The 6-foot-6 junior had games of 24, 10 and 23 points for a total of 57. He also accounted for 25 rebounds, eight assists, six steals and one blocked shot. MVP - Ed Turner, Texas A&M-Kingsville. Ed Turner, a 6-foot-7 silk-smooth junior, broke tournament tradition by becoming the first player from the losing team in the title game to win MVP honors. Although held to just 11 points in the 70-61 loss to SWT, Turner set eight new tourney records. He averaged 26.7 points per game, hitting 35 in a thrilling 82-80 overtime win over SFA, and 34 in A&I's semi-final victory over HPU. He tied single game records for rebounds with 2.0, before breaking marks for points in three games (80), points in two games (69), field goals (33), field goal attempts (55), rebounds (42), and steals (8) for a three-game series.

His top scoring game was in the opener against ETSU with 25 points followed by 11 against ACU and 24 in the title game with HPU. Against the Yellow Jackets, Whittenberg was eight of 13 from the field, eight of nine at the free throw line, pulled down 10 rebounds and blocked three shots to lead the Bearkats to their second tournament championship.

MVP - Anthony Carroll, Sam Houston State. Seeded second in the tournament, Sam Houston State, under the leadership of senior Anthony Carroll captured its second straight tournament championship. Carroll was the leading scorer in the three-day post-season tournament with 57 points. He set an individual tournament record for free throw percentage connecting on 21 of 22 attempts for a .955 mark. He also set an individual career record for free throws made with 35 in eight games covering four years. Carroll finished his tournament career with a 15.4 points-per-game average. His top game in the tournament came in the semi-finals against Texas A&M-Commerce when he scored 22 points making seven of eight attempts from the field and eight of nine attempts from the free throw line.

Austin State player to win the top individual honor of post-season conference tournament in leading the Lumberjacks to three straight wins and their first tournament crown. A senior from Monroe, La., Hagan scored 53 points and grabbed 18 rebounds. Hagan's best performance came in the championship game against Sam Houston State when he connected on nine of 11 field goal attempts, and one of two free throws, as he led SFA back from a 29-23 halftime deficit, to a 68-56 victory. Hagan scored 11 points in the second half against Sam Houston State as the Lumberjacks outscored the Bearkats 45-27 in the final period.
