesta) and 2006 (Sugar).

Weis spent the 2011 season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at the University of Florida. In 2010 he was the Kansas City Chiefs' offensive coordinator, helping guide the team to the AFC West title, its first 10-win season since 2005 and its first playoff berth in four years.

Weis previously served as offensive coordinator for the NFL's New England Patriots (2000-04) and N.Y. Jets (1998-99). He was instrumental in the development of Patriots quarterback Tom Brady, who entered the league as a sixth-round pick in 2000 and has since become a two-time Super Bowl MVP and five-time Pro Bowl selection.

Weis demonstrated his ability to tutor quarterbacks with the Fighting Irish as well. Brady Quinn (3,919 yards in 2005) and Jimmy Clausen (3,722 yards in 2009) put up the two most prolific passing seasons in Notre Dame history. Wide receiver Golden Tate also established eye-popping numbers under Weis, setting a Notre Dame record with 2,707 career receiving yards and taking home the 2009 Biletnikoff Award as the top receiver in the country. Tate also set single-season school records in 2009 with 93 receptions and 1,496 yards and a school record-tying 15 touchdown grabs.

During Weis' five-year stay with the Patriots - from 2000-04 - the club won three Super Bowls in a four-year span, only the second team in NFL history to accomplish that feat. New England was 53-27 (.663) during Weis' tenure and had a 9-0 playoff record.

Over Tom Brady's first four seasons as a starter in the NFL (2001-04), he ranked fourth in the NFL with 97 passing touchdowns and earned Super Bowl MVP honors in two of New England's three championship victories, while wide receiver Deion Branch earned the other. The Patriots produced two-straight 14-2 seasons - in 2003 and 2004 - each capped by Super Bowl victories. New England rushed for 2,134 yards in 2004, the team's highest total since 1985.

In Weis' first stint with the Patriots, he helped the club earn its second AFC Championship in team history, reaching the

Super Bowl following the 1996 season. Over the four years of his first tour with New England, Weis coached tight ends (1993-94), running backs (1995) and wide receivers (1996), helping players like Ben Coates, Curtis Martin and Terry Glenn emerge as playmakers.

The Trenton, N.J., native spent three seasons (1997-99) on staff with the New York Jets, working under head coach Bill Parcells. Weis came on staff as the wide receivers coach and was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1998. That season, the Jets advanced to the AFC Championship Game for the first time since 1982.

Weis first broke into the NFL as an assistant on Parcells' New York Giants staff, first as a defensive/special teams assistant in 1990, then moving to running backs coach in 1991 and 1992. In his first season with the team, the Giants won the Super Bowl. He then helped Rodney Hampton to a pair of 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

Weis spent time working in the Giants' pro personnel department in 1989 before joining the team on a full-time basis. While doing that, he served as head coach at Franklin Township (N.J.) High School and led the team to the state championship.

From 1985-88, Weis worked as an assistant at South Carolina. He began his coaching career at Boonton (N.J.) High School in 1979 before serving five seasons at Morristown (N.J.) High School (1980-84).

In 2003, Weis and his wife Maura created the Hannah and Friends Foundation, a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the quality of life for children and adults with special needs. The foundation funds Hannah's Helping Hands, which provides quality-of-life grants to families across the country who care for children and adults with special needs. The Weis family opened the Hannah and Friends Neighborhood, a 40-acre facility north of South Bend, Ind., that provides much-needed housing and care services for adults with special needs.

Weis is the author of a 2006 autobiography (written with Vic Carucci) titled "No Excuses: One Man's Incredible Rise Through the NFL to Head Coach of Notre Dame." His wife, Maura, is author of a 2008 book (written with Jessica Trobaugh Temple) titled "Miles from the Sideline"--a journey with the Weis' special needs daughter.

In the spring of 2008, Weis traveled to the Middle East as part of a contingent of college football coaches who were visiting military personnel stationed in the region.

Charlie and Maura Weis have two children, Charles Joseph and Hannah Margaret. Charlie, Jr., recently completed his sophomore year at KU, maintaining a perfect 4.0 GPA. Now entering his junior campaign at Kansas, he is also serving as a student manager-offensive assistant, working closely with assistant coaches Reggie Mitchell and Ron Powulus and the Jayhawk running backs and quarterbacks.

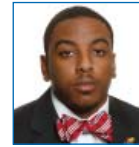
