## UW-OSHKOSH HEADED TO FIRST-EVER FINAL FOUR

UW-Oshkosh posted an exhilarating 95-88 overtime victory over Augustana College (Ill.) in Rock Island, Ill., in the sectional final of the NCAA Division III Men's Basketball Championship on March 10, to earn its first-ever trip to the Final Four.

The Titans (24-7) will face Ramapo College (N.J.) (25-6) in a national semifinal game on March 16 at the Salem Civic Center in Salem, Va. This will mark the fifth time in the last nine seasons that the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) will be represented in the Final Four. Conference schools have combined to win 12 NCAA Division III men's basketball championships. UW-Oshkosh advanced to the Elite Eight after a 93-72 victory over Emory University (Ga.) in the sectional semifinal.

For the first time in history, the WIAC had three teams competing in the "Sweet 16" as UW-Oshkosh was joined by UW-Platteville and UW-Stevens Point.

UW-Platteville was eliminated after a 79-78 loss in the final seconds to Nebraska Wesleyan University at Bo Ryan Court. The Pioneers completed the 2017-18 campaign with a 24-5 record and made the program's 11th NCAA appearance. UW-Platteville also won the 20th regular-season conference title in school archives.

UW-Stevens Point had its season come to an end after a 65-55 loss to Whitman College (Wash.) in a sectional semifinal contest in Platteville. The Pointers completed the season with a 21-9 record and made the program's 15th NCAA appearance. UW-Stevens Point also won the ninth WIAC tournament title in school history.
