## JAYHAWKS READY FOR DATE WITH ST. JOHN'S

Kansas women's basketball faces its second-straight opponent from the Big East Conference on Sunday, Dec. 6, when the Jayhawks host St. John's at 2 p.m., inside Allen Fieldhouse. The contest will air on the Jayhawk Television Network/ESPN3 and the Jayhawk Radio Network.



## AROUND THE GYM

Kansas fans are encouraged to participate in the Jayhawks' annual Toys for Tots games against St. John's. Fans that donate a new, unwrapped toy will receive FREE admission at the women's basketball on Sunday.

## KANSAS FAST BREAKS

- Kansas and St. John's are meeting for the second time on the hardwood Sunday afternoon. The Jayhawks defeated the Red Storm in the first meeting in 1993, 73-63, on the road.
- KU has a 35-19 record against programs from the Big East Conference. Kansas has faced eight schools that are members of the Big East, and has a lead or even series against seven of eight teams.
- When Brandon Schneider-coached teams are leading with less than five minutes to play, his overall record is 350-12, and 4-0 at Kansas.
- In the month of December, the Jayhawks own an overall mark of 186-81 (.696). During the 2019-10 season, Kansas went 7-0 in the final month of the calendar year.
- Kansas has a record of 409-166 (.715) in Allen Fieldhouse. Over the last five seasons, Kansas has posted a 64-29 mark on its home court.
- Sophomore guard Lauren Aldridge has made 30-of-64 (46.9 percent) of her shots on the year. Among Big 12 Conference players, she is fifth overall in field goal percentage with a minimum of 64 shot attempts. Among guards, Aldridge is the third-best in the league.
- Junior forward Caelynn Manning-Allen is 5-1 winning the opening tip this season, while Kansas is 4-1 when Manning-Allen claims possession on the opening tip.
- Sophomore guard Lauren Aldridge has recorded double-figure scoring performances in five of six games so far this season. Manning-Allen has posted double-digit scoring efforts on four occasions, including the first double-double (12 points, 11 rebounds) against Northern Illinois (11/27).
- The Jayhawks' roster features six local products that hail from Kansas or Missouri. Junior Sydney Benoit and freshmen Kylee Kopatich and Tyler Johnson are from the Sunflower State, while redshirt-junior Timeka O'Neal and sophomores Lauren Aldridge and Chayla Cheadle are from the Show Me State.

ABOUT THE JAYHAWKS

The Jayhawks (4-2) continue their six-game homestand with St. John's on Sunday, Dec. 6. KU is 3-0 inside Allen Fieldhouse this season and looks to extend that streak with the final five non-conference games before starting Big 12 Conference action on Dec. 30 at Oklahoma.

The Jayhawks turned the ball over only nine times against Creighton (12/2), the lowest since committing six mishaps against Wisconsin in 2011. Offensively, Kansas made 45 percent of its shots against the Bluejays, marking the second-highest percentage KU has converted from the field this season. Sophomore guard Lauren Aldridge and freshman guard Kylee Kopatich combined for just under half of Kansas' point total against Creighton, as the duo poured-in 33 of the Jayhawks' 67 points. Aldridge netted a career-best 18 points in the last game, while Kopatich scored a personal-best 15 points. Freshman guard Jayde Christopher dished out four assists against Creighton, her third game with three or more assisted buckets this year.

Offensively, Aldridge is leading the charge for the Jayhawks with 14.0 points per game. She is shooting 46.9 percent from the field, marking the third-best field goal percentage among Big 12 guards. Aldridge is connecting on 43.8 percent of shots from the three-point line, including a 5-for-7 mark against Northern Illinois (11/27). After starting every game of the 2015-16 campaign for Kansas, Kopatich is averaging 10.7 points per game behind 31.7 percent shooting from the field. Junior forward Caelynn Manning-Allen rounds out the double-digit scorers for KU with 10.3 points per contest. Manning-Allen leads the team with 7.3 rebounds and is fourth in the Big 12 with 2.2 blocks per game.

SERIES BREAKDOWN

**Record**  
The Jayhawks own a 1-0 lead in the all-time series against the Red Storm.

**Overview**  
Kansas and St. John's have met on the hardwood just once before Sunday's match up. The game, which was played in 1993 in New York, resulted in 73-63 KU victory. Sunday's game in Allen Fieldhouse is the first trip to Lawrence for the Red Storm.

**Last Time Out**  
In 1993, Angela Ayccock led all scorers with 25 points, while collecting eight rebounds. Lisa Tate netted 19 points and tallied a game-high nine rebounds. Kansas shot 41.5 percent from the field in the victory.

KU averages 65.5 points per game, while shooting 40.6 percent from the field and 33.6 percent from beyond the arc. Kansas averages 38.2 rebounds, 12.5 assists, 7.0 steals and 4.7 blocks per contest.

**SCOUTING THE RED STORM**  
St. John's lost its season-opener on the road at UCLA. Since losing the first game of the season to the Bruins, 76-58, the Red Storm have won five-straight games. After trailing by four in the closing minutes of the third quarter, St. John's (5-1) outscored Sacred Heart 23-6 over the game's final 11 minutes, as St. John's extended its winning streak to five games with a 67-54 victory over the Pioneers on Thursday night.

The Red Storm went 23-11 overall last year, including 11-7 in Big East play to finish fourth, and advanced to the third round of the postseason WNIT. Voted to finish the Big East in second place by the league coaches, St. John's is off to a 5-1 start so far in 2015-16.

St. John's senior guard Aliyyah Handford was selected as the 2015-16 Big East Preseason Player of the Year by a vote of the league's head coaches. Handford, a two-time unanimous selection to the All-Big East First Team and a two-time Honorable Mention All-American, led the league in scoring as a junior with a 19.3 points per game. Handford earned preseason recognition along with teammate Danaejah Grant. Grant was one of seven unanimous Preseason All-Big East Team selections. The senior guard combined with Handford as the highest scoring duo in the league. Currently, the duo of Grant and Handford is leading the way for the Red Storm's offense with 19.2 and 17.7 points per game, respectively.

The Red Storm average 69.0 points per game, while shooting 46.4 percent from the field and 25.8 percent from beyond the arc. St. John's averages 35.0 rebounds, 12.8 assists, 8.7 steals and 2.0 blocks per contest.

THE WEEK THAT WAS

After trailing by nine points at the end of the first quarter, Kansas women's basketball outscored Creighton by 24 points over the next two periods to record its first come-from-behind win, 67-54, on Wednesday night. Kansas saw career nights from sophomore guard Lauren Aldridge and freshman guard Kylee Kopatich, who posted career-high scoring marks with 18 and 15 points, respectively. Junior forward Caelynn Manning-Allen was one of three Jayhawks to score eight points, and brought down seven rebounds, which tied Kopatich for a game-high.

THIS DAY IN KU WOMEN'S BASKETBALL HISTORY

**Record on Dec. 6: 10-3**  
Kansas women's basketball will play on the sixth day of December for the 14th time in program history. The first meeting on Dec. 6 was in 1980 against Iowa State, while the last time the Jayhawks faced a team on Dec. 6 was in 2012 at Arkansas.

In 2009, the Jayhawks downed Northern Colorado, 81-54, inside Allen Fieldhouse. Danielle McCray scored 25 points, 15 of them coming during the first half, and Krysten Boogaard added 17 points as then-No. 24 Kansas over powered the Bears.

WOODARD RETURNS TO ALLEN FIELDHOUSE

In May, Kansas women's basketball legend Lynette Woodard was selected as the 2015 Naismith Outstanding Contributor to Women's Basketball Award delivered by UPS and the Atlanta Tipoff Club. Woodard will return to Allen Fieldhouse Dec. 5-6 to be recognized for her achievements by the Atlanta Tipoff Club and Kansas Athletics. A four-time Kodak All-American, Woodard will be honored during first timeout of the Kansas men's basketball game against Harvard on Saturday, Dec. 5. She will also be recognized during the first quarter break of the women's basketball game against St. John's on Sunday, Dec. 6.

TOUGH AND TOGETHER

First-year head coach Brandon Schneider has brought a "tough and together" culture to Allen Fieldhouse and Kansas women's basketball. The Jayhawks begin end every practice with t and t, which is short for tough and together. Schneider has vowed that his squads will compete and play together every day. Whether the Jayhawks are hitting the floor, flying over the scorers' table or passing to a teammate, they will play tough and together.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS

The Jayhawks are the only team in the Big 12 without a senior on their roster. In fact, Kansas will not face another team during the regular season that does not have at least one senior on its squad. The last time a Kansas roster did not include a senior was the 2002-03 season. The Jayhawks, along with West Virginia, boast the most underclassmen on their respective rosters with 10 each.

AROUND THE LEAGUE

After six games this season, Kansas is among the top six of Big 12 Conference teams in several statistical categories. The Jayhawks are sixth in blocked shots (4.7 per game), fifth in three-point field goals made (6.3) and fifth in rebounding defense (36.2). Redshirt junior Timeka O'Neal is tied for first in the Big 12 in three-point field goal percentage, shooting 50 percent this season, while sophomore guard Lauren Aldridge is eighth in the conference, making 43.8 percent of her attempts. Additionally, Aldridge is 13th in the Big 12 in scoring (14.0 points per game) and first in minutes played (34.5 minutes per game). Junior forward Caelynn Manning-Allen is 10th in the league in rebounding (7.3 boards per game) and fourth in blocked shots (2.2 blocks per game).

HOW THE JAYHAWKS STACK UP NATIONALLY

Collectively, Kansas is 68th in the country in blocked shots per game with 4.7. Individually, junior forward Caelynn Manning-Allen is 27th in the country in blocks per contest with 2.1. Sophomore guard Lauren Aldridge ranks No. 78 in three-point field goal percentage after connecting on 43.8 percent of her attempts.

ALDRIDGE A NOMINEE FOR 2016 ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Known for her tireless work ethic on the hardwood, Kansas sophomore guard Lauren Aldridge has the same attitude and mentality off the court, especially when giving back to the community. Aldridge is being recognized for all her contributions to the community as a nominee for the 2016 Allstate Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Good Works Team. In its fourth year, the Allstate WBCA Good Works Teams recognize players at all levels of college basketball who have made outstanding contributions in the areas of volunteerism and civic involvement. The final roster of 10 award recipients will be unveiled in February.

TOURNAMENT-TESTED

The Jayhawks will face 12 teams this season with postseason experience from the year prior. Familiar Big 12 foes Baylor, Texas, Iowa State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State all advanced to the 2015 NCAA Tournament. The No. 2 seed Baylor Bears experienced the most successful tournament run, reaching the Elite Eight. TCU, Kansas State, West Virginia, Texas Southern, St. John's and Washington State all were invited to the Women's National Invitational Tournament at the end of last season. West Virginia advanced the farthest, reaching the championship game where the Mountaineers fell to UCLA. Oral Roberts was selected to play in the Women's Basketball Invitational, advancing to the semifinal before losing a one-point game to eventual tournament champion, University of Louisiana Lafayette.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

This offseason, Schneider and his staff brought two highly-touted transfers to Lawrence in McKenzie Calvert and Jessica Washington. Calvert, a sophomore guard, played her freshman season at USC and averaged 10.2 points per game on 34.1 percent shooting. A five-star recruit out of high school, Calvert was ranked the No. 16 prospect in her class by ESPN's HoopGurlz. Washington will add to KU's backcourt presence after playing two seasons at North Carolina. When she suits up for the first time in 2016-17, Washington will be only the second McDonald's All-American to wear the Crimson and Blue. Last season, Washington tallied 7.3 points and 2.4 rebounds per game and shot over 36 percent from beyond the arc. Both Calvert and Washington will sit out during the 2015-16 season to comply with NCAA transfer rules.

JAYHAWKS EXCEL IN THE CLASSROOM

Caelynn Manning-Allen followed up her Academic All-Big 12 Rookie Team honors in 2014 by earning a spot on the Academic All-Big 12 First Team last season. Jada Brown was named to the Second Team, while Lauren Aldridge and Chayla Cheadle followed in Manning-Allen's footsteps, making the Academic All-Big 12 Rookie Team.

KANSAS IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Kansas is among one of the most televised women's basketball programs in the country. The Jayhawks have two games featured on FOX Sports Network, while every home game aired on the new Jayhawk Television Network/ESPN3. KU is scheduled to play 27 contests in 2015-16 on television, that's two more than a year ago.

INTERNATIONAL JAYHAWKS

Former Kansas women's basketball players Angel Goodrich, Aishah Sutherland, Monica Engelman and Asia Boyd are representing the Jayhawks overseas in various professional leagues. After playing the 2015 season with the Seattle Storm, where she made five starts and 23 total appearances, Goodrich is now the starting shooting guard for Gorzow, a professional team in Poland. Sutherland, who played for the Jayhawks from 2008-12, is playing in the same league as Goodrich, but for Sosnowiec. Slovak League team Piestanske Cajky is the new home for 2013 graduate Engelman. Boyd, fresh off her senior season with the Jayhawks, is now a small forward for Lulea Basket, a Swedish club that competes in the Sweden-Damligan professional league.

HAWK TALK WITH COACH BRANDON

"Hawk Talk" with Kansas women's basketball head coach Brandon Schneider is scheduled to begin after exhibition play, with the first show Nov. 12 at Henry T's. Each week Schneider will be joined by a player guest. "Hawk Talk" allows fans to ask Schneider questions and hear the latest Kansas women's basketball news. There will be a total of 15 "Hawk Talks" during the 2015-16 season. The show will air Thursdays from 6-7 p.m., with a few exceptions.

UP NEXT

Kansas continues its six-game homestand to close out the 2015-16 non-conference slate when the Jayhawks host UMKC on Thursday, Dec. 10 at 7 p.m., inside Allen Fieldhouse. The game will be broadcast on the Jayhawk Television Network/ESPN3 and the Jayhawk Radio Network.

Brandon Schneider became the sixth head coach to lead Kansas women's basketball when he was hired on April 20, 2015.

Schneider comes to Kansas after a five-year stint at Stephen F. Austin, where he returned SFA to the top of the Southland Conference. SFA won back-to-back league titles in 2013-14 and 2014-15 and the Ladyjacks made three postseason appearances during his time at the helm of the program. As head coach at Stephen F. Austin, Schneider was 95-66 overall in five years and 57-29 in Southland Conference (SLC) play.

During the 2014-15 season, Schneider guided the Ladyjacks to their second-straight Southland Conference title and a 23-8 overall record, marking the third time in his tenure that SFA reached the 20-win plateau. Schneider was named Southland Coach of the Year after the Ladyjacks finished with a 16-2 league mark. He mentored a handful of All-SLC Players during his time in Nacogdoches, including 2014-15 SLC Player of the Year Porsha Roberts, who was also a two-time Defensive Player of the Year.

After losing multiple starters throughout 2013-14 due to injuries, Schneider and his staff made adjustments to see the Ladyjacks finish the regular season with a 9-2 mark, including a victory in their final six matchups. SFA overcame a five-game deficit in the Southland standings to tie for the regular-season crown, SFA's first since 2010 and 16th overall.

The Ladyjacks finished the campaign with a 23-13 record and became the first team in school history to win three games in a postseason tournament. SFA defeated Texas State and Boise State at home during the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) and bested College of Charleston on the road to advance to the title game where SFA fell to Illinois-Chicago, 73-64.

Schneider saw his team's top player, Roberts, win Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Year accolades and become the all-time blocks leader in SFA history. Roberts averaged 17.0 points per game and shot an impressive 56.3 percent from the field. Her shooting percentage improved during league play where she hit 58.7 percent of her shots. Roberts was named first team All-Southland Conference and received all-tournament honors during the WBI.

During 2012-13, SFA concluded the season with a 14-17 overall mark and an 8-10 record in conference action. At the end of the regular season, Roberts once again claimed conference honors after being named to the All-Southland Conference Second Team and Defensive Team. The Ladyjacks won their opening game at the SLC Tournament before falling to Lamar, 69-65, ending the year.

In just his second season at SFA, Schneider guided the Ladyjacks to the Southland Conference Tournament Championship and a 23-win season in 2011-12. It was the most wins by a Ladyjack team since the 2005-06 season when SFA also won 23 games and just the fifth 20-win season of the decade. The increase in 11 wins from the 2010-11 season (12) to 2011-12 (23) was tied for the sixth-biggest turnaround in the nation.

Under Schneider's guidance, Roberts was named the 2011-12 Southland Conference Freshman of the Year, while Ashlee Mells was selected as the SLC Newcomer of the Year. Additionally, Schneider assembled a signing class that ranked 35th in the nation according to Premier Basketball Report, including four McDonald's All-American nominees.

In his first full season as head coach of the Ladyjack basketball program, Schneider led SFA to a 12-18 overall record and a 9-7 mark in conference play. The Ladyjacks clinched a trip to the Southland Conference Championship Tournament and nearly pulled off an upset of No. 3 Central Arkansas in the first round before falling, 64-58.

Schneider also oversaw the development of senior guard Tammara Marion, who was named to the All-Southland Conference Second Team. In 2010-11, Marion led the Ladyjacks and was fourth in the league averaging 16 points per game along with 3.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists. She also set the single-season record with 72 made three-point shots. The Ladyjacks topped the conference in offensive rebounding with 16.8 boards per game.

The Canyon, Texas native is the second all-time winningest head coach at the NCAA Division II level. At Emporia State, Schneider led the Lady Hornets to a 306-72 (.810) record, and the 2010 NCAA Division II National Championship. The school's all-time leader in wins and winning percentage, Schneider ranks among the all-time top 10 in fastest coaches to 100 victories, and third fastest among women's basketball

coaches.

In 12 seasons at ESU, Schneider guided the Lady Hornets to 11 NCAA Tournament appearances. During that stretch, Schneider's teams recorded two 30-win seasons and nine 20-win campaigns. Along with the 2010 national championship, Schneider coached ESU to four NCAA Division II South Central Regional titles, two Final Four appearances, six regular-season conference crowns and three league tournament titles.

Schneider made it tough on conference opponents during his time with the Lady Hornets winning 80 percent of those games. ESU posted a 173-43 (.801) record versus Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) foes. The Lady Hornets were nearly unbeatable at home sporting a 143-14 (.917) record during his tenure. Schneider posted a 39-26 (.600) record against nationally-ranked opponents, which included four wins over No. 1-ranked teams, and was 21-10 (.677) in the NCAA Tournament.

The first MIAA rookie head coach to win both the MIAA regular-season and tournament titles, Schneider was voted the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association of four-year colleges Coach of the Year in 2006. He was also a three-time MIAA Coach of the Year. The 2010 Bulletin Women's Basketball National Coach of the Year and the WBCA South Central Region Coach of the Year, Schneider's players have reaped the rewards of his guidance. He has coached seven All-Americans, including two NCAA Division II Player of the Year selections, 13 first-team All-MIAA honorees, eight conference MVPs and seven players have gone on to play professionally, including one in the WNBA.

Well respected for being able to attract some of the nation's top talent on the recruiting trail, Schneider signed six National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) All-Americans and four high school All-Americans to play for the Lady Hornets.

A 1995 honors graduate of Wayland Baptist, Schneider was a four-year letterman in men's basketball and was the school's first-ever academic All-American, capturing the honor three times.

Schneider's father, Bob, was one of the most successful women's coaches at the NCAA Division II level, having served as the head coach at West Texas A&M from 1981-2006. They became the first father/son combination to take teams to the Elite Eight.

Schneider and his wife Ali, have two sons, Cash and Cole.
