The Bruins secured a 91-61 win over Washington State in Los Angeles earlier this season (Thursday, Jan. 14).

ABOUT THE BRUINS

- UCLA has won eight of its last 10 games, with six over those wins by five points or fewer (or occurring in overtime).
- The Bruins won nine of their first 10 league games for the first time since 2007-08 (finished 16-2 that year).
- Dating back to last season, UCLA has won 16 of its past 19 Pac-12 contests (and 24 of 31 overall games).
- Dating back to last January, the Bruins have won 16 consecutive home games (including the last 13 in Pac-12 play).
- Not including Chris Smith (injured), UCLA has four active players who have averaged at least 10.0 points per game.
- UCLA has committed fewer fouls than the opposition in 16 of 17 games (the lone game was at Stanford on Jan. 23).
- Nine players on the Bruins' 14-man roster have each scored at least 10 points in at least one career game with UCLA.

INDIVIDUAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Tyger Campbell (11.2 ppg, 5.9 apg) continues to lead all Pac-12 players in assists per game (5.9).
- Jaime Jaquez Jr. (34.2) and Tyger Campbell (33.6) rank third and fifth, respectively, in the Pac-12 in minutes per game.
- Tyger Campbell (5.9 apg) was tied at the No. 17 spot (nationally) in assists per game, through Sunday, Feb. 7.
- David Singleton ranked No. 5 in the Pac-12 in 3-point percentage (45.3%, 24-for-53), through Sunday, Feb. 7.
- Tyger Campbell has registered at least 100 assists for the second consecutive season (101 assists, 31 turnovers).

ON DECK

The Bruins will play at Washington State on Thursday, Feb. 11. Game time is 8 p.m. (TV: FS1). UCLA has won seven of its last eight games against Washington State, including two of the last three meetings at WSU's Beasley Coliseum. Most recently, five Bruins scored in double figures as UCLA secured a 91-61 win over Washington State on Thursday, Jan. 14. Johnny Juzang finished with a team-leading 17 points in the win in Pauley Pavilion, connecting on 7 of 14 shots.

AGAINST THE COUGARS: UCLA has compiled an all-time record of 110-18 against Washington State, including the one victory earlier this season. The Bruins have won 55 of their past 62 contests against Washington State. Last season, the two schools split a pair of regular-season contests, with each game advancing into overtime.

TAKING ON THE HUSKIES: The Bruins will play at Washington on Saturday evening (4:30 p.m., PT). Last month, UCLA earned an 81-76 win over the Huskies in Los Angeles. UCLA has registered an all-time record of 102-43 against Washington, having won six of the last seven meetings against the Huskies.

THE LAST TIME OUT

UCLA absorbed a 66-48 loss at USC on Saturday evening (Feb. 6), falling behind by a 30-20 margin at halftime. Johnny Juzang recorded his first career double-double (13 points and a career-best 13 rebounds). Freshman forward Mac Etienne had eight points, five rebounds and two blocks in his collegiate debut (mid-year enrollee for UCLA). UCLA's loss at USC marked the Bruins' second loss in their previous 10 games. UCLA and USC currently are tied for the best record (9-2) in Pac-12 play. The Bruins are scheduled to face USC in the regular-season finale for both teams on Saturday, March 6.

CLOSING TIME

In two seasons under head coach Mick Cronin, UCLA has gone 15-4 in games decided by five points or fewer (and all contests that finish in overtime, regardless of score margin). Last season, the Bruins went 7-3 in such contests. This year, UCLA has gone 8-1. Through Coach Cronin's final three seasons at Cincinnati (2016-17 through 2018-19), his teams went 18-7 in those games. From 2016-17 through this season, his teams have gone 33-11 in those narrow contests.

POINT GUARD

Tyger Campbell, a sophomore from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, has averaged 11.2 points and a league-best 5.9 assists per game (17 contests). This marks the first season since 2015-16 in which UCLA has returned its starting point guard from the previous year (2014-15 and 2015-16, Bryce Alford). From 2011-12 through 2020-21, UCLA has utilized nine different primary (or starting) point guards. Prior to Campbell, Jaylen Hands served as the Bruins' primary ball handler in 2018-19. Campbell has been UCLA's first point guard to start each game during his freshman year since Lonzo Ball in 2016-17.

70 POINTS OR FEWER

This season, UCLA has compiled a 9-1 record when limiting the opposition to 70 or fewer points. Last season, UCLA went 18-1 when holding the opposition to 70 or fewer points (the lone loss was a 54-52 setback at USC in the final game of the regular season). Through his final three seasons as the head coach at Cincinnati (2016-17 through 2018-19), Coach Cronin's teams went 79-10 when limiting the opposition to 70 or fewer points. Over the past five seasons (2016-17 through 2020-21), his teams have gone 105-12 when holding the opponent to 70 or fewer points (through 153 total games).

BEST STARTS IN LEAGUE PLAY

The Bruins opened Pac-12 play with eight straight wins (now 9-2, Pac-12), marking the program's best start in conference play since 1982-83 (opened their Pac-10 slate with nine straight wins). That UCLA team went 15-3 in the Pac-10 (first-place finish, 23-6 overall record). The 1981-82 UCLA team opened Pac-10 play with an 0-3 record before winning 11 consecutive games (14-4 Pac-10 finish, second place). The most recent UCLA team with an undefeated league record was the 1977-78 Bruins under first-year head coach Gary Cunningham (UCLA went 14-0 in the Pac-10 and 25-3 overall).

POST PRODUCTION

Cody Riley has established himself as a go-to frontcourt scoring threat, having averaged 10.6 points and 6.0 rebounds in 16 games. Riley has totaled four double-doubles, including a 16-point and 10-rebound performance in UCLA's 57-52 win over Oregon State (Saturday, Jan. 30). Riley has started 16 games for the Bruins, logging noticeable improvements in his field goal percentage (54.8%) and free throw percentage (68.3%). Riley has made 14 of 18 shots from the field in the Bruins' final five minutes of all games (and made 16 of 20 free throws in those late-game situations, as well).

BIG MAC: Mac Etienne, a 6-foot-9 forward (New York, N.Y.), enrolled at UCLA in 2021 (winter quarter). He spent the past two seasons at Suffield Academy (Connecticut) before transferring to Brewster Academy (New Hampshire) for his senior year. Etienne was ranked as high as No. 31 in the Class of 2020 by 247Sports.com. While on the East Coast, he competed for the Nike PSA Cardinals AAU program and had been the top-ranked player in Connecticut (last season).

LOOKING AT UCLA'S ROSTER

UCLA entered 2020-21 with eight of its 10 primary contributors back from last season's team. The Bruins returned all five starters from the second half of last season (Tyger Campbell, David Singleton, Jaime Jaquez Jr., Chris Smith and Jalen Hill). UCLA also brought back Cody Riley, Jules Bernard and Jake Kyman, as well as Kenneth Nwuba, who took a redshirt year in 2019-20. The program added sophomore Johnny Juzang (transfer from Kentucky) and freshmen Jaylen Clark, Mac Etienne and Logan Cremonesi. The roster currently includes five players who have played in at least 75 games (at UCLA).

STEADY IMPROVEMENT

Junior Jules Bernard, who grew up in Los Angeles and attended Windward School, has averaged career highs with 8.9 points and 4.7 rebounds per game. He has shot 43.9 percent overall and 76.4 percent at the free throw line (42-for-55). Bernard has posted his best minutes-per-game average (25.5) during his three-year collegiate career. He tallied 47 assists and 84 turnovers in his first two seasons but has registered 22 assists and 18 turnovers through UCLA's 17 games this year. In addition, Bernard has scored in double figures in seven of 17 games.

MORE ABOUT JAIME JAQUEZ JR.

Sophomore Jaime Jaquez Jr. has averaged 12.3 points and 5.9 rebounds per game. He leads the Bruins with 20 steals and has registered a team-best 100 rebounds. Jaquez Jr., who spent the summer of 2019 competing with the Mexican National Team at the Pan-Am Games in Peru, is second on the team in most 3-pointers made (21). Through Sunday, Feb. 7, he ranked third in the Pac-12 in minutes per game (34.2). He has scored in double figures in 11 of 17 games.

PAC-12 PLAY: Jaime Jaquez Jr. has averaged 11.4 points and 5.8 rebounds in the team's 11 Pac-12 games. He leads the Bruins in minutes per game (34.0) in Pac-12 action, having shot 43.1 percent from the field in those games.

30-POINT CLUB

Senior Chris Smith scored a career-high 30 points last season in a 72-68 victory against Colorado (Jan. 30, 2020). He became UCLA's first player with at least 30 points in a game since Kris Wilkes had 34 points in a home victory over Arizona on Jan. 26, 2019. That marked Smith's first career game with at least 25 points. He scored in double figures in three games as a freshman and 10 as a sophomore and didn't score at least 20 points in a game until the fourth game of the Bruins' 2019-20 campaign (vs. Southern Utah). Smith has totaled 844 points, 401 rebounds and 126 assists in 105 career games.

OUT FOR THE SEASON: Chris Smith sustained a torn ACL in his left knee during UCLA's game against Utah on Dec. 31, 2020. Smith, who led UCLA with 16 points in that game, will miss the remainder of the Bruins' 2020-21 season.

THIS SEASON'S DOUBLE-DOUBLE TALLY

Jalen Hill has registered a team-best eight career double-doubles. Cody Riley has four double-doubles this season. In all, UCLA has five student-athletes who have logged at least one double-double during the 2020-21 campaign.

THE BRUINS WHEN ...

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, the Bruins have gone 74-9 when leading at halftime (spanning 150 games). During that span, the UCLA has gone 21-37 when trailing at halftime (4-2 when tied at the break). UCLA's largest halftime deficit overcome in that stretch has been 16 points – UCLA trailed at home against Oregon, 44-28, on Feb. 23, 2019, and outscored the Ducks in the second half (62-39) to win, 90-83. When the Bruins have built a 10-point lead (or larger) at any point in the game, UCLA has gone 79-9. When trailing by 10 or more points in a game, UCLA has gone 15-39.

STREAKING

UCLA has made at least one 3-pointer played in its last 703 games. That 3-point streak began after the Bruins went 0-for-14 from 3-point territory in a 78-63 loss at No. 2-ranked Stanford on Feb. 3, 2000 (Maples Pavilion). UCLA has made at least three 3-pointers in 249 of 255 games since the start of the 2013-14 season. The Bruins made a school single-game-record 19 three-pointers (on 31 attempts) at Colorado on Jan. 12, 2017. UCLA won that road game, 104-89.

- As a freshman in 2018-19, Moses Brown finished with 23 points, 14 rebounds and eight blocks in the Bruins' 95-58 victory against Saint Francis U (Nov. 16, 2018). He became UCLA's first player since Jerome Moiso (Jan. 22, 2000, versus Arizona State) to have recorded at least 20 points and five blocks in a game. The Bruins have not had any player with a triple-double of the point-rebound-block variety since Jelani McCoy on Dec. 9, 1995 (stats located above).

- This season, Chris Smith had 26 points, 12 rebounds and six assists in a triple-overtime victory over Pepperdine (Nov. 27). During the 2017-18 campaign, Aaron Holiday came close to notching a triple-double with 23 points, nine assists and six rebounds in an 82-79 victory at home against USC (Feb. 3, 2018). Holiday also approached triple-double territory in a win over Stanford (March 8, 2018), recording a career-high-tying 34 points, eight assists and seven rebounds.

PRESEASON PROJECTIONS

UCLA was selected first in the preseason Pac-12 media poll, announced by the conference office on Nov. 12, 2020. Arizona State was picked second, while Oregon was selected third. UCLA earned the top spot in the preseason poll for the first time since 2011-12.

Members of the media have correctly picked the regular-season winner of the conference 17 times in 31 tries. The winner has been accurately chosen in 19 of the 31 all-time preseason votes. UCLA was selected eighth in the 2019-20 preseason poll and compiled a 12-6 record in league games (second place). The Bruins last won the Pac-12 regular-season title in 2012-13. Other prior regular-season titles for UCLA took place in 2005-06, 2006-07 and 2007-08. The Bruins finished second in the league in 2013-14 and third in 2016-17. UCLA most recently won the Pac-12's tournament title in 2014 (in Las Vegas).

UCLA IN OVERTIME

The Bruins have won six of their past eight overtime contests (including a 2-1 mark this season). UCLA went 1-1 in overtime last year (both contests against Washington State). In 2018-19, the Bruins went 3-0 in overtime. That season, UCLA registered road victories at Oregon and California and at home against USC. In 2017-18, the Bruins played in five overtime contests, with one of those games pushing into two overtime sessions. UCLA went 2-3 in those five overtime games.

HEADED TO DOUBLE OVERTIME

Two of UCLA's last three double overtime games have come against the Stanford Cardinal. In 2017-18, the Bruins absorbed a 107-99 double overtime loss at Stanford. UCLA's last win in double overtime occurred against Stanford in Pauley Pavilion (Jan. 8, 2015). In that game, Kevon Looney had 27 points and 19 rebounds to help UCLA erase a 14-point deficit with just over nine minutes remaining in the second half.

HEADED TO WESTWOOD

UCLA received signed National Letters of Intent from high school seniors Will McClendon and Peyton Watson during the early signing period, as announced by head coach Mick Cronin on Nov. 12.

Both students will enroll as freshmen at UCLA in 2021-22. Watson, a 6-foot-7 guard from Long Beach, Calif., averaged 23.2 points, 8.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game at Long Beach Poly last season. Currently a senior with the Jackrabbits, Watson has been ranked No. 8 in his high school class by 247Sports.com (and No. 17 by Rivals.com). McClendon, a 6-foot-4 guard who has excelled at Bishop Gorman High School (Las Vegas), registered 16.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.0 steals per game last season. Now in his senior year at Bishop Gorman, McClendon has been ranked No. 37 in his high school class by Rivals.com and 247Sports.com.

Watson has been ranked as the state of California's No. 1 player by ESPN.com. In 2019-20, Watson guided Long Beach Poly to the program's 11th consecutive Moore League title before earning All-CIF Southern Section Division I honors. As a sophomore (2018-19), he helped Long Beach Poly to a 12-0 league record. In last season's regular-season finale, he finished with 28 points, 11 rebounds and three blocks as the Jackrabbits clinched the Moore League title.

McClendon helped lead Bishop Gorman to the program's ninth consecutive state title during his junior campaign (2019-20), as the Gaels took down Desert Pines, 65-37, in the Nevada Class 4A state title contest at Lawlor Events Center in Reno, Nev. He scored a team-leading 14 points in the championship victory as Bishop Gorman concluded the season with a 29-3 record. McClendon secured first-team All-Southern Nevada honors at the end of his junior season.

UCLA VERSUS RANKED TEAMS

- The Bruins' 2019-20 team finished the season with wins over three "top 25" ranked teams in the second half of the season. In fact, the Bruins won the final three games that they played against ranked opponents – at home against Colorado (Jan. 30), at Arizona (Feb. 8) and at Colorado (Feb. 22). UCLA had not won three games against ranked opponents in a one-month span since March 2008.

- Kentucky was ranked No. 1 in the nation in the AP and USA Today Coaches polls when UCLA faced them in Dec. 2014, Dec. 2015 and Dec. 2016. UCLA's win at Rupp Arena on Dec. 3, 2016 marked the Bruins' first victory on the road at a No. 1-ranked team since Feb. 3, 2001 (when UCLA knocked off Stanford, 79-73). UCLA had not played a road game at the No. 1-ranked team since Feb. 13, 2003. The Bruins lost that game at No. 1 Arizona, 106-70.

- The Bruins' victory at Kentucky on Dec. 3, 2016 marked the program's first victory in a true road game against the nation's No. 1 team since Feb. 3, 2001, when UCLA knocked off Stanford, 79-73, in Maples Pavilion. Since the start of the 1999-2000 season, UCLA has gone 6-8 against the No. 1-ranked team. Through the previous five seasons, UCLA has gone 2-3 against the nation's No. 1-ranked team (as ranked in that week's AP poll).

• Since 1948, UCLA has produced the second-most NBA draft selections (121) ... Kentucky tops that list with 134 ... trailing Kentucky and UCLA are North Carolina (116) and Duke (100) ... during the 2019-20 NBA season, UCLA had 14 former players in action ... Trevor Ariza is the most veteran of the group, having entered the league in 2004-05.

• With the NBA's 2020-21 season now underway, UCLA has 11 former players currently on NBA rosters. Four of these players have switched teams in the offseason. Russell Westbrook will begin his 13th year in the NBA, his first season with the Washington Wizards. Also on the move has been Jrue Holiday (to Milwaukee), Trevor Ariza (to Oklahoma City) and Moses Brown (to Oklahoma City). The NBA's regular season began on Tuesday, Dec. 22.

• Zach LaVine, a first-round pick by Minnesota in 2014, had a productive 2019-20 season with the Chicago Bulls. He averaged a career-best 25.5 points per game and 4.8 rebounds per game. The former standout at Bothell High School (Bothell, Wash.) has spent the previous three seasons with the Chicago Bulls (and is entering his seventh NBA season).

• In 2016-17, Russell Westbrook became the third player from UCLA to secure NBA Most Valuable Player acclaim ... Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (known as Lew Alcindor while in college) earned MVP honors six times (1971, 1972, 1974, 1976, 1977 and 1980) and Bill Walton was named the league's MVP in 1978 ... in the summer of 2017, UCLA became the first school in the nation to have produced three players who have won the NBA's Most Valuable Player Award.

• Russell Westbrook was named MVP of the NBA All-Star Game in 2015 and 2016 ... this season, Westbrook was selected to compete in the NBA's All-Star Game for the ninth time ... in 2017, he scored 41 points in the contest ... UCLA BASKETBALL ON THE AIR

For the 13th straight season, UCLA men's basketball games are being produced by the UCLA Sports Network from Learfield IMG College, with AM 570 Fox Sports LA in Los Angeles serving as the flagship station for the network.

The 2020-21 campaign marks the 24th year of UCLA's partnership with AM 570 Fox Sports LA owner iHeartMedia (formerly Clear Channel Communications). All men's basketball games will be broadcast on KLAC (AM 570) or one of its sister iHeartMedia stations. UCLA and Learfield IMG College have agreed to terms to simulcast a significant number of men's basketball games on 97.3 THE FAN in San Diego. The primary sister station in the greater Los Angeles area is AM 1150 (KEIB).

UCLA's 2020-21 schedule will be televised live on a variety of broadcast networks. While the team's schedule remains in flux, the Bruins's basketball games are being televised on the ESPN family of networks, FOX Sports, CBS and Pac-12 Networks. CBS will televise the Bruins' matchup against Kentucky in Cleveland, slated for Saturday, Dec. 19 (as part of the CBS Sports Classic).

Josh Lewin has entered his fifth season as the play-by-play voice for the UCLA men's basketball and football teams. In addition to calling UCLA games, he recently handled broadcasting duties for a select number of Boston Red Sox games. Prior to his work with Boston, Lewin spent seven seasons as a play-by-play voice for the New York Mets. He served as the voice of the San Diego Chargers for 12 seasons (2005-17), before the team relocated to Los Angeles. Lewin has over two decades of experience calling NFL, MLB, NHL and NCAA football and basketball contests.

Tracy Murray is now in his 12th season as a radio analyst. Murray, who played at UCLA (1990-92) before enjoying a 12-year NBA career, spent the 2015-16 season as a shooting coach for the Los Angeles Lakers. Previously, he served as a radio analyst with UCLA from 2008-15. Murray ranks 10th on UCLA's all-time scoring list with 1,792 career points in 98 games.

MICK CRONIN

The Michael Price Family UCLA Men's Head Basketball Coach

Mick Cronin has entered his second season as UCLA's head coach, having been named the 14th head coach in the history of the Bruins' basketball program on April 9, 2019. Cronin, 49, arrived in Westwood after spending the previous 13 seasons as head coach at his alma mater, the University of Cincinnati. He served as the head coach at Murray State for three seasons, prior to taking the head coaching position at Cincinnati.

Cronin was named the 2020 Pac-12 Conference Coach of the Year, marking the third conference in which he secured "Coach of the Year" acclaim. He was named the American Athletic Conference's Coach of the Year (AAC) in 2014, while at Cincinnati. In addition, he was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year (OVC) in 2006, his third and final season at that program. In addition, Cronin was honored as the Sporting News National Coach of the Year in 2018, having led Cincinnati to a 31-5 overall record that season.

Cronin entered the 2020-21 season having compiled the most head coaching victories at the NCAA Division I level (384) among active head coaches under the age of 50. Cronin will turn 50 years old next summer.

Last season, Cronin led the Bruins to a 19-12 overall record and a 12-6 mark in the Pac-12 Conference. That marked UCLA's highest finish in the Pac-12 regular-season standings since finishing in second place in 2013-14. The Bruins went 8-9 to open the season before winning 11 of their final 14 games (including wins against three top-25 ranked programs in January and February).

Before he became UCLA's head coach, Cronin led Cincinnati to consecutive NCAA Tournaments the previous nine years. He guided Cincinnati to a pair of back-to-back 30-plus win seasons in 2017 and 2018, and coached the Bearcats to the American Athletic Conference (AAC) Tournament title in 2018 and 2019.

LOOKING BACK AT 2018-19

Cronin helped Cincinnati to a 28-7 overall record in 2018-19, the third consecutive year in which the Bearcats won at least 28 games. In fact, through his final three years at Cincinnati, he registered an 89-18 record with the Bearcats (winning percentage of .832). The Bearcats went 14-4 in American Athletic Conference play that season, finishing second in the conference standings behind Houston (16-2). Cincinnati captured the AAC Tournament title for the second consecutive season, taking down Houston in the championship contest, 69-57.

PRIOR TO BECOMING A HEAD COACH

Cronin became a head coach at Murray State (Murray, Kentucky) at the age of 32, prior to the 2003-04 school year. The son of longtime high school coach Hep Cronin, Mick Cronin served as an assistant varsity coach and head junior varsity coach at Woodward High School while he was completing his undergraduate studies at Cincinnati. He served as the video coordinator and later as an assistant coach for head coach Bob Huggins at Cincinnati (assistant coach from 1997 through 2001). He joined the coaching staff at Louisville prior to the 2001-02 school year, serving as the program's associate head coach for Rick Pitino. After two seasons on the staff at Louisville, Cronin became the head coach at Murray State. In three seasons at Murray State, Cronin led the Racers to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances and a combined record of 69-24. Cronin compiled a 42-10 record in the Ohio Valley Conference during his three seasons at Murray State.

- In his first season in Westwood (2019-20), helped UCLA win 11 of their final 14 games ... UCLA finished the season 19-12 overall and secured a second-place finish in the Pac-12 standings.

• Served as an assistant coach at Long Beach State for 11 seasons (from 2007-08 through 2017-18) ... helped Long Beach State advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2012 and guided the program to Big West Conference crowns in 2011, 2012 and 2013.

Lewis and former Indiana standout Keith Smart are the program's only players to have ever recorded a program-best 15 assists in one game ... Lewis had 15 assists versus Iowa in the Hoosiers' regular-season finale on Feb. 28, 1998.

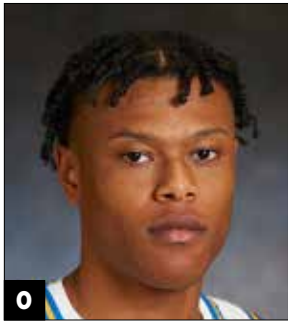

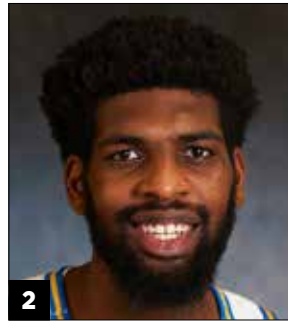
