SCOUTING THE OPPOSITION

USC at a Glance: The Trojans make the trip up to Seattle after a three-game sweep at home over Nevada last weekend. They combined for four home runs in their final game against the Wolfpack, a 7-2 victory. USC is 6-6 on the season and started off 2021 by winning two straight against Loyola Marymount. The Trojans then lost 6 of 7 before sweeping Nevada.

Man in Charge: Jason Gill leads USC in his second year as the head coach. It will be his first time coaching against Washington and his first Pac-12 conference game with the Trojans. Gill and USC were 10-5 in 2020 before the season was shut down.

Unique History: UW was scheduled to play USC in last season's Pac-12 opening series as well. The Huskies had boarded their bus to make the trip to California, but the series -- and season -- would ultimately get canceled due to the Covid-19 pandemic before the teams could play a game.

By the Numbers: On offense, the Trojans are led by Tyresse Turner, who slashes .317/.488/.420 and is nine-for-nine stealing bases. Jamal O'Guinn, Nate Clow and Clay Owens are tied for the team lead with three home runs each, while O'Guinn leads USC with 11 RBIs. On the mound, Clow has also thrown 3.2 scoreless innings of relief and has two saves. Isaac Esqueda has been the most successful Trojan starter, with a 2.28 ERA in a team-high 23.2 innings pitched.

HUSKY BASEBALL BITS

• **Starting Pitching Sets the Tone:** UW has been led this season by its consistent starting pitching. **Logan Gerling** has proven to be a valuable arm for the Huskies. He has not allowed more than two runs in a start this season and has an ERA of 3.00. **Jack Enger** has picked up where he left off after a dominant 2020 and is currently 2-0 with a 1.02 ERA and 0.96 ERA. Since moving to a starting role from the bullpen, **Adam Bloebaum** has struck out 18 batters in just 12.2 innings.

• **Bullpen Quality:** Returning a bulk of last year's dominant bullpen, the Huskies have found similar spurts of dominance in 2021. Last week against Portland, UW relievers combined to throw 6.2 scoreless innings to secure the win. **Gabe Smith** led the effort, throwing 3.1 scoreless innings to help bridge the gap to the back of the bullpen. **Davis Delorefice** earned his first save of the season by getting the last four outs of the game, three of which were strikeouts. The bullpen trio of **Delorefice**, **Stefan Raeth** and **Stu Flesland III** have combined to throw 25.1 scoreless innings in 23 combined appearances this season. Additionally, **Dylan Lamb** has shown the ability to come in and get big outs, which

included a save in UW's most recent win over Seattle U. **Colton Charnholm** has emerged as a quality lefty arm that can be called on at any point in a game..

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

• **Ward: Always On Base and Stealing:** Junior **Braiden Ward** cracked the Huskies' top-five list for career stolen bases last season and currently sits in fourth-place all time with 66 swipes. Up next for Ward is **Kevin Stocker** in third with 67. Ward led the Pac-12 with 10 steals in the shortened 2020 season and became the first Conference player to lead the league in stolen bases three times. He currently leads the Pac-12 with 11.

• **Hsue Heating Up:** After sitting on the bench in the team's final game against Loyola Marymount, Noah Hsue has now hit safely in the last four games for Washington, all wins, and is 6-15 (.400) in those contests.

• **Husky Firsts:** A couple of UW true freshmen have had moments to remember this season. Four different true freshmen have gotten a hit in their first-career at-bats this season. **Emilio Corona** and **Kelly Corl** each accomplished that against LMU. **Carson Blatnick** also ripped a single in his first career at-bat in the UTRGV series. **Nick Kresnak** singled in his first ever Husky at-bat in that series as well. **Michael Brown's** RBI double against Portland was the winning run last week and he launched his first career home run against UTRGV.

• **Playing For Alto:** Among the nine lives lost in the Jan. 26, 2020 helicopter crash that claimed Kobe Bryant were Orange Coast College coach John Altobelli and his wife, Keri, and daughter, Alyssa. The Husky coaching staff has known Coach Alto for many years and most recently recruited **Davis Delorefice** from OCC. Delorefice was the team and league MVP as Orange Coast went on to win the California State Championship in 2019. Delorefice joined OCC after playing at Utah in 2018 .

• **300 wins:** In 2020, **Lindsay Meggs** became the third UW coach to reach 300 wins, joining **Ken Knutson** (559) and **Bob MacDonald** (384). Meggs is now 310-275-1 in 12 years at Washington and 925-582-5 in 28 seasons overall.

• **Family Connections:** **Dylan Lamb** is the younger brother of former Husky and Arizona Diamondbacks 2018 All-Star third baseman, **Jake Lamb** ... **Christian Dicochea** has an older brother, Jason, that just finished his career as an infielder at Santa Clara ... **Nate Weeldreyer's** older brother, Colton, played tennis at Seattle University... **Jack Enger's** dad, Kyle, rowed at UW... Brothers **Jake** and **Brandon Leitgeb's** dad, Brian, was on the UW golf team ... **Rollie Nichols'** father, Rolando, is a baseball broadcaster for FOX Deportes in Los Angeles.

TEAM NOTES

• **Omaha Experience:** Washington has eight players on its 2021 roster from the 2018 team that advanced to the College World Series in Omaha, Neb., with many of them being key contributors to that group.

Christian Jones led the way with 52 starts for the Huskies. **Braiden Ward** played in 57 games with 50 starts, **Noah Hsue** played in 36 and made 26 starts at second base, **Kaiser Weiss** played in 54 games and had the game-winning sacrifice fly that sent UW to Omaha. Additionally, **Dylan Lamb** made 18 appearances out of the bullpen, **Michael Petrie** saw action in eight contests, **Brandon Leitgeb** played in seven and **Jack Enger** pitched in two.

• **2,000 wins:** The Huskies reached a major milestone in 2020, with a 3-1 triumph over Fresno State on Feb. 22 being the 2,000th victory in program history.

• **Expanded Rosters:** Due to the NCAA's blanket eligibility waiver for the 2020 Spring season and a shortened MLB Draft, players across the country that otherwise would have moved on were able to return to their teams for the 2021 season. UW is no exception, as its current roster of 42 players is an increase of six from last year's roster of 36.

• **Washington's Winning Ways:** The Huskies have the second-longest streak of winning seasons among Pac-12 schools. UW has posted a winning record every season since 2014, which has including three post-season appearances and the program's first College World Series appearance in 2018. Oregon State has the longest winning-season streak among Pac-12 school, last falling below .500 in 2003.

• **Strikeout Standard:** In its last full season, Washington's 2019 pitching staff recorded a school record 501 strikeouts. Josh Burgmann led the staff with 101 strikeouts and he was one of five pitchers to surpass 50 K's during the season. It marked the first time the Huskies have had five pitchers with 50 or more strikeouts in a season.

PAC-12 COACHES POLL

The Huskies were picked to finish eighth out of 11 teams by the Pac-12 coaches in the preseason poll. In recent years, UW has made a habit of outperforming preseason expectations. The Huskies finished third in 2018 after being chosen seventh. In 2016, the Huskies were picked eighth and ended up second, while in 2014 they were picked 10th and also ended up second. UCLA was the unanimous pick to win the conference, receiving all 10 possible first-place votes.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM:

Prior to Coach **Lindsay Meggs** arriving on campus, the grade point average of the baseball program rarely, if ever, reached 3.0 or higher. But the team has now accomplished a GPA of 3.0 or higher in 20 of the last 22 main session quarters (fall, winter, spring). They once again had another stellar quarter in the classroom, combining for a 3.25 grade point average during the fall and overall combined GPA of 3.16 as a team. In fact, 30 players on the active roster obtained a GPA of 3.0 or higher in fall of 2019 and In all, six players made the Dean's List -- **James Kobylt, Cole Miller, Leo Nierenberg, Jonathan Schiffer, Will Simpson** and **Michael Snyder**. Nierenberg, a senior majoring in visual arts, had a 3.94 GPA during the fall quarter and is a two-time First Team Pac-12 All-Academic selection. Miller, a freshman, notched a 3.97 GPA in his first college quarter, the highest among all Huskies.

DRAFT DAWGS

Since **Lindsay Meggs** took over at Washington in 2010, a total of 40 Huskies have heard their names called in the Draft. In the shortened five-round 2020 draft, pitcher **Stevie Emanuels** was taken in the 5th round by the Oakland A's, while UW signee **Dylan MacLean** was taken in the 4th round by the Texas Rangers. In 2019, the Huskies saw six picked: catcher **Nick Kahle** (4th Rd, Brewers), RHP **Josh Burgmann** (5th, Cubs), LHP **Chris Micheles** (14th, Phillies), OF **Connor Blair** (15th Braves), RHP **Jordan Jones** (16th, Indians) and INF **Ben Baird** (34th, Cardinals). **Brock Jones**, who was a UW signee, was picked in the 17th round by the Diamondbacks and elected to go pro. On the current roster, three Huskies were drafted prior to arriving on campus. Most recently, **Will Simpson** was selected in the 18th round of the 2019 draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates. In 2018, **David Rhodes** was picked in the 40th round by the Mariners and **Christian Jones** (31st, Red Sox) was selected out of high school in the 2016 draft.

FUTURE DAWGS

Head coach Lindsay Meggs signed 7 high school players in November that will join the Huskies in the fall of 2021 for the 2022 season. Max Debiec (Seattle, Wash.), a Baseball America Second Team All-American and No. 1-ranked player in the state by Baseball Northwest headlines the class. The six other signees for UW are RHP Kyle Bender, RHP Micah Bucknam, INF Cameron Clayton, OF Kyle Fossum, OF AJ Guerrero and OF/LHP Colby Wallace.

adidas PARTNERSHIP

The University of Washington athletic department activated its partnership with apparel provider adidas on July 1, 2019. The deal is for 10 years and reportedly worth nearly \$12 million annually. The deal is one of the 10 most valuable in college athletics — worth slightly more annually than the 11-year, \$128-million deal Adidas gave Nebraska in 2017 — and makes the Huskies the premier program for adidas on the West Coast.

THE 2018 COLLEGE WORLD SERIES RUN

2018 3-0 Conway (S.C.) Regional 2-1 Fullerton Super Regional 0-2 College World Series

The Huskies' amazing run to their first College World Series started at the NCAA Conway Regional, where they ran the table to reach their first-ever Super Regional. UW opened with a 7-1 win over UConn, followed by an 11-6 win over host Coastal Carolina and capped the tourney with a 9-6 win over UConn again.

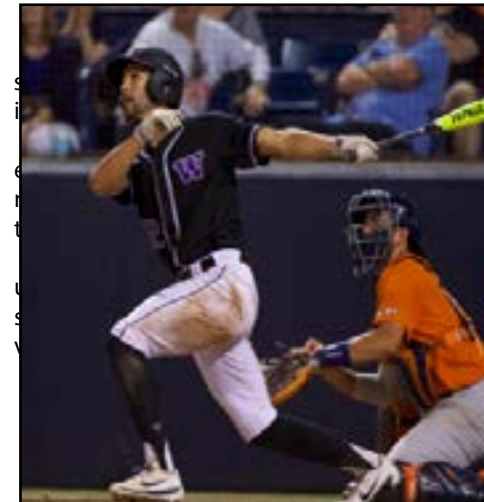
In game one, Joe Wainhouse broke a 1-1 tie in the sixth inning with a home run and the Huskies put the game away with five runs in the eighth. Joe DeMers allowed a first inning run, but allowed just four hits over the next seven innings to earn the win.

Against the host Chanticleers, UW had a six-run second inning, capped by a Nick Kahle grand slam home run, and added two runs in the sixth and seventh innings to blow open a 7-6 advantage and advance to the winner's bracket.

They faced UConn for the right to move on and UConn jumped ahead 6-1 in the top of the third before UW scored five in the third to tie things up. Wainhouse, who was the MVP of the Regional, bashed his third home run of the weekend, to highlight the inning. AJ Graffanino broke a 6-6 tie in the 8th inning with a base-loaded, bases-clearing double that earned him the post-game Gatorade shower.

Washington traveled to Cal State Fullerton for its first ever endeavor into a Super Regional and by the end of the weekend, both teams were emotionally drained.

The Huskies drew first blood, pounding out 14 hits to win game one, 8-5. UW fell behind 2-0, but tied the game in the third and took the lead for good in the fifth with a pair of runs. They scored two more in the seventh, but Fullerton answered with three in its half of the

inning to close the gap to one run, but Kaiser Weiss gave the Huskies some huge insurance with a two-run double in the ninth.

The Titans evened the score in game two, scoring a pair of runs in the second and never looking back. Joe Wainhouse hit a pair of home runs, but they accounted for the Huskies' only two runs in a 5-2 loss, setting up a decisive game three.

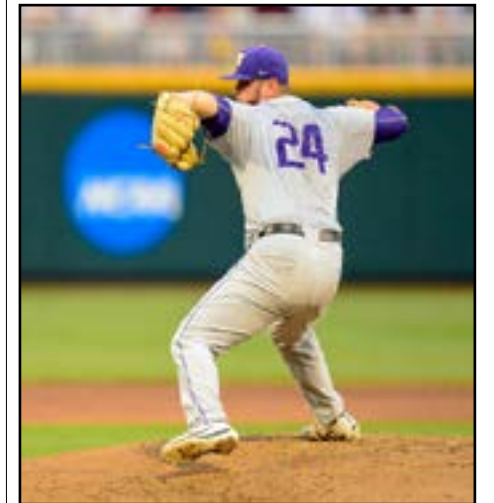
Ace Joe DeMers was on the hill for the Huskies in the final game and he was dominant for eight innings. He was perfect until giving up a lead-off single in the seventh and he was backed offensively by solo home runs from Nick Kahle and Willie MacIver, plus another run in the sixth. He led 3-1 heading into the ninth when all kinds of craziness ensued.

Spinning a one-hitter, the Titans finally got to DeMers in the ninth. After a hit batter to start the inning, they would wedge four hits around a pair of out and score three times to take a 4-3 lead.

The Huskies would not roll over as a pair of freshmen teamed up to send the game to extra innings. Kaiser Weiss doubled and Jonathan Schiffer singled him home to send the game to the 10th.

With two outs in the 10th, Titans second baseman Hank LoForte would hit a solo home run to give his team the lead, but once again, the Huskies did not back down. Joe Wainhouse singled to start the inning, and pinch runner Jack Johnson moved all the way to third base when pitcher Brett Conine threw a bunt by Jordan into right field.

AJ Graffanino reached on an infield single that scored Johnson and after a fielding error at short by Sahid Valenzuela loaded the bases, Weiss calmly lifted a deep fly to left that

scored Jordan, setting off a wild celebration between first and second base.

Mississippi State spoiled Washington's first-ever College World Series game, ending a thrilling, scoreless game with three, ninth-inning singles off Alex Hardy, the last of which, a drive from Luke Alexander that dropped beyond the UW's shallow outfield, scored Hunter Stovall, who had led off the ninth with a single.

The TD Ameritrade Park crowd of 24,758, the largest ever to watch a UW baseball game, was treated to a top-class pitchers' duel that was heavy on tension and rock solid defense. Joe DeMers, the Husky ace, pitched seven and one-third innings, allowing seven hits and a walk with two strikeouts. He threw just 72 pitches, 55 of them strikes, and induced 14 groundouts (two of them double plays). MSU's Ethan Small also worked seven
